STRENGTHENS MAN HIS TORAH LEARNING


It was already a couple of days and Yisroel Meisels* was feeling very overwhelmed. He was full of anxiety - Bahala, but he couldn't figure out why.

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

A poor person appeared before the tzaddik R Mendel of Riminov. He poured his heart out before R Mendel sparing no detail of his difficult situation. The Rebbe gave the man a substantial sum of money. Then as the man turned to leave, the Rebbe presented him with yet another coin.

SIXTY SECONDS OF INSPIRATION

With Rabbi Label Lam - Monsey, New York

I was speaking to a fellow the other day who was sharing his concerns

about Parnosso. And as part of our discussion, I reminded him—and myself—that Dovid HaMelech states, "Ach tov vochesed yirdefunikol yemei chayai," that "only goodness and kindliness pursue me all the days of my life," and it's not a cliché.

When we were in the womb, HaShem managed to "sneak" food into us, like intravenous, through the placenta.

Later on, when we were born into the world without teeth, sudden-

ly, magically, fountains of milk opened up. And then later on we got teeth for chewing, one set for practice, and a second set, and some of us got a third set.

If we look over our shoulder, we'll see that there's a trail of food

that traces all the way back to a singular Source.

Gut Shabbos!

We are taking leave of Chodesh Av. Av means father. This shows on the closeness that we had with Hashem. Reb Yisroel Salanter would say that a person can get a closeness to Hashem

on Tisha B'av as on Yom Kippur.

I heard an explanation as follows: Yom Kippur is connecting to Hashem through Teshuva while Tisha B'av is connecting to Hashem through yearning. The Seforim teach us that the definition for Aveilus on the Bais Hamikdash is mourning, but at the same time yearning.

In Judaism we don't cry over spilled milk. Our tears of sorrow are mingled with tears of hope and yearning.

Therefore, as long as we are still in the month of Av we are still in the mode of yearning for our Av - Hakadosh Baruch Hu. This is a time that we can still come close to Hashem through yearning as we explained.

One way to be mechazek ourselves in yearning is through our appreciation for all the good that Hashem has done for us already. The more we appreciate Hashem the closer we are going to be to Hashem. This will help us yearn for Hashem.

Yes, great waves of appreciation are rippling through



many of our nation, and many people are coming closer and closer to Hashem through this.

Many many Yidden are working on Emuna and Bitachon which highlights the great love that Hashem has for His children Klal Yisroel. The Chovas Halevavos elaborates on this in a few places.

We can see from the many stories that are going around that so many people are taking the Yesodos of Emuna and Bitachon and they are applying it into their daily lives. We hear about their Yeshuos that they are experiencing.

I once explained the idea that if one has Bitachon he will have Mezonos without much effort. If one lives with Bitachon many things fall into place. Why is that?

The Gemara teaches us that there is a concept of a "ben hasomeich al shulchan aviv". A son who sits by his father's table, his father needs to support him. However, if he doesn't sit by his father"s table, so his father doesn't need to support him.

Similarly, if a person un-

derstands that all his sustenance comes from his loving Father, Hashem, then he is considered "someich al shulchan aviv". Therefore, Hashem takes care of all his needs. However, if ch"v a person goes to work with the

thoughts that he is going to support himself then he is not considered "al shulchan aviv". This person will not be able to get the special treatment.

In essence a person that lives with Bitachon is living in the palace of the King. Not just any king, but the King of all kings. The creator, the sustainer of all mankind and the entire universe.

The good news is that every Yid can connect themselves to Bitachon. In essence every Yid is a Ben Melech, we just need to live our life with Bitachon [learning about Bitachon is how to start].

Since we realize that Hashem is our Av Harachaman this is our Nechama, and this brings us into the "shiva d'nechemte". We are consoled and comforted with the knowledge that He is our father, and He has only our best interests in mind.

In the Zechus that we are working on our connection to Hashem, may hashem console us with the ultimate Nechama which is with the rebuilding of the Bais Hamikdash speedily Amen.

Living With Appreciation By: R' Daniel Shasha

When discussing the laws that the judges have to abide by, our parashah tells us that they should not take a bribe, 'for a bribe will blind the eyes of the wise and will make crooked the words of the righteous' (16:18).

Chazal (Cetuvos 105 a) explain that receiving a bribe isn't limited to gifts or money; any benefit given to the judge, is also considered bribery, known as shohad devarim. For example, Ameimar, was sitting in Bais Din when a feather flew on him. Someone came and blew it away, explaining he did this since he was to be judged by Ameimar. Ameimar responded that he was therefore disqualified to judge his case, since he was benefited by him. Rav Elyashiv asks that surely this is very hard to understand. Would such an esteemed Tzadik like Ameimar really be swayed by such an insignificant act of blowing away a feather? Why should this disqualify him from judging?

Rav Elyashiv explains that the more refined a person is, the more he will appreciate even the small things which people do for him. Therefore, Ameimar, in his great righteousness, strongly appreciated even the small favors which were done for him. He was therefore so full of gratitude to this man for doing this favor, that he knew that the feelings of appreciation would prevent him from judging impartially. We learn from here the importance of being grateful, for even small favors which are done for us. Throughout our day, people are always helping us. Someone might open the door for us, hold the elevator, give us a ride, help carry our bags etc. It is essential that we try and appreciate this.

Even if our benefactor is getting paid to do a particular service, if we benefit, we are supposed to try and express our gratitude towards them. For example, the mailman, security guard, garbageman and the street-cleaner, these people perform a great service for us and work very hard; it is very important we try and express our appreciation. It will be hard to for society to function without the services that these people do. Imagine if we don't have garbage collectors or police! Often just a simple 'thank you' can go a very long way, and can really lift one's spirits; it is also a tremendous way of making a kiddush Hashem. As Rav Elyashiv teaches, the more we pay attention to the favors that others do for us, the more it reflects how refined we are.

Rabbi Moshe Aharon Stern, the renowned Mashgiach of Kamenetz, was meticulous to express his appreciation to anyone who benefited him. Every time he would travel to chutz

laaretz he would make sure to buy a gift, for his wife to give to the maid to express their tremendous appreciation for her cleaning their floors and for all the household work she did. (The Mashgiach of Kamenetz p.214)

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

ago, he was in a major motorcycle accident, and Hatzalah saved his life. For eight years he was looking to pay back Hatzalah, and now he finally had his chance!



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





Q. My daughter is a kallah, and the chasunah is approaching. Recently, she slipped and got a large cut in the middle of her face, and she needed stitches. Now, I'm mortified; how am I going to walk my kallah down the chuppah with stitches on her face?

What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. It may seem like the worst thing in the world happened. But the truth is, nothing major happened. Baruch Hashem, your daughter is okay. She's able to make it to her chasunah. She wasn't critically injured; she could walk, talk and function.

If you zoom into your emotions, what's so devastating about having to walk a daughter down the chuppah with stitches? It's your kavod. What will everyone think when they see my daughter with stitches? How will the pictures come out? Everyone is going to be wondering how she got stitches...

Break free from the jail of living for public opinion. Tell yourself, 'kavod is hevel havalim. Worrying over my kavod won't get me anywhere in life. On the contrary, it will only cause me tza'ar and ag-

In place of focusing on הבריות, start concentrating on the kindness Hashem did to you by protecting your daughter, as well the myriads of other demonstrations of love that Hashem is showering upon you on a constant basis. When you focus on this, you will walk your daughter down the chuppah with a heart overflowing with gratitude to Hakadosh Baruch Hu.

mas nefesh'.

Q. I was talking to my friend, and in the course of the conversation I accidentally said something that was extremely foolish. Now, I'm so ashamed of myself. How could I have made such a fool out of myself? How does the person view me now?

What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. The reason you're upset at yourself for saying something so thoughtless, is because you think that you are in complete control of how the words come out of your mouth. Therefore you feel, 'how could such an intelligent person like myself have said something so insensible?'

The passuk says [Mishlei 16, 1]: לאדם מערכי -לב ומה' מענה

לשון – it is to man to arrange thoughts of the heart, and to Hashem the expression of the mouth. This teaches us that the most we can do is to try to prepare to say the proper thing. But how our words unfold is up to Hashem. If your words came out in a manner that you did not plan, it's because that's how Hashem wanted your words to come out.

Therefore, instead of falling apart because of the way a human being regards you, busy yourself with being concerned 'how does Hashem hold of me?'. 'How does Hashem want me to feel?'

Hashem wants you to realize that it's He who made his words come out in that manner. And Hashem wants you to live with the awareness that everything He does is only for our good.

Q. There is a certain person who I don't have a very good relationship with. As a result, whenever I pass by him, I feel awkward. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. The reason a person can feel awkward in the presence of another person is because he's concerned about the impression he's making on the other

does the other person think about me?', 'How does he view me?', 'Does he think I'm weird?', 'Does he respect me?', 'Does he hold of me'? All these feelings cause a person to be intimidated and make him feel awkward.

The way to overcome these feelings is to break out of the narrow-mindedness of living to impress other people.

Decide that you don't care what type of impression you're making on the other person. Be yourself. Act the way you're supposed to act towards other people. Show derech eretz and be friendly towards him — without caring how the other person views you.

If a person still feels uncomfortable when in an awkward situation, he should know that all tza'ar a person is supposed to undergo was already nigzar on Rosh Hashanah, and when a person receives embarrassment through an awkward situation, he is being spared from car accidents, trips to the hospital and other forms of tza'ar he would never want to experience.

Q. I'm making a simcha. In the past, when I've made simchos there was a very low turnout. Very few people showed up and it was very embarrassing. They were wondering, 'Where is everyone?' People were looking at me as if to say. 'Where are all you friends? Why aren't people coming?'

Now, I'm cringing at the thought of making another simcha. How can I enjoy the happy occasion when I'm dreading the embarrassment of having an empty simcha?

A. The reason you feel this way is because you think that the joy of a simcha is when lots of people show up and make you feel choshuv. You see how popular you are and how everyone is coming to give you kavod.

However, the Mesilas Yesharim teaches us that kavod is nothing but a deception. At the moment it may give you an illusion that you're very choshuv, but it's not real. After the simcha is over, everyone goes home and no one is thinking about you anymore.

True joy is felt when you 'invite' Hakadosh Baruch Hu to your simcha, and thank Him for all the bracha He showered you with. Think about how many people would wish that they could make a simcha?

Rav Simcha Bunim Cohen relayed that he once went to

a family simcha, and he saw his Zaidy, Rav Avigdor Miller, sitting all alone. Rav Simcha Bunim figured that since Rav Avigdor Miller wasn't doing anything, he could take the opportunity to talk to him. But when he approached Rav Avigdor Miller, he said, 'I'm sorry, I'm not available now. I'm busy thanking Hashem for being so good to me and giving me a reason to make a simcha".

The fewer people attend your simcha, the less you have to focus on people and the more time you get to spend with Hakadosh Baruch Hu.

Once you understand how deeply Hashem loves you and how He is flooding you with bracha, you will feel so rich that you won't need 'handouts' of kavod from human beings.

When you include Hashem in your simcha, you will begin to tap into the true joy of making a simcha, and the quality of your simcha will not be affected by how many people showed up.

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Hashem Loves You!

A follower of the Hashem Loves You Hotline, whom we will call R' Motti* shared that this summer has been a very challenging time for him and his family. His family's summer plans didn't end up working out and everyone was going out of their minds. His wife did not have a job and he was not doing well in his learning. Things were spiraling out of control in a downward spin. To add insult to injury, his landlord decided to raise the rent by a large amount of money per month. Everything seemed to be going wrong with no solution in sight. Things looked bleaker than ever.

R' Motti asked a close friend, whom we will call Rav Avraham, for guidance. Rav Avraham is a big Talmid Chacham, as well as a serious follower of the Bitachon Hotline, The Spring Hill Times, The Hashem Loves You Hotline, and Rav Yehuda Mandel's weekly Thursday night Vaad. Rav Avraham advised him to try writing down, for a seven day trial period, one hundred things every day that he is grateful to Hashem for, such as, "Thank you Hashem for making me so bright and creative", "Thank you Hashem for The Spring Hill Times", "Thank you Hashem for the opportunity to help someone and to feel useful", "Thank you Hashem that my eyes are working", "Thank you Hashem that I have an automobile", "Thank you Hashem that I have eyes, ears, fingers, kidneys".

He also advised him to start writing a journal of ישועות השם, 'Salvations of Hashem' by listing the many times in life when things seemed that they would never work out – and yet Hashem worked everything out, going through life and recording clear examples and heartfully thanking Hashem for all of these salvations.

HaGaon Rav Yehuda Mandel has many notebooks full of how Hashem saved him and helped him through countless challenges and difficult situations.

R' Motti did this exercise as instructed. Within three days, he experienced a tangible turn-around. For the first time in the entire summer, things were working out for his family. By the end of the week, his wife received a job offer that would cover their new budget, with potential for growth. R' Motti started enjoying his family more and more and they responded in kind.

When I heard this story from R' Motti, I asked him where the Torah source is that thanking Hashem one hundred times a day can bring open miracles. He responded that we find that when there was a great plague in the times of Dovid HaMelech, and many

Yidden were losing their lives to this contagious epidemic, Dovid HaMelech instituted saying one hundred brachos a day, and then the plague stopped, and everyone lived in good health.
