Taryag Mitzvos Weekly

Parashas Ki Sisa contains 9 Mitzvos, 4 positive and 5 negative commandments.

Mitzvah Highlight: "Lo sevasheil gedi bachaleiv imo"

"You shall not cook a young animal in its mother's milk" (Shemos 34:26)

This pasuk is repeated 3 times throughout the Torah, and conveys 3 different aspects of the prohibition: eating dairy that's combined with meat, deriving pleasure from dairy that's combined with meat, and cooking dairy and meat together.

For the Shabbos Table



"Vayavor Hashem al panav vayikra, Hashem Hashem"

"And Hashem passed by and He called 'Hashem, Hashem...'"

"(Shemos 34:6)

The Gemara in Rosh Hashana (17b) describes how Hashem demonstrated

the 13 Middos HaRachamin to Moshe. It states that Hashem "wore" a tallis like a shaliach tzibbur, and instructed Moshe that if he prayed this fashion, Bnei Yisrael would be guaranteed forgiveness. What aspect of the tefillah is Hashem telling Moshe to emulate? What is the significance of His 'wearing' a tallis?

The Gemara in Brachos (8b) says that Hashem will never dismiss the prayers of group of Jews. However, Jews all over the world gather to pray several times a day, and their tefillos don't always seem to be answered. The Imrei Bina explains that the Gemara is not simply referring to a number of people praying simultaneously in the same room. Rather, the true intention is an assembly of Jews who pray for each other, who plead their fellow's case before Hashem and ask for his friends success.

This form of tefillah is the sort Hashem directed Moshe to emulate. By 'wearing' a tallis, Hashem intimated members of a congregation act as a shaliach tzibbur for each other, advocating on their friends behalf, they will be guaranteed forgiveness and salvation.
