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





Listen to every dispute among your brothers and judge righteously (Shemoa ben achichem u'shefatitem tzedek)

Even as a child, R' Yonason Eybeshutz was recognized for his brilliance. When he reached the age of 13 and became a Bar Mitzvah, he was approached by one of the finest scholars in his town asked him, "Please tell me: it is well known that a child possesses a Yetzer Hara from the day he enters the world, but that he does not obtain a yetzer tov until he turns 13. That being the case, how were you able to surmount your Yetzer Harah all these years?'

Answered the young R' Eybeshutz, "Listen

(to every dispute) among your brothers and judge righteously!

From this, Chazal (Sanhedrin 7B) derive that a judge may not listen to the testimony of one of the litigants before the other one has arrived.

I simply acted according to to the words of Chazal" responded Rav Eybeschutz. "Whenever my Yetzer Hara would begin to state his claims before me, I would tell him, "wait until the second litigant, the Yetzer Tov arrives. Only after you have both presented your claims will I decide which one is correct!"

SIXTY SECONDS OF INSPIRATION

A human being is comprised of of the working system. approximately sixty billion coop-

erative cells, and each cell knows exactly where it belongs and what it should be doing. This one is part of the pituitary gland, and that one is a red blood cell. Another one is a white blood cell, and another one is a brain cell.



Now, I have a hard enough time reconciling my checkbook! And here this is all happening without us even needing to be conscious of it.

It begs the rhetorical question that Dovid HaMelech asks: Mah ash-

iv LaShem, kol tagmulohi alai, how can I repay HaShem for all that He is doing for me?

Gut Shabbos!

While each one is performing its individual task, within those cells is six billion bits of information— that's quite a large library that describes the entirety



Our teeth exert a lot of pressure; our molars can create up to 200 pound of pressure per square inch. This is important to enable us to chew and crush a large variety of hard foods.

We use this powerful ability constantly, many times a day. This necessitates that our teeth are strong and durable so they can endure this pressure without getting damaged. This has to last a very long time, a life time! Most of the items we use on a constant basis get worn out or broken after a number of years.

For example, our glasses, watches, chairs or furniture are not around 50 years later. Our teeth, if cared for properly, can last for a lifetime.

The reason they last so long is that Hashem, in His kindness, made our teeth the hardest substance in the human body. Our teeth are made out of two layers, there is the internal layer, which is like bone, which is not extra strong, and there is the exterior layer, which is made out of enamel — it's this outer layer which is super strong because that's where the contact and the pressure is taking place.

The enamel, the outer layer of our teeth, is as hard as steel. Hashem, knowing the constant strong pressure that teeth undergo, made them the strongest material in the body. There is no other place in the body that has to stand up to such pressure.

In order for our teeth to serve us consistently and powerfully – it is not enough that they are made from extremely strong material, which is as strong as steel.

As strong as the material of the teeth is, it can only do it's demanding job, if it's very firmly connected to the jaw. Because if the connection is loose, the tooth, with its super strong material, might just end up inside an apple. Hashem created our teeth firmly connected to the jaw bone. The jaw bone has holes that the teeth go into, like a socket. They are also attached by many strong ligaments and by the gums. Our teeth are much larger than we think, only the bottom part is visible to us; the rest is covered over by gums and jaw bones.

This is like a building that gets its strength and stability from the deep foundation which is hidden underground. Two thirds of the tooth is covered and hidden, only the remaining 1/3 protrudes outside.

A building is as strong as the foundation, so too our teeth are so strong because of the large hidden foundation that keeps it firmly connected to the jaw. This can be seen and felt particularly by our canine teeth, which are the first and sixth of our cutting teeth in the front of our mouth. There is a large protrusion in our gums from the hidden part of our teeth. It is quite visible – check it out.

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I hope that at this point when you are reading this article, we will already have the ultimate Nechama with the Bais hamikdash. But if Chas Veshalom for some reason Moshiach hasn't arrived, then we will need al

ot of Chizzuk and a great Nechama.

I once heard an amazing thought. When a person loses a loved one r"l he needs seven days of Nechama, but on the Bais Hamikdash we need at least seven weeks of Nechama. This is the concept of "Shiva d'nechemta."

As we approach Shabbos Nachamu, many of us are anticipating a joyous Shabbos. Many people celebrate Motzei Shabbos with live music and dancing. This needs clarification. What is all the excitement about? The Bais Hamikdash has not returned yet.

Furthermore, why is this Shabbos called Shabbos Nachamu? What is the significance of this? Also, why does Hashem say twice the comforting words "Nachamu Nachamu Ami?"

Let's explore.

We will offer two explanations. We know that just like the Bais Hamikdash was the holiest place of the world, Shabbos is the holiest time of the week.

The Seforim teach us [Nesivos Shalom and others] that although the Bais Ha-



mikdash affected the world tremendously, it did not affect Shabbos.

Similarly, the Chafetz Chaim famously writes that the day of Shabbos was not included in the klala of the Eitz Hadaas [which is interesting because the klala for the man was to work hard and on Shabbos we don't work, we rest].

On Tisha B'av (and throughout the three weeks) we are stating that we miss the Bais Hamikdash terribly and we cannot manage without it- "Ki Hi Bais Chayeinu." For it was the source of our life.

However, afterwards when the Shabbos Kallah arrives, we are consoled with the fact that we still have the Shabbos that is untouched, which enables us [if we really work hard] to connect to Hashem like the Bais Hamikdash did.

On one hand we are in pain with what we lost but we are showing our Hakaras Jatov to Hashem for this wonderful gift that gives us consolation. Perhaps that's why it got the name Shabbos Nachamu. Therefore, this Shabbos is extra joyous, and Motzei Shabbos we celebrate with music and dancing, because Shabbos is what held us strong in Galus.

Having said that we can imply that the general Avoda of the weeks of

Nechama is to focus on all the goodness that Hashem has bestowed upon us despite our tremendous lack that we have in all areas. We recognize that although we have sinned and we find ourself in Galus due to our many Aveiros, Hashem is still showing us His love by bestowing us with so much goodness. We need to thank Hashem nonstop for all of this.

There is a story that Reb Avigdor Miller Zt"l lost a grandchild while traveling to Eretz Yisroel. It's said that he gave a Shiur that night as usual. When he was asked how can he be so strong? He replied that he lives his life drowning in all the Chessed Hashem. Therefore, he doesn't have room for any pain or sadness. This is our goal these days. To outshine the darkness with the goodness.

Second explanation: Let's start with a Mashal to bring out the concept (based on the Midrash). There was once a king that had a son who rebelled against his father. The king found out about it and he banished him from the palace. How-

ever, before he sent him away, he told him the following. "You should know that I really love you with all my heart, and although I am sending you away, I really want you back in the palace. Therefore, there will come

a day that I will come and take you back to me. Additionally, if I see that your behavior has improved greatly, then I will take you back as well."

As the prince left the palace in disgrace he was weeping. However, as the soldiers were accompanying him out of the city he started singing. The soldiers looked at him with pity, thinking that perhaps he had lost his sanity. He explained to them, that while obviously this is a tragedy beyond words, but it suddenly dawned on him how lucky he is. The king could have banished him from the kingdom forever, never to return. Not only did the king say that he will return one day, but he put the ability to return in his hands, and that's if he improves himself.

The Nimshal is clear. Chazal tell us that when when we exited the Bais Hamikdash the Keruvim were hugging each other. This is Hashem telling His children "I love you very much." Hashem told us in Parshas Nitzavim "Veshavta ad Hashem Elokecha,"



that when we do Teshuva then He will return us to our land.

There is a famous story that Reb Yehoshua ben Levi met Eliyahu Hanavi and asked him "when is Moshiach coming? He responded "Hayom." Afterwards he clarified himself with the Passuk in Tehillim "Hayom im bikoli tishmau." If we listen to Hashem then Moshiach is on his way.

So we see from all this that the Geula is in our hands, and like in the Mashal this in itself is a reason to celebrate with song and dance.

Furthermore, Chazal say that Kol Hamisabel al Bais Hamikdash.... If we mourn over the Bais Hamikdash we will merit to expert to see and experience the joy when it will be rebuilt. As the Chofetz Chaim elaborated that waiting for the Bais hamikdash brings Moshiach.

Furthermore, the Chassam Sofer and the Nesivos Shalom say that yearning for the Bais hamikdash is how we build the Bais Hamikdash.

The Chassam Sofar takes this so literal that he says that the reason why we can't mourn over the Bais Hamikdash on Shabbos is because building is prohibited on Shabbos.

Additionally, we know that Shabbos has the power to bring us back to

Hashem Therefore, Shabbos is our Nechama as well, to bring us back. This can be another reason for its name of Shabbos Nachamu, because Shabbos gives us renewed hope for redemption.

Based on all this it's beautiful why the Navi says twice, because נחמו נחמו we are dealing with two Nechamos, 1. Our Nechama that we look at what we still have, as we have explained. 2. Even when we look at what we lost, which is a tremendous loss bevond, we are still comforted knowing that we will get it back and it is in our hands as we explained. That is the double Nechama, and now you can sing and dance.

So through utilizing these weeks properly, appreciating all the good that we do have, and at the same time we yearn for the better days to come back as we are working on tzipisa l'yeshua. Then hopefully we will once again find ourselves in the arms of Hashem in the Bais Hamikdash together with the Tzaddikim Amen. Have a meaning and Joyous Shabbos Nachamu!

Living With Apprechation By: R' Daniel Shasha

Parashas Vaechanan opens with Moshe's fervent prayers to be given the great privilege to enter Eretz Yisrael. This was his heartfelt dream and he davened to Hashem for this opportunity with all his strength. The Ba'al Haturim notes that the word va'eschanan, "I entreated" is the gematria of 515, the same gematria as the word shirah, song. This is based on a teaching of Chazal (Sifri) that Moshe sung shirah to help have his tefillos answered.

How does singing shirah help have our tefilos answered?

Rashi (Berachos, 4b) explains that a person should first draw himself close to Hashem with praise; then when Hashem is close since we praised Him, we should daven. Praising Hashem brings us close to Him, so then it is the perfect opportunity to daven. We see that Chazal used this idea when formulating the nusach of our tefilos, since the first three berachos of the Shemoneh Esrei consist of praises to Hashem; only after do we ask for our personal requests.

For this reason, explains the Seder Hayom, Chazal instituted that we recite so many requests in the Sim Shalom beracha, at the end of the Shemoneh Esrei. Since it immediately follows the blessing of modim, in which we express our gratitude to Hashem, the gates of blessing have thus been opened, and we are therefore in a position to ask for many requests. This is despite the fact that the last three berachos are not designated for requests.

We can now understand why Moshe first sung shirah to Hashem, since this is for sure the most effective way to have our tefilos answered! Our Rabbi's teach that it wasn't Hashem's ratzon for him to enter Eretz Yisrael so He told him to stop davening. Otherwise his prayers would have been successful.

Whenever we are in a time of crisis, thanking Hashem first is always the perfect way to entreat Him to bring us close to Him. we can than daven for whatever we need.

Rav Yitzchok Dovid Grossman, grandfather of the renowned chief Rabbi of Migdal Ha'amek, was once returning from a trip from Poland, back to Eretz Yisrael. Unfortunately, the small ship he was travelling on collided with a big ship. The hostile crew decided it was only possible to save certain passengers by placing them on the big ship, and only wanted to save the non-Jewish passengers. The Jewish passengers, they figured, would be left on the small ship, which would shortly capsize.

All the members were petrified, except for Rabbi Grossman, who opened his siddur, and, since the event occurred at the advent of Shabbos, began to recite Kabbalas Shabbos with tremendous serenity and passion.

He subsequently got up to dance out of gratitude to Hashem for all the goodness He had performed for Him and for all that He does. Fueled by gratitude, he danced with remarkable

enthusiasm, despite, their precarious situation. By no means short of a miracle, their little boat did not capsize, and sailed to safety to the shores of Eretz Yisrael. However, the bigger ship wasn't as fortunate and it capsized. (Living legend, p.222)

As a Rebbi for a class of 25 boys, I continuously rotate students to their long-awaited chance to do various designated chores in the classroom.

One melamed I know has a whole list of rotating job positions.

He had: The Gabai, The Big Shot, The Small Shot, The Chazzan, The Rav, The President, The Monitor, The Shomrim... and some more...

As you can see by those names, that the Rebbe had a great sense of humor.

I have only: a Chazzan, two Copy Boys and a Stand by the Rebbe Boy when we review the homework in class.

Approximately once a month, I give each child the long awaited chance to be the 'Chazan of the class' for the Teffilos of the day.

Every child has his own unique way of doing the Chazanus.

There's a special Chazzan

character that only a few children possess at such a young age.

When that child sings 'Shira', the davening sing-song, with his sweet warm passionate voice, sends an instantaneous electrifying effect spiritually uplifting the class to daven nicer.

They in turn give the chazzan the energy and confidence to emotionally open up to add even more expression.

This ongoing 'give-and-take cycles' can go on for some time and all the while there's a gaining of more and more energy on both sides and it turns into a storm of emotions.

My feelings are sweetly swept along with them and I get caught up in a rapture with the children's pure words of davening!

I would love to give these children the best I can give them. I wish I could give them the world!

I, being human, stay stuck with that feeling...

I'm very limited in my ability to even partially reward them.

It all narrows down to a certain amount of nosh, tickets, prizes and awards etc.

I tell them, "Hashem will be the One who will give you your full s'char".

The children in class remember very well "those chazzanim" and when it's their chance to be Chazan, the boys immediately get excited about the upcoming davening.

By the way, they all know the class rotation list by heart!

It's exciting to see them get excited over a geshmake davening.

They love the way that type of davening feels. It's like 'they are touching the heaven'!

I had the zechus this year of having a wonderful pure-hearted talmid in my class.

He possessed a heilige emotion in his davening.

I was blown away by this child's 'heart full of emotions' when he davened.

It was the first time I can remember coming across this kind of Neshama in my 27 years of teaching.

He would sometimes literally cover his eyes when he was saying the words והאר עינינו and he would let his tears flow.

I would likewise get emotional along with him.

I'm even brought to tears remembering and reliving those heartfelt teffilos as I'm writing these lines.

Let's go together across the world away from these little Yiddishe angels to the Malachim.

My classroom davening is a משל to the angels praising Hashem and to the praise that comes forth from the Yidden.

Each respective group energizes the other.

Klal Yisrael gets to say שירה first.

We are the ones who start the cycle of the exciting exchange of energy for praising Hashem.

With the heilige words of our Shira, new praising angels are created and those מלאכים then say Shira.

They in turn become מלאכי, the amazing messengers to give us the power to sing and praise Hashem.

The cycling then turns the praise of Hashem to higher levels and heights resulting in a powerful way of storming the heavens with such an attachment... "dveikus"!!

V'atem Hadeveikim Bashem Eloikeichem Chaim Kulchem Hayom!

It results in a tremendous abundance of shefa tov pouring down to us from above as a result of being connected to "The Koil Yachoil".

The greatest רצון of Hashem is to be משפיע to us all the good things that we can possibly receive from Him in this world.

The rest of that shefa we cannot receive in this world. Oilum Hazeh is limited in its

ability to provide the highest quality of goods, the amount the Yidden are apportioned to receive from Hashem.

Since the חטא עץ הדעת, our bodies are not capable of receiving more than a very limited amount of schar. (דרך השם)

Hashem will be giving it to us in the future.

We will be able to receive much more when we reach the holding place of the souls the עולם הנשמות which we also refer to as the גן עדן.

However, there is a guaranteed "other-worldly never-ending" amount of שכר טוב that will be given to us in the "future world" also known as עולם הבא.

No one has ever set his eyes on the שכר of the "coming world" - עולם הבא.

Like the Posuk states clearly "No eye has seen that schar only Elokim"

Every parent yearns and desires to have a direct and personal connection with each of their children. The hardest encounter for a parent is the separation or the distancing of a child.

This surprised the Vilna Ga'on. "Why are you crying?" asked the Vilna Ga'on. You are going to fulfill the greatest mitzvah! You should be full of joy that you're privileged to do this great mitzvah. Not many people are privileged to do this, so why are you down?"

"I am not disappointed regarding the mitzvah that's facing me," responded R' Avraham. "I'm actually overly excited.

What's disturbing me is, that I wasn't given a Yiddishe family. I wasn't gifted with parents that observed Torah and mitzvas, nor do I have brothers that kept the mitzvas. And, last but not least, I don't have any descendants that will continue this tradition."

with Hashem. (Likkutei Av Haggadah, p. 423)

This incredible story teaches us the correct mindset of the significance of the connection with Hashem.

Whatever type of connection one seeks to have with Hashem a person can form. One who is lacking a son can have compensation with forming a connection with Hashem, which will fill that void. The love is so great that it can fill any gap.

Another point worthy of mention is, that Hashem yearns a connection with each of us. Although at times we may seek a brachah from a tzaddik, this shouldn't diminish the direct connection that we have with Hashem. This point was strongly encouraged by the Tolna Rebbe.

The Tolna Rebbe was privileged that many of his Chasidim had great brachah in their lives. His Chasidim were very rich... On the other hand, a neighboring chashuva Rebbe wasn't granted with this.

The Tolna Rebbe's Chasidim asked him, why he was merited in this manner, while the other Rebbe wasn't? The other Rebbe is also very great, so what is the underlining difference?

"The other Rebbe," replied the Tolna Rebbe, "gives a significant amount of time to each Chasid. And therefore, after leaving they feel that the Rebbe took care of the problem. This causes them not to daven with their whole heart."

"I, on the other hand, don't give them much time. I want that each of my Chasidim should personally turn to Hashem, and through that merit his yeshuah. This is the reason that I don't give them much time, and as a result they are granted enormous and immense success."

We see an important lesson from here. Whatever we do to grant a yeshuah it shouldn't be at the expense of the relationship with Hashem. Hashem yearns for a relationship with every individual.

When we turn to Hashem with such a mindset we are granted endless brachah, since Hashem give precedence to tefillos of such a person.

This story teaches us the power that each individual has. Every individual has a personal and a direct line that he can access and talk directly to Hashem!

We must always remember that Hashem is very close to us, and seeks a connection with each of us.

The Nedvarno Maggid was listening to the conversation that was taking place between two people at a simcha.

He heard one person confess-

ing that his davening was not worth much. "Hashem doesn't value my tefillos. Additionally, he doesn't think that they value his davening in shamayim?"

Hearing this, the Maggid voiced that he doesn't want any connection with this individual, and that he should no longer be allowed to come seek his advice.

Upon hearing this, the student was very distressed. He tried to appease the Maggid, but he held his own.

Finally, after numerous weeks, the Maggid agreed to meet the student once again.

At the meeting, the Maggid began as follows: "The reason for my disappointment was because you were missing the very fundamental basic concept in Yiddishkeit. I didn't want any connection with someone who is lacking the very basics.

You may not understand the great power that tefillah has in Shamayim, but you must know that Hashem seeks a relationship with you. Missing this is missing the very essence of serving Hashem.


In addition, when you daven you are holding a power that the great Sages put into davening. It's not the power that you put in. You're using the power that Chazal put into it." Q: If it's ossur to think divrei Torah in the bathroom, then what should one think about?

A: What should we think about in the bathroom? You should think about what a chesed it is that you're able to go to the bathroom normally. You should think about it. *Chasdei* Hashem! Yes, you should spend time thinking about that. It's a tremendous chesed.

Rofei Chol Basar U'maflee La'asos. Maflee la'asos means that it's a miracle. It's miracles upon miracles. Now, some of the *kadmonim* didn't always understand this, so there are all kinds of *peirushim* on those words. But today we know that it's simply miracles and miracles. I'd like to explain a little more about how miraculous it really is but it would take too much time. But it's a miracle. You're able to expel the waste; and you should be filled with happiness that Hakodosh Boruch Hu is doing this miracle for you. Put thought into that.

And then, when you get out of the bathroom and make the berachah of Asher Yatzar make sure to put all those thoughts that you had in the bathroom into the berachah.

The halacha is that an onen is exempt from mitzvos, and therefore doesn't recite berachos. During the levaya, his grandson was quite surprised to see Rav Stein saying Asher Yatzar after using the facilities. "Zaidy," he said respectfully, "perhaps you forgot that you are an onen?" At first, the Rosh Yeshiva didn't want to answer. After his grandson repeatedly asked the question he finally answered: "No, I didn't forget," said Rav Stein. "I am so full of gratitude to Hashem, that even though I am 95 years old, my body is still functioning properly. I just had to say thank you! So I said Asher Yatzar, but not in the form of a beracha; I said it without the name of Hashem!"

woman at all, but one of their counselors, with his face painted blue and green. "Color war!" the counselor shouted, surprising and delighting the children.

The judge, the attorneys, and the police officers, all of whom were real, had graciously agreed to stage a mock trial for the boys as part of the color war breakout plan. "Order in the court!" the judge called, banging

his gavel, as he produced a new sheaf

of papers. The counselors had provided him with a short speech to read on the topic of sur mera and asei tov. Each of the color war teams was to represent one of the two concepts, and the campers were charged with learn-

ing about each of them and understanding the need for both. "It isn't enough to stay away from evil," the judge read aloud. "One must also contribute to goodness."

The police officers later complimented the counselors on the campers' excellent behavior during the mock trial, offering to repeat the performance in a future summer. But perhaps the most fascinating reaction was that of the judge himself. When

A week later, Rabbi Chaim Sher, the owner of the camp, received a surprising call from a non-Jewish woman. A man once approached Rabbi Zecharia Wallerstein ZT'L seeking tzedakah. He had once been a very well-to-do individual, but unfortunately, he had lost everything after a plunge in the stock and real estate markets. Now, he found himself in dire need, unable to pay his mortgage or provide sufficient food for his family.

However, before delving into his plea, he had something incredible to share with Rabbi Wallerstein. Curious and attentive, Rabbi Wallerstein encouraged him to continue, assuring him that he was all ears.

The man began his story by describing an annual occurrence that took place before Purim. Every year, a man with a large family would approach him, seeking financial assistance. It was a heartbreaking situation as the man's house had burned down, he had lost his job, and his wife and two children were sick. Touched by his hardships, the storyteller had made it a tradition to give him \$500 over the course of a decade to help him through the Purim and Pesach holidays.

However, just last week, the man returned once again, seeking his yearly support. This time, the storyteller found himself in a difficult position as he had nothing to give. He couldn't even provide for his own family's needs. Nevertheless, he couldn't bring himself to turn the man away empty-handed. With a heavy heart, he took out his checkbook, fully aware that his checking account was completely depleted. Despite the lack of funds, he wrote a check for \$100 and handed it to the man, unable to deny him any assistance. 





- nothing stands in the way of bitachon. Bitachon is so powerful and there is no limit to what Hashem can give you.

There's a known writ-

ing of the Chazzan Ish that bitachon merely means to accept your situation.

Rav Mandel says he personally heard from R' Shlomo Brevda z"I that this is a misunderstanding of the Chazon Ish - that of course bitachon can bring bracha and change things around. R' Chaim Kanievsky was also known to have said the same thing.

Rav Mandel also heard from the Mashgiach R' Nosson Wachtfogel that a person can have bitachon to get what he wants, meaning what is considered normally good for a person. Yes of course there is a time when a person should work on accepting his situation with simcha. However, ideally a person should aim for getting yeshuas through bitachon with an all positive approach but have the ability to change his bitachon gears and when in need to be mekabel his situation.

Rabbi Yosef Moshe Mizrachi

Hashem Created the world with such perfect balance! Every element in this world is perfectly suited for us!

Take air for example. A person can't survived more than a few minutes without it. For that reason Hashem filled up the world with so much of it! Water is less necessary as we can go for more than a day without drinking and therefore Hashem gave us lots of water but still less than air. Food is yet less urgent and so Hashem put less food in the world than air and precious stone's and metals are not vital to us and therefore Hashem made them in the smallest quantity! These are the words of the Chovot Halevavot in Sha'ar Habechina Perek Hei.

I once heard a nice addition how it also applies to prices. Since we need so much air, Hashem made it free to save us from going broke! Water, which we need less of than air but still quite a lot, Hashem made very inexpensive. He made food slightly more expensive. And precious rocks are very expensive since we have very little actual use for them!

WHAT MAKES The Lesson: THIS OUOTE INCREDIBLE and amazing is that one who has Bitachon has such a happy life and he constantly thanks Hashem for what he does have and he thanks Hashem for what he does **not** have. It's all the same! The Chovos Halevavos is teaching us that this is the secret to never be jealous of anyone else to understand and realize that our "pikadon" that Hashem gave us was tailor made for us and what the other person has is POISON

mamesh!

THE STORY: A VERY CHOSHUVEH REBBE FROM LAKEWOOD who we will call Rabbi Kober told me the following incredible story: "I had a 12 passenger van that I could have sold for money that I could have used! However, I had a neighbor who could not afford a van so I told him that he can have my van for free! Shocked and confused my neighbor accepted my offer. The issue was that I still needed a new van. I put in a bid to buy a new van. Hashem had other plans for me. Shortly after, a Rebbe came around the Yeshiva I teach in and announced that he is looking to give away his van since his generous shver bought him a brand new one. Learning the Parasha with Rav Yehuda Mandel Shlita



Look at the beautiful words of משה יציר מבחר האנושי: "My L-d משה 'You have begun to show - את עבדך - גדלך וידך. For which power can do what You can do? Please let me see the good land and good mountain etc."

Moshe is full of warmth and love and admiration for Hakdosh Baruch Hu. Look at the way he pleads and the way he appreciates Hakadosh Baruch Hu's" good" land and "good" mountain.

This is a great מוסר השכל how a person should daven. We should learn from Moshe how we should relate to Hakdash Baruch Hu. We can suggest BS"D at least B'derech Remez that for good reason Hakadash Baruch Hu had to tell Moshe: אל תוסף – דבר אלי. Who could say "no" to such a beautiful, loving, and humble תפלה?

ההר הטוב

Rashi says that this is ירושלים. Look at Moshe's Ayin Tova: He doesn't call it ירושלים - rather the 'good mountain'. He sees only goodness in Hakadash Baruch Hu's world. Eretz Yisroel is also called the "good" land by משה. All he sees is the goodness of Hakdosh Baruch Hu. Remember how when approaching אדום, he called himself and Klal Yisrael "אחיך". Although he's speaking to the worst רשעים he still speaks with love and warmth.

He also seems to trust these רשעים that they would do him a favor and allow Klal Yisrael to cross their land. This is strikingly similar to דוד who trusted שאול even after שאול tried to kill him three times and he still made a heartfelt הספד on his worst enemy. These are true leaders who see only good.

Perhaps this is why Hakadosh Baruch Hu allowed משה to see Eretz Yisrael just like an Ayin Hara can hurt and even kill (Chazal). The same an Ayin Tova i.e., a person who fargins and wants only good for others creates Bracha. טוב עין – הוא יברוך

This is how a ברכה works. When you want good for others it helps them.

רות had רות see his fields because she had an Ayin Tova (זוהר).

Slabadka Yeshiva had phenomenal success since they were so involved in Ayin Tova. (Rav Moshe Chadash). So, we can suggest BS'D this is one reason why Hakadosh Baruch Hu wanted Moshe to see Eretz Yisrael.

וחזקהו ואמצהו

Right after משה is told that he can't come to Eretz Yisrael, the land that meant so much to him, he is told that will go instead and he should be מחזק him.

Look how Hakdosh Baruch Hu views משה as the purest of the pure. Not only aren't you going but you'll be מחזק someone else who is doing the job that you wanted. No room for קנאה.

To the contrary, all משה really cares about is רצון ה. Just like he wanted to go to Eretz Yisrael because he felt it's מחזק for him to want Eretz Yisrael - the same רצון ה is to be מחזק his 'competitor'. Indeed, there are no 'competitors'. All he cares about is to make Hakadosh Haruch Hu happy and he has loads of שמחה in seeing someone else doing what he wanted to do.

Q. I suffer from anxiety, and throughout the day I walk around being nervous. How should I view my situation?

A. The first thing you should know is, when you label yourself as Mr. Nervous you actually worsen your condition. Rather, consider yourself to be a relaxed person, and you will see that you actually start feeling calmer.

Next, don't look at your condition as 'bad'. If Hashem made you with this kind of nature, it's a good thing.

Finally, you should know that yisurim are mechaper a person's aveiros. Emotional pain, which is even more painful is mechper so much more. Therefore, when you experience the emotional pain of anxiety on a constant basis, you should know that your neshama is becoming snow white, and you have a straight ticket to Olam Habah.

Q. I am a jealous person by nature, and I try my best not to be envious of others, but it's not really working. What should I do?

A. You're doing exactly what you're supposed to be doing! Your job is to try to work on not being jealous, and that's precisely what you're doing.

You don't see any results? Who cares! We're not here for results, we just have to do our 'daily exercise.

Here is one exercise you can do to work on avoiding jealousy: Imagine going to the pharmacy to pick up a prescription, and as you're walking out, you see that your friend got a 'better looking' medicine. Would you be jealous and want to trade? Of course not! You understand, that what's good for him is harmful for you. You need precisely the medicine that was given to you.

It's the same way with your prescription in life. If you would have your friend's conditions, you would never be able to fulfill your tafkid in life. In order to reach your true tikkun haneshama, you need precisely the situation that Hashem put you in.

Q. I have a clumsy personality. I'm forgetful and I often make blunders. People look at me as someone who is incompetent and it's very hurtful. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. The reason you feel hurt is because you're taking the blame for your personality.

However, did you choose your disposition? Your nature was

given to you by Hakadosh Baruch Hu, because He knows that that's perfect for you. If anybody looks down at you, it's not you who they are looking down at, rather they are blaming the manufacturer, Hakadosh Baruch Hu.

Certainly, if you are able to do exercises to act with more dexterity, you should try to do so. However, never look down at yourself for being the way Hashem made you. On the contrary, you have to appreciate the character you possess, and strive to serve Hashem with your individual strengths and weaknesses.

Whatever shame or criticism you still have after doing your exercises will serve as a kappara for your aveiros.

Q. By nature, I tend to be very forgetful. I misplace my belongings and sometimes lose them. I feel bad that I'm such a shlemazel.

What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. In the Chofetz Chaim's city, there was a group of schnorrers that weren't able to find a job, and instead went collecting from door to door.

There were people in the town who refused to give them mon-

ey. They said, 'go get a job

instead of schnorring money from other people'.

However, the Chofetz Chaim: "These people are making a mistake. The reason the schnorrers aren't making money is not because they are a shlemazels. Rather it's the opposite. Hashem decreed that they shouldn't be able to make money, and therefore He gave them the nature to be shlemazels."

Similarly, you didn't choose to be forgetful. Hashem created you with a forgetful nature and with the outcomes of such a nature because that's what's best for your tikkun haneshama.

of Therefore, course you should try to devise methods to avoid forgetting things, by making reminders, alarms, notes etc. But you shouldn't judge yourself based on the outcome of your nature. If Hashem gave you the personality to be forgetful, you have to be completely satisfied. Because Hashem is perfect, and the way Hashem created you is perfect for you.

Q. Some time ago, I was trying to fall asleep. But I couldn't fall asleep and I was tossing and turning most of the night.

Since then, whenever I go to sleep at night, I get anxiety attacks. I'm scared that the horrible experience might repeat itself. This is causing me to have a hard time falling asleep every night. All this is causing me a lot of frustration and I don't know how to help myself. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. When a person tries to fight anxiety head-on, it often backfires and the negative thoughts resurface with even greater force.

Therefore, if you go into bed with the mindset, 'I must fall asleep', a voice inside you will say, 'But maybe you won't fall asleep? Maybe you'll even have a hard time falling asleep tonight' etc. And you'll be fighting with yourself the entire night.

Rather when you go to sleep, go with the attitude, "I don't care if I fall asleep. It makes no difference to me". And when you don't fight your anxiety, your anxiety won't fight back.

However, how can you make peace with this attitude? Don't you want to fall asleep so you should have energy the next day?!

The answer is, the emunah and bitachon perspective tells us that it's not sleep that gives people function. It's Hashem that gives energy, like it says הנותן ליעף כח.

Hashem just wants us to do our hishtadlus — to lie down in bed and try to get sleep. Whether you fall asleep or not does not matter. Hashem will give you exactly the amount of strength He wants you to have.

Therefore, from now on, when you go to sleep each night, go with the mindset, 'My objective is not to fall asleep. Falling asleep is not in my control. My goal is to lie in bed and relax, and Hashem is going to give me the exact amount of energy I need in order to function tomorrow'.

Isn't it wonderful? Hashem wants us to go on a vacation every night in our comfortable beds! We can think of all types of positive thoughts; how much love Hashem showed us during the course of the day by making so many good things happen.

When you lie down with this attitude, you will feel very calm, and, b'ezras Hashem, your anxiety will vanish into thin air.

How do we fix and rectify this 'needless crying' and complaining?

WE DO EXACTLY THE OPPOSITE! We start praising and thanking Hashem for all of the nonstop goodness he is showering upon us every moment! And even if according to our misguided perception it seems that we have nothing to thank Hashem for and nothing to be happy about, we will still thank Hashem for 'no reason' and be happy for 'no reason'! Chazal say that the Churban happened because of שנאת הום, 'needless hatred'. How do we rectify this? By חנם, loving every yid even when there is no reason.

I remember one Shabbas Nachamu in Camp Ohr Shraga when Rav Zelig Epstein was the Camp's Rosh Yeshiva. The camp prepared an entire program for Motzei Shabbos Nachamu complete with blasting music, lively dancing and a very late night full of fun and games.

I asked the Rosh Yeshiva 'Is this Motzei Shabbos program proper? We just cried and sat on the floor just two days ago and now we are going to the other extreme, of dancing and celebrating? It feels impossible for those who truly experienced Tisha Be'Av to do all of these things!'

And the Rosh Yeshiva responded, "Yes! It is proper! The Navi Yeshaya just said the words החמו 'Be comforted, my nation!' and our celebrating this Nevua demonstrates that we believe in the Navi's timeless words! We should all start singing and dancing all night long!"
