Continued ever she is in surgery, we from front sit in the waiting room page and we daven to Hashem.

It is often quite hard to daven because there is noise from other people's phones or from people chatting loudly together etc...

Yesterday, we were blown away and moved to tears by what went on in the waiting room. The scene in the waiting room was one that we have never ever witnessed in the eleven years of hanging out in surgery waiting rooms...

There was silence! Everyone, and I mean everyone, was davening. There were all type of Jews there, and everyone was saying something to HaKadosh Baruch Hu...

No one has ever asked me in the past to borrow my tehilim or siddur. Yesterday, I was asked four times!!!!!

One woman took my siddur and said she wanted to say shemoneh esrei. I saw another woman come up to her and asked her to find shema for her..

A man (with earrings in his ears) gave his son a tehilim and took a kipa off the shelf and told his son to put it on. His son, around sixteen-years-old with a design carved into his hair, put it on and finished two books of tehilim mechulak. He then put on tefilin!!!

I saw men with no kippot putting on tefilin... borrowing each others' caps...

One bareheaded man told another bareheaded man to give tzedaka for the zechus of a relative who was having surgery and told him to say a perek tehilim.

Another woman had a new tehilim mechulak and gave each member of her family a few to say. One woman asked her to wait. She took her cardigan and covered her hair with it.....

HASHEM... Look at YOUR children... connecting to You, pleading with you, acknowledging that there is nothing else but YOU..."

SHABBOS PROTECTS!

The oldest son of a family in Bnei Brak went off the derech. Several years ago, the mother of the family passed away. Her petirah inspired this son to commit to keep Shabbos, l'ilui nishmasah. He didn't do complete teshuvah. He continued to spend time with friends who were off the derech, but, come what may, he kept Shabbos.

Before Simchas Torah, his friends told him they were going to some sort of festival down South, and they invited him to join them. This festival was not in the spirit of Torah and not anything his father would approve of. It was certainly not appropriate for a bachur from such a chashuveh family to be there at all, but he agreed to the invitation, with one caveat: "I'll come, but I'm keeping Shabbos."

How would he keep Shabbos with all the emptiness going on all around him? He went there with a trailer, and he prepared a blech with cooked food. He organized the trailer nicely and set up electricity so he wouldn't have to turn on the lights on Shabbos, chas v'shalom. He truly did everything like a kosher Jew; he created an island of Shabbos in the midst of the desecration. Since he had already brought along all the equip-

ment and had prepared so much, he invited some friends into his "Shabbos room" and traveled down South. He had just parked the trailer near where the terrible party was to be held that night, and he got a call. His father was on the line.

"Listen to me," he told his son. "I want you back here in the house. Now."

"Why, Abba? What happened?"

His father himself had no idea what happened. He felt he was being pushed from on High. "You need to be home for Yom Toy!"

"But I'm already here, and I promise I'll keep Shabbos. I have a whole trailer here with everything we need."

"I haven't gotten involved in your life before," his father said. "This is the first thing I'm asking of you. Come."

"But will I make it in time? It's a long trip."


Yaakov Avinu was described coming down to Mitzrayim with his family, not as a huddling mass, but rather as a cluster of families.

Living With Appreciation By: R' Daniel Shasha

There was such a pleasant fragrance in Yosef's caravan when he was traveling to Egypt after being sold as a slave. After all, his caravan was on its way back from a large business deal and was packed with bags of sweet-smelling spices. The inviting aroma enveloped the entire caravan, making it smell like a perfume store! Chazal explain that these caravans would normally carry merchandise with an unpleasant smell, but in His great mercy, Hashem ensured that this time they carried spices with such pleasant fragrances. This meant that Yosef was able to smell the pleasant aroma of these sweet spices, as opposed to the unpleasant substances that were normally carried.

We might ask why was this miracle necessary? After all, Yosef was treated very badly by his brothers; he narrowly escaped being killed and was being sold into slavery. Would it have made such a difference if the caravan was carrying pleasant spices or not?

Let's ask another question. Chazal explain that Chanukah was established as a holiday for all generations because of the miracle of the oil. Why do they stress this reason? What about the fact that our lives were in danger and we were severely outnumbered by the mighty Yevanim? Why isn't this mentioned as being the main reason why Chanukah was enacted?

Rav Chaim Shmulevitz answers both these questions with one beautiful answer. He brings an analogy of a father and a son. When the son behaved inappropriately, the displeased father would only give him his essential needs and would not give him gifts.

However, when he behaved well, the father showered him with enjoyable presents and privileges. The son felt most loved by his father when he received all these privileges, even though they were not essential. So too, when Yosef was sold, he must have been in low spirits. The miracle of the pleasant spices was a "kiss" from Hashem; it was a reminder that despite this challenge, Hashem is His loving caring father and is going to be with Him each step of the way. It showed him that no matter how hard it was, he wasn't alone and everything would work out for his ultimate best.

Similarly, although the miracle of the oil wasn't essential for our survival, it was a "kiss" from Hashem. Hashem was displaying His overwhelming love for us and that He is always here, no matter what. He loves us ever so much and no matter how dark things seem, He is always with us. Therefore, it was for this reason that Chanukah was established as a festival of praise and gratitude. In order that we could appreciate that Hashem went above and beyond to display His great love for us. (Sichas U Mussar)

This is the message of Chanukah. Even in the darkest times Hashem is always there and looking out for us. This is such a powerful lesson that we can bring from this time, to the entire year; that Hashem is our loving caring Father and no matter what He is standing by our side. May we be zocheh to see all the nissim and yeshuos.




SHABBOS WITH THE MA-HARIL DISKIN

approved by the authorities, the police quickly dissipated the crowd, arrested the leader, and brought him to the precinct.

The leader of the hafganah was led to a dark, enclosed room, and he sat there on Shabbos with no wine, challah, or any part of his regular Shabbos meal. Not only that, but his thoughts were soured by his worrying what charges and punishments he would face in court...

But his sorrow didn't last too long. After about two hours, the door to his cell opened, and the Rav of the city, the Maharil Diskin himself, was being led to sit in prison along with him. From that point, the man's sadness disappeared. To him, it was worth staying in the dark without challah and wine to be able to spend

one Shabbos in the presence of the Maharil Diskin.

This serves as a mashal for us. When one is faced with what seems a very black darkness, once one realizes that Hashem is with him, as it says in Tehillim that Hashem is with one during his tzarah, then one is

comforted with the greatest light. Hashem's appearance brings light and joy.

HASHEM'S COMPASSION

A relative of R' Yitzchak Eizek Sher had fallen and broke her foot, and she was very disturbed about it. She was the mother of a bustling family, and now she was tied up in bed. This put her in a real down, and so R' Eisek felt that he must pay a visit to her, so he went and did bikur cholim.

R' Eisek asked her if she had memories from when she gave birth to her children, and she replied that she did.

"Are they pleasant memories?" R' Eizek asked her.

"Yes, they are," she responded.

"But I don't understand,

didn't you undergo a lot of pain? Why do you have good memories of it?!"


"Following the pain, I got to hold my dear, precious child. Therefore, the entire process gives me good memories."

"That's the same here," continued R' Eizek. "Just know that this will bring you good things. The fact that you don't see it as clearly as you see when you have a child isn't a reason for you to not be happy. You too have to know that this is for your very best, and be happy that it is so."

This is a very important les-

son. Although at times we don't see the good results, we must know that they're there but just concealed. All that Hashem does is for our very best interest, and even if it's not known, we must remember the truth. (Aleinu Lishabei'ach, vol. 1, p. 384)

R' Zalman Brazil was known to be a very happy individual. In every situation, he was seen happy and joyous.

One story that illustrates this happened when he was visiting his son-in-law's house in his old age. He had a hard time walking then, so they ordered a taxi to bring him back home.

The taxi pulled up to the door but didn't see him, so he figured that R' Zalman must be waiting by the other entrance on the opposite side of the building, so he zipped around the corner to meet him.

In the meantime, R' Zalman hadn't seen the taxi, and thus assumed that he was still going to come to the front. With his fragile body and walker, he slowly made his way to the front. Not seeing him there, he assumed the driver had gone to the side entrance, and he started to make his way over to there. However, when the taxi driver didn't see R' Zalman by the side, he assumed that he must have not come down yet, so he decided that he would wait at the original stop.

This happened several times—R' Zalman painstakingly going to where the taxi had moved to, all in good spirit despite his physical struggle. While he was doing all this, he turned to his accompanying grandchild and said, "Let's not be apikorsim. We must remember that this

ATTACHED TO A STRING FROM ABOVE

It's told about R' Yosef Chaim Sonnenfeld, the Rav of Yerushalayim, that despite several of his children being niftar during his life, he was never seen as being broken.

They asked him, "How were you able to be so happy during such times? Not only are you not let down, but you're constantly happy. How?"

He responded: "Generally, when an earthquake occurs, everyone starts running here and there. But that isn't so smart, is it? Will it help to run here or there? How does anyone know that it will be any better where they're running to? Perhaps it might be even worse there, so what makes them run?

"The real solution to being protected during an earthquake is to tie a strong string from above and to hold on tight. Doing this will ensure that whatever comes your way won't affect you."



This is what protects a person during hard times—when he doesn't know where to run, he doesn't know if here is better than there, or vice versa. By being tied to a solid rope connected from up on top, i.e., to Hashem, will ensure that any shaking "earthquake" won't push him down.

YOU ALWAYS CAN BE HAPPY!

A man once shared his troubles with Reb Shlomo Zalman Auerbach, zt"l. Reb Shlomo Zalman assured him that despite his problems, happiness was within his reach. The man protested, claiming that it was impossible for someone enduring his suffering to be happy. It was simply too difficult for him to see the good.

Reb Shlomo Zalman responded, "I know someone who, after an operation, is deaf in one ear. He is also a widower, r"l. Three of his children are childless. Despite his tribulations, he is always cheerful and smiling."

ry. "How can he be happy after suffering so much?"

Reb Shlomo Zalman revealed that he was referring to himself. He had endured this situation and nevertheless was always happy.

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A person who chooses death over transgressing the Word of Hashem is considered to have died al kiddush Hashem. The same status is conferred on a person who is



killed simply because he is Jewish. In his case, the kiddush Hashem comes from transcending his nature and maintaining his inner devotion to Hashem. In our own lives, we can achieve a touch of the greatness of mesiras nefesh by giving up the forms of entertainment and enjoyment that the secular world considers a vital part of life, in order to serve Hashem.

The True Value of Life

Rabbi Avrohom Chaim Feuer once asked a friend of his, a Yerushalmi Jew who was characterized by extraordinary devotion and piety, what had inspired him to lead such a spiritual life. "When I was a young boy in cheder," he related, "we had a very special rebbe, Rav Doniel Frisch, who went on to become a renowned mekubal and talmid chacham. He devised a game to play with us that probably would not have been allowed in schools today, but it had an extraordinary impact on us. We would all gather wood and build a huge pyre under his supervision. He would carefully ignite it, and when the bonfire was blazing, each boy would run toward the fire with all his might and then stop some distance away from it. Then the rebbe would cry, 'If a non-Jew tried to force you to serve avodah zarah and betray Hashem, what would you do?' And the boy would shout in response, 'I would rather throw myself into this fire than betray my beloved G-d!"

Clearly, the cheder rebbe's agenda was not to prepare his students for such a dreadful eventuality. Rather, he wanted them to develop an awareness of what is

truly important and valuable in life. With that recognition, they would be prepared not necessarily to die for Hashem's sake, but to live for His sake.

It is possible that living al kiddush Hashem can be even more challenging than dying al kiddush Hashem. Dying al kiddush Hashem is certainly difficult and decidedly traumatic, but it is a single decision that is made in a moment and requires self-sacrifice only at that time. To live al kiddush Hashem, on the other hand, one must spend an entire lifetime weighing and calculating the outcome of every single word and deed. It is a task that requires constant vigilance, care, and dedication, an ongoing mission that calls for all of one's faculties to be focused on that objective.

The determination to maintain our allegiance to Hashem even at the cost of our lives infuses us with the intent to live al kiddush Hashem.

Rav Yosef Leib Bloch was both the rav and rosh yeshivah of Telshe, Lithuania, from 1910 until his passing in 1930. He believed strongly that chinuch begins from the moment of a child's birth, which gave rise to a fascinating practice. In those days, mothers gave birth at home. Every time his wife delivered a baby, he would enter the bedroom shortly after the birth to wish her mazel tov and make sure that the room was clean. Then he would call his children into the room to wish their mother mazel tov and

would make a striking demonstration before their eyes. He would hold the new baby and announce to it, "Beloved neshamah! You have been sent to this world for only one



purpose: to publicly sanctify Hashem's Name. If you accept that as your mission, good. If not, it was not worthwhile for you to be born!"

We live today in a period that is unique in Jewish history. Throughout the bitter millennia of our exile, Klal Yisrael has primarily been subjected to persecution, discrimination, and intimidation from our non-Jewish neighbors. For generations, our ancestors were mekadesh shem Shamayim by giving up their lives, refusing to betray their G-d and their faith. There were few opportunities to create a kiddush Hashem through our lives, simply because the Jews were a despised nation and the Non-Jews were not impressed by our acts of virtue.

Nowadays, we live under entirely different conditions. Most of us are blessed in that we no longer live under the constant threat of persecution and harassment from the nations around us. America is a malchus shel chessed, a kingdom of kindness, where the Jewish people have been able to live and flourish. Why did Hashem put us into such a drastically different situation?

It seems that our mission, in these final days of our exile, is to create a kiddush Hashem through our lives, as many of our ancestors did through their deaths.

Now we have the opportunity to broadcast the truth of the Torah to the nations around us by acting and speaking in a refined, virtuous way. Now is the time to create a different kind of kiddush Hashem by bringing honor to Hashem through our lives themselves.

It may seem difficult to make a kiddush Hashem in today's world, when spiritual darkness is so prevalent. But the deeper the darkness, the brighter the light will appear.

In a certain yeshivah, the boys were being harassed by local hoodlums. They reported the situation to the police, and an officer came to the yeshivah to take down reports from the boys. One boy after another could not bring himself to utter the profanities that had emerged from the mouths of the ruffians who had been disturbing them. The policeman exclaimed in exasperation, "How can I prepare a report like this?" But he was also duly amazed by their refinement. "That's why we like you boys so much," he added. "You seem so much more human than the rest of the teenagers on the street."

Did you know that nowadays Hakadosh Baruch Hu does not want us to go to Bais Din when someone takes away our money from us? For most people it's just going to cause them stress, anxiety,

worries, fears, aggravations, machlokes, and sinah. That is not proper hishtadlus. Hakadosh Baruch Hu wants us to be mevater and give in, and He'll pay us back double.

In the Chafetz Chaim's Shaarei Tevunah Perek Yud Alef in Shmiras Halashon, a Gemara in Gittin, Daf Zayin is brought down. The Gemara says that the biggest and best hishtadlus is to keep quiet and let Hashem give whatever it is. This is true for anything in life: if someone takes away a Kavod from you, someone takes away a job, parnassah, money, someone takes a parking spot; whatever someone takes away from you, the Chafetz Chaim says that if you are mevater, Hashem will pay you back DOUBLE. There's no reason to ever have to fight back or do hishtadlus that is going to cause stress, anxiety, worries, fears, aggravations, machlokes, and sinah.

Reb Moshe Feinstein told Reb Reuven Feinstein, who told me, that when someone stole Reb Reuven Feinstein's parnassah, Reb Moshe told him, "Feinsteins don't go to Bais Din because that person is going to be upset at you. The Feinsteins, we don't like to make people upset. But, Hashem will pay us back." We see that Hashem paid back Reb Reuven with a lot more than double. Now he is a Rosh Yeshiva of a world famous Yeshiva, with thousands of talmidim; everyone looks up to him and they ask him shailos. Look at the koach havitur. Reb Aharon Leib Shteinman said, "I never saw someone who was mevater and didn't get paid back."

Thank and Thank and Thank!

We have now reached the *heiligeh* Yom Tov of Chanuka and the connection to Asher Yatzar is quite clear. The *gemara* in Shabbos (21b) writes, "the next year they established these days (of Chanukah) as a Yom Tov, *lehodos u'lehalel* — to thank and praise." Rav Nosson Meir Wachtfogel, *zt''l*, (Mashgiach of Lakewood Yeshivah) would say that every Yom Tov has its specific theme and here Chazal tell us that the theme of Chanukah is to thank and praise Hashem. Since this is the case, there is only one thing we should be doing the entire *Chanuka*: Thanking and thanking and thanking! (See *Leket Reshimos*, *Chanukah*, pg. 110)

Obviously, this means we must make sure to say Hallel and *al hanisim* properly, with feeling and emotion, not just to fulfill our obligation. But what about the rest of the time? We are so busy with our daily lives, whether it is learning, *davening*, working, going to school, or taking care of a family. How are we supposed to fill these days with giving thanks to Hashem?

Recently, I gave a shiur in Yeshivas Beis Dovid on the topic of Asher Yatzar and I described some of the miracles of the body. What is going on is so mind-boggling that statistically we really should not exist if not for Hashem's ongoing kindness. In the middle of the shiur, my dear *talmid* Nosson Meir Weiss "(yes, he is named after Rav Wachtfogel *zt"l*) asked, if so, why do we only thank Hashem when we use the facilities – we should be thanking Him every second of the day?

I answered that perhaps we can say that Chazal wanted us to say the *berachah* with emotion. Therefore, they only established it when we actually feel and experience the kindness of these miracles. So, when we say Asher Yatzar we are indeed thanking Him for all the constant miracles throughout the day. When we say this *berachah* we should have in mind all the wonders that have been going on inside our bodies since the last time we used the facilities.

If we put special effort into doing so during the eight days of Chanuka, the result will be that we will have transformed the entire Chanuka into one of giving thanks, because it will cause us to be more aware of what is happening all day long. Even when we are not actually saying Asher Yaztar, we can stop and think about how Hashem is pouring *chesed* upon us every moment just by the fact that we are alive and functioning! These feelings of gratitude will change our whole relationship with our loving caring Father in heaven.

Rav Wachtfogel continues (page 111) that by focusing on giving thanks on Chanuka, we will learn how to continue thanking Hashem throughout the entire year. This is such a crucial tool for all of *avodas* Hashem – let us make sure it does not slip through our fingers!

Hashem created our lips extremely sensitive. It's important that we have this heightened sensitivity because it serves as a sensor which guards our mouth from swallowing anything which is dangerous for the human body. This sensitivity is due to the vast amount of nerve endings that our lips contain; over a million nerve endings.

There's an additional factor that our lips have that cause their heightened feeling and sensitivity. Hashem created us with our flesh covered by many layers of skin. Even our faces are covered with around sixteen layers of skin. But our lips are covered by a mere three to four layers of skin. That's much less than the rest of the human body. This leaves our nerve end-

ing in the lips with much less coverings and more exposure, which causes them to have increased feelings.

When our bodies are very cold, our lips look blue. Why is it prominently our lips that change colors and not our cheeks or chin? This is because of the extra exposure that our lips have that the rest of the body doesn't have. The flesh which was responding to the cold feeling is visible much more through the lips than other places in the human body.

The lack of multiple layers of skin is also what causes our lips to appear more pink or red than the rest of our face. This is the color of our flesh which is visible through its thin skin covering. This is the only place in the human body where the flesh is revealed externally. Part of what makes the person's face beautiful is this change of color in middle of our faces. This is a nice present that Hashem granted to man whom he created B'Tzelem Elokim.

One last function we benefit from the lips is that we have the ability to contract our lips together and leave a small opening that we're able to blow out from. This concentrates the air to a specific area, which gives them more power and effect. For example, it can blow on a hot po-

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tato or on hot soup to cool it off. Or it could blow strongly on a small insect to distance it from a place we don't want it to be. Without our lips we would not be able to blow out strongly.

It's important to note, that almost all the functions which we receive from our lips are things that we can actually live without. Hakadosh Baruch Hu created all of the birds without lips, and they survive. Let's take a look at the differences between birds and people. Birds are missing all the wonderful enhancements that Hakadosh Baruch Hu gave humans with their lips. For example, food falls out of birds' mouths when they eat. Birds cannot nurse, smile, speak or play the clarinet. Just to name a few of the differences.

Let's close with something one of our listeners shared with me. He has a cousin who's physically unable to smile. He underwent a number of surgeries to try to fix this problem. That means they

felt so lacking by missing the single function of the lips of smiling that they're willing

to undergo a few surgeries just for a chance to regain that ability. Unfortunately, the surgeries were not successful. They joined a support group of people who suffer

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The Amazing One of Its Kind rounded by tentacles similar to Scarlet Sundew Plant those found on Sundew plants

We will continue discussing more unique miraculous carnivorous plants. This one happens to be the one and only of its type. It has a fully active, double trapping mechanism! No other carnivorous plant has this. There are generally two different types of carnivorous plants. There's the snapping

type. These snap shut and catch their prey. The Venus fly trap is a good example of a snap trap. Quite amazing of course. Then there's the fly paper traps.

The Sundew plants that we wrote about last week are good examples of those.

Now we will discuss the oneand-only Drosera glanduligera, commonly known as the pimpernel sundew or scarlet sundew plant. It is also known as a catapult-flypaper-trap plant. It is THE only known plant that uses BOTH methods. The snap and the flypaper all in one plant!

If you look at the pictures, you will see that there's three parts to the plant. Part 1 - There's the center part, part 2 - sur-

rounded by tentacles similar to those found on Sundew plants (yet quite different), part 3 - there's a long flat horizontal triangular shaped snap tentacle. If you look at the picture you will see what I mean. When the insect walks over the long leaf and triggers it off, in LESS than one tenth of one second it snaps "closed". You will soon understand why I put the word



"closed" in quotation marks. It moves so quick that you can't actually see it close.

When it snaps, it has a sophisticated catapult method which catapults the insect onto the next part of the plant. Most of the time the insect lands on its back making it more difficult for it to escape. These tentacles are full of glue. Many of them are horizontal and some are vertical. Similar to other Sundew plants. However, they do NOT

digest the insect like Sundew plants do. (In the picture below the insect is in middle of being transferred to the center of the plant. You also see many of the snap tentacles have already been triggered off so they are still bent over next to the ones that are still extended that haven't been triggered off yet).

But first I want to discuss the catapulting snap tentacle. As

you can see in the picture the blade goes all the way over to the other side. That's what I meant that it snaps "closed". It's a 180 degrees snap. It starts off at the 9 o'clock part of the clock and ends up at the three o'clock part. It goes a full 180 degrees.

What does that accomplish? Simple. If it would let's say just go up to the 12 o'clock, or even one or two o'clock position, the insect would fly over the entire plant! That won't accomplish ANYTHING. By the fact that it goes SO quickly a FULL 180-degree movement ensures that the insect doesn't go far at all. In fact, it just goes — and with a strong force as well — exactly where



it should go, which is onto the nearest tentacles of part two of the plant. The force with which it is catapulted helps the insect

get stuck onto the glue AND it is strong enough to start the next amazing process. Those gluey tentacles then start to move and they lift up the insect and slowly but surely, like a slow conveyor belt, move the insect to the center of the leaf.

Imagine you are holding up something with both hands, high over your head, and then you bring down the object you are holding, in front of you, down towards your knees. That's what these gluey tenta-



cles do. They lift the insect up and then bring it over to the center of the leaf and then lower it and thereby deposit the

> insect into the center of the leaf. The center of the leaf is also full of glue and that's also where the digestive enzymes are. While the insect is being deposited, more tentacles are activated that are situated at a close angle to the tentacles depositing the insect. They help push down the

insect by combining with and also going on top of the initial moving tentacles. This helps secure the insect and it helps to


push down the insect with additional force into the center where the gooky glue digestive enzymes are.

Scientist are still not 100% sure how the tentacle is able to move so lightning fast. They have discovered that there's a special "hinged zone" in the middle of the leaf where the leaf folds/bends on, but that in no way explains the amazing speed.

This is obviously NOT an accident! Let's think of a few things that this plant needs to "know". (besides needing to know things we have already discussed, such as how to make fake glue and how to make EXTREMELY complicated enzymes that are able to digest the insects and other enzymes that 'know" how to transport the digested nutrients to the correct parts of the plant for their nutritional benefit).

The plant has to know how to make this amazing spring mechanism

work such lightning speed. No small feat to say the least.

It has to know that it needs to go the full 180 degrees to get the insect to the best place for it to get captured.

There also needs to be a separate mechanism for the conveyor belt process we described. These are extremely complicated processes that no accident could ever accomplish

in a zillion years. Don't forget, the plant "knows" absolutely NOTHING. It has a zero IQ. In fact, it has no brains at all, yet it functions as if it was absolutely brilliant! How can an accident have a plan? There's a whole strategy of capturing insects through catapulting it onto a specific area that will successfully capture the insect, which will then transfer the insect to the digestive area. There's a

GREAT PLANNER HERE AND IT'S HASHEM!!

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
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
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

bi Boruch Levine join us at a Chanukah Mesiba. Rabbi Levine said over this story and he asked why Rabbi Chanina Ben Dosa was allowed to do this and rely on a Nes. He answered that Rabbi Chanina Ben Dosa realized that it is the same easy for Hashem and it is the same Nes to have both oil burn or vinegar burn. Hashem showed yes, since you realize this that they are both the same Nes, I will therefore make the vinegar burn. Chanukah is a time of Nissim.

My father Amu'sh says that we can Daven for everything and if we are granted what we daven for we don't have to worry about "Ain Somchin Al Hanes" because when we rely on Hashem and Daven - Hashem will provide. Story:



Idea:

Eight Ideas for Eight nights of Chanukah. You can play these games with your family or if you are a Rebbi or

a teacher you can play them in your classroom.

1. Game: Spin the dreidel of thanks: How to play: Spin the Dreidel. Whatever letter you land on, pump

yourself up by saying something that starts with that letter that you are thankful to Hashem for. For example: If you land on Hey you can say "Thank you Hashem for Hands."

- 8. Idea: Choose one person. It can be a spouse, child, friend, student or anyone. Each day of Chanukah pump them up at least once. For an added challenge and more fun try to add one complement each day. For example, on night number one,



pump them up once, on night number two pump them up twice etc. Another variation: Pump eight people up each day of Chanukah!




Feeling Hashem's Love!

Q: It says in a Mishna in Meseches Brachos that if a person davens for something impossible he is doing something wrong; it's a tefilas shav.

We hear all the time on 'A Life with Bitachon' that Hashem is a Kol Yachol. Nothing is impossible for Him, and that there is no such thing as nature; it's all Hashem. So why is it a tefilas shav?

Why is he doing something wrong? He is showing that Hashem is a Kol Yachol?

A. Before I answer the question, I would like to add to the question. The gemara in Brachos daf samech, where it says that if a person hears a cry in the city, he's not allowed to ask that it shouldn't come from his house be-

cause it's a tefillas shav, brings down that when Hillel walked into the city, and he heard a cry in the city, he said, "I have bitachon that it's not coming from my house." So the Meiri and Rabbeinu Yonasan MiLunel in Brachos said it's a stira! The gemara says it's tefillas shav and there Hillel himself did it? What the gemara says don't do, Hillel did!

The answer to the stira is, that the Meiri says that the reason why Hillel is not a stira to the sugya is because there's a difference between tefilla and bitachon. With tefilla, there are guidelines, don't do it if it's a tefillas shav. With bitachon, there are no limitations. In Tehillim (37:3,4) it says "Betach baHashem...." and then in the next pasuk, "vyiten lecha mishalos libecha." Rashi and Metzudas Dovid say that when it comes to bitachon you can ask for whatever you want. So we see clearly a distinction between tefilla and bitachon, which the Meiri says that you see clearly from the gemara in Brachos, where it says that it's a tefillas shav, but Hillel did it because Hillel was using bitachon rather than tefillah.

Tefilla has rules and tefilla has regulations. Bitachon has no rules and bitachon has no regulations.


Where does the difference come from? When you go with the derech of tefilla, you're pleading and begging in front of your Master, you're acting like a servant in front of its Master. That's bchinas eved lifnei adon. When you go with bitachon, that's bchinas a son in front of a Father.

When you act like a servant, then there are rules and regulations. A servant can't just ask for whatever he wants. There are rules, there are guidelines. If you only act as a servant and treat Hashem as a Master, so you yourself are not viewing Hashem as your loving, caring Father. If you relate to Hashem as a servant before his Master, you have rules and guidelines. However, if you go with bitachon, by relating to Hashem as a son before a Father, it's a different type of relationship. You're viewing Hashem as a Father. Once you view Hashem as a Father, then you can go all out. That's what Hillel said, I have bitachon that it's not from my house, because Hashem will do everything when you view Him as a Father. He'll change the whole world, He'll change the whole briah, change the whole mtzius!

So it comes out that the answer to your question, isn't Hashem a Kol Yachol, is that yes, Hashem is a Kol Yachol. That's if you view Hashem as a Kol Yachol, view Him as your loving, caring Father and He'll act with you as a Kol Yachol.

Are there guidelines for davening? Yes, there are guidelines for davening. Because davening means that you're not treating Hashem as your loving, caring Father, it means you're relating to Him as eved lifnei rabo, like a servant in front of a King. It's a different type of relationship. That relationship doesn't allow you the access to get that special key to go into any door you would like.

However, every person could choose, like the Rabbeinu Yonah writes in his pirush on Brachos, that even



when you daven and you're an eved lifnei rabo, but after you finish davening you could picture Hashem as your loving, caring Father, and turn that tefilla into bitachon and then get whatever you would like. That you're allowed to do. It's called tefilla mtoch bitachon.

We'll end off with two examples that show how bitachon is more powerful than tefilla.

First of all, in Parshas Bshalach, when Klal Yisrael were by the Yam Suf and they were all trapped and they started davening, Hashem said, "Mah titzak eiloy," why are you crying out to me? "Daber el Bnei Yisrael v'Yisau," speak to Bnei Yisrael and they should travel. The Ohr HaChaim Hakadosh asks, what's wrong with davening? Isn't that

what every yid is supposed to do? Especially in an eis tzara, a yid is supposed to daven!

The Ohr HaChaim explains that there was a kitrug against bnei yisrael: "halalu ovdei avoda zara vhalalu ovdei avoda zara." They weren't worthy with midas hadin of being saved. Therefore, Hashem told Moshe Rabeinu to tell the Yidden to strengthen themselves in Emunah and Bitachon and enter the Yam before it split, believing that Hashem would save them, and with that the middas harachamim would overcome the middas hadin. It's not time to daven, it's time to have bitachon! With bitachon, you're relating to Hashem as a son to a Father. Bitachon is a different relationship. With bitachon, you can get whatever you want.

Another maareh makom is, the Nesivos Shalom explains that in Eicha (3:8) we say "Gam Ki Ezak VaAshaveah Sasam Tefillasi," meaning, on Tisha B'Av Hashem doesn't answer our tefillos, and that's why we don't say

kaddish tiskabel on Tisha B'Av. However, the Nesivas Shalom continues, if you look several pesukim later on, (3:25), it says "Tov Hashem L'Kovav L'Nefesh Tisdrishenu." "Kovav" is a lashon of bitachon. If you have bitachon, even on Tisha Bav, you get answered. There's no difference Tisha Bav to the rest of the year. Why? Because you're relating to Hashem as a son to a Father.

So you see clear maareh mekomos that there's a chiluk between tefilla and bitachon. With tefilla there are guidelines, because you are treating Hashem as a Master, and you're only a servant. When you have that relationship then there are guidelines. However, zagt Rabbeinu Yona, you can decide to view Hashem as your loving, caring Father, and with that you can have bitachon for whatever you want. Even while you're davening, you can picture yourself as a son in front of his Father, and then even while you're davening, you can also have bitachon for whatever you want.



Q. I invested so much into being mechanech my children b'derech ha'torah, but one of my children is not going in the right derech. I know that we aren't in control of results, and since I tried, Hashem considers it as if he turned out well. But it still gives me so much agmas nefesh seeing my child doing things that he shouldn't be doing.

A. When a person feels bad about something even though he knows that he's not doing anything wrong, he should zoom into his emotions and uncover what's really bothering him. Once he zeros in on the underlying issue, he can take the appropriate 'medication' to gain a healthy perspective.

Let's discuss what are the possible underlying issues which may be bothering you, and the correct outlook towards each one.

• Perhaps you feel like failure because you weren't matzlich in being mechanech your child correctly? Maybe you feel hurt; you put in so much kochos into being mechanech your child and it all went to waste? Alternatively, you're concerned about your status in other people's eyes; how are people going to view me with a child who's off the derech?

All these feelings ultimately boil down to middas hakavod. Your medication is to do exercises in fighting against kavod which is threatening to break you. Work on internalizing hakavod hevel havalim. Who cares how people look at you? We only care about how Hashem looks at us. And Hashem knows that you tried to the best of your understanding.

- Perhaps your tza'ar is l'sheim shamayim. It hurts you that Hashem's name is being desecrated. The antidote for this is: if you're looking to increase k'vod shamayim, you should know that the biggest k'vod shamayim you could cause is when people see that you're not falling apart when Hashem tests you with a nisayon, rather you're accepting Hashem's will b'simcha.
- Perhaps what's bothering you is, you feel bad for your child's neshama that's becoming ruined because of his aveiros. Know and understand, the best thing that you could do for your child's tikkun haneshama is, by not becoming broken over your situation, rather to recognize that any tza'ar you're getting is not from your child, rather from our loving and caring father Hakadosh Baruch Hu.

When you do that, your child will thereby be the vehicle which is causing you to climb higher in hisbatlus to Hashem and His master-plan. And that will be your son's role in bringing k'vod shamayim into the world.

• If your pain comes from מידת הרחמנות, sharing the pain of another yid's suffering, you should know that perfecting our middos is a form of getting closer to Hashem. If by feeling your child's suffering you are becoming closer to Hashem, then it's a good thing.

But if a person sees that his rachmanus is making him depressed, that indicates that he's misdirecting his מידת הרחמנות, and he must channel it in a way that makes him a healthier and more wholesome oveid Hashem.

• If you're concerned that you'll be losing out on the s'char that one gets when his children are doing mitzvos, Chazal teach us the principle מחשבה במעשה. When someone tries his best to do a mitzva, but is unable to, he gets all the s'char as if he did the mitzva.

The יערות דבש adds that on a certain level, such a person gets even more s'char. That is because, when a person does a mitzva in practice, it's usually incomplete; he lacks the proper lishmah, he derives kavod from the mitzva and so on. However, when a person wants to do a mitzva, certainly he wishes for it to be complete, and it's therefore considered like he actually did the mitzva perfectly.

Q. I got a phone call from my child's principal that he's not doing well. He scheduled a meeting with me, and I'm very nervous about what he's going to say.

What is the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. The truth is, what you're really concerned about is that the principal might point out flaws in your child. And that is going to injure your kavod, "How could it be that my child isn't Mr. perfect? That means that I'm not perfect! Oy vey!"

You have to realize, he's not your child, and his flaws don't indicate that you're not perfect. He's really Hakadosh Baruch Hu's child. And since Hakadosh Baruch Hu is perfect, the way your child is with all his and מעלות, actually is perfect as well. Your role as a parent is to try to help your child to the best of your ability. And if Hashem assigned to you a difficult child, that indicates that Hashem is giving you an opportunity to gain extra s'char by having to invest in a more difficult child.

With this attitude not only won't you be nervous for the meeting, you'll actually be excited! You have the same goal as the principal. You're both on a mis-

sion to help out Hakadosh Baruch Hu's child in the best way you could.

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

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
