### A VISA DESPITE EVERYTHING

A Yid in Eretz Yisrael related:

I deal with helping people get US visas. One day, a bachur came over to me and



asked me to arrange a visa for him immediately. That same day, this bachur's mother called me and said, "My son came and asked you to take care of a visa for him. I am begging you – do whatever you can to make sure he does not get approved for the visa. Unfortunately, he has left the proper path, and I am very worried about him. If he leaves Eretz Yisrael he's liable to lose the last shred of Yiddishkeit left in him. I just don't want him to intermarry!"

Several months passed, and his mother called to tell me, "My son wants to come back to Israel, and I fear he will meet up with his old friends and will be drawn to them again, chalilah. Please, do everything you can so that he will not be able to get back to the country..."

Then one month, Rosh Chodesh came and the stipend did not appear in my account. In addition, the government's child allowance that I was accustomed to receiving was cut down as well, to about 300 shekels less than I had been receiving previously. I thought that I must strengthen myself in emunah and bitachon, and I decided to start learning the daily limud of Shaar Habitachon in Chovos Halevavos.

The next day, an avreich approached me and asked me if the stipend for my children had been cut down. "Yes," I re-



sponded.


"Does your wife work?"

"No."

"Someone gave me a sum of money for you," the avreich responded.

He took out an envelope and handed it to me.





A moment later he began to walk away, and I tried to catch what was going on and asked him, "Since when do they give out money here?" "Don't ask questions," he responded. "Take it. It's yours."

When I got home, I found a message was waiting for me from the kollel, that the stipend would go into my account in the coming days.

And what about the cut in the child allowance? Three hundred shekels each month is not a paltry sum. Hashem took care of this for me as well, with chessed and rachamim.

in finding one. Time after time, different matters held him back from signing. One time the price was too high for him; another time, moments before he signed a contract, someone else came and signed; another time, for some unknown reason, the owner did not want to sign a contract with him.

He told his problem to a friend who lived in Yerushalayim, and this friend told him, "I just saw an advertisement for an apartment for rent in Sanhedria Murchevet. Try speaking to the owner of the apartment." He gave him the phone number, and indeed, it was a wonderful apartment in a great area.

"This dirah has been waiting for you for a long time," the owner told him. "For several months it's been empty and I haven't been able to rent it out. This is really strange, because it's an excellent apartment in a sought-after location. It seems totally miShamayim that it was held back from everyone else so that you would get it."

The Yid from the moshav settled in Yerushalayim and went on to the next stage – seeking a shidduch for his daughter. Several shidduchim were suggested for her, but none worked out. At a certain point, this older bachur who went every year to daven in Lizhensk, was suggested. The proposal went over nicely, and the meeting between the bachur and the girl took place in the home of a neighbor – a family named Weisblum.

While the meeting was going on, the girl's father got a call: "I'm only telling you this for your own good," the caller told him. "I think you're making a mistake marrying off a young girl to a thirty-year-old bachur. I really don't understand you. Call it off now, before it's too late." The father was very confused. He'd actually thought the bachur was very suitable, but the call gave him cold feet, and he almost canceled everything.

A minute before taking that fatal step, he related the phone conversation to Rav Weisblum, the neighbor who was hosting the meeting between the young couple.

Rav Weisblum responded, "As you know,

I've seen all the bachurim that were suggested to you, and I'm telling you – this bachur is the most suitable for your daughter. Totally hand to glove. As soon as I saw him, I felt that this was it!" His good words had an effect, and the shidduch was closed with mazal tov.



The couple was married b'shaah tovah, and they have lived happily with great joy to this day. The neighbor who helped close the shidduch, Rav Weisblum, is a direct descendant of Rav Elimelech of Lizhensk, ben achar ben, and the next time the bachur traveled to Lizhensk, he indeed came with a shtreimel! massacre, I understood beyond a shadow of a doubt how I am ALIVE and not dead! To my great sorrow, of my 5 friends that stayed behind (at the party), I went to three of their funerals... and 2 were taken as hostages to Gaza...

And today, of course, I and my friends, who saw before our eyes the power of keeping Shabbat are continuing to keep it...because more than what we do, Shabbat protects us."






Secular Israeli Soldier Returns Home to Hashem

### Miracle in Japan Israeli Soldier's Life-Altering Survival Story with the Japanese Mafia

From Stories to Inspire. Transcribed and adapted by Shmuel Goldstein

Listen as Rabbi Duvi Bensoussan unravels an extraordinary tale of divine intervention amidst the enigmatic world of the Japanese Ma-

fia. This captivating story follows an Israeli soldier entangled in the dangerous web of organized crime, only to experience a series of miraculous events that defy explanation. I'd like to share with you a tremendous story that I heard recently from Rav Shlomo Levenstein Shlita. And I'll tell you honestly, I know that over the years I have said a few wild stories, but this one is out of this world. To be honest, I could never have the shoulders to say something like this if I didn't hear it straight from Rav Shlomo Levenstein, known as the Maggid of B'nei Brak.

He says over that there's a rabbi in Bnei Brak, Rabbi Yehuda Yosefi, a great Tzaddik and Gaon who gives classes to Persian Jews in Bnei Brak on a weekly basis. He's a leader of the Persian Community on the outskirts of Bnei Brak in Israel.

One evening on a Wednesday night after the Rav Yosefi gave his class, one of the guys runs up and asks him to please do him a favor. He says to the Rav, "I have a very good friend, a soldier who just came back from the Israeli Army. He's not religious and worse - he totally doesn't believe in HaShem. Please, could you speak with him a few minutes? Maybe you can put inside him a little faith and Bitachon in HaShem. I want so much to help my friend come closer to Torah and Mitzvot.

The Rav said, "Absolutely. Please tell him to come in and I'll speak to him." "Yeah, but Rav, I don't know how to explain this to you but this friend of mine doesn't want to come into the shul. He gets very nervous and he's scared that if he walks into the shul, the air of the shul is going to have an effect on him somehow. He doesn't want to get out of the car. But he's right now outside in front of the shul in the car. Does the Rav mind to go outside and please sit with him in the car for a few minutes and talk to him."

The Rav says goes outside. He sees the man sitting in the car and goes inside. Before Rav Yosefi can say a word, this Israeli turns to the rabbi and says, "Prove to me that there is a G-d."

"Wow." Rav Yosefi says. "Zehu? That's all you want? You just want me to prove to you that there's a G-d? That there's a Borei Olam? That's not a problem. Come, I'll show it to you."

He turns to the Chayal and asks, "Tell me, did you hear about Moshe Rabbeinu?" The soldier answers, "Yes. Of course, I heard about Moshe Rabbeinu."

"Well did you know that after Moshe Rabbeinu grew up in the palace of Pharoah, Moshe came out to his people and he began to help them and work with them. One day, Moshe Rabbeinu saw an Egyptian Taskmaster whipping a Jew. He was about to kill him and Moshe Rabbeinu ran and he killed the Egyptian. A miracle happened and the ground opened and swallowed the body. Moshe thought that no one saw but two people did see and unfortunately, they went and told Pharoah. How much it hurts when one of our own becomes a Malshinim and goes and tells on another Jew. Moshe at that moment was in danger.

Pharoah went and arrested Moshe and passed judgment. "Moshe, you killed the Mitzri so you will be executed with your head cut off."

Rav Yosefi explains that the Midrash tells us that it was at that moment that they took Moshe and tied him up and laid him down on a large rock. They bent Moshe's head all the way down so that his neck would be stretching out so it would be easy for the executioner to bring down the sword on his neck. "It was at that moment," says Rav Yosefi, "that Hashem made a great miracle. The executioner came and raised the sword and brought it down on the neck of Moshe Rabbeinu and a miracle happened. His neck became marble. When the blade hit the marble, it bounced right back up and killed the very same executioner. At that moment, Moshe Rabbeinu leaped up and ran away."

Rav Yosefi turns to the soldier and says, "Nu? You still don't believe there's a G-d? You still don't believe in a Creator who turned Moshe Rabbeinu's neck into marble? Of course, there is a Hashem! There has to be a Hashem! You see? I proved it! There's a G-d in the world!"

The Israeli soldier looks at the rabbi and bursts out laughing. He tells him, "You have got to be joking. That's your proof? You tell me this whole story about Moshe Rabbeinu and his neck turning into marble? Because of that, there is a G-d? I don't believe in Moshe Rabbeinu. I don't believe in his neck turning to marble, and I don't believe in this whole story. This is your proof, Rabbi? The Israeli soldier just burst out laughing."

"Well," Rav Yosefi says, "Okay. You're not Mekabel. You don't accept this. That's all right. Rav Yosefi picks himself up and walks out of the car. And that was it. Or was it...

Well, my friends, open your hearts and wait till you hear the end of this story.

A year later, this particular Israeli soldier, like many others, when he completed his time in the army, took a break of a year or so. These soldiers are then able to leave Israel to go anywhere in the world. So he traveled to Japan. Sure enough, he got mixed up with the wrong people and somehow started dealing with the Japanese Mafia. After some time, he even became part of the Japanese Mafia since he had military training and knew how to survive. He was very street-smart and fit in perfectly with the

Japanese underground.

It happened that one of the Mafia bosses gave him a large amount of money to deliver to someone on the other side of town. It was a very large amount of money, so this Israeli guy made a terrible mistake, and he said to himself, "You know what... I'll just tell him that I lost it," and he kept the money for himself.

When word got back to the mafia boss that this Israeli guy kept the money for himself, claiming that he lost it, the boss sent out people looking for him everywhere.

After two months of hiding, they finally found him and brought him back to the mafia boss. It was at that moment that the boss said, "You stole from me. That's it, you deserve to die." To show everybody what happens when you steal from the mafia, the boss said, "Cut of his head!"

At that moment, they grabbed the Israeli and put his hands behind his back. They tied him up and laid him down flat on a table. They then took his head and bent it all the way down so that his neck would protrude and stick out completely so that when the sword came down on the neck, it would be able to do its job.

It was at that moment that the Israeli began to cry out as he remembered what Rav Yosefi had said to him a year and a half earlier. Everything started coming back. Moshe Rabbeinu, Pharoah, the story of the executioner and Moshe's neck. It was at the end of that story, Rav Yosefi told this Israeli the words, "אל" א לימנע עצמו - don't give up hope." "תרייש" – Even if a shrp sword rests upon one's neck, שרחמים א לימנע עצמו – he should not stop himself from praying for mercy. You see? This is G-d. At the last second HaShem saved him and changed his neck to marble."

In these brief last moments of his life, this Israeli was thinking about this entire episode of Moshe Rabbeinu and his neck turning marble. The Israeli man closed his eyes and he screamed, "Borei Olam, if You really exist, now is the moment to save me! In these last moments, I'm not giving up hope. I'm crying out to You. If You save me, I'll be Chozer B'Teshuvah 100%. I'll go back to Eretz Yisroel and to Rav Yosefi and come back to You, HaShem." At that moment the executioner raised the sword to bring it down on this Israeli man's neck, suddenly, the door to the room opened and in walked the mafia boss's wife. She yells, "Stop! Wait one second. This Israeli guy that you're killing - you can't kill him!" Remember a few years back when there was the great earthquake in Japan? That day the ground cracked open and there was a tremendous hole in the ground. Well, that crevice opened up and my son fell inside. As he was being sucked into the ground



son's life. Let him go!"

When they heard that from the boss's wife, the executioner stepped away from the table and untied him. They sent him to the airport and the Israeli got on a plane back to Israel. He comes straight to Bnei Brak and ran to Rabbi Yosefi, grabbed him, hugged and kissed the rabbi. He screamed, "Bring me Tefillin, I want to say Shema Yisroel. You have to hear my story!"

The words that came out of the Rav's mouth was HaShem words. The Rabbanim are the Urim V'Tumim of our generation. No matter how right we think we are, no matter how LeShem Shamayim we believe to be, whatever the Rav tells us, those words are Kodesh Kadoshim. We have to take it to heart and remember, that:

אל תתייאש"-don't give up hope. אפילו חרב חדה מונחת על צואורו של אדם אל ימנע עצמו מן הרחמים




The Gemara in Brochos points out a contradiction between two pesukim in Tehilim. One possuk says, "Hashomayim shomayim LaShem veho'oretz nossan levnei

adam," the Heavens belong to HaShem, and the earth is given over to man, and the second possuk says, "LaShem ho'oretz umlo'ah," to HaShem is the world and everything in it. So what's the story with this world—does it belong to HaShem, or is it the domain of man?



The Gemara says it's not a contradiction: Kan kodem levrocho vekan le'achar haberocho. Before we make a blessing, it's like we're in the store, and we haven't paid for the item yet. But once we swipe that credit card, and we pay for it with a blessing, then it becomes ours.

There's an alternative explanation. Let's say, for example, I have an apple in my hand—before I make a berocho, it's "my" apple; it's a pedestrian apple. But once I make a berocho on it, now it becomes elevated to an expression of LaShem ho'oretz umlo'ah, that the whole world is filled with HaShem.

Nowadays we are all fortunate to have plenty of clothes yet this wasn't always the case. Our Parashah discusses the halachah of someone who lends money to a poor person who only has one change of clothes. He is so destitute that it is one of his few possessions and he needs to give it as a collateral when he borrows money. The lender needs to have mercy on him and ensure that this is returned to him at night, since he has no other clothes. (22:25)



An inspiring Midrash (Tanchumah 16) teaches that Hashem says, 'look how much you are obligated to me. When you sin before me and your neshamah returns to Shamayim each night, I return it, so too you must return the collateral to the borrower.' Hashem in His great Mercy returns our holy neshamah that is entrusted to Him each night, even if we are not deserving. Our role on this world is to emulate Hashem, therefore we must follow in His ways and compassionately return the borrowers' collateral.

Not only does Hashem in His great compassion return our neshamah, He also ensures that it is returned in a fresh state. As Chazal teach, 'humans will entrust their deposit in pristine condition, yet will receive it worn and used. Lehavdil, Hashem returns our weary soul after a tiring day, new and refreshed.' (Midrash Tehillim 25)

When our neshamah returns to the Heavens it becomes cleansed and revitalized providing us with an incredible opportunity to serve Him for a new day. Therefore, we need to offer our heartfelt appreciation. For this reason when we wake up, we recite the words שהחזרת בי נשמתי בחמלה "you have returned to me Your soul with graciousness..." as a way of expressing our gratitude for this. Hashem is our loving caring Father, and regardless if we are worthy, He graciously returns our neshamah new and refreshed, giving us another day of the priceless gift of life.

Rav Shraga Mendalovitz used to say, 'the greatest gift of life is life

out the years of his life. What a privilege!



### A SON-IN-LAW LIKE R' AKIVA EIGER

A man once entered the Mir Yeshiva in Poland, seeking a new son-in-law for his daughter. He asked the mashgiach, R' Yerucham Levovitz, who the best boy was. The mashgiach replied: "Who do you want? This boy is like Reb. Akiva Eiger, this one is a R' Yitzchok Elchanan, and the next is R' Paysach Pruskin. Which do you want as a sonin-law?" At the time, these weren't necessarily top boys of the yeshiva, yet R' Yerucham gave each talmid the feeling that he's going to be the next gadol, empowering and infusing each of them with courage of greatness. Many of these bachurim grew to be great leaders in the past generation.

More than what R' Yerucham said was the inner chashivus, respect that he gave to them. Empowering them with the capabilities gives a person the courage to bring forth the great potential.

### "YOU CAN BE A GENERAL!!"

The doors of the beis midrash opened up, and in came the Chofetz Chaim. All the talmidim were eagerly waiting the message that their great rebbi would reveal. "We know what Napoleon would

convey to his army," he said. "'One who doesn't believe he can be a general, even a soldier he



can't be.' Besides strength and power, fighting in the army needs 'courage.' The courage needed to fight in an army must be strong, and therefore only the one who believes that he can be a general is fit to fight as a soldier.

"So much so," continued the Chofetz Chaim, "applies to serving Hashem; one who believes that he can be great will have the courage and bravery to stand strong, but the one who thinks that he can't be great won't have the courage to stand up and fight. " (Sheva Ipol Tzaddik, p. 450)

"There are many who think that they can't reach greatness," says R' Yitzchak Hutner. "But this is the kefirah of our generation. The great shortcoming that a person can have, is the feeling that he can't become great, and that we must battle with all our might. "

### **RESPECTFUL DOGS**

In 1937, R' Elchanan Wassermann set out on a trip to America to raise the

necessary funds for the Baranowitz Yeshiva. He traveled all around America



for these funds. At one point, he had R' Shmuel Greinamen, the principal of Yeshiva Torah Vodaath, while he was staying in the home of R' Zalman Levin, going around with him as a translator.

When they got to upstate New York, they passed a wealthy-looking home, but R' Shmuel walked right by, not giving it much attention. R' Elchanan questioned why they were skipping that home. "There is a mezuzah on the doorpost." To which R' Shmuel answered there were two vicious-look-

ing dogs at the gateway, preventing any visitors entry, and that's why he avoided it.

R' Elchanan responded that he's go-



ing in despite the vicious-looking dogs. He opened the gate and headed toward the front door. Sure enough, the dogs came charging at him, but as soon as they got to him, they stopped.

front door, asking for a donation. The shocked man answered the door, asking, "How did you get in? Didn't the dogs 'greet' you at the entrance?"



This recollection gives us nobility and dignity. This in itself stands for us to take great pride in and to conduct ourselves in an uplifting manner.

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### The Empowerment of Responsibility

Ask anyone for a list of the keys to achieving success and becoming a leader, and they will likely rattle off a number of qualities and character attributes that are, no doubt, very valuable. But on the oth-



er hand, few people are likely to mention one of the significant causes of success that one researcher discovered — being a firstborn child.

This researcher discovered that firstborns, who make up only about 35 percent of the general population, form a much greater percentage of high achievers, political leaders, successful businessmen, and other top performers. Astronauts, company executives, renowned scientists, and even United States presidents



tend to be firstborns far more frequently than one would have imagined. The next question that the researcher asked himself was: Why? After extensive research and

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consideration of the evidence, he concluded that the primary distinction between firstborns and their peers lay in the fact that firstborns tend to be saddled with more responsibilities than their younger siblings. That responsibility tends to bring out latent abilities that otherwise

might never have been tapped (Bringing Out the Best in Others, by Thomas K. Connellan).

Simple observation indicates that responsibility is capable of transforming a person. An individual faced with a daunting array of tasks to perform and issues to resolve will almost always adapt to handle the circumstances.

The Gemara states (Shabbos 11a), "If all the seas were ink, the marshes quills, the heavens parchment, and all the people scribes, it would not be sufficient to write about the 'void' of the government." Rashi explains that the "void" in question refers to the depth of the king's heart. A king must concern himself with the affairs of all of his subjects, the smooth running of his entire kingdom, and major issues such as wars with his neighbors, rendering proper judgment in court cases, and the like. The average

citizen's puny concerns pale in comparison to the vast array of issues that weigh upon the ruler of a country. And this is no less true of today's political figures. The

head of state of any of the powerful nations must deal with a burden of issues: the economy, the military, public education, taxes, politics, and many more topics of concern. How does one man handle such mas-



sive responsibilities? When a human being is placed in a position of awesome responsibility, that very situation has the capacity to extract unimaginable greatness from him. A head of state knows that he, and only he, is responsible for contending with all of these issues, and that is what elicits his ability to do so.

Rav Chaim Shmulevitz zt"l writes that a person achieves greatness by accepting responsibilities. The more responsibility a person accepts, the greater he becomes.

This principle is relevant to many common situations. How should a parent react when a child blames his poor performance in school on an inept teacher or disruptive classmates? Some parents might be tempted to agree with the child and reassure him that his failure was not his own fault. But instead of empowering the child, this response actually diminishes the child's ability to succeed. In order to promote future success, the parent should tell the child — gently, of course — that regardless of his teacher's acumen or his



friends' behavior, in the final analysis, his performance in school is entirely in his own hands.

In the office environment, "micromanaging" tends to limit employee productivity. A business thrives when employees are entrusted with important tasks and made to feel responsible for the company's success. That sense of responsibility brings out the employees' latent capabilities.

The same is true of kollel yungerleit. Young men often flourish the most when they leave the large kollelim of the big cities and are thrust into the smaller, more intimate environments of out-of-town kollelim. Suddenly, they find themselves shouldering additional responsibilities that there is no one else to fulfill: delivering a shiur, mentoring, paskening, and being mekareiv. In such situations, yungerleit often discover strengths that they never knew they possessed.

Hashem calls the Jewish people "b'ni bechori Yisrael — My firstborn son, Yisrael. (Shemos 4:22)" The Torah also tells us that we are a mamleches Kohanim, a nation of priests; we are destined to be the leaders of the world. As Hashem's "firstborn," so to speak, we are entrusted with a much higher level of responsibility.

In November 22, 1963, the United States was shaken to the core by the assassination of President John F. Kennedy. The president was shot on a Friday morning, and a state funeral was held the following Monday. Private and public schools throughout the country were closing on

that day, and Dr. Joseph Kamenetzky, the director of Torah Umesorah, asked Rav Yaakov Kamenetzky zt"l whether their schools should follow suit.

Rav Yaakov advised that the



schools should definitely be closed, quoting the Kuzari's teaching that the Jewish people's relationship with the nations of the world is analogous to the relationship between the heart and the rest of the body. The Jews are supposed to be the "heart" of the world and teach mo-

rality to all the nations. If such a horrific wrong could be committed, it meant that the Jewish people had failed, in some measure, in carrying out their mission.

This idea provides us with another answer to the question we raised earlier in this chapter: how we can avoid demonstrating disrespect for people who do not live in accordance with the Torah. If we recognize that it is our responsibility to model the correct way to live, and that their failure to live properly represents a failing of our own, we will not be able to feel disdain for them.

It is often tempting to consider ourselves incapable of repairing the world's ills. We tend to look around and tell ourselves that the rest of the world will always despise us and it is not within our ability to make a difference in the world. But these thoughts are disempowering. It is a fundamental part of our faith that everything that happens in the world is connected to the Jewish people. In truth, everything depends on whether we succeed in making ourselves into proper reflections of Hashem. If we take responsibility for doing so, we can truly make a difference.

**In Review:** Our mission of kiddush Hashem means that we are the teachers of the entire world. Just as a teacher should not disparage his students for not knowing something that is his responsibility to teach them, we must also recognize that it is our responsibility to educate the world about the proper way to live, and we cannot disparage the secular world for not living up to our standards. If we kept the Torah perfectly, there would be more kiddush Hashem in the world, and the failings we observe would not exist. **Editor's Calcification on last week's article:** "Someone said that she was wearing a wig, but none of us believed it; it looked so real!"

It is self understood that the Rebbetzin was wearing a regular sheitel but to non-frum people or non-Jews who don't know that frum women wear wigs, it appeared as real.

In any case, everyone should follow their Da'as Torah as to which head covering is appropriate and best to use.



However the Gemarah in Brachos 58a says that when one sees 600,000 Yidden, he says 'Baruch ata Hashem chacham harazin' - blessed are You, Hashem, Who knows each Yid's unique thoughts! The Tzlac"h Explains that we are praising Hashem for giving each Yid their own personal connection with Him! 600,000 Yidden contain all the 600,000 variations of connecting to Hashem! Yes we are one nation but we bless Hashem For making every Yid unique! Amazingly the Gemorah continues and says that on a Gadol Hador One may also recite this Bracha of 'Chacham harazin'

The Ramban explains that the greater one is, the more they can relate to other people and appreciate their special Avodas Hashem. The Gadol Hador Is able to encompass all of the individual paths to Hashem and thus one can make this blessing on him for he contains all the diverse elements in Klal Yisrael.

Every Yid has their own story. Life Is a fascinating journey of struggles and triumphs and twists and turns that make the person who he is. We should try to be in touch with our own stories and take pride in them! When we serve Hashem from this unique place in us, our Avodas Hashem becomes very meaningful and personal.



*Yasher ko'ach* on your leaflet! You asked for comments or personal stories, so I will quickly share something.

After Simchas Torah I felt I had to do something as a *zechus* for Klal Yisrael. I was looking to take a *kabalah* in an area that would be significant and not easy for me, but on the other hand, would be something that I could really keep. After a few days of feeling lost about what to do, I thought about the fact that frequently I would need to say Asher Yatzar when I was in the middle of something. Therefore, since I wanted to rush back to what I was doing, I would tend to hurry the beracha. So, I accepted upon myself to say the beracha without rushing or starting to go to where I had to go, and then to say a short tefillah for the wounded and the soldiers and Klal Yisroel. Since I want the *zechus* for the tefilla to be *miskabel*, I have been successful in the kabala. (If I start to hurry, it's during the tefilla, and not while saying Asher Yatzar).

Now that I have been saying the beracha more slowly, I was *zoche* to the following realization. We are thanking Hashem for the fact that our most lowly needs receive the attention to be brought before the *Kisei Hakavod*, and this is because these needs are necessary for us to be able to stand in front of Him.

### Message from the Founder of Asher to the Yatzar - R' Yossi Hecht

In the past I discussed the fact that Yidden are above *teva*. Now I would like to delve deeper and better understand why we are not bound by the laws of nature. My rebbe, Rav Elisha Sandler shlit" a told over a beautiful *vort* from Rav Tzadok Hacohen. Our matriarch Sara didn't have a womb, yet Hashem performed a *neis* and she bore Yitzchak Avinu. Why did his birth have to be in such a manner? True, we know that Hashem wants the *tefillos* of *tzaddikim*, but still, couldn't Sara have given birth when she was fertile?

Rav Tzadok answers that it seemed impossible for a 90-year-old woman to give birth at such an old age. Yet, Hashem made the very first birth of a Jew through a *neis*, in order to set a precedent for the future generations of Yidden. We must know that embedded in our DNA is that we are privy to merit miracles.

Accordingly, we must recognize that even when the situation seems bleak, a Yid never gives up hope. As the Gemara (Berachos 10a) says: "Even if a sharp sword is resting upon a person's neck, he should not prevent himself (from praying) for mercy." Fortunately, we have the opportunity to tap into these miracles in the berachos of Refaeinu and Asher Yatzar. In the zechus of this recognition, may Hashem heal and protect our brethren in Eretz Hakodesh, along with healing all other cholim in Klal Yisroel, with the coming of Moshiach, *b'mheira b'yameinu*!



## A GLIMPSE INTO THE PAST







The ability that Hakadosh Baruch Hu gave us to speak softly or loudly is something which is of vital importance to us. When someone finds himself in a dangerous situation where he needs outside assistance to extract himself from, how can he make other people aware of his predicament? If the situation is one that needs an immediate solution, you cannot afford the time to relay the message through body language,

notes or whispering. He needs to scream loudly. This will immediately relay the message even to people who are far away from him. They will hear the unusual sound and hopefully rush to his rescue.

This also serves as an important dethrone to criminals. One of the things that stop criminals from committing crimes when other people are around is because they are afraid of being

apprehended by other people who are in the vicinity. They do not want to attract any extra attention to themselves. It just takes one short scream to rally up the neighborhood. If we didn't have the ability to scream, what would deter them?

For example, what would deter a ganav from walking off with someone's purse on a busy street corner? Hakadosh Baruch Hu gave us the ability to scream for our safety and protection. Even though this is not an everyday occurrence, if it protects a person once in his lifetime, then it's already a very important gift.

bally. When we were hungry, thirsty, dirty, tired or uncomfortable, we did not have the ability to clearly articulate our needs. Hakadosh Baruch Hu gave us the ability to scream and cry with a loud shrill voice, notifying everyone around us that we need something. Then it became the job of those around us to figure out what that something is.

Parents who are r"l deaf are not able to hear their young babies when they cry. They have to find other means to notify themselves, like vibrators, to know if in middle of the night their baby woke up. This same issue applies to a mute baby.



## The unique and amazing Seahorse and Seadragon.

Hashem often gives us a gift in nature that shows us that Hashem is CLEARLY



the Creator of that particular creature. A seahorse is surely one of those very unique creatures.

Now, even though officially a seahorse is a fish, it really has almost nothing in common with fish except that it breathes through gills like all other fish and it has the special swim bladder that most fish have that help them with their floating capabilities. Otherwise, it is completely UNIQUE in the fish world!

We will go from its head to its tail. Well, firstly, it swims vertically and do not swim horizontally like ALL other fish swim. (The only exception is the razorfish which also swims vertically.)

It has a head shaped like a horse with a long snout, hence it's called a seahorse!

THEIR EYES are from the very few creatures that can move their eyes independently of each other. That means that one eye can be looking up and back and the other is looking down and frontward at the same time, and its brain can process both visions at the same time. This helps is be able to be very aware of any food that might be coming its way.

They have unique fins. (See the picture.) They have pectoral fins by their neck area. These help it steer right or left. They have a dorsal fin on its back which helps it move around. The dorsal fins move back and forth from 35 to 70 times per SECOND. That's EXTREMELY fast. They also have an anal fin, and it's not clear what their exactly function is.

Most fish have their bones/skeleton on the inside with the fish flesh surrounding them. Seahorse's have their fish flesh on the inside. They are surrounded with a VERY UNIQUELY structured outer skeleton. It has about 10-18 bony rings surrounded by tight thin skin (they have

no scales). This is why you see in the pictures what looks like separate sections going down it's whole body until the bottom of its tail.

DR D.6 TO 14 INCHES

It has no teeth and it

has no stomach! It just has intestines. Seahorse are eating throughout the day. The reason is that since they have no stomach, they can't hold their food too long, so for proper nutrition it needs to constantly eat and their body is able to get enough nutrition from all that food. They suck in the food through their snout. It works like a straw. (Obviously they can only eat small creatures swimming by.)

PREHENSILE TAIL. – What fish have

tails? None. Their tails work like a monkey's tail. It can grab on to things very tightly. It's actually very important to the seahorse to be able to do so. Since they don't move around much, they anchor themselves to different sea plants and they camouflage themselves there. What's this about camouflaging themselves?

Seahorses are from the select creatures that can change its colors to blend in with their background. In this case it's the color of the plant that it's holding on to that it will copy. This keeps it camouflaged. Now, to go into the whole miracle of being able to change your colors to match your background is not for this article, but OBVIOUSLY it's a very complicate process that takes a bunch of cooperating parts and chemicals in the body and in its brain for it to work efficiently. Another miracle!

Basically, seahorse's have no predators. No other fish want to eat it since it has this unpalatable hard skeleton. Larger fish may end up swallowing them, more by mistake then on purpose. Their life span is about three years and then they die.

all the above differences weren't amazing enough, here's the clincher! If you look at the

picture you will see that the male seahorse has what's called a brood



pouch. It's very similar to the pouch of a Kangaroo! The mother lays a bunch of eggs into the pouch and the eggs develop in the father's pouch. (The number of eggs deposited can be quite a lot, sometimes numbering in the hundreds.) After about 2-4 weeks of development, they hatch out of the eggs alive and the father lets them out of his pouch. They come out looking exactly like the adults, just in a miniature version. (See the picture) They are completely on their own. What stupendous UNIQUENESS the seahorse has!! No other fish in the ocean has all these unique characteristics! Hashem has gone out of His way to show us that He is not beholden to any "rules" how nature has to work. He can create all different types of creatures; vastly different than one other, and they all work just fine!

Sea dragons. Sea dragons are basically exactly the same as regular seahorse's

a prehensile tail. They DO HAVE AN ABSOLUTELY AMAZING CAMOUFLAGE (besides also being able to change colors) which looks exactly like sea weed, thereby being unnoticed by the creatures they wish to get close to, to be able to eat them. See the picture. Quite amazing!

Q: The Gemara Yuma 4b brings from R' Masya Ben Cheresh that Hashem called Moshe Rabeinu up to Har Sinai for 6 days (to get the second luchos) to keep him in solitude away from people so he should be in a state of fear when he goes into Machana Shechina to receive the Torah. (לאיים עליו). The Gemara brings the Pasuk וגילו ברעדה.

1. We hear on 'A Life with Bitachon' that Hashem is kulo love and rachamim. Why did He want Moshe Rabeinu to be scared and afraid? Why should Moshe be afraid of Someone so loving and caring? And in general how do we understand the Mitzvah of Yirah. It seems like we are supposed to be fearful, scared and distanced from Hashem. It seems like the opposite message of what we hear on 'A Life with Bitachon'.

### 2. Why doesn't 'A Life with Bitachon' focus on Yirah?

A: Nowadays, most people associate the word yirah with negative thoughts. We think of a judge, a terrorist, a dictator;

he has power and what he says goes. We look at these kinds of people as scary. We look at them as having a stick in their hand ready to beat us up if we do anything wrong. We don't want to have any shaychus or a connection to these types of people. We want to stay far away from them. We don't want to be on their bad side. We're scared of them. Nowadays, most people associate yiras Hashem with those kind of feelings. They feel that Hashem is out to get us, to punish us, to take revenge, show us Who's boss, to put us in our place. That brings them further away from Hashem and that type of yirah is the type of yirah you have to stay faaaaaaar away from!

In the olden days, yiras haonesh, fear of punishment, was used in a positive way. It motivated people to become closer to Hashem, because they said, 'Wow, look, we want to make sure that we're perfect. Look how careful we have to be!' Also, they viewed onesh in a positive way, that Hashem is giving them soap and shampoo if they do anything wrong. So they viewed everything positively. Yiras hachet, of onesh, is what brought them even closer to Hashem. They viewed it as, 'We have to be perfect, and if we aren't, then Hashem wants to clean up the stains by giving us a shower.' However, for most of us, nowadays, we're not able to associate yiras haonesh with positive thoughts, so we should stay away from this type of yirah.

Then there's another type of yirah called yiras harommemus, which makes it that you're like WOW! You're awed by it; you're inspired by it. The difference between the first type and the second type is that by the first type you want to run away as soon as you can, no shaychus, no connection. The second type you want to become closer and you're like wow! If you see an awesome sight, wow, this is awesome! Like the water at Niagra Falls, mountains, hills – wow! You're blown away! Blown away. That blown away feeling makes you have positive emotions and that's a good thing.

That's the answer to the questions. Hakadosh Baruch Hu wanted Moshe Rabbeinu to reach the highest level. Now, the highest level is when you realize that there's nothing to be nispael about except from Hashem. Hashem is the only thing you can get excited about. That's why he had to stay away from other people, because when you look at a chashuy person, you think of them as having chashivus. Hashem wanted Moshe Rabbeinu to remove himself from people to realize that we don't get excited over people, because people are nothing more than just how Hashem programmed them. All their chashivus and awesomeness is




from Hashem. Thinking these kinds of thoughts will bring a person to become closer to Hashem.

For example, R' Yehuda Mandel said over from R' Aharon Kotler that "yamim noraim" means Days of Awesome. You know what's awesome? The amount of chesed and rachamim Hashem is going to shower us with this year! If anyone would see the amount of chesed, they would be so inspired they would just run to be closer to Hashem and love Hashem.

Similarly, the Zohar says that if you would realize and see how awesome Hashem is, you would scream like a lion on top of your lungs, you'd get so excited. Just like we scream when we see an exciting thing, look! Look! And we get all excited. Wow! Beautiful! Magnificent!

So the teretz is that whenever the Gemara refers to yirah, it's referring to a yirah that brings you closer to Hashem and that's a beautiful thing. But nowadays, for most people, because we don't have a healthy relationship with Hashem because we have negative associations with schar v'onesh and we feel that if we do something wrong Hashem is going to get back at us and Hashem is going to take revenge and get angry – the concept of yirah gives us a very bleak picture which makes our relationship with Hashem very unhealthy. Therefore, we have to go to the opposite extreme. This



world is supposed to bring out positive emotions and help us have a healthy relationship with Hashem." Ray Yehuda Mandel is what R' Moshe Feinstein writes in Darash Moshe in chelek beis on the word Elul. He has a paragraph about Elul and it says that Elul is Ani Ledodi V'dodi Li, you have to make Hashem your Beloved. How do you make Hashem your Beloved? Zugt R' Moshe, in the olden days they could do it through yirah, through onesh, through gehinnom, because that made Hashem look awesome, look wow, look at Hashem, look at His power, look at his might! Those are all things that drew people closer to Hashem. Wow, let's do everything perfect because we only want Olam Habah and Gan Eden. So those were all motivating factors in bringing people closer to Hashem. But nowadays we associate yiras haonesh with a dictator, something scary, something frightening, something we don't want to have a shaychus with.


So bottom line is, there's yiras haromemmus which is the highest level, where you're so awestruck, you're thinking,

"Wow, Hashem's amazing, wow!" And you chap we only should get excited about Hashem, not about human beings, because then you're turning human beings into getchkas, avoda zarah, which we don't want anyone to do. That was the chet of the egel, they turned Moshe Rabbeinu into a getchka, they got too excited over a human being. That's what Hashem was telling Moshe, don't get excited about human beings, only about Hashem. Then there's yiras haonesh, which in the olden days motivated them in a positive way, but nowadays most of us have no shaychus to this. Nowadays, most people associate yirah with thinking that chas v'shalom, Hashem is out to get us, to punish us, to take revenge, show us Who's boss, put us in our place. That brings us further away from Hashem and that type of yirah you have to stay faaar away from! Actually, the Chozeh M'Lublin says that one of the simanim before Mashiach is yiras hachet yimaasu, we're going to be disgusted from yiras hachet. The Chozeh M'Lublin writes that Chazal aren't saying something derogatory, they're saying that the way Klal Yisrael is going to connect to Hashem before Mashiach is only through positive, only through love, only through ahava. That's why a Life With Bitachon only focuses on positive, because that's the way we connect to Hashem nowadays.

The most important thing is that every person has to connect to Hashem in a positive way. You have to have positive emotions towards Hashem, positive feelings. However a person is able to do that, that's the way the person should do it. In the olden days, most people were able to do it through yiras harommus and through yiras haonesh, because they had a healthy relationship with Hashem, and they viewed everything in a positive light, and they didn't have any neg-



ative emotions towards anything. Nowadays, we associate onesh and gehinnom as negative, so if we focus on onesh and gehinnom we'll automatically view Hashem in a negative light chas v'shalom, therefore we're not allowed to focus on it. Instead, we just focus on positivity. Ahava, ahava, ahava! Love, love, love! By focusing on positive associations and ahavas Hashem, that itself will be mechaper for all our aveiros, because that's the best soap and shampoo for us. By just strengthening our positive connection with Hashem, that will give us a straight ticket to Olam Habah, and therefore for most people, through positivity alone we'll reach our level of shleimus.

Q. I'm in the parshah of shidduchim for a long time, and it feels like a roller-coaster. So many times, I was about to get engaged, but at the last minute the other side backed out. It hurts so much to keep on getting rejected.

**A.** There's no such thing as a shidduch 'almost working out'. Hashem already determined who your bashert is. When it's not the right one, it's not 'the other side' who's deciding to say no. It's our loving father, Hakadosh Baruch Hu, who's protecting you from marrying the wrong person.

The Sefer Chasidim writes that when a shidduch doesn't work out, you have to thank Hashem for saving you from a disaster! And if you meet so many people it is because Hashem wanted you to meet them – and for them to say no. When the right one comes, it will for sure work out, and the 'other side' will be powerless to stop it.

Q. My daughter has been in shidduchim for a long time and no names are coming up. My daughter is taking it very hard and is shifting the blame on me. Inwardly, I know that the blame is unfounded, but it makes me feel very hurt that after being such a devoted parent, instead of receiving appreciation, I'm being blamed. As a result, our relationship is turning sour.

**A.** The reason that you're allowing your daughter's attitude to affect your relationship is because you're taking her criticism personally.

Understand, your daughter's accusations are not coming from her intellect. It's coming from her emotions. Your daughter is in acute pain.

It's a part of human nature that when a person is overwhelmed by pain and doesn't know how to deal with it, he will shift the blame on someone else. People can even fabricate stories and convince themselves that they are true, just to have someone to blame their problems on.

When you realize that your daughter has nothing personal against you, you will be able to take yourself out of the picture and focus on helping your daughter deal with pain in a healthy way.

Show your daughter that you validate her feelings of pain and frustration. Show her that you're on the same page and that you feel her pain.

After she feels that she's understood, you could offer chizuk. Explain to her that Hashem is her loving Father, and He has the most amazing shidduch waiting for her, and only He knows when the right time is to find him. And when that time comes, you won't have to wait one second more.

Furthermore, take steps to enrich your relationship with her. Focus on everything that she has going for her and how many ma'alos she has. Think about what a bracha she is in your life. The more you invest in appreciating her the more you will value your relationship with her.

Although, right now it might seem to be a one-sided relationship, with time she will soften up and come to appreciate how you were there for her in her time of need. Eventually, you will cultivate a bond even more powerful than before.

I remembered that someone owed me money and they had told me a week before that they were going to write it down and try to give it to me. I texted him to remind him, and he called me back. He asked if he could send it to me via Zelle. Baruch Hashem, that was the best way for me to get the money, and my bank went back into Black.
