

Three Friends

The story is told about a person that's suddenly called to a meeting with the king. He gets nervous so he goes to his friends and asks for help, and they

shrug their shoulders and say, "Well, you got yourself into this one, buddy, you're going to have to get yourself out of it."

He thinks to himself, with friends like that, who needs enemies?

So he goes to another group of friends, and they says, "Well, we'll walk you to the gates of the king, but after that you're on your own." "Thanks a lot, guys."

He goes to the next group of friends, and they say, "We will walk in with you. We will stand by your side and speak up on your behalf. We will lend you all the support you need. "Ah—thank you, thank you so much."

After a hundred and twenty years, a Jew is called to a meeting with Melech Malchei HaMelochim, HaKodosh Boruch Hu. And who are these three friends? The first one is his material possessions: He goes

right away to the ATM machine, and the money's already been withdrawn, but he can't take it with him anyway. And the second are his friends, his knockaround buddies, and they all escort him to the grave site; they'll bow their heads, and go home, cry a little bit and eat some gefilte fish, but that's it—he's on his own.

The third group of friends is the Torah and the Mitzvos that the person did while he was in this world. And they will stand by his side and speak up for him for eternity.





Our teeth clamp down on the food from the top and from the bottom like a pair of scissors, but there is an important difference between scissors

and our teeth. The blades of scissors are connected together at a certain point where the upper blade and the lower blade meet — as opposed to our teeth which are not connected to each other at any point.

Let's contemplate Hashem's creation. Because our two sets of teeth are not connected to each other, we can open our mouth widely to contain a large amount of food. There is also another advantage that is related to the topic of chewing.

If the two rows of teeth were connected, the molars would only close down in a very specific place, the same way scissors always close at the same exact spot. Hashem, in His wisdom, created our rows of teeth not connected in order to give our bite flexibility when we chew. Very often our upper teeth are not biting in the center of the lower teeth; rather it goes to the right or left. Despite the fact that the difference seems very trivial, it actually makes a very big difference in the way our food gets crushed.

In addition, it helps the food get crushed from different angles. Every different an-

gle helps the food get crushed properly.

We discussed so many important facets of the job the teeth serve in chewing, let's continue and examine the roles that other parts of the mouth contribute to chewing.

Hashem created our teeth with space left over on the exterior side, which is between the teeth and the cheek. This is important because every time we chew part of the food gets pushed out to the space next to the cheek. When the food is next to the cheek it is not in the position to be swallowed, it has to return to the center of the mouth. That means that once again it travels through the teeth for another crushing.

The cheeks themselves also play an important role in the chewing process. They push the food towards the teeth. Whenever we bite down the cheeks expand outwardly creating a pocket that can contain food. Afterwards, when we separate our teeth and get ready for the next bite — our cheeks turn inwards and push out the food towards the teeth. This happens many, many times when we eat. If you pay attention to the movement of your teeth when you chew, you can discover this yourself.

Our cheeks were created with such wisdom and they help us chew our food in an incredible way.

Can we imagine the feelings of the Yisroelim that stood there as they watched the holy Avoda transpiring? Can we imagine how much Yiras Shomayim and Ahavas Hashem they acquired just from watching?

Yes we hope and yearn that very soon we will be able to once again experience this awesome and elevating experience.

However, while we are waiting, we need to know that yes - even today we can still have a taste of this experience. Let

me explain.

The Avudraham writes that in Galus when we don't have the Bais Hamikdash, every Yid that davens is considered the "Kohen HaMakriy".

How do we understand this?

We know that every Yid considered a Mishkan, a place for Hashem to dwell as it says "bilvavi mishkan evneh". The Nefesh Hachaim speaks at length on this topic, and he says that the mind of a Yid is is considered the Kodesh Hakadashim. If you think about it, this is a profound statement, and it should give us a tremendous boost to our self-image.

Rav Schwab in his Sefer on Tefilla [M'eyn Bais Hashoeva] outlines the whole davening as a journey through the different parts of the Bais Hamikdash. For example, he says that the fifteen Brachos that we say in the morning by Birchas Hashachar correspond to the fifteen steps leading to the Heichal. The climax obviously is Shemone Esrei and that's as if we enter the Kodesh Hakadashim.

The Rashba writes famously that when we wash our hands in the morning it's like the Kohen that washes himself from the Kiyor.

From all this we see that every single one of us is like a Kohen that is serving Hashem in our own Bais Hamikdash. With this frame of mind we should get a tremendous sense of pride, similar to the Kohen in the time of the Bais Hamikdash.

The truth is that the origi-

nal clothing that Klal Yisroel used to wear during Tefilla was pretty similar to a Kohen. They wore a long robe, pants, a hat, and a belt.

However, there is one very apparent difference between our avoda and the avoda in the Bais Hamikdash, and that's the tangibility. The Bais Hamikdash was a physical place of awesome Kedusha and there were Keilim, Mizbeichos, Korbanos, and they saw the Nissim as well. On the other hand we don't see anything in front of our eyes besides for the Siddur. So how can we tap into the avoda?

According to Rav Chaim Volozin it would seem that Tefilla is ultimately the avoda of the Neshama. All our preparations that we have to tefilla is to disconnect our body from our Neshama. It's similar to a concept called "aliyas haneshama".

They say a story that there once was a question in Halacha that applied to Pikuach nefesh and the Chazon Ish zt"l was in middle of Shemonei Esrei. At first they tried waving in front of his face, but to no avail. See-

ing no choice they started shaking him and it took a while until they were able to get the Chazon Ish away from Hashem [so to speak].

How do we understand this? Tefilla is a time of intimacy and connection that the Neshama can have with its loving and caring father Hashem. This can only happen when there is a disconnection from this world. [The Arizal says that when he sleeps he learns things that if he would be awake for a thousand years he would not be able to grasp].

However, the Kohanim although they were busy with physical actions like slaughtering, salting, and even eating. they were able to do it purely for Hashem. For the rest of us our Tefilla involves almost totally our Neshama.

So how can we be mechazek our avoda to disconnect from our body so we will connect to our Avoda?

Step 1 - Physical preparation - We will prepare ourselves as much as we can. If someone can go to the Mikva that's wonderful. Taking care of our bodily needs is very important, so that our Neshama can soar toward the Kodesh Hakadashim.

Obviously, guarding our eyes, our tongue and our ears are part of insuring that we are able to soar as the Chafetz Chaim elaborates greatly. When the Orchos Chaim of the Rosh discusses kavonah in davening, he adds a seemingly unconnected line - "אינין מכל דבר שאינו שלו. The me-

forshim explain that the Rosh is teaching us that the way to successfully focus on davening is by guarding our eyes throughout the rest of the day!

Step 2 - Mental preparation - Aside from physical preparation, there is the the preparation for our mindset as well. If you go to the Mikva, picture yourself as the Kohen going to the Mikva before he enters the Bais Hamikdash. When you wash your hands picture yourself washing your hands from the kiyor. After all, these days you are the Kohen.

When we say the Brachos we should picture ourselves walking up the fifteen steps. When we finally get to Shemone Esrai we should be ready to enter the Kodesh Kadashim.

Applying these steps, besides for the great benefit in connecting ourselves to Tefilla, this will also stimulate our yearning for the return of the Bais Hamikdash - because the Bais Hamikdash will become more tangible to us. We will yearn to once again experience Hashem's open love to His people.

We beseech Hashem "Vehosheiv Hoavoda l'dvir beisecha". Return the avoda to the Bais Hamikdash once again. Visechezenu eineineinu bishuvcha letzion birachamim Amein.

Living With Appreciation

After Klal Yisrael sinned by complaining about the manna, there was a very serious plague of snakes. Baruch Hashem, they realized they were in the wrong and desired to do teshuvah. Hashem instructed Moshe to place a copper snake on a pole: those who looked upwards at it would be healed. Chazal (Rosh Hashanah 29a) ask "does a snake cause death or life? Rather, when they looked up and directed their hearts to Hashem, they realized that everything is from Him and they were saved."

Really their yeshuah came from Hashem, our loving caring Father, Who only wants our best. He wants us to be aware that everything is from Him. This is why looking upwards helped cure them from the plague. This idea also applies to our own lives. For example, the Seder Hayom teaches that it is very important to recite the berachah of asher yatzar carefully and with intent, feeling the tremendous kindness of Hashem for the incredible wonders of the human body. Those who do so will be guaranteed always to be healthy!! When we turn to

Hashem, recognizing that our health is solely from Him, there is a guarantee that we will never have any health problems!!!

Rabbi Shimshon Pincus related that he was told by a medical professor who was familiar with most types of illnesses and diseases, how amazed he was that the average person on the street is healthy since there is so much which can go wrong! The fact that we are healthy is solely due to Hashem's great rachamim and love: there is no other explanation. Every second there are countless processes which occur in our body, ensuring that we are healthy.

For example, our heart beats, our liver cleans out our blood; our lungs enable us to breathe, our eyes see, and this information is sent to the brain to be stored, allowing us to remember. These are just a few examples, of the constant miracles which allow us to stay healthy.

The berachah of asher yatzar is an important way we can express our hakaras hatov for these wonders. Many have seen incredible salvations by resolving to say this berachah

with kavanah.

A young girl was diagnosed with severe digestive problems. Things looked very grim, and the doctors told her parents that she would have to undergo a series of complex surgeries. The surgeries could not be done in their home country of Eretz Yisrael; they had to fly to America.

Her parents, understandably, were anxious with this challenging predicament and sought something as a zechus to help their daughter.

Her father suggested the family take on to say asher yatzar from a siddur with kavanah. They also asked their close friends to do this.

Suggestions for the case of the Rav who rebukes a teenager publicly in Shul.

- 1. The Rabbi realized that if he didn't nip it in the bud right from the start, the teenager and many like him would become talkers. The Rav knew he was being harsh, but he also knew that Simcha, the teen and everyone around them would remember this scolding and that it would prevent them from talking unnecessarily in shul for a long, long time!
- 2. It's possible that the Rav was very excited about this shiur. He had spent a long time preparing for it, had a great message to convey, and was anxious to share it with the community. The Rav may have been a bit too wound up in it and forgot to treat the teen and his congregants with proper respect but if we take a step back and think about why the Rav was so out of

character in his rebuke, we may come to appreciate him more because we will recognize that he is only human just like us. Maybe the experience will help us to control our impulse to react and to use our words and emotions in a more positive way.

- 3. It was a useful experience, as he learned how NOT to handle a disruptive talker.
- 4. He learned just how important respect for Torah and its progenitors is.
- 5. The boy who got berated has a unique opportunity to work on being mekabel the embarrassment and he may grow exponentially from this experience! He also could ask for a yeshua in some area that he is in need of.

After a pleasant conversation, Naomi got up to go. It was then that she realized that she had sat down


on a wad of bubble gum which someone negligently left on the bench. Now her skirt was ruined. She was beside herself.

What Do the Words Mean?

Several years ago, when I was in the process of writing my *sefer* about *tefillah* ("Heavenwords") I had the *zechus* to speak to the Mashgiach, Rav Mattisyahu Salomon *shlit"a*, may Hashem send him a speedy *refuah sheleima*. I asked him what is the best thing a person can do to connect to davening. He was very weak, but he whispered, "He should learn what the words mean. If you don't understand what you are saying, how can you connect to it?" That being said, I would like to explain the words of this powerful *beracha*. If we bear in mind some of these ideas when we say Asher Yatzar, it will help us say it with more feeling!

Birchas Asher Yatzar - Part I

- 1) Introduction: The Aruch Hashulchan (O.C. 6:1) asks why is it that most *berachos*, such as "*mezonos*" are short and to the point, while Asher Yatzar is quite long and doesn't even mention using the facilities? He answers that it would not be respectful to say it outright, so we discuss the fabulous creation of the human body and how it functions. We thus allude to the wonders of this process in a modest way.
- "אשר <u>יצר</u> את האדם בחכמה <u>וברא</u> בו נקבים נקבים, חלולים חלולים" (2

"Who fashioned man with Wisdom and created within him many openings and cavities"

Why do we use two different words: "yatzar - fashioned" and "bara - created"? The Sifsei Chaim explains based on the words of the Gra that "yetzirah" means forming existing matter into a shape such as "forming" wood into a table. "Briah" is when you create something by taking something else away. For example — we say "borei choshech"- Hashem creates darkness by taking away the light. Here also, we are not focusing on the creation of limbs but rather on the various hollow spaces and open areas which contain the food during the long digestion process.

Perhaps we can give a deeper explanation. The *seforim* say we use these words in order to mention the four spiritual worlds that make up the universe which are *Asiyah* (*mafli <u>la'asos</u>*), *Yetzirah* (*asher <u>yatzar</u>), <i>Beriah* (*u'bara bo*), and *Atzilus* (*"lifnei kisei kevodecha - before Your Throne of Glory"*). We can suggest that this teaches us that on the one hand, Hashem is so holy and sublime that His glory fills the entire world, and is in a totally different spiritual sphere. But on the other hand, He is involved in everything – even the lowly function of expelling wastes, because Hashem is the source of every aspect of our lives.

If we bear this in mind, this beracha can infuse us with extreme joy. The Master of the entire Universe, who is so great and *kadosh*, is interested, involved, and watches over every single part of my body and life!

נקדש את שמך!

One of the primary ways that the Jewish people create kiddush Hashem is by revealing Hashem's hashgachah to the rest of the world. We bring honor to Hashem when we tear away the veil that conceals His Presence, exposing His guiding Hand behind every event. This becomes possible when we follow Hashem's Will and faithfully observe His commandments; when we do that, Hashem reveals himself through us, and that demonstrates His absolute dominion over the world.

In his book Inside Their Homes, Rabbi Nachman Seltzer tells the story of a child who was born at Maayanei HaYeshuah Hospital in Bnei Brak and became gravely ill. The child's condition deteriorated to the point that the doctors were certain he would not survive, but fortunately, he did recover. When the grateful parents were finally able to take their baby home, they made sure to thank the hospital staff for their devotion to the child's care. The head of the department, an irreligious woman, had an interesting response.

"There is no medical explanation for the fact that your child survived," she told the parents. "It is clearly a miracle; however, I can explain why it happened. When this hospital was first founded, the Steipler Gaon gave a berachah to its founder, the tzaddik, Dr. Rothschild, that no baby should ever die in the maternity ward. To this day, thousands of children have been born in this hospital, and the Steipler's blessing has come true: Not a single baby has died in the maternity ward here." Because the Steipler Gaon was a devoted servant of Hashem, he had the power to give a berachah that would come true, revealing even to an irreligious doctor that Hashem controls the events of His world.

In a similar vein, Rav Chaim of Volozhin (in Ruach Chaim, his commentary on Pirkei Avos) explains that

an aveirah committed in private can create a chillul Hashem because it makes the sinner unworthy of being the vehicle for a display of Hashem's hashgachah. Therefore, even if a person commits a sin in a place where no one else can witness it, it can still add to the concealment of Hashem's Presence. When a person contaminates himself with sin, he causes Hashem to remove His hashgachah from the world and thus make His Presence less apparent. This is the very definition of a chillul Hashem, a term derived from the word "challal" (void); a chillul Hashem is the void created by the absence of Hashem's Providence.

This leads to a simple equation: Every mitzvah that we perform leads to a further revelation of Hashem's hashgachah, giving rise to a kiddush Hashem. Similarly, every aveirah adds to the concealment of the Divine Presence, causing a chillul Hashem. Tzaddikim have the power to create change in the world through their berachos and tefillos, since the power of their berachos demonstrates that Hashem controls the world and responds to those who serve Him. Every mitzvah we perform is therefore an act of kiddush Hashem, since it creates a greater opportunity for Hashem to demonstrate hashgachah and to drive away the darkness that hides His Presence







A Meaningful "QUOTE" BASED ON the Sefer Chovos Halevavos "SHAAR HABITACHAN"

The Quote: "The counterfeiter is always looking for big jobs and works very hard! He sometimes is even willing to be in danger of death for his livelihood, whereas, the בעל בטחון can find a way to support himself easily and without putting himself in any danger. Furthermore, the counterfeiter is always nervous and careful to hide his business tactics in order that no one "ח"ו" learn his secret tactics and overstep him, whereas the בעל הבטחון the opposite is true. He prides himself in the fact that he only trusts in Hashem and that he doesn't have any of the above concerns."

The Lesson: WHAT MAKES THIS quote so amazing is that the Chovos Halevavos is teaching us that if one relies that **Hashem** is the One giving him his parnassa he does not have to endanger himself to earn his livelihood ever, because he knows that Hashem can support him without danger! Secondly, one who believes that Hashem is supporting him, is never nervous that someone may steal his business ideas etc etc! "No one can steal a penny from me! Hashem is my "Boss" giving me my paycheck and no one can take an iota from my parnassa!" It's so calming when Hashem is the one supporting me!

THE STORY: THERE WAS AN ISRAELI JEW who became a successful doctor in a non-Jewish medical center in



England. He slowly gained a high reputation and was very trusted. One day, he decided that the time had come for him to open his own office. "Why work under someone else?" he thought. As soon as the center found out about his plans, a major uproar occurred. They told him there was no way that they were going to allow him to do that. Major court cases were being scheduled and it was a very sticky situation. It turned out, that for some reason each party was afraid of the other. During this whole situation, the Israeli doctor met up with a friend of his from Eretz Yisroel, and after revealing the current events to his friend, he told him the following; "I suggest that you travel to Eretz Yisroel and seek

Perhaps, because we have mountains upon mountains of toiling that is taking place before we walk into the Beis Medrash. There so many things that pull us in all directions but day after day we turn away from them. We say, "No" to them again and again. Even when we don't have cheshek to learn!


He was a Masmid and all the Rebbeim were praising him. He was the best in the class.

Bitachon Perspective

Q. There is someone who I was very jealous of, and it seems like I gave them an ayin harah, and something terrible happened to them. Now, I'm eating myself with guilt?

A. The concept of Hashem being perfect means, that whatever happens, is because Hashem wanted it to happen. A person's bechirah is only in his mind and it can't affect another person whatsoever. Even when it seems like you caused something to happen, the truth is, it really would've happened anyway. Therefore, there is no room for feeling guilty over what 'you caused'.

If you feel that you shouldn't have been jealous, you can do teshuva and do exercises not to be jealous in the future. For example, tell yourself that what's good for your friend is poisonous for you. Do you feel bad that you don't have poison?!

Q. I accidentally caused a chilul Hashem, and I feel terrible. What's the message that Hashem is trying to tell me?

A. In Nevardok, whenever they did something wrong, they would say, 'I'm going to turn it into a business. I'll use my mistake as an opportunity to grow even more in avodas Hashem'.

For example, they would say, 'I made a mistake because I'm a

human being, and humans are intrinsically imperfect. I will utilize this mistake to deeper my awareness that only Hashem is perfect and not people'.

In your case as well, Hashem's message is, 'I want to see that you won't fall apart from your mistake, rather you'll use it as an opportunity to grow'. Tell yourself, 'Now that I see how much chilul Hashem bothers me, I will make an extra effort to make a kiddush Hashem by showing how friendly and considerate frum people are'.

Q. Last week, when I baked challah, I forgot to be mafrish challah, and my whole family ate from it. When I realized my mistake, I felt so guilty that I was machshil my family to eat from dough that challah wasn't taken off. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. How did it happen that you forgot to take off challah? Because you're a human being and not a malach. Thank Hashem for making you a being human and not a malach! malachim don't make mistakes, but they can't grow either. Human beings who are able to fall have the ability to grow. And people are able to reach even higher than malachim. Hashem created the world for people, not malachim.

Next, remember, Hashem

doesn't demand results; He wants to see that we're trying. Do an exercise to remind yourself to take off challah whenever you bake, like hanging a reminder on your refrigerator. This will demonstrate how important the mitzva of challah is to you. And this is what gives Hashem the greatest nachas ruach

Finally, turn your mistake into a business. From now on, taking off challah won't be done by rote, rather with an extra element of zehirus. Now, because of your mistake you'll come out ahead!

Q. I am a teacher, and there is one student in the class that everyone is picking on. I tried all different methods to prevent it; talking about the importance of acting nice, positive encouragement, punishments, but nothing is helping the situation.

As a result, I feel that I'm failing my responsibility as a teacher to care for the welfare of the students. What's the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. The definition of being successful is: successfully doing what is in your control to help your students. However, what the outcome will be is completely Hakadosh Baruch Hu's department.

is What there left for you to do? Add bitachon to your efforts in helping your students!

Each day before you go to school, say, 'Hakadosh Baruch Hu, I will do my hishtadlus to help my students. But it's You who's is control of all outcomes.'

Once you know that you are succeeding in your responsibility as a teacher, you won't feel bad when you don't see results, because you know that all results are from Hashem. And you can be sure that Hashem is doing a perfect job.

In addition, Hashem's policy is that when a person acknowledges that results are from Hashem, he will see unbelievable sivata dishmava in his hishtadlus as well.

Q. I am a ba'al teshuva. Recently, I was interviewed in front of a large audience about what inspired me to become a ba'al teshuva and which lessons I would like to share.

One of the questions I was asked was, "what motivates you to continue in your growth?".

At the moment, I wasn't able to come up with anything too inspiring and I gave a rather dry response. Looking back, I realize that there was really a powerful message I could have said that would have made a big impact on the listeners. Now I'm so upset at myself that I wasted such a valuable opportunity. The whole interview feels like a flop. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. The reason you feel crushed is because you think, 'I had a koach to influence people, and now that I didn't utilize the opportunity, those people are not going to be as inspired as they could have been'.

However, when a person truly lives with emunah and bitachon, he understands that when he sets out to inspire people it's not his efforts which brings about the outcome. The results are going to be the way Hashem wants things to turn out.

Hashem is perfect and He's running a perfect world. Hashem will see to it that they receive the inspiration in the way He sees fit.

Therefore, there is no such thing as going out and 'flopping'. Your job is merely to do the hishtadlus of going out and do your best to help people as best as you can.

If you want the audience to receive the positive influence you wished to have given, say: "Hakadosh Baruch Hu. I want-

ed to inspire the audience but you did not decree that the right words should come out. You have many ways of inspiring people. Hashem, give them the boost they need to become inspired".

Q. When something goes wrong, should I think that it's a punishment for my aveiros and do a cheshbon hanefesh, or should I say, "It's not a punishment; it's actually good because it came from my loving and caring father, Hakadosh Baruch hu and everything He does is perfect?"

A. Do what works for you. If making a cheshbon hanefesh will make you improve, and help you create a healthier relationship with Hashem, by all means. But for some people, constantly blaming themselves weakens their self-image. In that case, Hashem does not want you to be blaming yourself. In that case, you should know and realize that what happened was really for your good.
