

Echoes Of Mashiach!

Italian parliamentarian: Rome would like to return the keilim of the Bais Hamikdash!

Recently, Israel 365 News reported that at a large gathering in Jerusalem, Rabbi Shmuel Eli-

yahu, Chief Rabbi of Tzfas and son of the son of Israel's former Chief Rabbi Mordechai Eliyahu, said that a leading Italian parliamentarian had told his son, Amichai Eliyahu, the current Minister of Tradition, that Rome has possession of vessels of the Jewish Temple, and would like to return them to Israel! The Italian said he feels it is important for them to do so, as Italy is being overrun by other nationalities (as is the case in various European countries – including France and Germany).



The Italian parliamentarian continued to ex-

pound about how Israel is a miracle. They have succeeded in educating their people in love, trust and family values.

"Your nation has been chosen by G-d to teach the world values", he said.

"We have in Rome the Golden Menorah and many other Temple Vessels that we took from Jerusalem 2000 years ago. With these vessels you brought light to the entire world. They are with us. By keeping them, we are perhaps preventing you from fulfilling your destiny."

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Interstingly, the mefarshim say, in the course of explaining Haman's error in his calculating the seventy years, (as the Navi had said the first galus would be seventy years. Haman claimed it was up, and the Jewish people were forsaken), that there was a calculation both on the people and on the keilim. Those keilim that had gone into galus earlier, were sent back earlier.

Is there a special reason why we are receiving this revelation now?

May we see the time when they are returned and put to real use soon!

It is interesting to note that there is a story in 'All for the Boss' about Yid In Eretz Yisrael who contacted Rav Yaakov Yosef Herman for help when an Arab farmer found an indentation in his

field, and found that it was the entrance to small cave. Inside, he had found what seemed to be keilim of the Beis HaMikdash. Rav Herman sent a certified letter to the Chofetz Chayim, with details about the keilim and their geographic location, and, after deliberation and consultation with seforim, the Chofetz Chaim determined that they are actual keilim. He said that the entrance to the cave should be sealed with cement, and the location kept secret.

Rav Zev Smith, talmid of Rav Pam, related a story about a Yid who had permission to enter the Vatican storehouses in order to reproduce old seforim. Once, the curator asked him that he noticed every summer, the vessels of the Beis Hamikdash develop moisture on them and seem to be crying, would he have an idea why...

I once heard a similar story about a Yid who had been in the forest with the Partisans during the Holocaust. He was walking, after the war, through what used to be a frum shtetl. He saw goyim using a pot to cook treif, a type of pot that only Yidden had used, and he was certain he heard it crying!

May we be Zoche to see the Beis Hamikdash Hashlishi B'mheira B'yameinu!

Hashem said, "Even what you thought you wouldn't get, you could have, with door to door service!"



woke up, and the child's eye looked PERFECT! No issues, no problems! The Chofetz Chaim said that if somebody has a medical issue, they can go into a room say, "Hashem, I'm



leaving it up to you." Then walk out and that's it! That was the Chofetz Chaim's hishtadlus.

While taking a walk on Shabbos, I notice that




those fall leaves that turn yellow and brown and let go of

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Living With Mpprectation By: R' Daniel Shasha

After the Bnei Ches agreed to sell Avraham a burial plot for Sarah, the Torah tells us that he bowed down to them (23:12). Why did he do this? The Seforno explains that he bowed down to them as a way of expressing his gratitude towards them. Another instance where we find bowing in our parasha as an expression of gratitude was when Eliezer went to look for a wife for Yitzchak. When he saw that his mission was proving to be successful, he was so full of gratitude to Hashem that he bowed down as an expression of his appreciation. What is the association of bowing with gratitude?

True gratitude is the admission that we are indebted to someone else and we therefore humble ourself to show appreciation. The word להודות to thank, shares the same root as the word, מודה to admit, since true gratitude is an expression of acknowledgment. Feeling humbled is a key feeling when we sincerely express gratitude. Therefore, we bow down as a way of expressing our appreciation.

One example where we see this is during modim, the beracha devoted to gratitude. This is one of the only berachos where we bow both at the beginning and the end, since this is such an important way to express our gratitude; showing how we are so humbled by Hashem's kindness. Rabbi Avigdor Miller would caution against bowing out of rote and instead recommended that we should think how grateful we are to Hashem when we bow. He would say "don't waste a bow", since when we bow down to Hashem, we have the opportunity to make it a very meaningful experience. He would recommend in particular to contemplate something we are grateful for just before we say "modim anachnu lach" and have that thing in mind when we bow. This will ensure that our bowing is fueled by gratitude and is not just by rote.

Another way in which modim is unique, is that it is the only berachah where the tzibbur says together during chazaras hashatz. Why is this so? The Abudraham answers with something beautiful. This beracha shows our great appreciation to Hashem for all He does for us and gratitude cannot be expressed through a shalaich, it has to be given directly. Therefore, the entire tzibbur says modim together! May we be zocheh to try and have a bit more Kavnana during this special beracha, it can go such a long way. Also, when expressing appreciation, let's try and do so directly.

When Rav Elyashiv was in his final years, he required a very important surgery in which a top surgeon was flown in from America. After the surgery, he asked those around him, how to say thank you in English. Surprised, they said we will thank him for you. 'No', the gadol

insisted, I need to thank him personally. He practiced how to say 'thank you' in English a few times and then approached the surgeon and thanked him personally in his own language!

Why is Avraham Avinu so ahead of everybody ברוחניות ובגשמיות?

There is no question that Avraham Avinu had unusual love and respect for תורה, but the תורה only elaborates about how he went all-



out in חסד. A חסד that is purest of the pure - where the person can't even smile to you and say "Thank you."

Part III

This story shows the cardinal difference between Avraham Avinu and בני דורו. They viewed a woman as a source of their own pleasures. They were generally "takers" and Avraham Avinu was a total "giver". דור המבול But respect for nobody but their own יופי s.

אברהם and being a radher who by definition is a giver אב-רם and means respect and truth!

Part IV

And the kings would kill the husband and kidnap the wives. And when אבימלך says , הגם צדיק תהרוג

Chazal explain that he was full of נגיעות and he fooled himself into thinking he was a צדיק. had a lifetime mission to be radically

different than his contemporaries. 'רס call him העברי meaning the whole world is on one side and he is on the other side.

Part V

We don't find him davening to have children - just thanking מזבח by building מזבח by building מזבח s when הקב"ה tells him that he'll have children. Of course he davened for children but



it appears that the תורה wants us to know his special עבודה in purifying himself and he mainly was involved in thanking that is against the nature of most humans who always kvetch about what they don't have.

Part VI

דורה תורה tells us about his constant שבירת שבירת tells us about his constant המדות. His davening for סדום - his arch enemies! And his risking his life to save לוט who had been n a state of מחלוקת with him and he had just

rejected א"א and said אי אפשר לא באברם ולא and his true love and respect for שרה אמנו after she was גפטרת.

Part VII

The Alter from Navardok שמוס on this week's פרשה - יפה שיחת עבדי on this week's שמוחת on this week's אבות מתורתן של בנים. Why? Because every move אליעזר made was an act of שבירת המדות המדוח ואם told him אין ארור מתדבק בברוך told him א"א So he had a strong אין ארור מתדבק בברוך to work out, so שידוך would have no choice but to marry אליעזר 's daughter. אליעזר went to war against his נגיעה.

Part VIII

He davened against his נגיעה and made an all out effort that he should be מצליח with all kinds of יצחק to make things work and to take care of יצחק in a different direction than his desires. Notice that his name is never mentioned in this פרשה. Perhaps this is a סימן of his selflessness. And not having his name is a רמז of his having no "zich" in mind throughout this episode.

Part IX

But he does call himself (עבד אברהם (אנוכי). We can suggest that he was indeed עבד אברהם - just like א"א was always going against his גגיעה. So was אליעזר. It always bothered me how Avaraham Avinu could tell him you're an ארור and go out and get a יצחק for יצחק! What about אליעזר sensitivities?

Part X

Of course, we have no understandings about these giants - but I can still suggest בס"ד that אליעזר had such a strong חינוך from אליעזר to go against his נגיעה that it wasn't an issue at all! It was אליעזר that אליעזר wouldn't have a הקפדה he would gladly go against his own to get ברוך and not his own daughter (an ארור).

Part XI

In our terms: Going against your רצון was the "in thing" in א"א house - "That's what we're all about around here!" Especially since עיקר חיות האדם שבירת המדות וא"ל say that למה לו חיים. This may also answer why אליעזר wanted the girl to be extreme and say וגם לגמלך



אשקה - since א"א was extreme in חסד the way he ran as an old man on a day of סכנה (3rd day of מילה) (and אל הבקר- רץ he shechted 3 cows just for their tongues alone.)

Part XII

In a world of selfishness (especially in such a close proximity to סדום where an עוסק was חייב מיתה you need to go extreme ron. (Like the רמב"ם says in פרקים). Also, we

see how א"א wasn't afraid to send an שתופי זימה to bring a young girl on a long trip. א"א was pure and his סביב was pure.

Part XIII

When אליעזר came to יצחק לשוח בשדה and he came from באר לחי רועי.

רש"י says that he got a הגר! The same person who was kicked out of the house and her son ישמעאל was sent away because of יצחק. Yet, we don't see any animosity between them and יצחק דוקא back since he cares only for his father's שידוך!

Part XIV

And the מפרשים bring down that he went to daven in the same place that הגר screamed הקב"ה שרשים when she was driven out of יצחק was pure, without יצחק and no hard feelings towards הגר whose son ישמעאל had tried to kill him. This sounds similar to דוד המלך who took שמעי בן גרא to be a tutor for his son שלמה, even though שמעי בן גרא at cursed דוד a הקללה נערצת.

Part XV

By the way, דוד was for sure heavily involved in שבירת המדות as you can see how שמואל are loaded with הטבה במקום הקפדה. The above ד"ת fits in totally with הטבה במקום הקפדה s'ר' גרשון ליבמן fits in totally with ד"ת sifestyle. He was once walking around Armontaire and they asked him what he's looking for and he said, "אני מחפש שבירת המדות" and your whole זישני מחפש שבירת המדות! living!

Part XVI

Believe it or not, if a person wants to constantly work on his middos these days - he may need to be busy building himself up day and night with כשר and also be עוסק בבטחון and also be שכר and also be lots of time. He'll get plenty of שבר since it's so much against his nature. And it could even be apply and ושמרתם נפשותיכם and low self esteem can ו"ו hurt a person physically.

Klal Yisrael is continuing to grow and shteig and become closer and closer to Hashem.

At this time, during the war, Klal Yisroel's Emunah and Bitachon is getting stronger; some people are

strengthening themselves in the area of Tefilah. Other people are taking on various Kabbalos strengthening their connection to Hashem. It's simply amazing how people are rising higher and higher in Torah and Mitzvos. Mi k'amcha Yisroel!

When we do Mitzvos there are two things happening. Firstly, we are doing Hashem's will and we are bringing



a nachas ruach to Hashem, which is the biggest privilege for a human being. Secondly, we are bringing down a holiness, a light, onto the world. This light influences other people to do Mitzvos.

This is one explanation for "Mitzva goreres mitzva". When one does a mitzva he will bring himself and others to do more mitzvos.

The Mishna in Pirkei Avos

says that Avraham
Avinu got reward
equal to his entire
generation. Why?
Because Avraham
Avinu was the one
who spread the light
throughout the world

and influenced his generation. This is a tremendous chizzuk for all of us.

When we do Mitzvos, we are giving Hashem much nachas ruach, and at the same time, we are spreading light throughout the entire world!

With this zchus, we will be zoche to see Mashiach, bimiheira biyameinu amein.



R' Yonasan Aber, a well-known mechanech and son-in-law of the great mashgiach, R' Dov Yaffe, relays an incredible story that happened many years ago when he was newly married at his father-in-law's Shabbos table.

He had gone to shul on Shabbos morning and started davening Pesukai De'zimrah in the side room of the shul, intending to proceed to the main shul thereafter.

While he was there, there were two young boys pretending as if they were learning. They had taken out Gemaras, although they were too young to read and certainly to understand the Gemara language. Their discussion went like this:

The first one questioned, "assur?"

The other responded, "assur!"

The first requestioned, "assur, assur?"

The other affirmed, "assur assur assur!!"

For several minutes, this was how their dialogue continued, each time the assurance coming that whatever the first was asking about was definitely "assur!"

After davening, he returned to his in-laws' house for the Shabbos seudah. As they were waiting to begin, he told his father-in-law about the boys he'd overheard before davening. R' Yaffe became full of trep-idation and was greatly disturbed. He asked his son-in-law for the names of the boys. "I need to speak with their parents immediately! The seudah will have to wait." With that, he headed for the door.

The family tried to dissuade him, but he was very determined. "This is a matter that cannot wait. I must resolve this right now." His wife, though, convinced him that the family he wished to speak with wouldn't take his words well if he would address the issue with such urgency, so he agreed to wait until after the seudah to go.

After the seudah, his son-inlaw asked R' Yaffe why he was so persistent about this. Why was he willing to postpone the start of the seudah for it? Was it a matter of pikuach nefesh?

R' Yaffe responded: "With a child who hears 'assur,' 'assur,' and more Continued on 'assur,' the pre-

diction for such a child is that he won't continue serving Hashem. If everything in Yiddishkeit is only 'I can't do this' and 'I can't do that,' his future is at stake. That makes it a very critical matter.

"Serving Hashem is the most enjoyable thing, and if it's not presented so, children are at great risk. It's so fundamental that it's worth the entire seudah being postponed so that they won't have this wrong impression.

"Children must see and feel that serving Hashem is the 'best thing' in their lives the only thing that brings true, intrinsic happiness. By planting this idea in this manner, over time they will mature to truly feel that and continue serving Hashem."

The sad ending of this story is that the father didn't take these words to heart and didn't change his children's mindset (or his own). Sadly, over the years, neither of those boys continued on the right derech. (Be'er Haparshah, Balak 5783, p. 17)

What we take out from this story is: 1) To listen to da'as Torah. They know best, and we must trust them.

2) The proper way of training our children—and our-

selves—is that serving Hashem is the most enjoyable thing in the world. It's not a burden and a yoke. It's the most fulfilling thing in This World, let alone the World to Come.

DEAD FISH

"I had a student," says R' Y.Y. Jacobson, "who became a baal teshuvah. He grew up in an nonreligious background, and within a short amount of time made a turnaround to begin a full commitment to Hashem and His mitzvos. One day, when I felt it was the right time, I asked him what changed his life to turn him in the right direction. This was his story:

"When I was four years old, my parents got me a fish for my birthday. I was obsessed with it. I would sit and analyze the fish day and night. I noticed that he wouldn't move for the entire day. He parked himself in one spot for hours on end, and then would swim to another spot for a few more hours, and that was his whole day.

"I figured that he must be suffering from boredom,



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having nothing to do. So, as a clever four-year-old, I came up with a solution. I decided that I would keep him company. I would stick in my hand to take him out and play with him, and so I did.

"I was so happy. I had a chance to make my fish happy. But that wasn't it. What made me even more excited was that when I took him out, he was jumping from joy. I saw how much he liked and needed this 'outlet.'

"Out of my excitement, I went running to tell my mother about the great 'chessed' that I'd done, expecting that she'd be impressed by my care and concern.

"But, to my surprise, that was not her response. She wasn't thrilled with my plan of action but told me that taking him out was not befriending the fish but the opposite—that I was killing it! I was taking away its source of sustenance, and that was why it was jumping. It was on the verge of dying and was jumping for its last breath!

"With that, I took the fish,

replaced it in the water, its source of life, and it was able to regain its breath just before it had died.

"That served as a life lesson for me. Some people seem to be full of life, and we assume that they're the happiest, but essentially, they're just distracting themselves from their essence. When one's connected to mitzvos, that's when one is alive; when you're not, you're not. The people who I thought were full of 'life' were just filled with emptiness. They were living a life distracted from a meaningful, productive and fulfilling life. That is why I made a U-turn in my life and started living and more meaningful life." (Heard on Stories to Inspire Hotline)

MEANINGFUL LIFE

R' Elimelech Biederman spreads that there was a very wealthy man who told him that in his younger years, whenever he'd heard that the best thing in THIS World was serving Hashem, he always thought to himself: "If you'll tell me that serving Hashem will bring me the 'Next World,' that I

understand, but This World? Is this the best way to succeed in this world?"

"Then the day came when I went out to the world. Oh! Did I see that they were right! Once I went to work, all I saw in my life was the dollar and nothing more. My connection with my children was limited to the dollar. The only thing in my life was money, and that's not a life. I couldn't continue on like that. It's an empty life. They were so right—the best way to live this life is by serving Hashem. It is the best and only way to have an enjoyable life." (Disclaimer: This doesn't mean that it's impossible to work in a way that'll be a Kiddush Hashem and fulfill many mitzvos.)

HANDS ON

There's an incredible story that brings out a practical way to feel this appreciation, and this is how it goes:

Reuven had a relative that was, r"l, in the hospital. While he was watching his relative, he figured that since his relative was stable, he would take the opportunity to visit other patients. He entered the room of an older individual and asked him how he was feeling. Upon quick glance, though, it seemed to him that the man's time to enter the Next World was near.

After striking up conversation, the patient told him the he was a survivor and had no family left. All his children went off the derech, and no one takes care of him.

As they were departing, he told the visitor that he's well aware of his medical situation and nevertheless wasn't concerned about his judgment in the World to Come. "Since I hadn't had any family to assist me, I was faced with many challenges. How did I overcome them? I would think about how much it meant to Hashem that I was withstanding the challenge, and that gave me the courage to continue.

"That didn't do the whole trick, though, so one day I came up with a new idea, and that was that with every challenge I faced, I took some money and placed it in a bag. If it was an easy ni-

sayon, I'd put in five dollars, and if it was a difficult one, I'd put ten or twenty, and so on. At the end of each day, I would calculate how much money I'd put into the bag. Doing that gave me tremendous chizuk to withstand the confronting challenges. Recently, I calculated my money; it was an enormous amount. This, I'm sure, is going to stand for me in the World to Come, and I'll be protected."

This is an incredible way to see and feel the accomplishment of our mitzvos. The mitzvos that we do many times are forgotten very soon after—if not right after they're done. Doing so brings forth the realization of the mitzvos that we do and gives us the proper satisfaction.

Even if we can't copy what this man did, at least being aware of the mitzvos that we do and eventually building our proper appreciation for them will be tremendous.

The mitzvos that we do are endless. We do a lot of mitzvos unconsciously. By focusing on the many mitzvos we do and building an appreciation toward them, we'll be better and happier people.

RECAP

Mitzvos are the most and only satisfying thing in This World. Other enjoyments don't fill us up and don't make us intrinsically happy. They might distract us from a deeper emotional pain, but are they satisfying? No! The neshamah needs something else. "Placing apple juice in a car's gas tank isn't going to make it run." Our neshamah is made up from the Shechinah, and therefore the only thing that satisfies it is serving Hashem. The stronger the commitment, the greater the resulting happiness is going to be.

This is especially true now that we stand at a time that we all are improving. We should remember that this "lifestyle" is the best life that can be. Doing Torah and mitzvos is the best thing "in This World," and for sure in the World to Come. We have learned that the mission of the Jewish people is to spread awareness of Hashem in the world. But it seems difficult to understand



all of a Jew's obligations in this light. There are many mitzvos we perform that the non-Jews do not understand. When a Jew wears tefillin or tzitzis, takes the arba minim, or performs any of the other chukim in the Torah, can it truly be said that he thereby earns the respect of the nations of the world? Often, these mitzvos make us seem bizarre to them. Furthermore, how can the mitzvos that we observe in private bring honor to Hashem?

Let us examine an incident that the Rambam cites, rather surprisingly, as a classic example of kiddush Hashem. In Hilchos Yesodei HaTorah (5:10), the Rambam writes: "Any person who desists from a transgression or performs a mitzvah, not due to any factor in the world — not from fear, not from awe, not in a quest for honor, but only because of the Creator — as when Yosef HaTzaddik refrained from [sinning with] his master's wife, is considered to have sanctified the Name of Hashem." Certainly, Yosef's refusal to sin with Potiphar's wife took place in private; how did it represent a kiddush Hashem? Furthermore, it seems to have resulted in the exact opposite; Potiphar's wife slandered Yosef, accusing him of committing an immoral act, and he was imprisoned. How can the Rambam cite this episode as an instance of kiddush Hashem?

In Parashas Yisro (19:5), the Torah states, "You shall be a treasured nation to Me, for the whole land

is Mine." What is the connection between these two thoughts? The Meshech Chochmah explains that when the Jewish people observe the Torah and its commandments, they will be a "treasured nation," subject to special Hashgachah Pratis (Divine Providence) that will guide them and save them from all calamities. This special Providence, which will be clearly recognizable to the nations, will cause the entire world to accept Hashem as the King of the universe, essentially making the whole world "belong" to Hashem.

During World War II, the port city of Shanghai, where the students of the Mir Yeshivah had sought refuge, was a strategic location occupied by the Japanese. Consequently, it was heavily bombarded by American air raids. In light of the imminent danger, the yeshivah students considered fleeing to safer locales, but the mashgiach, Rav Yechezkel Levenstein, told them to remain there and assumed personal responsibility for their safety. None of them were harmed by the bombings, and the Heavenly protection that they were afforded was so overt that the local Japanese residents ran to stand alongside the bachurim whenever an air raid siren sounded, confident that the boys had been granted supernatural

protection (Reb Chatzkel, Rabbi Yitzchak Kasnett). The Japanese realized that the Jewish boys must have had special qualities that earned them



such extraordinary Divine protection.

True kiddush Hashem emerges when the Jewish people perfect their observance of the Torah and mitzvos, earning the status of tzelem Elokim, and then are the recipients of special Divine Providence. It would not create kiddush Hashem if Hashem merely performed miracles and wonders to demonstrate His might; Hashem's Name is sanctified only when He bestows such miracles upon a nation that is a true reflection of Him.

In practical terms, then, our responsibility is not necessarily to make efforts for kiddush Hashem to emerge from our actions. Rather, our task is to become proper reflections of Hashem, by keeping His Torah and mitzvos, and then Hashem Himself will sanctify His Name before the world. This is why Yosef HaTzaddik acted correctly when he refused to sin with Potiphar's wife. Regardless of the potential fallout, there is only one determining factor in any decision: what Hashem truly wishes. A Jew must follow Hashem's directives and let Hashem Himself take care

of His reputation, so to speak. In fact, the pesukim show that despite the scandal that erupted around him, Hashem caused Yosef to become well-liked

and respected — hardly the way one would expect an immoral person to be received.

In a sense, this concept is reflected in many common parent-child interactions. What happens when several children are playing in a playground, with all of their mothers watching, and one of the children misbehaves in a way that embarrasses his mother? It is only natural for the mother to try, if she can, to avoid acknowledging that the child is hers; she is ashamed by his behavior. But if the child does something laudable, something that evokes his mother's pride, she might very well rush to his side and embrace him or otherwise demonstrate her affection; she would want to take credit for his actions. When Hashem demonstrates special providence toward us, it is also an expression of affection. Certainly, our Father in Heaven would want to show us special affection only when our behavior makes Him proud, so to speak, and when we truly reflect the way that He wants us to live.

Everything is going to be okay Hashem runs the world. And then he told me sternly 'you must respect this Yid!! In Shamayim He may be much greater than you because he is having difficulties and he's still holding on...'!

When we feel inferior it's a sign we need to say 'no, I'm better than everyone else!' And when we feel much better than a certain Yid then it's time to stick up for him and say how truly great that Yid really is! **Shabbat Shalom U'mevorach!**

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

"It is obvious and known before Your Throne of Glory."

Why do we mention Hashem's Throne of Glory, something not found in any other *berachah*?

In the past we cited the words of the Vilna Gaon who explains (Siddur Hagra) that there are those who believe that Hashem is so holy, it is impossible for Him to have anything to do with the lowly and mundane aspects of this world. In order to negate this folly, we say that from His Holy throne, the place from where even the highest and holiest angels must stand tens of thousands of "miles" away, Hashem oversees lowly matters such as using the facilities.

I once heard another explanation. On the one hand, we must place food and drink into our mouths – otherwise we would starve to death. But that very source of life, if not for Hashem constantly ensuring that our intricate digestive system runs smoothly, would cause us death. Through this *berachah* we instill in ourselves, in a very tangible way, the reality that Hashem, our King, is constantly bestowing us with life. We therefore mention the throne because that is where the king sits when he rules and presides over his kingdom, making sure that everything is running smoothly. The reason we stress the throne of "Glory" is that each time we say this blessing we are elevating and glorifying Hashem's name through praising His absolutely mindboggling involvement in our lives. The more we praise Him and realize how connected He is to us, the closer we come to Him!

Someone once traveled to Sanz in order to speak to the Sanzer Rebbe, the Divrei Chaim ztⁿl. When he arrived, the *gabbaim* told him that he could not enter yet. While waiting he suddenly heard from behind the door the Rebbe reciting the beracha of Asher Yatzar. He said it out loud and with so much excitement that it took twenty minutes to recite it! When he entered the room, the Rebbe said to him: "Young man, you should know that one must say Asher Yatzar with more kavanah than when saying "Unesaneh Tokef", because that is a minhag and this beracha is a "takanas chazal. The most important stage of our development is the early stage of infancy. For the first few months of our life we received all of our sustenance through the function of sucking. Our lips also play an important role in communication. The way we position our lips reveals and relays our emotions to others, and likewise, it informs us the emotional state of others. You can tell if someone is happy or sad based on the position of his lips.

too vital. We can get through the day without it. But, the





he's overwhelmed shocked. This is an important and useful barometer, because often people are not prepared to verbally express their emotions. There are even situations that people are not capable of expressing their emotions. Hashem created our lips that convey our emotions to those around us, even if we do not consciously decide to share them. It's through this that those around us can relate to us accordingly, with the proper response and proper sensitivity.

movement in the smile is from the way we position our lips and the way we raise them to reveal our teeth. The teeth themselves are stationary.

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


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

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Rabbi Zevy Golombeck - A Life with Bitachon




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- Q. Chazal tell us that because Avraham Avinu asked Hashem "במה אדע", he was punished that his children were to be in Galus in Mitzrayim for 400 (210) years.
- 1. We hear on 'A Life with Bitachon' that Hashem is full of love and compassion, so how do we understand that He gave such a severe punishment for one very small 'mistake' that Avraham Avinu made?
- 2. I feel very anxious, because I make a million mistakes every day that are much worse than Avraham Avinu's 'mistake'. What am I supposed to think?

A. The first part of the answer is, says the heilege Chofetz Chaim, the reason why people view punishment as negative and get a negative emotion from it, is because they think Hashem is angry at us: He is taking revenge, He's showing Who's boss, and He's putting us in our place. So whenever we hear the word 'punishment', we get negative emotions and negative feelings. That's why people say, "One second, why is Hashem doing this to me? Why can't He just overlook it?"

The Chofetz Chaim said, if you would realize that if somebody has an infection and it might

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

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Start Your Day with a Hearty Delicious Davening! spread, and the doctor has to do a surgery to take it out, no one is going to look at it as a punishment. No one is going to look at it as revenge. You would look at it as love. The doctor cares for you, the doctor is healing you. The Chofetz Chaim explains, there's no such thing as punishment, it's a fake word, it's fake news. It means love, it means Hashem's care, it means Hashem's chesed, it means Hashem's rachmanus.

If you look at how the Torah refers to Galus Mitzrayim, it calls it Kur Habarzel. You know what Kur Habarzel means? Kur Habarzel means when you want to clean gold and diamonds from impurities, you put it into a special furnace and it makes them pure. That's how the Torah refers to Mitzrayim. Mitzrayim was called an oven that cleans us, that purifies us, makes us beautiful, makes us shine. The amount that Klal Yisrael shone from Mitzrayim was actually the reason that Klal Yisrael is still thriving till today! Look at all the other nations — they're



going downhill. Every nation is downhill. Go look, nation after nation, and you'll see that the more they live, the more they're going downhill. Look at Klal Yisrael – the more we live, the more we're going uphill! We're thriving! Our true colors are shining, even with what's going on in the world right now. When the non-Jews show the animalistic part of them, the Yidden start shining and look like malachim. You know where this comes from? It's thanks to Mitzrayim.

Now that we know, that this all comes from Mitzrayim, let's see what we gained from Mitzrayim. Let's learn what we appreciate from Mitzrayim.

And you'll see that we're thriving like we are because of Mitzrayim


So let's look at what Mitzrayim did for us that caused us to still thrive in galus till today. It's the reason why the non-Jews are hitting rock bottom and Klal Yisrael is just getting stronger and stronger. Because Hashem is the source of all bracha, Hashem is the source of all chesed, Hashem is the source of all rachamim, Hashem is the source of all tov. The closer you get to Hashem, the more and bigger and better person you're going to be. The further you get away from Hashem, the further you're going to go downhill.

The non-Jews are getting further and further away from Hashem; Klal Yisrael is getting closer and closer to Hashem. You know where we learned that? From Mitzrayim. When the Mitzriyim were working us like slaves — what did we do? It caused us to call out to Hashem. It caused us to form a relationship with Hashem. It made us realize that when the Mitzriyim touch our guf, that's when our neshama shines and we call out to Hashem. The Mitzriyim were hitting our body, but our neshamos were shining, our neshamos were getting closer to Hashem. We became so close to Hashem, we grew so much in emunah and bitachon, and that's when Klal Yisrael's diamond started getting shaped and shining.

Look what happened right now, what's going on in the world. The non-Jews touched our bodies and what happened? Our neshamos started to shine! Our neshamos sparkle because when you weaken the guf, you strengthen the neshama. In Mitzrayim, they weakened our bodies, but our neshamos started shining. We started connecting to Hashem. Klal Yisrael is growing and shteiging and thriving like never before!

So, says the Chofetz Chaim, there's no such thing as punishment. Everything is love, everything is chesed, everything is rachamim, everything is a cleaning process. Hashem saw a (minute) imperfection by Avraham Avinu when he said "bmah eida," he was missing in his relationship with Hashem. Hashem said, "I want your neshama to be perfect," so He made the Mitriyim hit our bodies, because that's when the neshama shines.

The Rambam paskens halacha I'maaseh, that you can even convince someone to give a get, to say rotzeh ani, by hitting them, even though you're not allowed to force the get, because when you hit the body, the neshama shines, the neshama gets stronger, and the neshama really wants to give the get.



Now I'd just like to give over a very important concept. R' Aharon Kotler said, that this is only if you love midas hadin and you realize it's a candy and it's sugar, and you love it, and you say Hashem, "I would like midas hadin." That's what Avraham Avinu wanted.

However, nowadays, yes, we make many mistakes. We make mistakes by the dozen. R' Aharon said, if you want to say, "Hashem, don't judge me with midas hadin, I'm not holding there, I want open rachamim." Hashem was giving Avraham

hidden rachamim, but, "I want open rachamim and open chesed." Then, R' Aharon said, Hashem says: "Oh, you want Me to treat you with open rachamim, unconditional love? Then I'm not going to look at your mistakes and give you consequences of hidden rachamim. Just turning to me and saying 'You are my Father and I am Your son,' that itself is the best cleaning process. That itself cleans the stain we have in a way of rachamim.

So even though we make many mistakes, we say, "Hashem, we want You to consider us Your son, and treat us with unconditional love," and that itself will make it that Hashem cleans

us with open chesed, open rachamim. That's the best cleaning process, the best tikkun haneshama, and we don't need midas hadin.

Avraham Avinu loved midas hadin, and he wanted it. But we're not on that level, so we love midas harachamim. So just by wanting open rachamim, that itself cleans us.

That's why the Ramchal says, that mikvah, which means purification, is lashon kaveh — bitachon. Kaveh means bitachon. If you want to just rely on Hashem's chesed, that itself is going into the mikvah, and you don't need any hidden rachamim, you'll get open rachamim. So we just zoom into Hashem's unconditional love, and Hashem says, "I'll give you open bracha." And that itself will clean us from all our stains so that our neshamos will be able to shine.

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#1656 - Every week, Mrs. Holstein from Cleveland sends out a package. She leaves



it by her door to be picked up by the delivery man, who brings it to where it has to go. Without fail, every single time

he comes to pick it up, he does it bright and early in the morning. By 7 o'clock, it's already picked up. Therefore, she always prepared the package the night before.

Q. I want my house to be technology-free. However, my husband is involved in technology. He is not willing to give it up and there is no hishtadlus for me to do to change that. I'm scared that my husband's behavior will have a negative impact on the chinuch of our children, but my hands are tied behind my back. What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. The first thing you should know is: There is no such thing as your hands being tied behind your back.

The concept, 'my hands are tied behind my back', implies: I'm in control of what happens, and since there is nothing for me to do, things are out of

We have to remember: Who's in control of the world? Hakadosh Baruch Hu. His 'hands' are not tied behind His back. He could do anything and everything.

control.

Say, "Hakadosh Baruch Hu, I want my house to be technology-free, because I want to come closer to You and raise children to become yirei shamayim. Hashem, I know that You are in control of how my children will be affected. You could make it that not only will they not get affected, rather they will turn out strong and resilient."

Turn to Hakadosh Baruch Hu to change your husband's atti-

Say, "Hashem, I know that my husband's attitude is also in your hands. You could cause him to have a change of heart and decide to turn around."

tude as well.

Therefore, your first exercise is to remember: Hakadosh Baruch Hu is in control of results. The more you turn to Hashem, the more He will show you how He will help the situation turn around.

Secondly, the truth is, that you can do hishtadlus to influence your husband to change: Focus on your husband's ma'alos. Praise him and give him kavod for all of his strong points.

Human nature is, when a person feels that someone re-

Therefore, it's critical to habituate yourself: as much as your husband's involvement in technology bothers you, you must always remember to compliment him. The more your husband feels that you respect him, the more he'll be motivated to listen to you.

Arguing with your husband and warning him of the dangers of technology is likely to be futile and even counterproductive.

The most effective hishtadlus you can do is to show unconditional admiration. This will motivate him to please you and encourage him to change his ways.

Q. My daughter suffers from a severe case of ka'as. She has a terrible temper, and it causes tremendous friction in the house. Whenever I try to help her work on staying calm, it just backfires. This whole situation is making me feel broken and crushed. What's the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. Whenever we help others, we must remember that whatever exercises we do to help

is just hishtadlus. Ultimately, Hashem is the one in control of a person's emotions. Therefore, take your daughter out of the picture and put Hashem there instead.

That being said, what's the proper hishtadlus to help your daughter?

Ninety-nine percent of the time, criticism and unsolicited advice make issues worse. Compliments and kavod bring out the best in people.

Therefore, the first thing is, when your daughter gets angry and loses herself, don't react.

Next, go one step further and focus on her ma'alos. Look for

to compliment her and give her kavod. Instead of expressing your displeasure over her temper, show how proud you are over her good qualities. This is excellent hishtadlus to cure her ka'as and transform her into a controlled and wholesome person.

Q. There is a bully who is instigating my son's entire class to be against my son. Now my

son doesn't have any friends and he's miserable. I tried many different hishtadlus, but nothing is helping, and my heart goes out for my son.

. The Chovos Halvavos teaches that any harm or benefit that we receive do not come from people, rather it's Hashem Who's causing it.

Explain to yourself and teach your son: there is no human being who can affect who will

be your son's friend. Friends come from Hakadosh Baruch Hu, and Hashem gives every person exactly what they need.

Additionally, sit down with your son and focus his attention on how many ma'alos he has. Tell him, 'Look how special you are. If people don't recognize

your ma'alos, it's just because they don't really know you. People need to be zoche to be your friend!'

Additionally, help him do exercises in hishtadlus to make himself liked:

- Give people kavod; show that you appreciate their strong points.
- Speak respectfully and avoid arguments.
- Write a note stating their ma'alos, you can even buy them small gifts. Acts of friendship melt people's hearts.

All the while, remember that it's Hashem Who is in charge of who will be your friend.

And when you take people out of the picture and put Hakadosh Baruch Hu there instead. Hashem will demonstrate that He is in charge and will help you find friends.

twelve emesdika ehrliche yidden who were almost all in Kollel or Yeshiva. Next, the seller accepted our offer even though it was below the asking price!

We were trying to figure out the mortgage and started dealing with a bank when the "Lakewood Resource Center Referral Center" told us that they had a special deal from a bank that didn't fill their federal quota for the year and they needed more mortgages to attract buyers. This bank was offering 3.5% when the going

rate at that time was between 5% and 6%! We initially were hesitant to leave the first bank but they told us to leave because they couldn't match the second bank.

Next, my wife was

offered a raise to be implemented right in time for the new mortgage payment.

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

HaGaon Rav Chaim Pinchas Scheinberg ZT"L was famous for wearing up to 175 pairs of Tzitzis every day. Once, in the airport, a not-yet frum security guard asked him why he wears so many pairs? He responded, "I wear one for you! I will gladly give you one of my Tzitzis if you will wear it for a few moments every day!"
