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


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stop.

R' Chaim was on his way back from Baltimore MD, to Lake-




wood, New Jersey.

On the way back, R' Stern was extraordinarily drained, but Hashem gave him the koach to be able to safely drive the family home! B"H!



You shall not fear in the face of man

The Reward of Shabbat

In the fourth Perek of Pirkei Avos, the Mishna states, "Sechar Mitzvah Mitzvah—the reward of the Mitzvah is the Mitzvah."

The Nefesh Hachaim explains that woven into the Mitzvah itself, is the reward of the Mitzvah.

How so? Let's say, for example, I have the opportunity to pick up at the airport Ray

Chaim Kanievsky zatzal, and when we arrive at the destination, he reaches into his pocket and he gives me one hundred dollars for my time, the tolls,

and the gas. I'm happy to accept one hundred dollars from him, but the real reward was that I had the opportunity to spend time with, and be in the com-

pany of, the Godol HaDor.

So too, the reward of Shabbos is Shabbos.

Sure, the kugel is delicious, and the company is delightful, but the real pleasure and the real reward is that by keeping Shabbos, we have the

opportunity to host, and to be in the company of, Melech Malchei HaMelo-chim, HaKodosh Boruch Hu.

Gut Shabbos!



Besides for the impressive amount of pressure that our jaws create, there is an additional impressive function that our jaws have – which is their stamina.

Stamina means the ability to continually exert without tiring. Most of our muscles get tired after they are used for an extended amount of time.

For example, our legs have a very strong and large muscle, the largest muscle in the human body, but after going up 100 stairs – you really feel the strain.

Our jaws, after chewing 100 times, even a food that is hard to chew, doesn't feel strained at all. According to my calculations, during a 20 minute meal, we chew over 1,500 times. Can you imagine what your feet would feel like after going up 1,500 stairs? How many times would you have to rest in the middle of climbing those stairs?

If our muscles would be affected by chewing in a similar way to climbing stairs, after every bite that we would chew around 32 times we would have to rest before taking the next bite. Eating would take forever and it would greatly disturb our ability to work and produce.

Since we use our jaws so much, Hashem made them with so much stamina, that we

do it naturally. We don't feel our jaws and we don't think about it. It's more like walking straight than like going up stairs. So 1,500 bites feels like 1,500 steps on a straight path. What a blessing!

Our jaws have a very large stamina; we can chew and chew without feeling any strain at all. But occasionally, we have to work hard on a tough piece of food and we do feel the stain in our jaws, but how long does this feeling last?

I was once on a very high floor for Shabbos and over Shabbos I had to climb up over I,000 steps. My leg muscles were sore for quite a few days afterwards. Did you ever have a Charley horse jaw which lasted for a few days after a large meal? Did you ever feel, after a large Shabbos Seudah, like you couldn't eat any solids for the next day or two because your jaw had to rest? The strained feelings in our jaw lasts for only a few moments.

Hashem in His kindness created our jaws with a high stamina level and even though we are exerting an average of 162 pounds of pressure per square inch in our molars, we don't feel any strain, and if we do it's very short lived. He created our jaws and muscles with the ability to chew excessively without getting tired out.

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Last week we spoke about how to take action in our love for Hashem. One of the ways of showing Hashem that we love Him is by waiting for Moshiach.

We have also explained in the past that we may not fully under-

stand the importance of Moshiach, what it means to the world and to Hashem. But since this is what Hashem wants, then we want this too.

However, there is a higher level in Tzipisa l'yeshua, and that's yearning to be with Hashem. We say every Shabbos in Yedid nefesh "nafshi cholas ahavosecha." We are sick from our great desire to feel Hashems love.

During the time of the Bais Hamikdash, when a Yid felt an urge to show Hashem his love and to feel Hashem's love he would travel to the Bais Hamikdash. He would buy himself a Korban Todah or Shelamim to thank Hashem for the constant goodness that Hashem bestows upon him.

He would travel a great distance and he would spend lots of money on the Korban. This showed a great display of love for Hashem.

When he would come into the Bais Hamikdash he would feel so connected to Hashem. The delicious smell of the Ketores would bring a person to Yeshiva. Just watching the Avoda and seeing the beautiful vessels of the Bais Hamikdash would bring a person so much Ahavas Hashem and Yiras Shomayim.



The Vilna Gaon writes that he has an understanding of our holy Rishonim, the Gaonim, Amoraim. But a simple [or not so simple] Yid during the time of the Bais Hamikdash, such a person he couldn't fathom.

When we hear such words we should become full of yearning to reconnect once again to Hashem.

Let's do an exercise together [you can do this daily during these three weeks and whenever]. Close your eyes and go down the memory lane. Try to relive a spiritual experience that you felt extremely excited and uplifted. It was a time that you felt as if you were not on this planet.

Here are some examples. It can be the warm feelings that you experienced on Shabbos or Yom Tov. It can be at a wedding [perhaps your own wedding]. It can be while learning Torah with a fire or when you did a Chessed with joy and mesiras nefesh.

Try to recall the most exciting and exhilarating moments of your life. Going on an exciting trip etc.

Relive that experience to the best of your ability.

Imagine if you can have these feelings times a hundred over.

Moreover, imagine having these feelings times a hundred the entire day. That my friends is the reality of Yemos Hamoshiach with the Bais Hamikdash and the Shechina in our midst.

Now some people may have a hard time

relating to this. It's like telling a pauper who is eating crusty dirty bread, that any day he may become a billionaire and he will own mansions and have teams of servants serving him. It may be extremely difficult for the pauper to fathom this.

However, with Emuna and Bitachon we understand that Hashem is Hakol Yachol and His chessed is unlimited. We understand that if we are are connected to Hashem then we are above nature and we will go into a new realm.

When we start thinking like this it becomes much easier to yearn for Moshiach. We all want to rebuild our personal Mishkan within our heart so Hashem can dwell within us. This will happen when Moshiach comes with a Shelaimus. In meanwhile we need to do the best we could to purify our hearts and build ourselves as much as we can.

However, there is a higher level according to the Shomer Emunim [and others]. That is that we are waiting for Moshiach for Hashem. The Gemara teaches us that Hashem and the Shechina have pain when we are in Galus.Hashem [so to speak] misses His children.

If a person can live with an

attitude that I must do whatever it takes to alleviate the tzar Hashechina, this is truly special.

If a person has the attitude that we must restore the Kevod Shamayim, the Malchus Shamayim back to this world, this is the ultimate.

The obvious question is how can we reach such a level? Is this for a simple Yid or is this level only for great tzaddikim.

The answer is that yes it is not a simple level, but as we have said in the past that no Yid is simple. Every Yid can achieve great levels in Ahavas Hashem and Yiras Shomayim, but it needs work.

When a Yid looks at himself as a servant of Hashem, who is here in this world to bring the kavod of Hashem, automatically your life will be on a different plateau. When we live like this then all our decisions will be based on this one question. "What does Hashem want". We take ourselves out of the picture, and focus on Hashem instead.

Furthermore, we are now in Chodesh Av which means that Hashem is our father. A loyal son wants the most for his father. So he would do anything to bring honor to his father. So he is constantly asking himself the question. "What does my father want?"

Ultimately, this is the idea of living a life of Kiddush Hashem and not visa versa Chas veshalom. There are many stories of



people that made a tremendous Kkiddush Hashem. I will say one story to demonstrate how some people fully live with this concept that we are here for Hashem. It's not about me.

I heard that a certain famous philanthropist has an amazing story behind his great Bracha of wealth.

He purchased a house and moved in with his family. One day, one of his kids was jumping on his bed. All of the sudden, they heard a crash. They all came running and they discovered a great treasure with jewelry and cash.

Now at first glance he thought to himself that the money was rightfully his. In the contract it stated specifically that they bought the house and anything that was with it.

However, he said one second let me take myself out of the picture. What does Hashem want. How does a Yid find out what Hashem wants?

He called Rav Moshe Feinstein zatzal and lo and behold Reb Moshe told him to return it

The person that owned the house previously was a nonreligious Jew. When he called him to inform him about the treasure, the man said the following. "I knew that there was a treasure hidden somewhere, but I did not know where it was hidden. But I did know that a religious Jew like you would surely return it."

This story is obviously a story of Kiddush Hashem. The Yid took himself out of the picture and asked the question "what does Ha-shem want".

As the story goes, from then on the Bracha started flowing. Because when one lives for Hashem, then Hashem will give him the tools he needs to serve Him.

When a person lives a life that it's all about Hashem then of course he is waiting for Moshiach. This person can be mevatel himself to Hashem and he tries his utmost to live his life of Kiddush Hashem. This will bring this person to be from the "Avelei tzion", as he is awaiting Hashems name becoming exalted in the world once again.

Let's be mechazek ourselves, our families and our friends to yearn to become connected to Ha-shem once again. Let's be mechazek ourselves, our families and everyone to focus on Kiddush Hashem, Kevod Shmayim. If we do then hopefully Hashem will show us His Kavod in the Bais hamikdash, and this year Tisha B'av 5783 we will be wishing each other— A Freilichan Tisha Ba'av. Amein

Living With Appreciation By: R' Daniel Shasha

Our parashah recounts the episode of the meraglim. Eretz Yisrael was really a very plentiful land, infused with great holiness and blessing, yet the meraglim slandered it. This caused Klal Yisrael to cry the entire night, despite Hashem's promise that everything would be ok. Hashem said "you cried for no reason, so I will give you a reason to cry." That night was Tisha B'Av (Taanis 29a). The Rabbeinu Yonah (Shaarai Teshuvah4:12) writes that the contrary is also true. When a person encounters challenges, and is seemingly justified to feel despondent, yet feels happy and accepts everything with love, Hashem will give him a reason to be happy and things will get better!

Rabbi Shimshon Pincus (Shaarim Betfilah p57) brings an allusion to this idea from the verse in Eichah 'kumi roni balayla,' get up and sing at night'. Rav Pincus notes that this verse is rather puzzling. Do people normally sing to Hashem in dark times? Really, he explains, this is the most opportune time! When the gates of blessing seem to be closed, there is no better way to open them, than with songs of praises to Hashem!

This is a very powerful segulah, continues Rav Pincus; when a person, is going through challenges, he should try to focus on all the blessings which he has. No matter our challenges, everyone has an abundance of things to be grateful for: health, family, the ability to walk, see, talk etc. We can learn not to follow in the footsteps of those who believed the spies' slander. Just as people can always find grounds to complain, we can also find grounds to appreciate the goodness which we receive. Doing so will bring down great shefah from Shamayim and we will see yeshuos meal hateva, as we see in the following story.

Rabbi Shimshon Pincus relates that a friend of his, Rav Peretz Maimon, lived in a certain community which suffered from a very severe drought. There was no sign of rain in sight and the situation continued to look more and more precarious. Many of the crops were dying, causing a great lack of local crops. The community instituted fasts and public prayer gatherings, yet there was still no rain in sight. They really didn't know what they could still do to help avert this decree.

The community than decided that instead of fasting out of distress, they would celebrate and express their gratitude for all the good which they had received. The community ordained a 'Yom Tov' and all the inhabitants celebrated. A large elegant seudah was served with lavish food and wine flowing. Many lechayims were served, and the meal was full of expressing praise to Hashem. They expressed what they were grateful for and song many songs of praise, as a medium to convey their appreciation for His eternal goodness.

Not long after this 'Yom Tov' the skies began to darken with clouds forming. Then, lo and behold, the long-awaited rain began to pour down from Shamayim! (Shaarim Betfilah p.57).

I used to own a book about trees it was called: Trees of The Northeast area of the United States of America.

The book taught facts about trees.

It gave me their names and offered a minimal description of them.

It spoke about their nature and tendencies.

It had information about in which areas and in what types of ground the tree grows. What kind of weather conditions would be beneficial to those species.

It also gave identifying clues in the type of bark, leaf, seed and flower. Each family of trees, is unique in its own way, and thereby can be easily identified as soon as one sees it.

In addition to that, there was mention about the shape of the tree's crown, its trunk, and branches.

It also spoke about the use of the wood of the trees.

I was mostly interested in learning about the trees that grow here in the New York city area.

I was excited to learn about the different types of trees, and I actually contacted the New York City Department of Parks and I asked them to please send me maps of the types of trees that they planted all over the city.

I was really "into it" for a few

years.

Now twenty years later, I still remember some of the things that I read in that book.

I'm now re-appreciating what I learned then, with a new perspective.

I'm slowly learning to have more "hakoras hatoiv" to Hashem...

The 'New York City Tree Planting Project' lists the various trees that have been planted all over city streets and parks in the last few decades.

Over the years, lots of data from past experience were compiled and combined with studies and research results about the nature of "city trees".

They learned and tested the ability of many more different types of trees that can live in the city area.

The trees were proven to be tough enough to withstand pollution and other hard-growth conditions that are present in urban areas.

There's even one type of tree that the Chinese people collect the fruit that grows on them.

The Chinese happily and excitedly take home their traditionally known-to-be precious food for consumption.

It's the fruit of the Ginkgo Biloba tree.

After coming down from those beautiful symmetrical branches with its unique pretty leaves, it lays on the ground forlorn and forsaken due to its odor.

The Chinese who appreciate the hidden medicinal power that it contains, come along and chance upon it.

They'll quietly, almost secretly, start carefully collecting those fruits as if they've found a treasure trove!

The Chinese traditionally believe they contain special medicinal properties.




Suggestions for the Case of Mrs. Stein's young boys practicing giving a haircut on their little sister, Miri:

A Dose of Chizuk

From His Throne of Glory

Asher Yaztar is one of the holiest *berachos*! The proof is that it is the only *berachah* that mentions the "*Kisei Hakovod* – Hashem's Throne of Glory." Why is this so?

The Gra explains (*Siddur Hagra*) that there are those who believe that Hashem is so holy, it is impossible for Him to have anything to do with the lowly and mundane aspects of this world. In order to negate this folly, we say that from His Holy throne, the place from where even the highest and holiest angels must stand tens of thousands of "miles" away, Hashem oversees lowly matters such as using the facilities.

This is brought out through the verses found in Hallel (Tehillim 113:4-6): "Ram al kol goyim Hashem – High above all nations is Hashem." The nations of the world believe that Hashem is holy and way above this world and doesn't interact with it. We continue: "Mi ka'Hashem Elokeinu hamagbihi lashaves, hamashpili le'ros ba'shomayim uv'aaretz – Who is like Hashem, our G-d, who is enthroned on high – yet, deigns to look upon the heaven and the earth?" Yes, Hashem is very holy and high, infinitely beyond the comprehension of the holiest angels. However, He still lowers Himself to watch over us and take care of our lowliest matters.

When a person recites Asher Yatzar, he is not only thanking Hashem for the gift of being able to use the facilities normally. He is turning what seems to be a lowly animalistic act into a declaration of Emunah which makes his connection to Hashem much greater! Hakadosh Baruch Hu is surrounded by myriads of mighty angels who stand with trepidation and anticipation. Multitudes of fiery Serafim, magnificent Ofanim, and holy Chayos praise Hashem in the most exalted manner. Yet from that very place, Hashem is interested in EVERY aspect of our lives! This should envelope us with feelings of awe, and at the same time closeness, to our Father, our King!

----- Internalize It! -----

While we wash our hands before reciting this *berachah*, think how we are preparing ourselves to recite a very *kadosh berachah*, one that connects us to Hashem's Throne of Glory. Let us also contemplate how He is watching over us from there!

In Sefer Tehillim, David HaMelech states, "Give thanks to Hashem for He is good, for His kindness is eternal."

Rav Chatzkel explained that this means that any kindness that Hashem performed for the Jewish people throughout their history is eternal and ongoing, and that anyone who achieves the proper level of emunah will be able to experience that kindness within his own life.

Ray Chatzkel found a very real illustration of this concept within his own life:

He lived through the miraculous escape of the Mirrer Yeshivah from Europe during World War II, and he once wrote that it was a manifestation of the same miracles that occurred during Yetzias Mitzrayim.

He illustrated this point with a number of examples:

In Mitzrayim, Pharaoh himself ultimately gave permission for the Jews to leave; likewise, it was the Soviet secret police who permitted the yeshivah to leave Russia, in violation of the government's standard policy.

Furthermore, the Jews in Mitzrayim came to be treated with great respect by the very people who had enslaved them; likewise, the yeshivah students from Mir were placed in the best hotels in Russia and were even taken on a sightseeing tour of Moscow, all as part of the travel package provided by their tickets.

Additionally, just as the Yam Suf split so that the Jewish people could escape their pursuers, the bachurim and faculty of the yeshivah were transport-

ed to safety across the Sea of Japan. That alone was a miraculous trip, for the rickety boat that took them did not seem capable of making it across the sea. In fact, the boat sank on its very next voyage, with only a minimal complement aboard.

Finally, just as Hashem provided for the Jews in the Wilderness over the next 40 years, the yeshivah students somehow received everything they needed — including food, shelter, and medical care — during the seven years they spent in Japan and China.

Rav Chatzkel demonstrated that it is not sufficient for a Jew merely to speak about the miracles of Yetzias Mitzrayim. Every person experiences his own Yetzias Mitzrayim and can identify plenty of hashgachah pratis in his own life. A person who succeeds in finding that hashgachah and recognizing Hashem's kindnesses will exist in a different reality, thus serving as a living testimony to the Divine Presence. We yearn for the day when millions of people will live this way: sensing the existence of a spiritual reality that is invisible to the human eye, and feeling a connection to Hashem and His Presence everywhere they go.

There was once a Yid named Chaim in Montreal facing hardships and looking to move to an unknown part of Canada. The Tosher Rebbe, known for his compassionate nature, approached Chaim, eager to understand his reasons for such a drastic decision. With genuine curiosity, the Rebbe inquired about the availability of a minyan, a mikveh and a cheder in this new city. During a business trip to Antwerp, he had come into possession of a substantial sum of money. Tragically, this fortune inexplicably vanished at the airport, leaving him penniless. Overwhelmed by despair, he returned to Montreal burdened by the weight of his financial troubles.

Moved by Chaim's plight, the Tosher Rebbe made earnest efforts to dissuade him from leaving. However, Chaim remained determined to relocate, impervious to the Rebbe's appeals. Reluctantly, the Rebbe watched as Chaim prepared to depart, seemingly resigned to his

Shlomo HaMelech spared no expense in building the Beis HaMikdash.

Knowing that the work of mortals would not endure, no matter how grand,

he carved tunnels underneath, anticipating the time when our transgressions would end peace in the land.

The Temple of Hashem was inaugurated with two magnificent seven-day ceremonies.

The Elders and Leaders of the nation attended as well as Yidden from near and far.

120 Kohanim sounded trumpets. Levyim sang and played cymbals, lyres, and harps.

There were oxen and sheep for korbanos k'eelu ad ayn mispar.

The most auspicious moment arrived when Shlomo HaMelech would set the Aron of G-d in the Holy of Holies. The gates remained locked until he davened:

"... remember the righteousness of Your servant, Dovid." Those precious words were just the right keys.

Only in the merit of Dovid HaMelech would Hashem allow His Shechina in the Holy Temple to dwell.

With the yearning in Dovid's heart to build a Mikdash "for the sake of My Name, Hashem said, "you have done well." The Aron HaBrit, with the Luchos and Keruvim, was placed in the innermost chamber of grandeur.

The Kohain Gadol could enter once per year to attain atonement for himself and B'nai Yisrael on Yom Kippur.

On Shemini Atzeret, Shlomo HaMelech kneeled with palms raised toward the

G-d of Israel, Ha Kadosh Baruch Hu:

Then Shlomo HaMelech rose and blessed the entire congregation of Israel so all could hear

Blessed is Hashem who has granted menucha l'Yisrael

Not one word has gone unfulfilled of His great promise to Moshe Avdo.

"May Hashem be with us as He was with our forefathers yomam v'laila

and never forsake us; Al yazveinu v'al yitsheinu

May He grant His servant and His people each day in its day, its just due.

"The nations of the world will know there is none other than Hashem Hu Elokim, Ain Od." The Beis HaMikdash will be the permanent dwelling place of His Divine Presence, His Earthly Abode.

Fire from heaven consumed the korbanos on the mizbeach that replaced the ancient altars.

His thick Cloud of Glory, enveloped the Beis HaMikdash completely to fill.

The assemblage knew that Shlomo Hamelech had pleased Hashem and fulfilled His will.

There was no dry eye when the entire Kehilla bowed to HaMelech HaGadol v'HaKadosh along with King Shlomo They expressed their overwhelming gratitude: Hodu L'Hashem Ki Tov, Ki L'olam, Chasdo.

One Altar, One Mizbeach, one continuous and constant service to G-d.

This would mark the immediate end of bammos scattered throughout the land.

Yidden would make the Shalosh Regalim, bring tithes, and receive atonement;

elated to follow the Eibishter's every command.

Klal Yisrael enjoyed a time of national peace and prosperity

while the monumental Beis HaMikdash stood, but our relationship with G-d is never about gold, silver, marble, and wood.

Hashem wants our observance and devotion with a lev

shalaim

rather than rote tefillos and mindless service.

The most indestructible fortress

could not have survived the collapse of our spiritual edifice.

For 410 years, the envy of all nations,

the Beis HaMikdash was known for majesty and splendor. The era of triumph ended in tragedy, on Tisha B'Av, when our Bayis Hagadol v'HaKadosh

was demolished by the evil King Nevachadnezer.

The roads to Zion became dark and desolate.

We mourned the departure of the Divine Presence, we had taken for granted over the years.

Our enemies gloated over our vast ruin, while the rivers of Bavel overflowed with our tears.

Less than a century later, Kel Chanun v'Rachum showered us with mercy,

accepting our teshuva for the aveiros that He abhorred.

He returned His Shechina to Har Tzion and allowed the Holy Temple to be rebuilt and our avoda restored.

The Romans raised their raspy voice of vengeance after 420 years.

By Tisha B'Av, the second Beis HaMikdash was desecrated and felled.

Gone was the physical embodiment of the ideals we once held dear.

Gone was the Sanctuary where the Heavenly Presence had among us dwelled.

The Holiest City was sacked and all that remained was smoldering cinder.

We lost our Beis HaMidash again,

but, Baruch Hashem, Av HaRachamon forsook the Temple rather than us, His cherished kinder.

Due to unbreakable kedusha, the Western retaining wall could not be toppled.

Not even with heavy boulders launched by catapult.

The Roman general saved face by claiming the wall show-cased our defeat

and what the rasha thought would be a final blow and insult.

The Aron of G-d, with the Keruvim and Luchos had been sequestered by King Yoshiyahu beneath the Kodesh Kadoshim out of harm's way. In a secret cavern, like us they wait, for Geula and redemption to this very day.

Despite our sins, the Keruvim are still panim el panim, as if learning.

They long for our return to He Who Never Slumbers and Is Not Sleeping.

Their mourning streams down the wall from their vault with their weeping.

Without our Holy Temples, we can no longer receive atonement through sacrifice.

We are not able to see Hashem's Shechina in pillars, clouds, or fire;

but Hashem still gathers our prayers at Heaven's Gate and we feel His Presence in our hearts and souls with sincere effort and desire.

We are dispersed throughout the globe.

Neither we nor the Shechina have a place to settle, a Mikdash to call home;

Through Siata D'Shmaya we feel the constant guidance of

It will descend from Shomayim with Hod v'Hadar, Oz v'Chedva

a complete, everlasting gift from the One Eternal G-d.

Please Hashem send Moshiach Tzidkecha to take us on wings of eagles to Geula and Ir Kodshecha.

The levyim will sing and make music with a unified heart and the Kohanim will restore Haavodah l'dvir Beisecha.

Hashem' will still be everywhere,

The heavens and earth will rejoice,

Or Chadash will shine,

and your Divine Presence will rest on each of us, B'nai Tzion, your Beloved Yidden, for eternity.

A VISIT TO R' DANIEL!

Recap: A most amazing piece of information that is too good to be true, came to our attention! That here in New York lives a very old man, who is the last known remaining living Yid who left Mitzrayim. His name is R' Daniel and he is from Shevet Don. When he left Mitzrayim, he was a 15-year-old boy and today he is 3350 years old! He lives today with his great-great-great-grandchildren in Monsey, New York. The Spring Hill Times has been granted the rare privilege of being able to interview him from time to time.

It was a beautiful and warm summer morning and we set out to visit R' Daniel in his house. We wanted to hear first-hand what it was like living back in the times of the Bais HaMikdash!

R' Daniel was so happy to see us and we had a most fascinating interview:

Spring Hill Times: Many of our readers are very curious to know what life was like in the days when Hashem dwelled amongst Klal Yisrael

R' Daniel: I cannot describe to you the excitement that our Neshamos felt.

All I can say is that it was the best feeling that a human can possibly feel on earth! We were together with Hashem!

Spring Hill Times: Was this only when you visited the Bais Hamikdash? What happened when you were outside Yerushlayim? Did you feel anything special?

R' Daniel: Yes! The main resting of the Shechina was not in the Bais Hamikdash! It was in our hearts! We felt it everywhere we went! The real Mikdash was inside of us! We felt His presence at all times.

Spring Hill Times: This sounds so amazing! Was daily life different because of this?

R' Daniel: Our entire day was around Hashem. He was with us in all our actions. We lived with Him and we lived for Him. Nothing else interested us! All we wanted to do was get closer and closer to Him.

Do you want to hear something interesting?

Spring Hill Times: Sure, please.

R' Daniel: I had a good friend by the name of Zevy. He was obsessed with Hashem. He simply couldn't stop thinking and talking about Him! He would go around telling everyone the good things that Hashem does for him. Even the most minor detail!

We once went together to Yerushlayim to bring a korban for Hashem. He was so excited. He was a kid going on a major trip to a water park x 1000!

When he would think about Hashem, he


After a while, he saw that he was losing money, but he continued to follow the Rav's directive.

Bitachon Perspective

Q. When something upsetting happens, should I go straight to working on the exercises of emunah and bitachon, or should I first recognize and take notice of the pain, and then apply the exercises?

A. When something upsetting happens, it's natural to feel pain. Should one dwell on it and allow himself to feel the hurt before working on his bitachon? It's a matter of personality. For some people, in order to feel comfortable with the emunah and bitachon perspective, they first need to validate the cause of their pain. For others, it's not necessary, and they could work on bitachon right away. One derech is not better than the other. Each person should do what works for him.

Q. There is a certain person I look up to and respect. However, there are times where he loses himself and acts in an appalling manner. It bothers me to no end that such a respectable person could have such flawed middos?

A. What's bothering you is that you expect so much from him. Therefore, whenever he demonstrates inferior middos, he lets you down.

However, you have the ability to exercise your ayin tovah and view him from the opposite perspective. Instead of demanding perfection and focusing on when he falls short, regard him as he is a work in process. Give him credit for all the good traits he possesses and view his shortcomings as traits that he is yet to acquire.

Additionally, train yourself to regard him the way Hashem regards him. Hashem loves him for his ma'alos despite his weaknesses. You, too, should strive to appreciate him for his many good qualities notwithstanding the fact that he has room to improve as well.

Q. Baruch Hashem, I have a lot of good in my life. But I have an issue that I'm never happy with what I have. I see other people walking around looking happy and content, and I wish I could also feel grateful for my lot. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. Hashem doesn't demand that you should be happy. He is the one in control of emotions. Hashem just wants you to try to be happy. That's the only thing that's in your control.

Try to think of ways to become happy. Think about all the brachah that's in your life. Every one of us has gifts that others would pay all the money in the world to have: a functional body, a family, shelter, being emotionally balanced, not being hospitalized etc.

If after doing exercises in trying to be happy you still suffer from ungratefulness, now that you've done everything in your control, and any pain you undergo will be deducted from your aveiros and make your neshama sparkle and shine.

Q. I used to work for a company and I invested my heart and soul to do my job the best possible way. Recently, I had a baby, and when I was ready to go back to work, my boss called me up and said, "our company decided that they could manage without you. We kindly request you to find yourself a new job".

After hanging up the phone I was devastated. After investing so much into the job, they throw me out as if I'm worthless?! What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. True, if you label your fleshand-blood boss as your ultimate boss, when he fails to appreciate your dedication, indeed it is very depleting.

However, who is your true boss? Whose opinion of you is truly valuable? Your loving father Hakadosh Baruch Hu. You're working for Hashem, and His opinion of you is what counts.

How important does Hashem consider you? בשבילי נברא העולם, for me the world was created. We must understand this in its most literal sense. You are so incredibly important in Hashem's eyes, that it was worth creating the entire universe just for you to be born!

When you understand that it's

that really counts, it won't make any difference to you what your fisher-price boss thinks about you. You'll fill your heart with the most delicious feeling that Hashem loves you to the sky and he holds the world of you.

Q. My mother is very passionate about upholding the correct standards of tznius. My friends call my mother a fanatic, and I feel very hurt.

A. Your friends may not appreciate what your mother is doing. But Hashem does. Hashem loves people who stand up for His honor and insist on the correct standards of tznius.

The fact that there are people who try to oppose her is part of the way Hashem set up the world; whenever someone tries to start something good, there are always going to be people who try to stop them. When Reb Yisroel Salanter started the mussar movement, there were plenty of people who tried to stop him. But he didn't care, because he knew that he was doing the right thing.

Q. I was asked by a certain institution to speak at their affair. On A Life With Bitachon I hear that Hashem wants us to live with menuchas hanefesh. I'm not a public speaker, and I know that if I agree to speak, I will be filled with nervousness. Is this a reason to turn down

the offer?

A. It's true that Hashem wants us to live with menuchas hanefesh. However, if what's robbing your menuchas hasnefesh is that you're scared of public opinion, Hashem does not want that either. He wants you to do exercises to overcome your fear.

Each day do an exercise to overcome you intimidation:

- Introduce yourself to someone new.
- Call a friend whom you haven't spoken to in a while.
- Give a nice 'good morning' to someone who you don't usually greet.
- When you see a job well done, offer a compliment

Over time you will find your confidence growing stronger and stronger.

Therefore, the general advice in such cases is: if you have the courage to accept – go for it! Now is your opportunity to sharpen your focus: 'I'm not here to serve people; I'm here to serve Hashem'.

Prepare a speech and practice until you feel comfortable with what you want to say. Do daily exercises to combat your intimidation from people. And when Hashem sees that you are trying your best, you will receive siyata d'shmaya.

Ultimately, when you succeed in

breaking your fear of people, you will find that you'll have much more menuchas hanefesh than ever before.

Q. I suffer from insecurity about my decisions. Now, when it comes to da'as Torah questions, I do what da'as Torah says without compunctions. However, in decisions which are a matter of preference, I have a very difficult time deciding what to choose. And after I've already decided, I always second-guess my decision. What should my perspective be?

A. Rav Yisroel Falk responded: the first thing is, try determining logically which option is the most beneficial for you. If you have a difficult time calculating, you might want to take a pen and paper and weigh out the pros and cons.

If after the calculation they both seem to be good options, however, you can't decide which one to choose, in that case, simply decide on any one. You can feel comfortable with your decision because you know that it was Hashem who put into your brain the idea to choose that option.
