"Vayaratz Lavan el ha'ish ha'chutzah"

"And Lavan ran outside to the

man (Eliezer)" (Bereishis 24:29)

Rashi questions Lavan's actions; why did Lavan choose to run to Eliezer? What was Lavans goal by rushing to greet Eliezer?

Rashi explains that Lavan noticed the jewelry his sister Rivkah was wearing. While this explains Lavan's reason for approaching Eliezer, how does this explain why Lavan felt an instant need to rush over, instead of approaching him in a more civil manner? We see from Rashi a lesson in human behavior. When it comes to money, our natural instinct is to jump at even the slightest opportunity of financial gain by any means necessary - even if it requires us to go against our better judgment. Our predisposed inclinations and desires can easily override our normal manner and cause us to act thoughtlessly.
