For the Shabbos Table

"Veharbah arbeh es zaracha kehochvei hashamayim vechachol asher al sefas hayam"

"And I will increase your offspring like the stars of the heavens and the sand of the seashore" (Bereishis 22:17)

We find later on in sefer Bereishis (28:14) that Klal Yisrael will be multiplied like "afar haaretz" "the dust of the earth". Why does the pasuk compare Klal Yisrael to these three things, sand of the seashore, dust of the earth, and the stars in the sky?

Rav Moshe Feinstein zt"l explains the

correlation. What protects the land from being flooded by ocean waters is the sand barrier at the shoreline. So too, Klal Yisrael has an inborn nature and the ability to be able to persevere and withstand waves of trial and tribulation.

The dust of the earth, explains Rav Moshe zt"l, has no innate purpose other than being the bedrock of the growth of agriculture. Even man himself was created from dust of the earth. A person must realize that he wasn't created to serve himself, rather to do for others and fulfill the will of his creator.

The star symbolizes the ability for each and every Jew to rise and shine independently and individually. We are all invested with strengths and capabilities to accomplish in our own lives and shine like a luminary in the eyes of Hashem.

In a similar vein, Rav Shlomo Freifeld zt"l gives an explanation as to why we are compared to the stars. It says in Tehillim, "There are countless stars and they each have a name." (147: 4). This is comparable to Klal Yisrael, as we are all part of a great nation, yet at the same time, each one of us has a "name." Each one of us has his own significance and importance which can't be accomplished by someone else.
