a whole bunch of Shul caravans with people going to and from shul, but it didn't explode or hurt anyone!! It had 20 kilo of explosives and made a 6 foot crater in the ground. See picture.

It fell right before Kol Hane'arim so there were many women and children outside at the time. All four shuls next to where it dropped, are built as a 'binyan kal' which means the whole thing is just a metal frame with plaster and cinder block walls with no safe rooms. On top of everything, due to technical issues the sirens in that neighborhood weren't working so every time a siren went off the people heard it very faintly. If you were in the shul you didn't hear them at all. Rumors were going around that there were going to be sirens

in Yerushalayim at 6 p.m. to-



night. 6 p.m. came and went, but there have not been sirens since yesterday morning!

- There were no Hatzalah calls related to rockets or missiles in Yerushalayim! [as of when this letter was written.]
- The city of Ofakim has been cleared of terrorists now!
- A tremendous Kiddush Hashem has been created over the past two days.
- Jews of all stripes and backgrounds are giving chizuk to each other and

davening
for the safety of their
brothers
and sisters.
Cars filled
with freshly baked
goods, tons

of snacks, letters, and toiletries have been sent to the army bases. Soldiers have been putting on tefillin. Men and bochurim have been learning with hasmadah during bein hazmanim.

- A Chassidish man was driving his car, when he heard a siren. He ran out of his car and a rocket hit it then, and exploded, while he watched this happenfrom safety!
- There is a woman in Yerushalayim ordering tons of camouflage tzitzis, and many soldiers are ordering them, possibly putting on tzitzis for the first time!
- Over 2,000 Afghanistan's were killed in a tremendous earthquake just yesterday. Afghanistan had promised to join in the fight against Israel. Hashem is amazing!!! Let us daven that they and all the other countries will be unsuccessful!



It had rained for seven days straight in Lakewood, New Jersey (Except for a few hours on one day - enough time for people to put up their Sukkos). On Friday Erev Shabbos and Yom Tov it *mabuled* all over New York and New Jersey and a record amount of rain fell, flooding streets in Monsey, Brooklyn and Lakewood. Weather Forecasts

predicted that it was going to continue to rain non-stop

the entire first night of Sukkos and first day of Sukkos until noon...

Yidden in Brooklyn, Monsey, Lakewood and all over the Tri-State area were extremely worried. The way things seemed, they would not be able to be mekayim the Mitzvah of Sukkah on the first night. They couldn't entertain the thought that Hashem did not want their mitzvah.

Over fifty people reached out to Rabbi Golombeck for chizuk on decorations in the rain how to deal with the crises. One woman told Rabbi Golombeck that she davened to Hashem that it shouldn't rain, by saying the entire Sefer Tehillim!!!

A man told Rabbi Golombeck that he could not cheer up his wife. She was devastated. He said 'It was Pikuach Nefesh' that Rabbi Golombeck give her Chizuk. A man told me that the day before Yom Tov he kept on repeating to Hashem, "We love You and we love Your Mitzvah of Sukkah!!!"

Yidden all over New York and New Jersey stormed the Heavens with prayer and Bitachon.

I said to myself, as many other Yidden did, that there was no way Hashem is going to make it rain on the first night. It just can't be. I kept checking on Erev Yom Tov the weather app (on my kosher flip phone) but nothing was budging. It kept on predicating non-stop rain till midday the

first day of Yom Tov.

On Erev Yom Tov, about 2 p.m. I went with my children into the Sukkah, in the pouring rain, to hang up the decorations. We hung them up with such Simcha! The rain dripped into our eyes, nose, ears and mouth but we never had such a fun time hanging up Sukkah decorations! It was such a pleasure showing Hashem how much we love his Mitzvos!

At about 4 p.m. the Shul sent out a text message with instructions from the Rav what to do Leil Sukkos in the rain.

I kept on checking again and again waiting to see some improvement in the prediction. Baruch Hashem something changed and it said that it was going to be dry from around 5 p.m. - 6 p.m. Still not a Yeshuah but an improvement!

OUTPOUR OF LOVE COMES FORTH FROM HASHEM

Suddenly the weather forecast showed that it was going to stop raining for a couple of hours until about 9:00 P.M. What a simcha!!! We went crazy with joy. It was a dream come true. I texted Rabbi Golombeck that things started looking better here in Monsey and He told me that in Lakewood too! At that point my bitachon kicked in and I said to myself, "That's it! Hashem is not going to make it rain. For sure!"

I told my wife that I wasn't going to take my raincoat to shul. "It's not going to rain." Even though it looked quite threatening outside.

Before Ma'ariv, the Rav spoke about how to make kiddush and start the Seudah in the rain. I whispered to the guy next to me, "It's good to know the halachos but it's not going to rain!"

After ma'ariv, it was not raining. I ran home to quickly make Kiddush and Hamotzei in the Sukkah. There was such an excitement in the air!!! We kept on singing 'Chasdei Hashem'. We couldn't believe that we were actually able to make a Leishev and be mekyaim the mitzvah!

The meal proceeded. I kept on waiting for the rain to come back but it didn't! Chasdei Hashem! When the meal was over I told my wife, "Hashem deserves a double as-good-bentching from

me."

I was sure that by the time we went to sleep it would be raining again. But no! It stayed dry! It stayed dry the entire night! Until about 7:35 a.m. the exact time when we needed to get up for Shacharis! Then it started raining lightly!

The Rav by his weekly drasha before mussaf, spoke about the open love Hashem showed us with withholding the rain the entire night! Against the weather forecast, up until right before Yom Tov!

By the time Shacharis was over it was dry again!

A very similar story repeated itself in Brooklyn and in Lakewood, New Jersey! It was the talk of the town everywhere!

Hashem made it pour buckets before Sukkos and then made it stop in time for the mitzvah! There is no greater sign of bracha!

And of course we also cannot forget the beautiful warm days of Chal Hamoed Hashem gave us!

There is No Such Thing As Hashem Doesn't Want Our Mitzvah!

Chazal seem to indicate that if it rains on Sukkos it is a siman klalah - a sign that Hashem isn't interested in our Mitzvah. However this is impossible, because a person has a Chiyuv Min Ha-Torah on Yom Tov to be happy. Understanding Chazal this way, will destroy a person's Simchas Yom Tov and cause him to not fulfill a Mitzvah Doraisa! In addition we say every day: אוהב עמו Hashem always loves us.

קללה backwards is הלל ק. It is something that we need to thank Hashem 100 times for! It's Love and Bracha but just hidden! When Hashem makes it rain on Sukkos, He **makes it appear** as if He isn't interested in our Mitzvah so as to test us to see our reaction: Will we show a longing for the Mitzvah or not (like the Goyim Le'asid Lavo). But in truth, His love for Klal Yisrael and their Mitzvos is something that will never ever diminish, Chas V'shalom. [Rabbi Golombeck]



Living With Apprechation By: R' Daniel Shasha

How phenomenal was the creation of the world! It went from absolute nothingness to having mountains, hills, oceans, lakes, trees, flowers, fish, animals, and most importantly, humans. The account of maaseh bereishis is truly fascinating, yet why did Hashem create this beautiful world? And why were we created? To answer these questions, let's look at one of the first Midrashim.

Chazal darshan the first word in the Torah bereishis to read bishvil raishis, 'because of the first' a reference to the first crop offered in Yerushalayim, the bikurim. The Alshich explains that the whole essence of bikurim is gratitude to Hashem for giving us produce. Therefore, Chazal are telling us that gratitude is so fundamental that it is the reason for the creation of the world! Another Midrash teaches that this is also why Hashem created mankind in order to praise Hashem. We and the stunning world around us were created to thank Hashem! Fascinating!

Throughout our day we have countless opportunities to express our gratitude. We recite many berachos, recite pesukai dezimra, modim, aleinu, etc. We say phrases like Baruch Hashem, chasdai Hashem etc. These are all ways of fulfilling the reason for the creation of the entire world and the reason why we are here.

It is very interesting that during the berachah of refa'einu, when we daven for health, we say Ki tihilasainu Ata, 'for You are our praise'. What is the connection? Rav Chaim Kanievsky explains that we are asking Hashem for health so that we can praise Him since this is the reason why we and the world were created! Praising Hashem gives us health and life since we are fulfilling the purpose for which we and the world were created!

Each second, we are surrounded by such tremendous blessings. We can see, walk, talk, and breathe; we have shelter over our heads; friends and family who are there for us. The list just goes on and on. Each day in modim, we say 've'al nisecha shebechol yom imanu', thanking Hashem for the miracles which happen to us constantly. Just pausing for a few moments taking note of these miracles can add tremendous meaning to our lives, as we see in the following story.

A bachur in the Manchester Yeshivah was undergoing a very difficult nisayon. He approached his Rosh Yeshiva, the renowned gadol, Rav Yehudah Zev Segal, who gave him life changing advice. He said 'each night when you daven Maariv, and you say the words, veal nisecha shebechol yom imanu, you should think of a certain miracle that happened to you that day." Determinedly, he followed this practice each day and it made a huge impact on his life and he became a very chashuvah talmid hacham. He exclaimed, "For forty years, each night I did what my Rosh Yeshiva suggested, and I can testify wholeheartedly that there wasn't one day all these years that I didn't find some miracle to praise Hashem for."

May we be zocheh to thank Hashem for His constant gifts and miracles; fulfilling the reason why we and the entire world at large was created!

Learning the Parasha with Rav Yehuda Mandel Shlita

l always wondered why was Dovid's life totally involved in הטבה במקום הקפדה. He never points at his enemies and says, "You are the problem in my life." Instead he always forgives and he only sees הקב"ה in them. He loves and respects שאול אבנר אבשלום who were his worst enemies even though they all hated him and wanted to kill him.

Part II

דוד was actually the last 70 years that אדם הראשון lost. The main problem with אדם הראשון was when he blamed חוה for his sin. האשה אשר האשר מור (כפוי טוב). The זוה"ק says that he would have been somewhat forgiven right away for his sin, but saying

that it's הקב"ה's fault because He gave him חוה for a wife, was his true major sin.

Part III

We can suggest ב"ס that this is why דוד was so involved in forgiving his enemies. He was being מתקן אדם. When you see a human before you and you don't realize that he is only a נסיון in disguise then you fail to understand the basic truth of your existence.

Part IV

You were created to work on your middos and when you love your enemies without blaming them then you are living with the truth. The people in your life simply don't count. They are just tests מן השמים. This is why דוד was always מודה on all his wrong-doing וחטאתי on all his wrong-doing מדות."

Part V

Not like כי יראתי- את העם -ואשמע בקולם. He didn't take responsibility for his actions. Rav Wainkrantz ז"ל told me that in your life there is only 'you' and הקב"ה testing you via the people in your life. This is why דוד's greatest accomplishment was when he said about שמעי בן גרא (who was cursing him) שמעי בן גרא - it's not him, it's הקב"ה.

Part VI



"Did the Rav forget to tell me about an upcoming Yom Tov? Is today possibly Shabbos, and

I lost calculation?!"

When he saw a Yid coming down the street holding his tallis and tefillin, he was comforted that at least it wasn't Shabbos. "Excuse me," he asked the man. "Why are all stores closed the and the streets empty?"

"Today is a taanis tzibbur," the man answered, and continued on his way.

The farmer accepted the explanation, but it disturbed him greatly. "Why didn't the Ray tell

me about this when I was last in town?" he wondered. "I already ate today and davened the wrong tefillos!"


Leaving his donkey and his produce, he ran to shul to ask the Rav why he wasn't informed of this upcoming fast day the last time he had been by the Rav. "Today is not a calendar fast," the Rav told him. "You're surely aware of our lack of rain. When the heavens seem to be shut for us, then we call for a day of fasting, so that we can call out to Hashem and beg for His mercy."

The innocent man wasn't convinced. "I don't see the need for such a burden on the people."

"Well, how else do you suggest we deal with the problem?" "When I sense that my field isn't getting enough rain," the man told the Rav, "I turn to Hashem and I say, 'Father, we are in need of rain!' Soon after, the rain starts coming."

"If so, then do the same now," the Rav requested of him.

Diligently, the farmer then went over to the corner, turned to Hashem and said, "Hashem, your people need rain. Do You want them to die Continued on from drought?!"



Soon after that, dark clouds started to form, and plentiful rain came down. (Tiferes L'Moshe, p. 57)

This incredible story shows the great power of a simple-minded tefillah. Hashem is there for each of us, and is ready to give us all the good in the world. This temimos'dikah tefillah has even a greater ability of being answered, as it comes with no complicated calculations or caveats. Simple belief that Hashem is listening to us and desires to fulfill our needs is

what brought about the yeshuah for this farmer in even an abnormal fashion.

The gift of tefillah is given to each and every person. This means is that Hashem is telling us that EVERY SINGLE PERSON, without exception, can merit great yeshuos. When approaching Hashem with simplicity, knowing that Hashem listens to each and every one of us every time we turn to Him, our reliance on Him is strengthened, and we will be granted our requests.

This is reflected by the following halachah: If someone during his davening mistakenly says "V'sein tal u'matar" in the middle of the summer, he must repeat Shemoneh Esrei. Now, even if this man is in Yerushalayim, a place where it almost never rains at that time of year, he still must go back and repeat his davening because he uttered a request at the wrong time.

Do we really think that Hashem would take his tefillah seriously and make it start raining

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Put Hashem there instead!

in the middle of a bright, sunny day? Moreover, the person we're discussing didn't even request rain with any real kavanah, and yet we're still concerned that his tefillah is going to bring rain?

We learn from here: that each and every individual has the enormous power, regardless who he is or what he is intending. Therefore, he must repeat his davening.

CLUELESS!

An additional story that brings out this concept is relayed by the great tzaddik, R' Gamliel Rabinowitz:

There was a particular family whose mother had raised them on a kibbutz. She merited to see every one of their children grow to become great talmidei chachamim and rabbanim. What was the secret behind their success?

Their great-grandmother had grown up behind the Iron Curtain in Russia, and therefore never received any formal Yiddishe education. She knew nothing of Torah or mitzvos, but there was one thing she remembered from her mother: lighting Shabbos candles on Friday night. Although she

hadn't known what Shabbos was, she nevertheless would light candles on Friday night. She also recalled her mother davening with great kavanah for her children's success after she lit, and so that was all that this daughter continued doing.

Not knowing much, when she was able to leave and come to Eretz Yisrael, she initially settled in a kibbutz far from where any frum Yidden lived, and became inculcated in the ways of the chilonim.

When it came time for her to light Shabbos candles and daven for her children, with her simplemindedness, she davened that they should grow to be like Ben Gurion, the big rasha. She was convinced that he was the biggest "tzaddik" of the generation, as he had been the one chosen to run the country.

One day, she saw that Ben Gurion had made a trip to the heilege Chazon Ish. At that meeting, the Chazon Ish persuaded him to drop his terrible plans for policies that went against the spirit of Yiddishkeit. When she heard this, she understood that there must be someone more special person than Ben Gurion (as she didn't know the difference between the two!).

So, her Friday night tefillos switched to now request that her children be as great as the Chazon Ish, since she figured that he was an even bigger tzaddik if he had been able to persuade Ben Gurion.

As a result of these tefillos, she merited that her children and grandchildren should be outstandingly special and devoted to Hashem and his Torah.

R' Gamliel Rabinowitz explained that we learn from this story the effect of the tefillah of even a simple woman, coming from the depths of her heart. She merited to raise outstanding children and grandchildren without even known the basics of Yiddishkeit. Hashem listens to everyone's tefillos, and thus she was able to get such a wonderful family.

How much more power do we then have? Baruch Hashem, we who were given the proper chinuch and are able to serve Hashem properly are certainly able to access this wellspring of berachah. By believing in the power of our tefillos we'll see their results (Tiv Hischazkus, Hallel V'hoda'ah, p. 449).


Hashem'. As holy and special our Minhagim and nusachim are, they cannot overshadow and take up more focus than Hashem Himself!

Did you know?

We're lucky to live in today's generation. When we do even the smallest, tiniest mitzvah, Hashem magnifies it a thousand times. We are in galus for more than two thousand years, and still doing mitzvos? Our tiniest mitzvos are bigger than Amoraim and Tannaim's mitzvos. When we do an aveira, Hashem is dan l'kaf zchus; how can more be expected of us?!

R' Chatzkal, brought down in the sefer Shaar Hageula





are very active. It seems like both of our jaws – the higher jaw and the lower jaw are in constant motion, moving up and down. The truth is that our two jaws work very differently from each other. Our bottom jaw is the one that's constantly moving – biting, chewing and crushing, as opposed to our higher jaw and the upper set of teeth that are inside it, which are fixed and not too movable.

Let's think about this for a moment. Why did Hashem set it up this way? Well, if our top jaw was the active one – or even if both of our jaws were equally active, our faces would be in constant motion when we eat. Every bite would jilt it up and down. Even when we speak, this would occur - but on a smaller level. This would make it very difficult for us when we eat to focus on anything – like the person across the table or reading material. It's not too conducive for ישוב הדעת. in addition, perhaps this constant movement thousands and thousands of times each day is not so healthy for the brain, it would keep shaking it around. This is besides for the fact that it would diminish the respect that the human face calls for.

הקב"ה with His חכמה created the upper jaw stationary to assist us in a number of ways, like we mentioned. The movements of eating and speaking are confined to the lower jaw which is at the bottom of the face.

To smile – and to do an act of חסד like it's מבואר

When we eat and chew, our mouth and teeth in the גמרא – contains the power to gladden and strengthen others, and to build relationships. Smiling is also very beneficial for the person himself who is smiling to others. As the saying goes, "Whatever you do for others, you're really doing for yourself." This actually applies to both our emotional and physical health.

> Smiling releases a hormone in our brain, it improves our mood and makes us feel happier. So when we feel down and start to dream of different ideas to lift our spirits, instead of heading to the refrigerator or searching for some other distraction, just find some people to smile at. That's a simpler and quicker way to change your mood. You can also pick up a priceless מצוה of חסד on the way. Our physical health also benefits from smiling in a number of ways.

> Studies show that smiling reduces blood pressure, boosts our immune system, increases our endurance, and reduces stress and pain. Laughter is the best medicine. We cannot laugh without smiling, and that helps us our both emotionally and physically. These two fields work together, as we know that our physical health is greatly influenced by our emotional state. Smiling is always important, but if you're down or in pain, then it's extra important. It might be hard to do, but it's worth the extra push.

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The Rambam in Hilchos Yesodei Hatorah Chapter 2 Halacha 2 and in the Sefer Chovos Halevuvos in Shaar Habichina in the first paragraph of the hakdama, both say that when one contemplates the amazing wisdom and complicated structure and mechanism of everything in Nature, one immediately comes to recognize the amazing Yad Hashem in them. The Chovos Halevuvos says that proper study of Nature is the quickest way to strengthen one's Emunah. Everything in Nature shows very complex design — and where there is complex design, a Designer exists and that of course is Hashem. From atoms and molecules, to plants, to animals, to humans — the

world screams: "Something very Intelligent created me! I didn't just pop into existence by accident!" The method I use is basically the method taught by Hagoan Hatzadik Horav Avigdor Miller ZT"L.

Let us begin with something so complex, and yet so very simple, that we tend to overlook its great message.

Let us begin by studying a simple orange.

THE ORANGE

The simple orange contains unimaginable wisdom and design.



Orange fruit on a tree testifying to the world the Greatness of their Creator.

First, the tree's main ingredients are sunlight, earth, water [and time, if you want to call that an "ingredient"] and of course the orange pit. Ok, so, let's start by considering the actual trunk and branches of the orange tree. (Of course, the following not only applies to the orange tree, but to other trees as well.) They consist of wood.

But let's ask ourselves, where did the wood come from?! From the water? Obviously not. Wood and water are two entirely different substances. Did the wood come from the sunlight, then? Of course not. How about from the orange pit? That can't be either, since the pit is also not wood. So, it must have come from the earth, right? Well, besides the fact that wood is clearly not the same material as earth, there's another problem with this assumption. Let's do a little experiment. Say you placed an orange pit in 500 pounds of earth and waited fifteen years or so for a well-developed orange tree to grow. If you measured the dirt surrounding the tree fifteen



years later, guess how many pounds of earth there would be? That's right, about 500 pounds!

Where, then, did this ton or so of wood of the tree come from? How did this complex combination come about? How did the microorganisms, (tiny live organisms which live in the earth), know how to combine completely unrelated materials into a "live" tree?

The human equivalent would be an incredibly huge factory with dozens of highly trained and skilled technicians (the microorganisms in the earth) working to create a car using only some paper, rubber bands, and paper clips (the water, sunlight, and pit). It's highly unlikely that they would succeed no matter what machinery or chemicals they would use. Yet, without any tools or machinery, from the little orange pit is produced a large tree with hundreds of fruits on it. Fruits that even have the ability to reproduce themselves! Somehow, one pit turns into thousands. It's truly amazing. It's a miniature factory, yet it has no foreman, no blueprints, no electricity, and still, it works!

Let's examine this a little further next week B'ezras Hashem.





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
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
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Hashem is the 'Borei Refuos'. In order to understand the word Borei, we can learn it from another place. It says Yotzer Or and Borei Choshech in the Shacharis of Yom Tov/Shabbos. The word Borei means to create something from nothing. Indeed, with regards to Refuos we find numerous examples where medications have come from the most unexpected places, thereby coming from "nowhere", and have made dramatic changes in mortality

and morbidity.

For example, 'Angiotensin Converting Enzyme Inhibitors' (ACE inhibitors) make up a critical armament for heart failure and have been shown to be of the very few medications to lower morbidity and mortality in heart failure. The active ingredient in the first ACE inhibitor, captopril, was actually derived from poisonous snake venom of the Brazilian viper (Bothrops Jaraca)!


Collective grunts of frustration were heard from all sides. A few hours delay was not on anyone's plane plans for the day.

He demanded.

- Q. The Gemara in the end of Meseches Kiddushin says: The world needs boys and girls. Lucky is the one who has boys and woe is to the one who has girls.
- 1. It seems as Chazal are giving us a negative view on something that Hashem does. How can that be?
- 2. Hashem is running a perfect world and everything He does is perfect. If this man would have boys then it would be poison for him, so why is it 'woe' for

him?


- 3. There is no intrinsic value in boys or girls. It's all ratzon Hashem. So what's the difference between the two?
- 4. What message is Chazal trying to teach us? Is that the attitude that we are supposed to have when someone has a girl?

A. It's amazing how when someone doesn't understand properly the Gemara, it can turn them into a person who is lacking in his belief in Hashem, and doesn't believe that everything that Hashem does is perfect. That's why some people can fall into the trap of thinking, "Nebbach, I had a girl. B'dieved, I had a girl...."

Chas veshalom, rachmana litzlan! A girl is lechatchila shebechatchila!! My Rebbe said that whenever you find such a Chazal, you'll always find the opposite Chazal. In the Gemara in Bava Basra, R' Yochanan said he liked daughters better than sons. It's a clear Gemara that says that daughters are even better than sons. We all know that b'zchus nashim tzidkaniyos nigalu by Mitzrayim. We find in many places in Tanach that Klal Yisroel only continue to exist in the merit of the women. We know that the mirrors from Mitzrayim were used for the Kiyar. We find that Amram didn't want to have any more children, but his daughter told him, "You have to have children!" We see in many places that actually the daughters saved Klal Yisroel. We are only existing because of the daughters!

Of course, daughters are l'chatchila shebichatchila. When a person has a girl, they have to realize that it's the happiest thing in the world! Wouldn't it have been better to have a boy? No. The girl was born at the moment that if she wasn't born, the world would've been destroyed.

So then what is this Chazal telling us? What are we supposed to learn from this? The answer is that Chazal are telling us the halacha perspective, the halacha attitude. There's a halacha in the Shulchan Aruch that if two people are drowning, a boy and girl, you




should save the boy. Why? Because boys are obligated in more mitzvos. Our job as an Eved Hashem is to serve Hashem with what we see in front of our eyes. So we see that by saving a boy, there will be more mitzvos in the world, it will be promoting mitzvos, and we're always supposed to promote mitzvos. That's how we serve Hashem.

R' Chaim Kanievsky says a similar point, that within the first forty days, we should daven for

a boy, because a boy is obligated in more mitzvos. The Chazal is teaching us this perspective, that when it comes to halacha, such as in the case of saving a life, or davening before the baby is born, the boy takes precedence. (Similarly, a man makes the bracha of "shelo asani isha" because he is obligated in more mitzvos.)

However, this is only in the Olam Hanigleh (the revealed world), not the Olam Hanistar (the hidden world). When a woman makes the bracha "she'asani kirtzono" she is thanking Hashem for creating her as she is (as Hashem wanted to create her). Even though



according to the Olam Hanigleh, it looks to us like the boys have more kedusha because they have more mitzvos, she knows that in reality it is the best thing that she was created as a girl.

In the Olam Hanigleh, it looks like a boy brings more kavod shamayim and is serving Hashem more than a girl, but the reality is not like that. In the Olam Hanistar, which is the Olam of Emunah and Bitachon, if she was to have been born a boy, there would be less kavod shamayim. If Hashem made a girl, that is because the world would be imperfect without her, and that is how the biggest kavod shamayim will come out.



Q. I am a mother to a large family. When my husband comes home at the end of the day, he often sees me struggling to take care of all the kids simultaneously. However, instead of offering help, he goes straight to the couch and relaxes. I tried every hishtadlus to explain to him that I desperately need an extra pair of hands, but he always responds that he's two too tired to help. Whenever this happens, I become very annoyed and frustrated.

The

What should be my perspective about this?

A. In Novardohk they would teach that whenever a person feels frustrated, he should zoom into his emotions and see what's bothering him. Then he could take the 'emunah and bitachon perspective medication'.

If what's bothering you is that you feel, 'all because my husband is not willing to help, I have to work so hard', your medication is to understand that Hashem is the one who decides how much you have to work, not your husband.

If Hashem wants you to have an extra pair of hands helping you, He will send you one. And if Hashem decreed that you should have to work extra hard, your husband's assistance won't make your work any less.

If you're annoyed at your husband's poor middos, 'how could my husband take it easy when he sees that I'm struggling so much?', remember, Hashem is perfect, and the way He made your husband is perfect for you. Your husband, with his personality, is exactly what you need for your tikkun haneshama, and there's no room to be upset about the way your husband is.

Perhaps you're concerned over your children's wellbeing. You feel 'all because my husband refuses to lend a hand, the children are not getting the care they need'.

If this is what's bothering you, you have to remember that Hashem is the one who's taking care of your children's needs. And you can be certain that He's making sure your children are getting exactly what Hashem knows they need.

hishtadlus to help your chil-

dren in whatever way you can. Ultimately, however, Hashem is in complete control of your children's welfare. And your husband's lack of cooperation cannot affect the welfare of your children whatsoever.

And in the z'chus of recognizing that your situation is from Hashem for your best, Hashem will show you openly how He's taking care of you and your children in the best possible way.

Q. I borrowed an expensive camera from my daughter, which contained all her cherished pictures, but I misplaced that camera. Now, I'm afraid that when I break the news to my daughter, she will become devastated and heartbroken.

A. We must remember at all times: we are in this world only to please Hashem - not to please people. Therefore, whenever someone is upset at us, our primary concern should not be: how can I find favor in the eyes of that person. Rather we should be busy with: how should I react in a way that Hashem will be pleased with me. If the person is justifiably upset at us, our responsibility includes doing whatever we can to rectify the situation to the best of our ability.

Therefore, in regards to your

daughter's camera, your first responsibility is to turn to Hashem and say, 'Hakadosh Baruch Hu, I know that you are the One in charge of people's emotions. You could make it that my daughter won't be upset, rather she will be mekabel what happened b'simchah'.

Next, go over to your daughter and apologize. Show her how terrible you feel. Tell your daughter that you understand how devastated she must be that her camera was lost. Make it clear that you're not giving up, and that you'll do whatever it takes to try to find the camera.

From this point on, there is no reason to become tzubrochen. We're in this world to serve

- Q. Whenever I'm on the phone with my daughter-in-law, and she gets a beep, she tells me, 'One moment; someone is calling me', and she takes the call. She puts

me on hold, I'm left waiting for a while until she finishes on the other line.

When this happens, I grow very annoyed, 'A chutzpa! This is how you treat me? Where is your derech eretz? Where is your sensitivity?'

If I tell my daughter-in-law anything, I'm scared that I'll make things worse. What should be my perspective about this?

A. Every person possesses ma'alos, and every person has

shortcomings as well.

If you focus on your daughterin-law's weaknesses, naturally, you will be upset at her and look down at her. Therefore. whenever this happens, habituate yourself to dwell on your daughter-inlaw's good qualities, and to excuse her faults by judging her l'kaf z'chus.

Next, turn your situation 'into a business'. When you find yourself getting annoyed at your daughter-in-law's weaknesses, remind yourself that we're not in this world to change anybody else other than ourselves. Don't you possess flaws as well?

You don't have to look too far to discover a flaw. Why does it bother you so much when your daughter-in-law interrupts her conversation with you to take incoming calls? It's your pride that's being hurt. 'How could my daughter-in-law keep me waiting just like that?' 'Does she think that everyone else is more important than me?'

Take this opportunity to work on the flaw of kavod. Tell yourself, 'hakavod hevel havalim. I don't live off of other people respecting me'.

When you do an exercise to work on not caring about kavod, you are using an unpleasant situation to your advantage and coming out ahead.



"You are facing twenty to thirty years behind bars", eighteen year old Doron* was told. He had joined the wrong crowd, and committed terrible crimes, crossing many uncrossable red lines. The Rebbe assured him that all would be well.

A few months passed and the trial date arrived. The prosecution stated their entire long laundry-list of crimes and their rock solid evidence was unbreakable. After a very long hour of accusations, the judge asked Doron if he had anything to say for himself.

Doron said 'Yes', got up in front of the entire court, and recited the entire Tefila of אשמנו בגדנו while crying the entire time in an unprecedented display of sincerity and real feelings and emotion.

Everyone in the room was wondering what Doron was saying since they didn't know hebrew. Finally, the judge asked, "Does anyone understand what this man is saying?" No one responded except for his attorney, who proceeded to give a detailed explanation of the meaning of this Tefila, recited on the holiest day of the Jewish Calendar. Everyone was stunned. The judge called for a recess. Finally, after a very long period of deliberation, the judge announced, "The case is dismissed!" The prosecutor was furious, and asked 'How can you do this?' The judge responded, "I have been at this bench for over thirty years and have seen everything. But I have never seen such real, genuine sincerity. The whole point of prison is to change the person and teach him a better way of living. Well, the accused has clearly learned his lesson and is a completely changed person like I have never seen before. The case is dismissed."

We just finished Yom Kippur and Succos, and did Teshuva out of love of Hashem, which transformed our worst Aveiros into major Mitzvos and precious Zechusim.

We can only imagine how grateful Doron was with his clean slate and fresh new start to a new and better life.

Let us begin the new year, Parshas Beraishis, with tremendous gratitude and appreciation to Hashem for our new lease on life, and for granting us a chance to be the better person we

really want to be.
