
They were advised that in order for them to make the flight on Motzei Shabbos they would have to spend Shabbos near the airport.



Let Us Make Man



When HaShem was creating Adam HoRishon, on Aleph Tishrei which is Rosh HaShono, five thousand seven hundred and eighty four years ago, He employed an unusual phrase: "Na'aseh adam betzalmeinu, let Us make man in Our image."

Who was Hashem speaking to?

The Nefesh Hachaim says that HaShem was calling on the higher world and the lower world to invest in

humanity. And therefore the human being is the summary of the spiritual universe and the physical universe, and everybody is interested in the success of mankind.

But it could be there's another factor at play over here, and that is, when HaShem said "Na'aseh adam betzalmeinu," He's speaking to man himself, and saying, "We need you to participate in the completion of yourself.



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Let me share with you one last thought on baby teeth.

Young children are usually very apprehensive when their teeth are about to fall out. Adults are very quick to reassure them, "Don't worry, it will barely hurt, it might even fall out without you realizing it," and similar types of chizuk.

I think the fears of the children are well founded and rational, after all, their teeth were very strongly connected a short while ago. Severing a strong connection to the human body sounds very painful, similar to the way we would perceive severing a finger. Yet the reality, like adults know, the severing of baby teeth is not a big deal.

The reason for this is because Hashem, in His kindness, arranged that when the permanent teeth begin to grow in, they slowly push and disintegrate the roots of the baby teeth. Therefore there are no firm roots attached to the baby teeth holding them in place and they fall out quickly and easily. This is a chessed that Hashem did for every one of us, not only once, but 20 times, for all our baby teeth. We were probably too young and ignorant to be מכיר טוב to Hashem for this kindness; it began when we were around 5-7 years old. But it's

never too late to be מכיר טוב.

Hashem's wisdom is very apparent in the simple setup of our bite. When we bite down does our higher set of teeth close down on the lower teeth or not? The answer is, it depends on which teeth we are talking about. There is a difference between our front 6 teeth and our back 10 molars. The front teeth close down in front of the bottom teeth, not on top of them. This is different than our molars in the back of our mouth that close down on top of each other.

The reason for this is because the job of our molars is to crush; it can only do this if they close down on each other, creating the necessary pressure to crush the food. If our molars would not meet, it would be impossible to smash to food, even if it would only be semi-hard.

On the other hand the job of our front teeth it to cut. Cutting works great when two sharp cutting edges slightly overlap. That's the way our scissors work, the two sharp blades do not meet, rather one goes directly above the other.

Hashem gave us two types of teeth that do different jobs and bite in two different ways.

This Niflaos HaBorei 2-Minute Audio Shiur is sent out 6 days a week.

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We are approaching the awesome and amazing day of Rosh Hashanah.

With Hashem's help we will get a deeper understanding in the Yom Tov of Rosh Hashanah so

we can get so much chizzuk and insight, that this year 5784 be"H will be a year like never before. Both in Ruchniyus and in Gashmiyus.

Consider the following scenario. One day, you come home and you hear the news that your brother is a Chasan. There is a resounding "Mazal Tov" that comes pouring in from all



directions, followed with a Lechaim. Then we celebrate a Vort with great pomp.

Fast forward a few months and the wedding is approaching. The family turns over their life for approximately a month with the appropriate preparations for the great wedding. If you think about all the preparations that goes into that one night, it's mind boggling.

It's simply beyond comprehension.

Finally, the great day arrives and people come streaming from all over the world to attend this wedding.

Friends, young and old, dance away with all their strength until the wee hours of the night. They

give up from their precious sleep for this young couple. Many people bring their babies as they struggle to control over-tired kids. Others spend a fortune on baby sitters.

We then celebrate seven days of Sheva Brachos with speeches and food while giving up more nights for the couple.

It's simply unbelievable. The love that comes gushing out is not to be believed. People are showing their love B'chol Nafshum, with Mesiras Nefesh. Bichol levavam - with all their heart and soul with their dancing. Bichol Me'odam - with lots of their money.

When a young couple is getting married they are beginning a new home. They are starting a new journey that is going to be wonderful. They are creating together a new world. Therefore, there is an overwhelming amount of excitement, happiness and love that come out at those moments.

Now let's make our way back to Rosh Hashanah. The Seforim teach us that Rosh Hashanah is not just a new year, it's a new world. Everything starts all over again. The Nesivos Shalom

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Eat the lunch that Hashem packed up for you with love and care.

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Fulfill YOUR Mission!

points out that although every day is a new day, but Rosh Hashanah is starting fresh as if the world is being created now.

Perhaps we can give a mashal to understand this. At this time many children

have returned to Yeshiva. They have entered a higher grade, with a new Rebbe and new material (new mesechta). However, the Yeshiva didn't change. On the other hand if someone went to a totally new Yeshiva, this is a whole new level in hischadshus.

Similarly, each day of the world there is a new mission and more material that we need to cover, and one can start anew each day for that reason. However, Rosh Hashanah is a time where the world is starting over again on a totally different plateau. 5783 was one world. Now there is another world of 5784.

We are at the beginning stages of a year full of endless opportunities of growth. A year full of happiness and connecting to Hashem. This should bring forth in us tremendous feeling of excitement, Simcha and Ahava.

Another way to start the



day of Rosh Hashanah amazingly is to give Chizzuk to another person. When we give chizuk on Rosh Hashanah you are launching people on their new year that is currently starting.

In general, Hashem loves it when people are michazek each other and it gives Him a tremendous Nachas Ruach. The Rambam says that the greatest form of Chessed is giving chizuk to others.

This year, the first day of Rosh Hashanah falls out on Shabbos so there is no Shofar [unless Moshiach comes we hopel. However, I would like to say this. Shabbos is loaded with Emuna and Bitachon. It's a day that we abstain ourselves from any work, showing that we trust in Hashem that He will take care of us. We go all the way out buying food and supplies for Shabbos and we show that we believe that Hashem will pay us back.

Shabbos is a day that we show that Hashem is the King over us and the world, as we keep all the halachos of Shabbos. On Shabbos we are mevatel ourselves to Hashem.

Shabbos is a day of joy and gladness, as we sing every week "Menucha Vesimcha Ohr LaYehudim".

So we should realize that although we don't blow with a physical Shofar but each one of us are acting as the Shofar of Rosh Hashanah [some say that this is the reason our Chachamim were able to hold back Shofar because it isn't necessary].

Another feature that Shabbos has is a day of Hoda'ah. A good portion of the day is spent in Shiros Vetishbachos. Whether its Lecha Dodi, all the Zemiros, Nishmas Kol Chai and more, we can see that this is one of the themes of Shabbos.

I heard a tremendous yesod from Rabbeinu Yona [Sha'arei Teshuva 4:12] that the more we praise Hashem the more He will give us more opportunities for praising Him.

Now Hashem created us to praise him and this is our main tafkid. So since we are praising him this is called chaim [as it says 'lo hameisim yehallelu ku']. This itself can be a reason to be granted a new year of life.

Furthermore, the seforim point out from a few Pesukim that tell us that the tachlis of the time of Moshiach is to praise Hashem. So if we are praising and thanking Hashem non stop this is a good reason

for Hashem to bring more opportunities to thank Him and to praise him.

Reb Yoel Rubinfeld Shlit"a pointed out that we see from the Gemara in Sanhedrin that Hashem wanted to make Chizkiyahu Hamelech Moshiach. The generation was worth and he was worthy, but he had

one flaw. That was that he didn't praise and thank Hashem for all the miracles that Hashem had performed.

We see clearly that what held Moshiach back was the lack of praise to Hashem.

Now there is a question that should be asked, and literally it is mind boggling. We have spoken in the past how even the lower class of today's generation has more [in a sense) than kings and queens from centuries ago.



There are many Jewish billionaires and so many luxuries. Why us?

According to what we are saying it's clear. Hashem is giving us so much so it will make it easy to thank him. Just take out a paper, and pay attention to details and you will go on and on.

When we will thank Hashem for all the good that He bestows upon us, Moshiach will finally come. This is why Hashem is giving us so much in this generation - the final moments before Moshiach - in order

that our praise should usher in Moshiach.

This year should be a year of chizuk for all of Klal Yisroel that need chizuk. Especially, people that are confined to hospitals, nursing homes and anyone that has tzaros. May it be the will of Hashem that this Rosh

Hashanah 5784 we should find ourselves hearing the Shofar on Shabbos at the Bais Hamikdash.

If Chalila it's not here by Rosh Hashanah, at least there should be a psak din in heaven that this year should be the year of Geula. May we all rejoice together in good health very soon in Yerushalayim Amein.

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Living With Appreciation By: R' Daniel Shasha

The Midrash notes that if someone were to be judged in court, they will wear black clothes, be unkempt and anxious. Yet lehavdil on Rosh Hashanah when Hashem judges us, we cut our hair and nails, wear white clothes and eat festive meals. Why? The Midrash explains that Klal Yisrael are so confident that Hashem will perform miracles for us and tear up bad decrees, that even now we celebrate!

We also see in navi how Rosh Hashanah is a happy day. Sefer Nechemiah recounts how Klal Yisrael were very dejected when Rosh Hashanah arrived, feeling great remorse for their avairos and were crying. However, Nechemiah told them not to be sad and rather to eat a festive meal since this day is a day of simchah. We are so confident that Hashem will gives us a good judgment that we celebrate! After all, we are being judged by our loving caring Father who wants what is best for us.

The Sefer HaChinuch (311) brings an additional reason why Rosh Hashanah is a happy day, since we are so full of gratitude to Hashem for giving us this opportunity to start afresh. Once a year we have the ability to receive an entire new decree and whatever has been decided last year is a thing of the past. In fact, he writes that if not for this day the world would not be able to continue! Only due to Hashem's great kindness, that He gives us an opportunity to start afresh and to receive new decrees, can the world exist!

Furthermore, we are happy that Hashem has given us the most incredible gift of life until now and continues to give it to us. Each second, we are able to breathe and enjoy another moment of the phenomenal world that Hashem made for us. Rosh Hashanah is a great opportunity for us to express our gratitude for this priceless gift. Really, before davening for a new year of life, it is important that we thank Hashem for the wonderful gift of life that we have experienced until now.

This Tiferes Shlomo brings an allusion to this from our tefilos in the aseres yemai teshuvah. In modim we thank Hashem for the gift of life and for all the miracles that we experience constantly. We then insert an additional phrase u'chtov lechayim tovim..., asking to be inscribed in the book of life. Only when we have first expressed our gratitude, can we ask for more.

Harav Avigdor Miller was very particular not to take the gift of life for granted. One time, on the second night of Rosh Hashanah, he delivered a shiur in his shul. He began by telling his kehillah that 'first of all we need to thank Hashem for the gift of a day in the new year'. When he observed someone chuckle, he remarked: I am being serious, all of us right now must say:

'Thank, You Hashem for the gift of a day in the new year!' (Rabbi Avigdor Miller, His Life and Revolution p. 293)


SELF VALUE

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


- Donny ate there before and thought they would remember his restrictions.

Before You Ask...

Rav Avigdor Miller zt"l would say that before we ask Hashem for another year of life, we must first express our appreciation for last year. This gratitude includes so many aspects, but one of the most important ones is the good health that we enjoyed. Here are his words:

"I gave you another year of life," Hashem says, "and it was much more than life in general. All the needs of your life I gave you." If you're still here, it's a result of thousands and thousands of benefits, thousands and thousands of miracles. Your kidneys were working. Your pancreas was working. Your heart was pounding away every day. Your liver was functioning — did you once this year thank Hashem for your liver? You never even thought about it. All year long your blood circulation was working. Do you know how many miracles there are in your blood? Even your blood clotting — just the fact that you didn't bleed to death every time you got a cut this past year is a miracle! There are nissei nissim in the process of blood clotting. Every process in the body is so deep and profound — it's astounding to contemplate what Hakadosh Baruch Hu is doing for us all the time.

And we want it again. We want a lot! We don't want a little bit; we want everything. We want to be healthy not only in our blood and our pancreas. We want to be healthy in our eyes and healthy in our ears and healthy in our teeth. We want to be healthy in our throats, in our pharynx, in our larynx; going down and down - we want to be healthy in our gullets, healthy in our stomach, healthy in the intestine, healthy in the bladder, healthy in the heart, and in the spleen and the colon. There are a lot of things we need and each one is a very big achievement by itself. Because if a man has health in all of the organs except one chas veshalom he'll discover it's not enough. Oh boy will he discover it then! (Toras Avigdor Shoftim 5783)

Making some sort of *kabbalah* that helps us say Asher Yatzar properly is an excellent way of expressing our *hakaras hatov* to Hashem for 5783, helping us merit another year of good health. Here are some examples: Try accepting on yourself – even once a day for a just a few weeks – to say Asher Yatzar while standing in one place. Or perhaps to think about the wonders of the body before saying the *berachah*. Another idea is to have a *choleh* in mind, which help you have more *kavanah* when saying Asher Yatzar.

May we all be zoche to a kesiva ve'chasima tovah!

One of the names for the neshamah, the human soul, "kavod." is This is because the neshamah is taken from the Kisei Hakavod — Hashem's of Throne Glory itself. Due to its origins,



the neshamah craves honor; therefore, it is natural for a human being to spend his life in search of kavod. In effect, honor is oxygen for the soul, a form of nourishment that satisfies one of the deepest desires of every human being.

Why is the desire for honor so deeply ingrained within the human condition? Ray Yerucham Levovitz explains that this stems from the neshamah's recognition of the purpose of a human being's existence: to promote kevod Shamayim, using both himself and others as vehicles for bringing honor to Hashem. Rav Yerucham adds that the greatness of a human being, and the extent to which he is in touch with his neshamah, can be measured by the degree to which he shows respect to others. When a person treats others with kavod, it is a sign that he has remained cognizant of his purpose as an instrument for bringing honor to Hashem. When a person is disrespectful to others, though, it indicates that he has lost touch with his soul.

The ideal of demonstrating respect to everyone, regardless of their identity or station in life, is exemplified by Rav Shlomo Zalman Auerbach, a gadol who lived in our midst as recently as three decades ago. Throughout his life, Rav Shlomo Zalman epitomized this trait, and while we may not be capable of reaching the same lofty heights he attained, we can certainly try to emulate his example at least within the limits of our abilities.

Rav Shlomo Zalman was once asked to visit a prominent surgeon who was scheduled to operate on a noted talmid chacham; the

askan who contacted him believed that a visit from the gadol hador would motivate the surgeon to take his responsibility even more seriously. When Rav Shlomo Zalman arrived at the

doctor's home, the man was shocked. "Rebbe, what brings you here?" he exclaimed.

"Doctor," Rav Shlomo Zalman said gravely, "you have saved many lives in the course of your work, and a person who saves even one Jewish life is viewed as if he had saved an entire world. You are certainly deserving of a visit." He went on to speak at length about the weighty responsibility borne by every doctor, and spent a few moments discussing the impending operation.

Perhaps the most noteworthy part of Rav Shlomo Zalman's visit, though, was his brief exchange with the surgeon's wife just before he left. Rav Shlomo Zalman noticed that the lady of the house had been listening with great interest from an adjacent room while he spoke with her husband, and as he was about to leave, he made a point of approaching her. "I know that life in the home of a doctor can be very difficult," Rav Shlomo Zalman said, "and I am sure that your husband's busy schedule is often a burden to you as well. As the wife of a doctor, though, you have an equal share in all of the merits he gathers in the course of his work. If you ever feel resentful or displeased, I ask you to remember that your husband is busy because he is involved in saving lives."

The full impact of those few brief sentences was revealed only after Rav Shlomo Zalman's petirah, when the doctor's wife placed a phone call to the askan who had sent the rosh yeshivah to their home. "I must thank you for asking Rav Shlomo Zalman to visit us that day," she said with great emotion. "Our shalom bayis had been suffering terri-

bly, but thanks to his visit, it was completely restored."

With his well-placed words to the doctor's wife. Rav Shlomo Zalman hinted at an important dimension of kavod that is often overlooked. Many of

Rashi brings down in the parsha of Kriyas Shema, "Bechal Levavcha," two Beis's, to serve Hashem with your Yetzer Tov and Yetzer Hara. The obvious question is, how do you serve Hashem with your Yetzer Hara? Let's say someone gives you a compliment,

instead of shrugging it off and saying 'it's not true, you don't really mean it', R' Miller says to think, "Hashem wanted me to hear this compliment. Like Rabbi Miller said, whenever he would Bentch in front of other people, he would give them Hakaras Hatov, and say "Thank you," because he would Bentch with more Kavana when he knew people were looking at him, just like when people look at you, you Daven with more Kavana. So Kavod is a very good thing.

So why is it that we were brought up that Kavod is bad?

That's if you use Kavod the wrong way. Let's say someone criticizes you and makes fun of you, and you get all insulted, you don't speak to that person, and you want to get back at him, that's because of your Kavod, and you're using it the wrong way. That Kavod, stay away from, say "Kavod Hevel Havalim."

However, the Kavod that's going to motivate you to become a better person, that's the best thing in the world! Therefore, you have to view the Yetzer Hara as bringing you closer to Hashem, as a positive thing.

The Quote: ONE WHO GAINS true Bitachon in Hashem not only will experience מנוחת הנפש



but will also experience מנוחת הגוף. He will have a physically and emotionally easier life! How so? The reason is because someone who relies on Hashem, understands that it is Hashem Who is supporting him. Therefore, he knows good and well that he does have any need to take on himself a type of livelihood which is backbreaking or one which will drain him out. To the very contrary, because of the very fact that he puts his reliance only in Hashem he will feel at ease to choose only a job that will

be much less taxing on his body and that will leave him with a good name.

The Lesson: WHAT MAKES THIS QUOTE SO INCREDIBLE and amazing is that we may think that we have to ruin our menuchas haguf to support their family. With bitachon POWER, - bitachon in Hashem, we understand and realize that **we** do not support ourselves at all, *rather* all we have to do is go through some motions of hishtadlus. The Chovos Halevavos is teaching us is that there is no reason to do a job that will take away from your menuchas Haguf or meunchas hanefesh!

THE STORY: JUST BEFORE WORLD WAR II began, when the smell of war was in the



air, a fellow approached HaGaon HaRav Chaim Kriezworth לצוק"ל and said: "I have a request. I see the days of war are approaching and nobody knows what their future or fate will be. We are living with the thoughts of "who will live and who will die". Therefore, I am concerned of what will be with me in the coming days, so I ask the Rov if I can give him my information where I have my money kept in one of the Swiss banks, and if I don't make it through this war ו"ה, and the Rov survives I ask that the Rov to pass over the information to one

of my children or relatives so that they will be able to use the money."

After the war, Rav Kriezworth related to an audience; "Bichasdei Shamayim I survived the war and for over twenty-five years I searched high and low hoping that I would be able to find

out what happened to this man and maybe even find a relative of his, but I did not manage. One day, I was travelling by train in one of the cities in America. Sitting next to me was a fellow who by taking one look, one saw that he was an 'Y' of the highest level and he suffered terribly because of his situation. During the ride the fellow began to pour out his heart and relate to me all of his troubles. He mentioned between his sobs that he came to America empty handed with no money, no family and no profession. Bare handed.

I asked the fellow, "Tell me, what is your name?" I was shocked to hear his last name. It was the same name as the one who gave me his bank information before the war.

"Are you related to so and so?" I asked him. "Yes", he said "that was my father!"

I did not hesitate a moment and I told him that his father left me his bank information before the war with instructions to give it over to someone from his family. The עני told me that he did not have the money to fly to Switzerland. I told him that he doesn't have to worry about it, I would be happy to lend him the money he needed.

When the fellow retrieved his father's money he was astounded, and shocked to have received a Yerusha of three quarters of a Million dollars (!) which in those days, was worth far more than it is today!

We can learn a great lesson from this story. This is a mashel for all of us! All that we are meant to have we have already and is there waiting for us. We are like the "wealthy man" who didn't know he was rich. Therefore, all the extra toil and lack of menuchas Haguf to receive it, is unnecessary. Hashem could give what is coming to you without you having to overwork yourself to receive it!



Q. There is a Chazal in the Gemara Chagiga 5b, that if a person does an Aveira one day of the year, it is as if he did the aveira the whole year.

We all know that Hakadosh Baruch Hu is our loving caring Father. He's always looking to give us more Zchusim. The Gemara two lines before this says that if one does a Mitzva one day of the year, it's as if he did it the whole year. Hashem is looking to do good. Why over here do we see something that feels so negative?

Why doesn't Hashem look at the rest of the year when he didn't do the aveira? Why is He focusing on the one day that he did the aveira?

A. My Rebbi gave me over a very important Mesorah from his Rebbeim that the point of every single Chazal is to motivate you to become a bigger, better, happier, healthier person, to give you more Menuchas Hanefesh and Simchas Hachaim, and to bring you to a closer connection to Hashem. If it's not doing that, either you're misunderstanding Chazal or it's not for you.

How can we understand this without walking away with a negative emotion? The answer is like this.



The Gemara is talking about a person who wants to do the Mitzva every day of the year or wants to do the Aveira every day of the year.

B'Nogea the Mitzva, he was so busy preparing he could only do it one day of the year. The flip side is that the person really wants to do the Aveira every day of his life, but he was so busy preparing he only managed to do it once. But he dreams and he wishes that he could do the Averia every single day.

What about the famous concept we all know, that by a Machshava Ra, Hakadosh Baruch Hu doesn't consider it as if you did it? That's because, Rabbi Miller said, a Yid isn't really sincere about his bad thoughts. Because he's not sincere, he doesn't get a punishment as if he did it.

In contrast, this Gemara is talking about a person who is an exception to that rule. He's only doing it today, but he wishes he could



do it every day, he just wasn't able to.

It's just like by the Meraglim. The Meraglim wanted to spy out every part of Eretz Yisrael, even if it would have taken forty years, so the punishment lasted forty years. So it comes out that this Gemara in Chagiga is talking about a Rasha, just like the Meraglim, Rashi says they were Reshaim. It's talking about a Rasha, someone who lives with Aveiros, he loves Aveiros, and he wishes he could do it every day. The Gemara says, you want to

do an Aveira every day, so Hakadosh Baruch Hu gives you whatever you wanted to do, Machshava K'Maaseh.

It comes out that this Chazal is not Nogea to anybody listening to a Life of Bitachon, to anyone reading the Spring Hill Times, or to any Frum Yid.

No Frum Yid wants to do an Aveira every single day. Nobody wakes up in the morning wishing he could do an Aveira. So this Gemara is not relevant to anybody who is a Frum Heimishe Yid. So therefore, right there you can't walk away with anything negative, because it's not relevant for you. Chazal were not talking to you, they were talking to Reshaim.

In addition, even in the Middas Hadin for the Rasha, you'll still find Hashem's Rachamim, because Hashem even loves Reshaim too. There are two aspects of Middas Harachaim here. Regarding the Meraglim, the Mefarshim say that this that they had to stay in the Midbar forty years instead of forty days was a tremendous Chessed, because this way everyone in Klal Yisrael from twenty to sixty didn't have to all die at once in a forty day span, which would have been extremely traumatic, and the ones who were twenty were able to live to sixty, otherwise they would have had to die at age twenty and forty days. Hashem wanted to give them more of a chance to enjoy life and do Teshuva. The second point is that this that the Gemara is teaching that the Rasha who did the Aveira one day



it's as if he did an Aveira every day of the year, is also a tremendous Chessed, because when someone does Teshuva, the Aveira turns into a Mitzva. For example, someone who wishes he could eat Chazer every day, he's looking to get it, but he only managed to eat it one day, it's considered as if he ate Chazer every day. When he does Teshuva on this Aveira, it's as if he ate a Korban – and it is as if he ate a Korban 365 days of the year!

Therefore, it's actually an opportunity and an incentive to get tremendous amounts of Schar for doing Teshuva.



Bitachon Perspective

Q. I am a teacher, and I have to be absent for one day. The school asked me to find a substitute. I turned to my sister-in-law, who's an experienced teacher, and asked her if she would be willing to fill in for me. She responded, 'if you're stuck, and there's no one else, I'll fill in for you'.

The

However, I suspect that she's only consenting because she feels uncomfortable turning me down.

The truth is, there is another person who would be happy to substitute, however, she's inexperienced, and doesn't really know what she's doing. Perhaps it's not right for the class to have such a sub.

What is the right thing to do?

A. Rav Yisroel Falk responded: You're not allowed to put someone on the spot who will agree against her true will.

Therefore, in your situation your sister-in-law is not considered an option. Practically, you only have one option – the inexperienced teacher who's willing to sub happily.

Q. I hear on 'A Life With Bitachon', that if I choose to go out of my way and do favors for others, it's imperative that it should be done whole-heartedly, and not accompanied with resentment. Which exercises can I do to work on doing favors with joy?

A. Here are two exercises:

Tell yourself, 'If I go the extra mile and do favors for others even though I'm not expected to do so, Hashem will act with me מדה כנגד מדה and do favors for me, even when I don't deserve it'. It comes out, that when you help someone else, in reality you're helping yourself.

Another exercise: The Steipler writes that it was already nigzar on Rosh Hashanah how much tza'ar and agmas nefesh each person is supposed to undergo during the course of the year. If a person receives tza'ar by means of a mitzva it will be deducted from his cheshbon.

Therefore, you should tell yourself, that when you go out of your way to help others, you are sparing yourself from receiving tza'ar in other forms of pain, such as car accidents and trips to the hospital R"L.

Q. My husband has a business, and recently he's been very successful and is making a lot of money. People are hearing that we have money, and a lot of people are coming to us for tzedakah. Since my husband has a big heart, he gives them whatever they ask for, and it feels like people are taking advantage

A. The Gemara says that tzedaka saves a person from yissurim. Therefore, when people are coming to ask for tzedakah, in reality, they are saving you and your family from car accidents and trips to the hospital R"L.

Also note, giving tzedaka is the best investment you could make. The Rambam teaches that no one becomes poor from giving tzedaka. On the contrary, tzedakah makes a person rich, and Hashem will even give him back double.

Would you feel bad that people are taking advantage of you by saving you from car accidents and making you get rich?!

Q. I have an acquaintance who can be very nosy. She tends to ask me all sorts of personal questions about my private life. I can't tell her to step back, because she will feel very insulted. Now I'm stuck having to deal with her. What's the right attitude about my situation?

A. We have to remember that every bit of tzar and agmas nefesh that is coming to us was already nigzar on Rosh Hashanah. It can happen through car-accidents and trips to hospital, alternatively it can come about through the pain of doing a chessed to someone else.

This acquaintance of yours is the greatest gift you have in your life! She's sparing you from terrible things happening in exchange for a little bit of time and patience. Whenever she seems to be 'interfering' with your life, you should know that you just had a stroke of good fortune.

Q. My husband was diagnosed with depression, and I'm devastated that I won't have a functional husband. I also feel sorry for my children that their fate is to have a father who is depressed. I tried davening that he should get out of it, but I didn't see any results. Is there anything more Hashem wants me to do?

A. The first thing Hashem wants from you is to thank Him. Now that you see how terrible it is to be depressed, thank Him that you were not diagnosed with depression, and your children aren't depressed.

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Next, despite your husband

depression, he certainly has other ma'alos. Thank Hashem for your husband's ma'alos.

Program your brain to see all the chessed and bracha that's in your life. Make yourself so busy thanking Hashem that you won't even have time to worry over your husband's condition.

The z'chus of focusing on Hashem's chessed is so great, that it could cause your husband to have a complete recovery. Q. I had to go out of town, and I asked my siblings if they could babysit my children for a couple of hours. But no one agreed: one was busy, another wasn't feeling so well; each one had their own reason. Although I understand where they were coming from, I still felt hurt. Don't they see that I'm desperate? Aren't family members supposed to go the extra mile?

A. The Chofetz Chaim writes: Included in the concept of hashgacha is the principle that when a person needs a favor, Hashem

is the One who decrees which person is going to be the shaliach to do the favor.

Therefore, if someone is not willing to do you a favor, there is no reason to be upset with him. It simply means that he is not the person who Hashem decreed to carry out the favor for you.

It's like if you're looking for a person called Reuven. You see someone and

you think that it's Reuven, and you walk over to him. But the person says, "I'm sorry. I'm not Reuven: I'm Shimon."

Would you get upset at him, "But I need Reuven! Why aren't you Reuven?" It's utter foolishness. He's not Reuven. What do you want from him?

It's the same way when you ask someone to do you a favor and he turns you down. That simply means that he's not the one who was supposed to help you. Hashem decreed that 'Reuven' should be the one to do the favor for you, and the person who you asked is 'Shimon'.

If you are having trouble finding 'Reuven', turn to Hakadosh Baruch Hu and say, "I don't know where my help is supposed to come from. But I know that it is You who is running the world for my good. I'm leaving it up to You to help me out." And when you rely on Hashem, He will show you openly how He will help you out.
