I live in Yerushalayim. I have a friend who made Aliyah to Eretz Yisrael from the States. He was married twenty years ago and has been learning in kollel since then.

His brother, who lived in America, was suffering a lot. He was ill, and his situation became complicated; he needed serious treatment in the hospital.

My friend received an urgent call from his brother's family in America, asking him to come and strengthen his brother physically and spiritually, to give him what only a brother can give.

My friend understood that he was needed

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in America, so he quickly arranged everything, prepared all the necessary documents, and boarded a flight.

When he got there, he met his brother whom he hadn't seen for fifteen years, but within minutes they felt as though they'd

been gether forever. My friend did his job wholeheartedly, offering his heart and his words,

his advice and his time.

Once, when my friend was in hospital with his brother, he suddenly had a terrible headache. It wasn't the first time his head hurt, but the intensity of the pain was cause for concern. "Here I am in the hospital,"

thought to himself. "I may as well ask them to examine me."

He was taken in for an examination, and the doctors were shocked. The results of the examination revealed something very problematic, and my friend needed immediate medical intervention.

Continued there was no need to be confrom front cerned. "You don't go to the hospital for this sort of thing." He would simply have waited

for it to pass.

But he had this intense headache precisely when he came to help his brother in the hospital – and his life was saved.

Sometimes a person thinks he is doing something with mesirus nefesh to help another, and he doesn't realize that Hakadosh Baruch Hu wants to help him, save him and heal him. [Kav Hashgacha Pratis]

"TISHREI"

For a while we had wanted to begin a seder to learn hilchos Shabbos during all our seudos, and baruch Hashem, we were zocheh to do so. We are learning two halachos at every seudah, and we came to the halachah regarding how Shabbos and Yom Tov expenses come back to you.



That's right, Chazal have said that a person's parnassah is predetermined every Rosh Hashanah, except for Shabbos and Yom Tov expenses. Dorshei Reshumos

even gave an acronym for all expenses that are calculated on Rosh Hashanah, and they are the initials of the word "Tishrei," which stands for Talmud Torah, Shabbos, Rosh Chodesh, and Yom Tov.

One of the children got really excited.

"What – really? Everything comes back to you?" he asked in disbelief.

"Everything," I said.

"How does it come back?"

"The Ribbono Shel Olam has many ways of providing," I said.

"And can it also happen that someone just gives you money in your hand?"

"Yes, it's possible."

A short while passed, and it was Erev Pesach. We strengthened ourselves in our emunah that Yom Tov expenses come back to you, and we bought what we needed, relying on the open Hand of Hashem, Who took us out of Mitzrayim. On Chol Hamoed, when I went down to the park with the children for a short outing, a car stopped right near us, and the driver called out to one of my children to come to him.

I saw this and I was suspicious. I imme-

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diately went over to him myself. What does this stranger want from my child? "I have an envelope to give you," he said.

He handed me the envelope, and I could tell that there was money inside. I refused to

accept it.

"Why don't you take it? It's meant to be yours."

"What do you mean? Do you even know me?"

"I'll explain," the driver said, while his wife nodded along, agreeing with everything he said. "We are traditional. There is money here to give to a family with children. We decided that we would go to Bnei Brak and give the envelope to the first family we'd meet. You are the first family we met, so the money belongs to you!"

Considering the incredible series of events, I understood that Hakadosh Baruch Hu had sent me the money, and I took it happily and with thanks.

At home we counted the money, and we saw that the sum equaled the exact amount we had spent on Yom Tov expenses.

Not only that, but for some reason, on the envelope was written one word that explains everything: Tishrei. [Kav Hashgacha Pratis]

bathtub. Calling in a professional plumber is a big expense, and I tried to save the cost by calling my friend who somewhat understands these things. He listened to my request, and he came over to take care of the problem. He released the blockage, and all he asked as payment was 150 shekels.

I paid him and he left, but then I realized that he'd made a severe error: He had removed the entire pipe; instead of helping, he had made matters much worse. The water started flowing freely under all the tiles, and now we would have to repair the damage and put in a new pipe. I asked experts and plumbers what such work should cost, and it became clear that the lowest price possible was 1200 shekels. This seemed to be a harder-than-average job, because a lot of plumbers hemmed and hawed and told me they were loaded with work and could not come help me. I complained to my friend. I told him about the damage he had caused me, and he argued with me and claimed that he was not obligated to pay for it. We almost went to din Torah, but b'siyata d'Shmaya, I stopped in time. I decided to let it go, with the emunah that one doesn't lose out from letting something go, and I anticipated Hashem's salvation.

Soon complaints started to come in from the neighbors about dampness in their walls. At that point I could not wait any longer. Moisture in the walls meant that the damage would only get worse and the cost would only grow, and what would I do then?

I spoke to my mother, and she recommended wonderful experts — a grandfather and his grandson who do plumbing and installation work together.

"They're good-hearted people," she emphasized, "and they'll definitely want to help you." I called them, and even though it was almost Erev Pesach, they came. Initially, they estimated the work would cost 1200 shekels, but after they start-

ed working, they realized that they would have to drill a hole in the wall to create a new water-supply point and to pull a line toward the main pipe. This would cost 3000 shekels. I told myself that I am privileged to be an avreich kollel, and my money is especially safeguarded by Hashem. Shekalim belonging to an avreich kollel are a type of "shekel hakodesh." They weigh more, and I was confident that Hakadosh Baruch would certainly help. I thank Hakadosh Baruch Hu for the fact that during all the time the grandfather and grandson were working in my house I did not feel pressured, and when the thought entered my mind: What will be? Where will I find the means to pay this big sum, and what's more, on erev Pesach? - I immediately replaced it with the thought that my money is safeguarded, and Hakadosh Baruch Hu knows exactly how I will pay this.

When I asked them while they were working, "How much will this cost?" they responded, "When we finish – we'll talk."

For a full day they worked and drilled and put in and took out until finally, at the end of that long day of work, they finished the job. The new water-supply point was properly installed, and the water began flowing through the new pipe.

The grandfather and grandson washed their hands, straightened up, and stretched. To my query of "How much?" the grandfather answered, "400 shekels."

While I was standing open-mouthed, not knowing how to react, he said, "From the start we decided to do good work and to ask you to pay only for the materials, and we haven't changed our minds."

I realized that this miracle was due to the fact that the entire time I remained strong in my emunah and did not lose focus from the awareness that Hakadosh Baruch Hu would help me. [Kav Hashgacha Pratis]

which has a private entrance, we waited for an opportunity to host guests. With this goal in mind we tried to get hold of beds for a guest room, but we did not find any, so we decided to buy them. We went down to a store and ordered beds. They told us the beds would arrive by Thursday.

That week, my brother-in-law and sister-inlaw rented out their apartment for Shabbos, and we gladly invited them to spend Shabbos in our home, counting on the beds that would arrive later in the week. However, on Thursday, when we called the store to ask when the beds would arrive, they told us that they would probably not arrive until the following week.

"We'll try to get beds," I said. "There will be beds, with Hashem's help." I knew our guests did not have another place to go at this point, and Hakadosh Baruch Hu would certainly help us. On Friday at 12 p.m., I went to the main entrance of the building, planning to ask the neighbors if we could borrow mattresses, and right there I saw a nice hi-riser bed with two mattresses. I assumed that the bed belonged to one of the neighbors, who gets hold of secondhand furniture from time to time, so I called him. "What can I do for you?" he asked

"Does the bed in the entranceway belong to you?"

"Yes."

"Can I take the mattresses for Shabbos? I have guests."

"You can take the mattresses, and take the bed too. Take, take, no problem. If you need it, it's a sign that it was sent for you. You never lose out from doing chessed."

As soon as he finished talking I heard a dial tone. He had told me he was very busy. This hi-riser was really a great piece of furniture, and thus we were zocheh to host my brotherin-law and sister-in-law happily and comfortably, and we all gained. I went to the store where we had ordered the beds, and they agreed to cancel the order. Every-

thing worked out, and I was amazed by my neighbors' noble behavior.

Before Shabbos Parshas Balak, this same good-hearted neighbor told me, "The Yid who brought me the bed asked if I was enjoying it, and I told him I had given it to you - my neighbor the avreich who hosts guests. He could not understand how I had agreed to give up the bed at a time when I needed it myself. I told him, 'I brought the beds in on a Thursday night, and this avreich needed them urgently for Shabbos. I understood that they were meant to be his, and one never loses out from doing chessed!' This Yid was so impressed by the whole story that he told me, 'Okay, then I'm buying you new beds!""

This is how I saw that Hakadosh Baruch Hu helps us all, with a chain of gemilus chassadim. We searched for beds because we wanted to do the mitzvah of hachnasas orchim, and the neighbor gave them to us because he wanted to do chessed, and the Yid who gave him the beds had the ability to give him beds again. Ashreinu that we were zocheh to be part of this chain of giving! [Kav Hashgacha Pratis]

sented me with several nisyonos in financial matters. The nisyonos themselves are opportunities. A life without nisyonos is a boring life. Did I get up early in the morning just so I'd be able to sleep well at night? I want to be someone who is constantly moving forward, learning and growing and



coming closer to Hakadosh Baruch Hu.

One Thursday night I was sitting in front of a list of debts, all of which had to be paid very soon. I had no idea where I would get so much money, and I was trying to find sources of funding. In my mind I went through the people I knew, and then I remembered a friend who owed me a large sum of money. The due date for repayment of that debt had long since passed. Perhaps it was preordained, so that I would have the money now, when I so desperately needed it. I called him up, and we had a friendly conversation; then I reminded him of the debt. I told him I needed the money and would be happy to receive it as soon as possible.

He totally missed the message. Instead of promising to repay the money soon, he started stringing together all sorts of sentences, the underlying message being that he was obviously not planning on paying his debt in the coming days.

The conversation ended uncomfortably.

Was this a friend?! Is this how one acts to one's friends?! I had stood by him in his time of difficulty, and he was turning his back on me when I needed money! Where was his honesty? Where were his good middos?! What sort of behavior was this?! This was not okay! I was angry. This was not the way a mensch behaves.

Aah...a mensch. Nu, what did I tell you? Hakadosh Baruch Hu sends me nisyonos in order to uplift me. If I were stuck without money and without a borrower who was supposed to repay his debt, then I would have had to strengthen myself in emunah and bitachon, to make sure to stay calm, and to hope for Hashem's salvation, for He can do anything!

I told myself: So what if you found someone to blame – does that exempt you from doing the work that you have to do? What does it matter what the process is in this case? Hakadosh Baruch Hu is running His world, and He is transferring funds from one person to the next. If He wants, He will put it in my friend's heart to return the debt to me; and if He wants – the yeshuah will come about from a different source. I made a determined decision that I would bear no grudge against this person. He would still be my friend, just as before! I davened Maariv and asked Hashem to help me cover the debt, "and that I not get angry today, nor anger You," and I hoped for the best.

After Maariv this friend called and said, "Tonight you'll have the money!"

I had no idea what happened to him. What

caused him to in the refuse beginning, and what made him pay me now? I saw clearly that Hakadosh ruch Hu wanted to test me, and once I was zocheh to place my burden only on Him, He sent me His help. [Kav Hashgacha Pratisl

My friend immediately drove over, took the compressor, and went back to install it on the air conditioner that he was repairing. Within twenty minutes the matter was taken care of, and it didn't end up costing him anything!

It was amazing to see how the nisyaon of whether or not to tell the owner of the house the truth was only a nisayon. What a joy it is to see such he'aras Panim: My friend did the right thing, gained a clear conscience, and did not lose out at all.

While he was learning it, he got a phone call about a house in the perfect location and for the right price! Someone reached out to him! He signed on it and he is moving into it!



Suggestions for the case of Yossi who is getting tired of his friend Pesach who is constantly needing to talk to him for

great amounts of time: Maybe Yossi can introduce

Pesach to other people so that he branches out to more people. In doing so, he may help Pesach become more socially aware.



- Yossi should realize that he has a significant impact on Pesach's life. Focusing on that fact may relieve some of the resentment.
- It will likely be difficult for Yossi to have a conversation with Pesach on this matter, yet he will gain immeasurably in his maturity by doing so.
- Yossi will learn how to be there for a friend and at the same time making sure the person doesn't take over



his life. Hashem has given him this opportunity to learn to establish proper boundaries.

- At least he's not in Pesach's position with all that baggage.
- Yossi could think to himself that he must be special, as he is needed and is able to be such a source of comfort for someone else.
- Perhaps, he will realize that in certain situations he behaves similarly, and it will be enlightening that another person may have similar thoughts regarding him.

Ayin Tova Success Stories:

The following is a story that demonstrates both the greatness of ayin tova and how hashgacha pratis is always manifest in our lives.

hlomo (name has been changed) wished to say birchas HaTorah prior to leaving for shul to daven. He got out his siddur and began reciting the brachos. At some point, one of his children came into the room and made a noise that startled Shlomo momentarily, and he lost track of where he was holding in the bracha. He asked his wife to be motzi him, but she was having stomach trouble and couldn't do it. Shlomo said, "there must be a reason why this happened" and he accepted that he would now have to find someone at shul to be motzi him.

When he arrived, he asked the first person he saw. The man informed him that he had already recited those brachos at home. Shlomo thanked him and continued his search. Not a minute passed before that same man came running toward Shlomo. He exclaimed that on further thought he realized that he had not said the brachos yet that morning as he was wont to do. Had it not been for Shlomo he would certainly not have said them at all that day! Now, it was clear to Shlomo why he needed to get befuddled with his own brachos, and why his wife temporarily couldn't help him out!

he next story happened on the same morning. When Shlomo and his wife woke up, they realized that they had both been so tired the previous evening that they neglected to put away the meat that was cooling off in the kitchen. His wife was saddened by the possibility of both the monetary and time loss that the spoiled meat presented. Shlomo tried to pacify his wife by explaining that everything Hashem does has a purpose. He added that sometimes Hashem reminds us to do important things that we may have otherwise forgotten and sometimes and we don't get any reminders. His wife was only mildly appeased.

When Shlomo went to shul, he noticed a Torah weekly that was on his table. One of the sections related a story about a woman who had spent weeks cooking for Rosh Hashana, and then a blackout caused them to lose all their perishables. She was beside herself with grief and was in a bad mood the entire Yom Tov. She later attested that she experienced a bad year. The moral of the story was that one should always accept all that Hashem sends our way with love. Interestingly, this particular weekly almost never appears in Shlomo's shul and certainly not that early in the week. Even more fascinating was the fact that this was the only copy in the whole shul, and it was on HIS table.

When he later related the whole story to his wife, she was so taken aback that she completely accepted the situation. (The meat ended up okay. as well)

'There must have been a mistake, I didn't give any homework last class', remarked the startled professor. 'Weren't those questions on the board homework?' he asked. 'Homework? They weren't homework. It says וחמשים עלו ממצרים – the מצרים left מצרים with weapons, and it also says ויצאו צבאות ד'. The army of הקב"ה left מצרים '. The army of מצרים left מצרים was going on? We can suggest בס"ד that it all means בס"ד - and they left with all kinds of tactics to win the יצה". And indeed, the מדבר was loaded with מדבר A Yid becomes a Yid with a ב" - and as eidel as a Yid should be in his הקב"ה like a sheep, he still needs weapons.

Part III

There is a time for the most soft type of person to show a tough front, or else he can end up with nothing ו"ח. You can't let רשעים (or your 'יצה") step all over you, and many people need to learn how to be assertive. Also, even if you are a weak (sheeply) type who isn't from the big עובדי ה, but he tries to act like a soldier he's already ideal!

Part IV

Like the person who is in a heavy addiction of קנאה תאוה כבוד etc. who makes that phone call to ask for עצות how to improve, or he learns a measly 5 minutes of מוסר since his severe ADHD doesn't allow for more. Or he at least tries to read stories of צדיקים since he isn't into learning בהתמדה.

Part V

Or he kvetches all day: "I wish I could improve" – all these are tiny efforts but are of utmost value in שמים. Leaving מצרים is something we talk about daily and people should always try to escape from their latest new יצה"ר. One of the worst יצה" is when you must feel that you accomplish like everyone else.

Part VI

All you need to do is to be a fighter! Or else you're in a treif מצרים mentality and מיצר means being confined and מצומצום where you must succeed and have the whole world respecting your great בתורה ובחסד. But by הקב"ה it's:

א' המרבה וא' הממעיט ובלבד שיכוין לבו לשמים.

Part VII Story

There is a story at the end of עמלקי where דוד destroyed an 'שמאל א band and he took loads of booty. The 400 men who went to war with him wanted all the spoils since they risked their lives, whereas the 200 men who stayed behind watching the בלים didn't deserve anything. These 400 men are called אנשי which is the lowest term בלי בליש.

Part VIII

Yet, דוד spoke eidel to them and he called them אחי "My dear brothers" (similar to יעקב who called אנשי ארם אחי who called אנשי ארם אחי who called אנשי ארם ארם swindlers). He told them that the 200 people should get equal amounts. We are דוד's heart [and a לב העם is a מלך]. How he cares for

the underdog, and he did the same as אברהם אבינו who after conquering the 4 kings gave equal booty to those who were עומד על הבלים

ענר אשכול וממרא.

Part IX

We can suggest בס"ד that all these מלחמת are also a זמר for מלחמת, and those who can't fight full force (and the מפרשים say that those who stayed behind were indeed weak) but do the best they can, are just as good. Look how these people are like the worst on the highest הדרגות can be downright dangerous, since such an attitude pasuls so many people.

Part X

Perfectionism is similar to בלי הקב"ה only wants you to do the best you can and it's love of כבוד and success that can get a person without עול בשר ודם just עול בשר ודם or big No respect for trying and wanting to improve – "Just be 100% or else you belong in the garbage ו"ח".

Part XI

During זמן חרותינו a person has to try to become a top 'עובד ה' but in a relaxed manner and with the knowledge that you serve only הקב"ה who is אלא for not eating blood בר את ישראל wants to be מזכה you, so should you try to be מזכה yourself and be דן את עצמו לכף זכות.

The message of אז ישיר

We say אז ישיר every day and yet, as soon as we finish davening we are still dreadfully worried about our pecklach of פרנסה and health, and relationship issues. אז ישיר is extremely powerful. It smashes, destroys, crushes, and sends your issues to the bottom of the sea never to be seen again, תהרוס, תרעץ, אללו בעופרת- במים אדירים

טבעו, נמוגו – all these are various לשונות of destruction and a Yid should view his serious problems being destroyed by הקב"ה who has all kinds of ways to give you a ישועה.

Part II

But this takes work on בטחון.

זה קלי ואנוהו

הקב"ה etc. are all powerful לשונות of making הקב"ה great of making הקב"ה great in your eyes. This means working on בטחון. There are scary doctors lawyers, personalities, employers, spouses, teenage children etc. that you feel are hurting you. סוס ורוכבו, מרכבות פרעה, אלופי – are all expressions of scary and dangerous powers in your life.

Part III

Your bad habits and addictions and sins can also disappear if you make הקב"ה great in your eyes. They will melt (נמגו) and get crushed סבת, and sink טבעו, and drawn all the way down טבעו, and they war and they were all terrified when קריעת ים took place.

Part IV

And you sing all this! This is a daily exercise in every Yid's life. יאכלמו עם your issues can turn into "cheap straw" and disappear! What a pity that it's so hard to get the message of אז ישיר and apply it to your own life.

Part V

I spoke to an אדם גדול from אי"י and he agreed that if people would spend some time learning שער בטחון before מעריב and מעריב then they would have more feeling in their מוסר would be like learning מוסר and it would calm them down!

Part VI

Look at עזרת אבותינו and אמת hey are super powerful messages of אמונה ובטחון. People are busy keeping the הלכות תפלה and davening with כוונה but despite this, their present fears are still going strong!

Part VII

Somebody said that if in the siddurim next to the words אלי מואב it would say — your boss who hates you and next to אלופי אדום it would say the giant "impossible" situation, etc. then אז would hit home and it would ממש be a מוסר סדר.

Story

I couldn't care less!

The more you're involved in Luca the happier your life will be

I was sitting in the car of one of my חסידים who was taking me to a חתונה and he overheard me saying to myself, "I couldn't care less!" He asked me what that was all about, and I told him that I just found out that all my hard work in producing my Bitachon Weekly went to the garbage since 7 hard earned pages that I wrote were lost with all my brilliant needs and it's lost forever.

Part II

And how does a person who always learns שער הבטחון overtime react? "I couldn't care less! And I'm actually happy. I lost it!" My רבי רח"מ ווינקראנץ told me that in the next world we'll "n be punished for having aggravation since ב"מ דעביד רחמנא לטב עביד, and having ב"מ is the opposite of having true! And I say I couldn't' care less with a tremendous שמחה and a coldness and laughter.

Part III

In fact, if I hadn't lost those pages it would have been the worst thing for me! (עיין ב"ק איך מנחמין אבלים שבבבל)

הקב"ה cares for me and my holy work much more than I care for myself, and if he wants me to make mistakes and lose things "He knows what he's doing! I'm in good hands!"

Part IV

Part V

But by far the main messages and accomplishments of ימי הפסח is to learn from the most incredible experience of יצ". To learn to have all kinds of יצ"מ in our real lives. That's why I learn extra ימי הפסח during מוסר and all the way till שבועות. Sometimes we ימי הפסח ימי הפסח no נסיונות to inspire more active .מוסר

Part VI

Last year I discovered that I had

a הייז ר"ל a few days before יו"ע, and I was going to Montreal to my relatives for יו"ט. So I spent lots of time working on till the next time I saw the doctor. A LIFE WITH BITACHON ON THE PARSHA



Bitachon on Pesach

Every young child knows that Hashem brought ten makkos on the Mitzriyim. This is one of the focal points of sipur yetzias Mitzrayim. They were punished in ways that were completely lema'ala miderech hateva, to show them that Hashem is the One running the world, and nothing else has any koach whatsoever.

Harav Avigdor Miller Zt"I would say, that if the ten makkos were there for the Mitzriyim to realize that Hashem runs the world, then kal vechomer, the ten makkos are there for us, the Yidden, to learn and internalize this message. Because the entire world was made for Klal Yisroel, whatever lesson the Goyim were supposed to take out of the ten makkos, we the Yidden need to learn a thousand times more. So in essence, the makkos were there to teach Klal Yisroel what it means to live with Emuna and Bitachon, more than

anything else.

Let us take a look at makkos dam as an example. Chazal say, that a Yid would be drinking from one half of the cup, and a Mitzri from the other side of that very same cup. The Mitzri would drink disgusting, horrible-tasting blood, and the Yid would get delicious, refreshing water, from the very same cup! This is the lesson of Makkas Dam. You can have two people drinking from the same cup, and each will experience what Hashem wants him to experience, even if it's the complete opposite.

It is worthwhile to mention, the Meforshim say that before Moshiach comes there will be the same type of Nissim. Iy"H, we are going to see this exact episode in front of our eyes. The Goy and the Yid will be standing in the same spot, and the Goy will be affected in the scariest, fiercest ways, and the Yid will have it great.

Makkas Dam taught us that there is no independent power as blood or water. It is all our loving, caring Father, the Ribono Shel Oilam running all forces and objects. Whatever was in the cup was just an illusion. Whatever Hashem decided, that creates the metzios and it doesn't matter if until that moment the cup had water or blood, Hashem is recreating the world brand-new every second. When the Mitzri and Yid were drinking, Hashem said "Dam for him, and water for him."

The more we internalize the message that every second Hashem is recreating the world brand-new, the more Hashem says, "You realize I am running the world, I will show you openly how this is true by giving you so much bracha, chessed and rachamim, and by showering you with yeshuos lema'ala miderech hateva."

A Yungerman shared: "We had a family member who had serious medical complications. His body started to shut down. The doctors said, "His body Is too weak to handle any treatments. There is nothing we can do. It is a matter of days at most." I turned to my family that was present and I told them, "I don't believe in teva or in what the doctors are saying. All I know is that Hashem is creating the world brand-new at every second. What does last second have to do with this second? What does last second have to do with now? Hashem is creating a new briya!" I kept on being mechazeik them, and we really felt like anything can happen and we can see an instant yeshua. Suddenly out of the blue, we saw a color change on his face. We called in the doctor, and he responded, "Wow! It looks like there is a drastic improvement. It seems like he may be coming back to himself!" It didn't take too much longer for him to wake up and become well enough to be discharged! Now he is running around completely healthy!

An amazing story was sent in by Harav Eliezer Fried: When my baby was born, the doctors took a sonogram. I was obviously in shock when they told me the results, "Your baby has four large holes in his heart. It is impossible for him to live for too much longer. We cannot even do surgery to help him as the holes are too large."

They told me I should go to another expert for a second opinion. Sympathetically, the second doctor told me that the only thing he can do is give him medicine to alleviate the pain temporarily.

I told the doctor, "Maybe you don't have anything to do, but I have something to do. I am going to laugh at the prognosis and say, 'who are the doctors to say what my son's situation is?' I have Hakadoish Baruch Hu, who is the Kol Yachol. The same Hashem that made four holes in one second, can make those holes close up the very next second. Therefore I have nothing to worry about. Hashem is the only intrinsic doctor, and therefore I am going to go under his care."



The doctor responded, "I don't understand your language. I don't know what you're talking about. That the holes are just going to close up? It is not what goes on over here."

I answered him, "That is true in teva, but with Bitachon there is a different set of laws."

I was mechazeik myself that Hashem is the only intrinsic Power that exists and He is going to renew my son's heart. The next time I went to the doctor they took another sonogram.

They turned to me and asked me, "Are you sure this is the same child? I cant find any holes! They just disappeared. Even if the holes somehow closed up, we would have noticed that there was a hole there, but it just managed to close up. But there is nothing there. We can't figure it out. It makes no sense! It is as if your son has a brand-new healthy heart!"

Well, until today b"H my son has a perfect heart!


After all this, we burst into a heartfelt Hallel, fol-

To Share My Share Of My Daily "Shir Chadash"

"HASHEM, MATIR ASURIM, HASH-EM, POKEIACH IVRIM"

One Sunday afternoon, I stayed late in Yeshivah. It's the one afternoon each week that I have time available to work in my Yiddish classroom, undisturbed by anybody or anything. I can file away worksheets, or change signs and pictures that are decorating my bulletin board. In the quietness of that empty classroom, I can Be'ezer Hashem plan some new class project, and my mind can conjure up some fresh ideas for learning/behaving incentive programs. It charges me with some energy and excitement for the coming week.

I entered the staff restroom to use the facilities, and when trying to exit I found myself locked in. The doorknob lock had jammed. I try to reason with it, by twisting and turning that 50-year-old solid metal doorknob, but it wouldn't give in to my pressure. The tough internal mechanism was totally stuck. I'd had to find some other solution. I looked at my cellphone. It B"H had one bar left on the battery gauge, and on the reception scale it also showed one small line. Through the thick cinder block, and brick walls, plus the heavy wooden doors of the strongly built Yeshivah building, the phone still showed B"H some hope. I called the main office hoping someone would still be there to answer my phone call. No answer. I called the maintenance guy's cellphone. No answer. Then I tried again the main office, dialing the switchboard code for the Yeshivah's elderly trusted money-man. The Tzaddik who sits in his office, even into extra hours, wracking his brain trying to figure out, how to put together the funds for the next payroll, and to pay all the monthly bills. Sure enough he picked up. I told him what was going on, and he came

with his huge ring of keys, and after ten long minutes got the outer door to open. The inner door however, would not give in to any key. He called the right people and after about a half an hour, the doorknob was sawed off, and I was free to go.

I had a lot of time to think, in that half-an-hour, and I did. Why was I here, locked in? I came up with a few answers.

#1 – I should appreciate being free.

#2 – I should Daven for others to be free.

#3 – I should sympathize with those that aren't free.



We Boruch Hashem live in a country where freedom is taken for granted. We can B"H congregate and Daven uninhibited, we can learn Toirah with no one prohibiting us from doing so. We can dress like ehrliche Yidden without being harassed, and we can B"H go about our day doing Mitzvois and Maasim Toivim, without anyone withholding our right to do so. We B"H have the rights to engage in all types of commerce and business, without being excluded from interacting with anyone, on any level of the financial upper tiers of the wealthy. For thousands of years our ancestors struggled with all of the above rights. We must constantly thank Hashem for our freedom!

We should daven for those who have been incarcerated. In the Toi-

rah which is the ultimate only True Laws set by Hashem, there is no such punishment as incarceration! One of the reasons Chazal give us for earthquakes is because of Yidden locked up in jails. Hashem should help them all to be freed B'kuroiv!

We should sympathize with them, and try to help them in any way possible.

With the ongoing "Matzav in Gaza, we should be "Mispalel" for all the hostages that are still in captivity, they should all come home speedily, in the fastest, and easiest way possible!

GOLUS AND GEULAH

Rashi in the beginning of Parshas Vayechi, tells us that the Parsha is Stumah because the hearts and the eyes of The Bnai Yisroel closed shut (so to speak), at the time of Yaakov Avinu's Petirah. The term "Heart" in the Toirah also means thought. The Heilige thoughts and subsequent feelings of the Bnai Yisroel were sealed shut, because of the beginning of the servitude and slavery to the Mitzriyim.

The Arizal refers to this as Golus Hadaas. They couldn't think as Yidden. They lost their Yiddishe mindfulness, thoughts and D'veikus relationship with Hashem! Being subjugated to the whims and wants of the king of land of Pharoh, and to their taskmasters, the Mitzrivim, filled their minds with the constant worry and thoughts of the need to please their masters. Being in captivity, slaving away, every day, in a state of mindlessness, lead them to "losing their mind". Together with losing their Daas, they lost their way of looking at things, in a Yiddishe Toirah'dige perspective! Whatever trials and tribulations, pain and suffering, that were going on all around them and taking place in their personal lives, were all shrouded in darkness as

they couldn't think straight and make sense of anything! Their Toirah'dige mind, heart, and vision was incapacitated.

When I explain this Rashi to my class, I use the examples of the English saying, "Oh I see what you're saying". I then say it in Yiddish too, "Ah! Ich Zeh Vus Du Meinst Tzu Zugen!" In Aramaic it's also used, in the same way. For example in Sefer Zohar"Ta Chazu"-Come and see", and in The Toirah there are plenty of times the word "Va'Yar" means and he understood. I guess we can explain that as the mind seeing something with utmost clarity. In another way we can explain that term to mean, "look around and see things with a true "Toirahdige Emes'e understanding".

When the Geulah came about, with Hashem sending Moishe Rabbeinu to take the Yidden out of Mitzrayim, their Daas was returned to them entirely. Upon seeing the love of Hashem towards them throughout the process of the Makkos, they felt Hashem's love. As Hashem punished those tyrants, and oppressors, and when all the cruel Mitzriyim got their exact calculated punishments from Hashem, they started feeling reunited with Hashem! Chazal teach us that at the same time the Makos went on, any Yid who suffered from a similar pain that somehow was related to that Makkah, was immediately totally healed." Naguf L'Mitzrayim, V'rafoh L'Yisroel".

With more and more revelations of the "Clouds of Glory", and then the extreme earthshattering, sea-splitting, world-wide known event of the miraculous Krias Yam Suf, where every Yid was able to point at the revealed Shechinah, exclaiming "Zeh Keili V'Anveihu!"until the great climactic

event of Mattan Toirah! There every Yid again was healed, and saw



The Revealed Shechinah, and even heard Hashem speaking to ALL OF

THEM! The nations of the world trembled in awe and fear. They asked Bilam if Hashem is bringing a Mabul to the world. "No", he answered them, "Hashem is giving His most precious Toirah to His Nation The B'nai Yisrael!" We received Hashem's Personal Chochmah! We attained the truest form of Da'as that there is in this world!

The Yidden then regained and retained the return of Daas to them. They became known as the "Dor Deiah." The Rebbe who brought it to them was Moishe Rabbeinu, who symbolizes Da'as, in the holy words and terminology of the Arizal. We became subordinate to Hashem's Will. With total submission we surrendered our desires, to do only His! We became attached to The Chochmah of Hashem, Ki hu Chochmaschem U'Vinaschem L'Einei Ha'Amim! We became the smartest people in the truest sense!

The Seforim write that on the night of Pesach every Yid merits to gain this Heilige clarity of mind! "Gadlus Hamoichin!" Let's try to maximize the use of this zechus, and present from Hashem! Let's absorb every moment of clear Toiradige thoughts!

Let's continue this train of thought by serving Hashem as servants, and only wanting to do His Ratzoin. In that fashion we'll be able to continue having our minds think as Hashem wants us to think. If we continue learning Hashem's Toirah, and we think Toira'dig, then we will become THE ULTIMATE FREE PEOPLE! We aren't bound to any other desires needs and wants, that disrupt the free feeling of clear heilige thoughts and vision of the world!

Freedom n 1 : The quality or state of being free : INDEPENDENCE 2 : EXEMPTION, RELEASE

The definition given in the basic English Merriam Webster Dictionary doesn't explain what the subject is free to do, or what he can use his independence for. Same goes for the second definition. What is one exempt from, or released from when he's free? Can we do whatever we want to do? From what obligations does one become

exempt and released from? What can he do with his freedom? "Breaking free" to be able to do... what?

The true Cheirus-Freedom, is the ability to be free to think emes'dige heilige thoughts with a clear toirah'dige vision, and free to do Hashem's Ratzoin, uninhibited by wanting anything else!

Hashem took us out of Mitzrayim, bondage, and slavery, to be able to experience total involvement, and the ability to have a powerful relationship with Him! No more other "wills and wants" to get in our way, to interfere with our bonding to Hashem. To feel free to express anger and rage, or feeling free to pursue all sorts of lust, are actually called in the words Chazal "Eil Acheir" Chas V'Shalom. It's simply because they remove us totally from cleaving to Hashem. That's not freedom! That's Slavery! One then feels tied - bound. His mind, heart, and body are in bondage to a Ratzoin other than Hashem's! Chas V'Chalilah! Hashem Yishmireinu, V'Yatzileinu.

LET'S STAY FREE!

Let's be smart and hold on tight to the loving strongest age- old bond, between us and Hashem!

"After I come close to Hashem," she shouted, "and start keeping his mitz-vos, I'll be ready to forgo a million desired boys, but I will not to give up on Hashem. That is what I truly desire, and there's no way I'll forsake Him for anything else in the world." (Arieh Sha'ag, Chanukah, p. 25)

THE MISSED BRACHAH

The Berditchiver Rav, R' Levi Yitzchok, would say Birchas hashachar out loud each morning. He would say each brachah so that everyone could answer "Amen" to his brachos. One morning, he said all the brachos but omitted the brachah of "shelo asani goy." This

puzzled the listeners. Why is he omitting this brachah? Should we approach him to inform him about the mishap?

When they approached him to ask why he overlooked the brachah, he answered in a way that can serve as a great lesson "This for us. morning, when I rose from bed, I thought to myself about the great gift that I

was fortunate to receive – the gift of being a Yid. I was so overjoyed that right then I jumped up and said the brachah of "Shelo asani goy." So, when I started saying the morning brachos, I was forced to omit that brachah.

A minority of people were treasured with this. Let's take advantage of this award and appreciate it to the fullest. As R' Shlomo of Karlin said: "A person should be overjoyed with happiness just by the fact that he is a Yid and not a gentile."

THE UNIDENTIFIED SON

The Ksav Sofer's youngest son, R' Shimon Sofer, known as the Erlauer Rav, was an exceptional tzaddik who fasted for days on end, completely detached from This World. As a young man, he married the daughter of R' Chaim Shmuel Birnbaum, the youngest sonin-law of R' Akiva Eiger. R' Chaim Shmuel, a chassid of Peshischa, was the son of one of the wealthiest Jews in Russia.

Right after R' Shimon's marriage, he entered the luxurious home of his father-in-law. R' Shimon, who was not



accustomed to that, felt this hindering his growth in ruchniyus. After a half a year, he told his wife that the comfort level was disturbing him from his growth, and that he must move away. His wife was unwilling to forsake her family, to which he concluded that they must divorce. The decision was made, and R' Shimon returned to his father's house, leaving her with her family.

R' Shimon's wife who at the time was expecting, later married the great gaon, R' Yitzchok Shmelkis, known as the Beis Yitzchok. The child was raised thinking that he belonged to the Shmelkis family, while in truth he was the son of R' Shimon Sofer, and a grandson of the Chasam Sofer.



At marriageable age, the Beis Yitzchok decided that it was time to tell him about his biological family, and that he was from a very principled family, a grandson of the Chasam Sofer and the Ksav Sofer.

Hearing the news, he traveled to Vienna to seek out his family and inquire about them. Needing somewhere to eat during the lengthy trip, he sought a restaurant to have supper. After ordering food, he sought an empty table to eat at, but there were no empty ones available. Second best, he found a table that had only one fellow sitting there, and so he made his way there, asking if he could join him on his private table. The man happily welcomed him to his table.

While sitting there, the man asked him his name, and he felt a bit awkward. He told the man that up until just recently, he'd assumed his name was Shmelkis, from the family of the Beis Yitzchok, but he just found out that his real name was Sofer, the son of R' Shimon Sofer.

The man sitting at the table asked him, "Do you mean to say that you're the son of my father, R' Shimon Schreiber, the Michtav Sofer? He identified himself as the son of R' Shimon. R' Shimon, however, had never revealed to his family that he was previously married and that he had fathered a son from that first wife.

He sent a telegram to his father, questioning if this man could really be his son. To which his father replied, "I indeed had a son from a previous marriage. Please bring this boy back home to see his family." (R' Moshe Weiss from Yerushalayim heard this from the son of R' Shimon Sofer, who then relayed it to R' Wachsman)

R' Ephraim Wachsman concludes this story as a story of someone with exalted lineage who was totally unaware of it. "We are the sons of Hashem, as the pasuk says: 'Banim atem L'Hashem Elokeichem.' We must remember our royal lineage, and make sure we are not missing out on this honorable nobleness."

The Mishnah tells us that Hashem, out of His compassion, informed us

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that we are His children. The reason for this, explains R' Leib Chasman, is because without the knowledge, one can have all the money in the world but cannot access it. We, however, the children of Hashem, were informed about this excessive gift, enabling us to access it, appreciate it, and elevate ourselves with this unduplicable gem.

The Haggadah quotes the pasuk in Yechezkel (16:7), "I multiplied you like the plants of the field." Rabbi Yitzchak Isaac Chaver points out that plants sprout from seeds that are sown in the earth, but the plants emerge only after the seeds have rotted and disintegrated in the soil. A seed that maintains its form and fails to disintegrate completely is incapable of producing a plant. In a similar vein, Klal Yisrael was capable of becoming Hashem's chosen people only after they had divested themselves of their own independent nature. The Jewish people serve as Hashem's representatives to the world, demonstrating the nature of His middos and kedushah. In order to properly represent Hashem, the people had to divest themselves of their own personal agendas and inclinations, distilling their thoughts and emotions until they embodied nothing but the ratzon Hashem. Just as a mirror must be perfectly clean, without any dirt or smudges, in order to generate a perfect reflection, the Jewish people must cleanse themselves of all their personal agendas in order to "reflect" Hashem.

Reb Shimon Galai, a dayan on the Beis Din of Rav Nissim Karelitz, was innocently walking down the street one day when a speeding patrol car plowed into him, sending him sprawling on the nearby pavement and seriously injuring his leg. The alarmed policeman leapt out of his car and ran to help his unintended victim. "How can I help you?" he asked, bending over the prone pedestrian.



Reb Shimon's body was racked with pain and blood was gushing from his injured leg. It was almost impossible for him to speak. Nevertheless, he managed to utter a few crucial words: "If you really want to help me, commit yourself to observing Shabbos!"

A nonreligious husband and wife were passing by at that moment and were astounded at Reb Shimon's display of selflessness. They felt compelled to learn his identity, and spent an inordinate amount of time on the telephone with the ambulance service and with various hospitals until they discovered where he had been admitted. Upon arriving at the hospital, they went to see him and identified themselves as eyewitnesses to his accident.

To their continued astonishment, Reb Shimon was still uninterested in speaking about himself and his own condition. Instead, he lectured them about the importance of keeping Shabbos. The irreligious man was deeply moved and kissed Reb Shimon's hand, exclaiming, "Now I understand that Torah scholars are very different from the other people in the world. This man thinks only about Hashem's Name, while people who do not learn Torah are concerned only for themselves" (Aleinu Leshabeach).

Even in the midst of his excruciating pain, Reb Shimon Galai did not forget that the purpose of his existence was to bring honor to Hashem. He had truly internalized the lesson that a Jew does not live for himself.

Pesach is the time when we are commanded to remove the chametz from our homes. But we must also remove the chametz from within our souls. When we set aside our own desires in order to perform Hashem's Will, we become a pure, untainted tzelem Elokim. If we succeed in this, then Hashem will declare about us, "Avdi atah Yisrael asher becha espa'er — You are My servants, Yisrael, and it is through you that I am glorified."

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



Hashem is My Doctor!

י אתה בחרתנו מכל העמים - You have chosen us from all the nations! We begin the special *Yom Tov* section of *Shemoneh Esrei* with this joyful proclamation. The *Siach Yitzchok* (in *Siddur Hagra*) explains that these words are referring to *Pesach*, when Hashem chose us as His special Nation. This exalted status comes with many benefits, one of them being that Hashem became our private and personal doctor. Immediately after *Krias Yam Suf*, Hashem tells Moshe: (*Beshalach* 15: 26) כל המחלה- אשר שמתי -במצרים לא -אשים עליך -כי אני די רפאך יי רפאך - any of the diseases that I placed upon Mitzrayim, I will not bring upon you, for I am Hashem, your Healer." We have the best Doctor in the world!

Indeed, in the beracha of Asher Yatzar we conclude רופא כל בשרי - Hashem heals all flesh," meaning all of mankind. But in the beracha of רופא מו שראל " – which seems to imply that Hashem only cures Klal Yisroel? We can answer based on what we have seen in the past that with Asher Yatzar we thank Hashem for regular bodily functions. In order that there should be a functioning world, Hashem makes sure that all human beings stay healthy, including ensuring smooth digestion of food. But if a person actually gets sick, Hashem only gets personally involved if it is a Yid, as He is our private doctor. The rest of the world will have to be cured through regular human doctors. It is obvious that the difference between when Hashem cures and when a human does (or tries) is infinitely vast, and if we look carefully at the *pasukim* we will see this clearly. Rabbeinu Bechayei (Shemos 21:19) points out that when Hashem heals, it says "rofecha" with the soft-sounding letter "פ" (without a dot inside). But regarding a human doctor it says (Mishpatim 21:19) with the hard-sounding letter "פ" (with a dot inside). When Hashem cures it is in a soft, easy, and non-invasive way. But when we need to use a human, it may be hard and difficult. It might entail painful surgeries or treatments that have difficult side effects and damage to other parts of the body. In addition, the Shomer Emunim cites the Zohar which says that when Hashem cures it lasts, but when humans cure it may return.

Now in *galus*, Hashem runs the world under the guise of *teva*, nature, so we are obligated to go to the doctor and do *hishtadlus*. But we do it merely as a way to cover over the real act of healing, which is directly from the Hand of our personal doctor, Hashem. If a person goes to the hospital and puts his trust in the doctor, the cure may be difficult and not everlasting. The truth is that it would be foolish to do so. An honest doctor will admit that many times he really doesn't know what to do



and is just trying his best. So, even when modern medicine has a "tried and tested method" – don't put your trust in it. Say the special tefillah that we recite before doing an act of *refuah* and then go through the motions!

Make It Real!

Now, this may be difficult, as the accomplishments of modern medicine are truly dazzling. So many solutions have been discovered for syndromes and diseases that were previously thought to have been "uncurable." The entire approach to many surgeries has drastically changed using state of the art technology such as such as fiber optic cables, miniature video cameras and special surgical instruments that allow minimally invasive surgery. Science certainly seems to be able to pat itself on the back. But in



truth, who is the One who opened their eyes to these discoveries? How many of the most famous inventions and discoveries happened "by chance" or through an "accident"? It is from Hashem!

But it goes further. The Shomer Emunim (Bitachon, perek 15) writes that there are certain herbs and grasses that have unbelievable inherent curing power. We just don't know which ones they are and how to use them. And he quotes one of the tzadikim who said that really their healing power comes from special winds that Hashem blows into them. If a person puts his complete *bitachon* in Hashem, Hashem will cause those very same winds to blow into the bread and meat the person eats and he will be cured without needing any medicines or herbs. He explains with this the pasuk in Mishpatim (23: 25) ועבדתם את ד'י אלקיכם וברך את -לחמך ואת- מימיך והטרתי -מחלה מקרבך (23: 25) ועבדתם את ד'י אלקיכם וברך את -לחמך ואת- מימיך והטרתי -מחלה and water with these special winds, and the bread itself will cure us! This was a real eye-opener to me! It means that it could be that the medicine a person is taking cannot really cure him. However, if he put his trust in Hashem, that He is his doctor and curing him, Hashem will blow special winds into the medicine or other food that he eats, and that will cure him. This is a great way to make this concept much more real to us!

Open Wide!

I would like to end off with one more lesson from Yetziyas Mitzrayim that can really give us strength to deal with difficult situations in life. It says in Tehillim (81: 11מלכי ד' אלקיך המעלך מארץ- מצרים הרחב- פיך ואמלאהוו) – I am Hashem, your G-d, who raised you from the land of Mitzrayim; open wide your mouth and I will fill it. I heard in the name of Rav Eliyahu Gutmacher that if you say this *pasuk* and then daven to Hashem it is a very big *segulah* to have your tefillah accepted. Perhaps we can explain that by saying this *pasuk* a person first internalizes the important lessons we learnt in Mitzrayim: 1) We saw that there is no other power in the world besides Hashem. 2) We saw that He loves us and wants only our best. 3) We saw that He can change the very laws of nature if He so desires. Then he opens his mouth wide and ask for whatever he wants! A request made after all that has a different level of power to it.

So, when it comes to health matters – remind yourself that you are in the hands of the best doctor, who cares about you and can heal you easily without difficult treatments. He can change nature and send cures without us knowing it. Just put your trust in Him with knowledge that He can do anything, and ask for a complete and easy cure, straight from Him!





The Quote: Every person has a נטייה to a certain type of Avoida. Hakadosh Baruch Hu put that feeling in the person in order he should be pulled to that Avoida. Hashem did the same by the animal world, He put in each animal their nature. For example: Hashem gave a cat the טבע to want to catch mice. Hashem created the bodies of the animals in a way that they can take care of their needs. For example: Ducks eat fish so Hashem created with a longer beak, and lions who get "פרנסה" from tearing apart animals and eating them, Hashem gave them fierce teeth and sharp nails. Whereas animals who achieve their "פרנסה" by eating plants, do not have these body parts.

The Lesson: WHAT MAKES THIS IDEA SO INCREDIBLE AND AMAZING, that we see how Hashem gave us built in to us everything we need to achieve what we personally need. We are "Custom made". If Hashem created each animal in a way that they have the instincts and physical capabilities to live. Kal V'choimer that human beings were given everthing they need in order to live a happy lifer!

The Story: THERE WAS ONCE A WEALTHY man who visited Eretz Yisroel to support people who were learning Torah. During his visit, the גביר saw a young man learning with a bren and geshmak early in the morning. He was really impressed and he said, "This is the man I want to support". The גביר found out the young man's whereabouts and someone offered to show the גביר how this man lived.

The גביר was in absolute shock when he saw the living standards of this young man, but what astounded him even more was the happiness that radiated from his home. First, he saw how his family barely had what to eat, all they ate was challah with oil. He saw the father learning by the table with such feeling of peace and serenity, bursting with an overwhelm-

ing enjoyment in what he was doing, truly an aroma of גן עדן... He saw how happy the faces of the little children looked. He was simply affixed to the amazing sight that he was seeing.

Continued from Chapter 2:

The Torah Obligation to Enjoy Olam Hazeh

Even Sinners Should Be Happy!

Even a person who transgresses and commits sins should be happy and positive, because sadness and depression only lead to more sins. We learn this from the very beginning of the Torah, where the pesukim describe the korbanos brought by Kayin and Hevel. Kayin brought an inferior offering to Hashem, so Hashem did not turn to his korban. Hevel brought a superior korban and Hashem did turn to it. This bothered Kayin terribly and he reacted by becoming depressed, as the pasuk says, וְחָבּר לְּהַנִי Pַּנְיוֹ This upset Kayin greatly and his face fell" (Bereishis 4:5).

So Hashem spoke to Kayin, saying, "לָמָה חָרָה לֶך- וְלְמָה נָפְלּו -פְּנֵיְך", Why are you upset and why has your face fallen? בְּיִלִיג שְאֵת " Surely if you will improve yourself, you will be forgiven" (Bereishis 4:6-7).

This teaches us that Hashem does not want a person to be depressed, even after he sins. Rather, Hashem desires that one continue to be happy and simply do teshuvah. If one does this, he will surely be forgiven.

This idea appears in Secrets of the Soul:

The optimistic attitude towards teshuvah, "Let him do teshuvah and be forgiven," is an outlook that no other culture in the world possesses. Instead of worrying about your sins and punishing yourself for them, focus on the positive. Lift yourself back up. Find the path to return. (Secrets of the Soul: Conversations with Rav Shlomo Hoffman p. 112).

We thus see that there is no room for either depression or despair in Yiddishkeit — not for tzaddikim nor for resha'im, no matter what day of the year it is and no matter how difficult life gets. Hashem wants all of us to be happy and positive, all the time.

Chapter 3: The Purpose of Pleasure

In this chapter we will learn why enjoyment and pleasures are such an important part of life

Why Enjoy Life?

We have been saying that Hashem wants every person

to enjoy life. But why is it so important to enjoy life? Isn't avodas Hashem what is truly important? Who cares about enjoyment? A person who recognizes Hashem should serve Him without the distractions of worldly pleasures!

This question goes to the heart of this entire book. We will explain as follows:


Chazal compare the relationship between Hashem and a person to the relationship between a husband and wife. The husband is a mashal for Hashem and the wife is a mashal for a person. Perhaps the most well-known expression of this mashal is in Shir Hashirim, where Shlomo Hamelech describes Hashem and Klal Yisrael as a man and woman who are deeply in love with each other.

In line with this idea, Chazal teach us that a person's relationship to Hashem in Olam Hazeh is compared to the first stage of marriage, eirusin (in which the woman has committed herself to be married to the man). Olam Haba, on the other hand, is compared to the nisu'in stage of marriage (in which the couple can finally live together under one roof). (See Shemos Rabbah, Bo 15.) (In ancient days, the eirusin stage of marriage usually preceded the nisu'in stage by as much as twelve months.)

To understand the dynamics of a person's relationship with Hashem, it's important to ask the following question: Upon whom does the responsibility fall to initiate this relationship? Is it the person? Or is it Hashem?

For an answer to this question, it makes sense to look at the example set by Avraham Avinu. Every frum Jew is familiar with the story of how Avraham Avinu came to recognize Hashem: He looked around at the world. He saw the vast wisdom in all of Creation. He saw all the

people around him worshipping useless idols. He analyzed. He contemplated. And eventually, he concluded that without a doubt, there is one supreme G-d Who controls all of Creation. Then, he ded-



icated himself to serving G-d with absolute self-sacrifice, to the point where he allowed himself to be thrown into a fiery furnace rather than publicly worship an idol.

Seemingly, Avraham was the one who initiated his relationship with Hashem. With honest reflection, he "found" Hashem. And Hashem reciprocated with open miracles and blessings, establishing Avraham as the forefather of an entire nation dedicated to continuing his dedication and sacrifice.

It therefore would appear that the way to form a relationship with Hashem is by seeking Him out. Only then does Hashem reciprocate.

However, this does not seem to fit with the mashal of a husband and wife. For in Maseches Kiddushin, the Gemara explains that when it comes to marriage, it's the man's responsibility to search for a wife — i.e., to initiate the relationship — and not the other way around (Kiddushin 2b). So, if a person is compared to Hashem's wife, why should he have to initiate his relationship with Him? Why doesn't Hashem initiate the relationship with him?!

The answer is, He does.

In actuality, Avraham Avinu did not find Hashem. He did not initiate his relationship with Hashem. It was Hashem who initiated the relationship. Hashem sought Avraham out, and Avraham merely responded. He simply answered "yes" to Hashem's offer.

How do we know this?

Well, let's ask ourselves the following question: What impressed Avraham the most when he looked around at the world? What was really going through his mind? Was it the awe-inspiring Divine wisdom that proved there is a Creator? Was it the silly idol worshipers all around him?

can figure out what Avraham was thinking based on his actions. Avraham is called the amud hachessed, the pillar of kindness, because he spent his life imitating Hashem — engaging in a campaign of unparalleled chessed toward others. Avraham did not merely travel around giving speeches to prove there was a G-d. He actually copied Hashem's actions as he perceived them. (See Ray Avigdor Miller, The Beginning, 18:8 (p. 311). See Kiddushin 32b.) And to Avraham, copying Hashem meant giving to others. Giving and giving and giving, as much as he could.



This means that when Avraham looked around the world, he did not just see incredible Divine wisdom. Rather, he saw Someone Who was giving things to him. Giving him life. Giving him eyesight to see millions of colors. Giving him a strong, healthy body. A bright, warm sun and a glowing moon and a panorama of stars. A spectacular earth. Rain and wind and bread and meat and fruits and vegetables — millions of flavors — and trees and flowers and music and parents and a wife and weather and more and more and more.

Not just useful things. Enjoyable things. Gifts of pleasure. For years and years and years, Avraham enjoyed those countless pleasurable gifts. He enjoyed them and he thought about them. And that is how he concluded that without a doubt, Someone was seeking him out! Someone wanted him!

Someone was asking for his hand in marriage!

And Avraham answered, "Yes!"

Hesham's Unlimited Wisdom and Kindness

Our nose and its sense of smell give us the ability to enjoy all the scents in the air around us. Like the challah baking in the kitchen, the leaves in the forest, or a fresh rain or snow.

But the main pleasure that Hashem gave us with our sense of smell is from the food that we eat. We tend to associate our taste exclusively to our taste buds, but the truth is, a very high percentage of what we taste comes from the sense of smell that we have. Our taste buds work in a partnership together with our sense of smell to give us the huge variety of flavors and tastes that we are familiar with.

Up to 80% or more of the taste that we have is coming from our smell. That means that our mouth and taste buds are only contributing a small part of our taste. The majority is coming from our sense of smell.

It's the sense of smell which picks up all the subtle differences that there are between similar flavors and tastes. So all the various delicious tastes that Hashem gave us and that we receive flavor from - like rib steak, ice cream, salmon and chocolate, we mainly enjoy through our sense of smell. Such a wonderful gift!

We receive a large part of the enjoyment of our food through our sense of smell.

How does this work?

When we insert food into our mouths, it's very close to the opening of our nose and we get a very direct and focused smell of what we are eating, but this only lasts for one second. After the food is inside our mouths, we actually chew with our mouth closed. And then the opening of our nose is not next to the food and we are not smelling the food anymore. We would think that after the food is inside our mouth, the taste is coming only from our taste buds. But if that would be greatly minimized, because the

taste buds only supply around 20% of the taste and flavor.

The answer to this brings out Hashem's masterful design in

our creation. Hakadosh Baruch Hu created two different passage ways to the sensory cells inside our nose. One is from the two visible openings that are on our face, but there's an additional hidden internal passage that connects the throat to the nasal cavity. This allows us to smell internally. So the sensation of smell is still working even while our mouths are closed and we are chewing.

Hashem b'chasdo designed our nasal passage and sense of smelling in a way that we can receive maximum enjoyment from our food!

Hashem's Universe A Divine Masterpiece!

THE AMAZING STARFISH (Sea Star) Part 3 of 4

In the last article we mentioned how cilia (hairlike structures) are all over the starfish's body, externally and internally. They may be "hairlike," but they are VERY COMPLEX. Below are pictures of them and you can see for yourself that this isn't just a "hairlike" structure. In fact, they are more like a thick cable with many thinner "wires" going through them with an inner mechanism that makes them bend. In fact, there's 22 (11 x2) thin "wires" in them. 9 (x2) in a circle, on the inside perimeter of it, and 2(x2) in the center.

How the cilia move back and forth, thereby moving forward the water in one direction, is a complex mechanized process, too complex for me to describe. One thing I will say is that they move quickly to one side, thereby moving things in that direction, and then, at a much slower pace, they move back to their original starting point, ending straight up vertically, and then it again moves quickly to the other side, coming

back slowly again, with the process continuing until a signal comes telling it to stop completely.

The reason for this method is simple. If they would move quickly both ways, things wouldn't get anywhere. They would go one way and then go right back the other way! Therefore, the cilia's mechanism is perfectly pre-programmed to go quickly one way, and for the way back it goes just slow enough so that it doesn't cause any backwards movement of the water. Hmmm. I wonder WHO programmed the cilia to work at those correct speeds?!


Cilia are found in many of Hashem's creations including in humans as well. In a starfish they are absolutely crucial for the moving about of the water that's in the inner main parts of the starfish, so that nutrition and oxygen gets to the right place, and wastes are moved out as well. The water needs to be moved around by the cilia over the outer surface of the starfish in order to bring fresh oxygenated water to the gills. Being they are so crucial for the starfish's


functionality; therefore, I mentioned them. Below are pictures of cilia.

Now, we will discuss a third part of the skeleton: The pedicellaria.

Here too, like cilia, it is something that looks quite simple but it's actually quite complex. Everything in Hashem's world is that way. The pedicellaria are like pliers/scissors that are important for keeping the surface of the skeleton of the starfish clean. This is EXTREMELY crucial since the gills, through which 80% of the gas exchange of oxygen and carbon dioxide takes place, must be clear of any debris.

Since the starfish can often just lay around, going nowhere, there more of a chance that things that can grow on pretty much any surface, can end up growing on them (like Barnacles and the like). So, the pedicellaria can pry them off if they startt to grow there. If any dirt gets stuck on it, it will remove it. In some starfish species, where the pedicellaria are quite large, they can actually grab on to smaller fish and then it can become food for the starfish.

How this works will be explained in the next article. Here too, you need to see the pictures in order to get a better idea as to how it works, and how complex they are.

Here you can see that around the spine (the center of the picture) there's a whole bunch of pedicellaria.

On the bottom center ones you can see clearer that they are shaped like an open plier.

In the picture below, you can see how complex these pedicellaria are. They can stretch out and bend over in order to remove things. Some pedicellaria (and spines) have toxins in them (harmful substances if touched or eaten) as do other parts of the starfish.

We will finish off by mentioning that the starfish has at the end of its "arms" two things that are important to know. One, in spite of it not having a brain, it still has an eye at the end of each arm. They are somehow connected with the pretty complex nervous system of the starfish. However, they are not able to see anything more than light and darkness. Nothing colorful, or clear is seen by it, nevertheless it helps them move


around. The starfish also has light sensors over the top parts of its skeleton. At the end of the arms are also crucial sensory tube feet, which are


different than the regular tube feet that they have. These feet are very sensitive at picking up scents of potential food. The starfish always "follows its nose", in this case being the special tube feet at the end of their arms. The starfish will suddenly change directions if it smells food coming from a different direction.

Note that at the end of the arm, there's a red dot. That's its eye. Also, at the end of the arms are the special feet that are typically NOT used for walking, rather the end of the arms are typically lifted up a bit off the ground and they sway and swing around in the air, trying to pick up all types of signals of what a ahead of them, especially sniffing for food scent.


In the final article we will be

\$55 or \$550 for a bottle of milk...



On most Shabbos mornings, I B"H walk to visit someone who appreciates visitors. I love the walk, as I pass the most beautiful, stunning creation of Hashem — the Lakewood lake. The lake is a magnificent sight; all year round it has so many aspects of glory including small ripples in the water, beautiful trees, and a path. I









feel like I am in Hashem's Garden.

Many Shabbosim, while I am on my walk, I pass an Ernste Zisseh Yiddishe Mama. She walks with her head facing the ground, back hunched, looking at the floor. Weeks have passed and I never saw her lift her head. Five steps behind her, single file, walks her son, a bacheinte Yiddishe boy who has Down syndrome. I would guess he is in his twenties. They walk single file, looking gloomy and sad, week after week. One Shabbos when I passed them, I called out to this Yiddishe Mama "Good Shabbos." At first, she did not look up. I continued and said "Good Shabbos, I want a Bracha!" She immediately turned in my direction. "A Bracha?" she asked. "Yes." I responded. "I want a Bracha from your son. I believe he is one of the Lamed Vav Tzadikim and I want him to

give me a Bracha." She stood up straight. Tears welled in her eyes. She looked at her son. She said, "Please give this girl a Bracha." The boy murmured something and I could not make out the words he said. I said a resounding "Amein." Then the mother said, "Now give her a Bracha that she should become a Kallah." He enunciated every syllable with labored energy and attention until he got the words out "Yo------u sh----ou----Id bec----ome a K-----allah." I answered a resounding "Amein!" And I told them both they made my day so joyous and so happy and I was so thankful! And with that, we parted ways. I turned around and I saw the Mama was no longer hunched; with a straight spine and a smile on her lips she nearly danced back into that single file. And as if in a dream, I saw that bacheinte Yiddishe boy had a smile on his face too!

This column is all about how much love we all have in our hearts and how easy it is to pump people up. This week we want to share ways of pumping people up through bringing closeness between one another. There are so many ways to do this including Bentching people, asking people for Brachos, sharing with people how Mitzvos are worth more than a million dollars, joining people, giving and giving more, connection ideas and having fun!

Bentching people:

When we bentch people, we bring closeness between ourselves and them. All of Klal Yisroel is one big happy family and the more we bentch people the better. On my walk, I make a habit of trying to bentch the people who live on every block I pass. I say out loud, "Hashem should bentch all the Yidden living on this block with millions of Brachos." I learned this from Rabbi Avigdor Miller zt"l. I also bench people as I pass them. I was walking one Shabbos by the lake and I saw two girls who I could tell had a lot of pain in their hearts. I was not going to directly pass them and I was in a rush to get back before dark so I continued on my way. One second later, I thought to myself — who knows what one 'Good Shabbos' can do? I retraced my steps, pretending that I was going their way to look at the lake from the location they were at. I passed the girls and warmly wished each of them the Bracha of 'Good Shabbos.' Then I turned to the first girl and joyously Bentched her, "You should have a million Brachos." I turned to the second girl and joyously benched her "You should have a million Brachos!" Then I continued on my little roundabout way to look at the lake for a few seconds. I quickly turned to go back to the direction that I was really going towards. As I was about to pass the girls again, they approached me and one of them asked. "Can I ask you a question?" I said, "Sure." She asked, "What makes you have such positive, exuberant energy, so full of love? We have never met someone with this much love in their heart." Without missing a beat, I answered, "I talk to Hashem all day. That's what gives me this positive energy."

She came over to hug me and said, "I am so happy to have met you." She thought for a second and said, "Can I ask you another question?" I said "Sure!" She said, "How does one get close to G-d? I open my siddur and I feel thin air. I feel nothing. I don't feel Hashem at all (R"L)." I looked up at the tree overhead and asked both girls, "Do you see this tree?" They nodded their heads yes. I asked, "Do you like this tree?" They said, "Yes." I said, "Hashem put this exact tree right here especially for you to enjoy because He loves you." I continued, "You see this lake?" They said "Yes!" I asked, "Do you like this lake?" They answered, "Yes!" I said, "Hashem put the lake here for you to enjoy because He loves you." Then I turned to one girl and asked, "Do you see your shoes?" She said, "Yes!" I said, "Do you like your shoes?" She nodded yes. I said, "Hashem gave you those shoes and made them especially for you because He loves you very much!" I turned to the other girl and asked, "Do you see your shoes? Do you like them?" She nodded yes. I told her that Hashem gave her those special shoes, just for her because He loves her! I turned to the first girl and asked her, "Do you like your sweatshirt?" She said "Yes!" I said, "Hashem gave it to you to enjoy because He loves you!" "What about you?" I asked the other girl. "Do you like your sweatshirt?" She said, "Yes, I love it!" I said, "Good! Hashem put it here for you because He loves you."

We hugged again! Then, before I walked off I told them, "Your faces are shining from the Shechina!!"

Giving a simple Bracha of "Good Shabbos" or "Hashem should bentch you" can turn a person's whole day around. So many people respond, "How did you know I just needed that!"

Asking people for Brachos

Asking people for Brachos shows that you genuinely believe they are a good person. When we show someone that we genuinely believe in them it builds a deeper connection and is a way of pumping people up! I once heard from a Chashuva Talmid Chochom that every single Yid is 100 times greater than we would ever imagine Ray Yisroel Salanter was (and of course Ray Yisroel Salanter was way greater than that). Every single Yid has a part of Hashem inside of them and is pure greatness. I once met a young woman who was struggling tremendously. At the end of our first meeting, I asked her for a Bracha. She looked surprised so I shared that I believe she is an extremely special person so I want a Bracha from her! She then gave me a Bracha that I should have only good. A few weeks later her mother confided to me that asking her for a Bracha boosted her so much that some of her pain was alleviated. Her daughter shared with her that she didn't realize she had the value to bless someone. If she could bless another person, then she is worthwhile. I genuinely believe in every single person I meet. I love people as they are all my sisters and brothers and we are all joined in one cause of Yisgadal V'yiskadash Shmei Rabba! We all are on this journey and the journey is so beautiful.

Sharing with people how Mitzvos are worth millions:

We spoke in a previous article about how Mitzvos are worth millions and sharing this with others is a way of pumping people up. Recently, I sat with an amazing individual who said she feels worthless. I looked into her eyes and I asked her "Do you believe that there is a Hashem?" She said, "Yes!" I said, "That's two billion dollars right there!" I asked, "Do you believe in Avodah Zarah?" She said, "No!" I said, "That's another two billion dollars!" I asked, "Do you believe Hashem was, is, and always will be?" She answered, "Yes!" I said, "That's another two billion dollars by Hashem!" I asked, "Do you remember Yetzias Mitzrayim?" She said, "Yes!" I said, "There's another two billion dol-

lars!" I asked, "Do you remember what happened to Miriam?" She said, "Yes!" I exclaimed, "There's another two billion dollars." I said, "Right now you are doing the mitzva of V'nishmartam Meod L'nafshosechem. You are taking care of your health by coming to talk to someone so that's another two billion dollars." I said, "You are worth more than 12 billion dollars just sitting here! Hashem is so happy with you and loving you and with you and wanting you and you are doing amazing!" She shared that she felt a very heavy stone roll off of her heart.

Joining people:

I remember reading a story about a boy who was having a very difficult time and was in a lot of pain who went to Rav Moshe Feinstein TZL. Rav Moshe asked him to come back in a few days. The boy came back and when he left, he was a very changed person. Someone asked Rav Moshe why he said to come back in a few days. Rav Moshe explained that this boy loved dogs. Rav Moshe took a few days to learn all about dogs so that he could join with the boy by talking to him about what he likes. This deep level of joining and sharing of heart made such an impression on the boy that he left as a completely changed person.

Every single person has their own language and it's our job to learn it. This includes finding out what the person enjoys. If a person likes a guitar, I will have a guitar set up for them. If a person likes something that I can not have readily available, I talk to the person about what they like. This is a deep level of connecting and pumping people up. We can ask our friends, spouses, children, and students to tell us more about what they like. We can be available to hear the details. We can ask follow-up questions such as "What else about it do you like?" and "Do you wish you had it in many different varieties?" When people feel we really get them, then this close connection is a deep form of pumping people up. A few years back, a nine-year-old child who we will call Moshe came to sessions. I was told he is very destructive and does not communicate with people. He also doesn't share any emotion with his parents and he doesn't want to receive or give love. The first thing I did was I made sure to find out exactly what this precious child likes. It turned out he liked a certain type of comic books. Before he came to me, I bought many of these types of books and labeled a shelf in my bookshelf with the words "Moshe's books." Moshe was so pumped and this opened the door to connect and join. Within a few months the parents reported he had calmed down and was able to give and receive love!

Giving and giving more:

Giving and giving more forms a deep connection and it actually empowers the limits that we do set in limit-setting moments.

We want to give and give more. Whatever we are planning to give, we want to add a little bit more at the end. To give a very basic example, I might have some fun items that I picked up at a dollar store. I have one toy behind my back, and I hand it to the child, saying, "Oh my! Look what I got for you!" Then, a second later, I say, "And.... I also got this!" I pull something else out, and then one more thing. Those two extra things make a huge difference.

Now, they know:

A. I will give and go the extra mile.

B. I give because I really care about them, and want them to get that extra.

Another example: I might say, "You want to just talk before we do homework? Okay. You know what, let's just talk for one min-

ute. Actually, you know what, let's give ourselves two-and-a-half minutes to talk." I will give and then give more. I get a question often, "Does that make a child, teen, or adult then want to go over boundaries?" Actually, it's the opposite. When someone knows that I will give more whenever I can, then when I say no, they know it's a real no and I can't give more this time.

We also use this concept to show that we care and that we're going the extra mile in our care and concern. If I'm with a teenager who is really upset about something, I might say, "I am so, so sorry that that happened to you. And, you know what else? I'm so sorry that that the other thing happened!" When I say, "You know what else?" He is not expecting me to say, "I'm sorry that that other thing happened" again. But I say it, and it shows him that I really care. I care on a deeper level.

When you're ready to leave your child's room, say, "Oh! I really want to stay with you for one more minute." When you give your child a dollar and five cents to purchase something in the dollar store, say, "You know what, I really want you to be able to get two things in the dollar store. Here's another dollar, and another five cents." When you need to leave in the middle of playing a game, say, "Hey! I actually want to stay one more minute because I'm having so much fun with you." Going over the time limit, or giving one more tiny item shows that you want to go the extra mile, and that whenever you can, you will. This is a deep level of pumping people up.

Boxing in time:

Another way to pump people up is by boxing in time! Boxing in is the idea that you want to "box in" time for your child/spouse/ friend. You are anyways about to spend time with the person. How can you box in that time and make it more valuable and of greater quality? The first way is leading up to the event with anticipation. If you will be spending time together in two hours, you can verbalize: "Hey, in two hours we will be playing that game and I can't wait." Right before the time that you spend with the person, you want to box in that time to show them that it is just for them. You may say to your child, "Dovid, can you please put my phone in the kitchen drawer. Right now, we will be playing together and we don't want anything to disturb us. I need it completely out of sight as I want to spend a few minutes talking/playing with you, and I don't want to take any calls." During the time we spend together, we want to solidify that time with them and say, "Hey, it's just us now playing this game and I am having a great time with you." After the game is done, regardless if it was for two minutes, five minutes, or a half hour, we want to remember that time. Later in the evening or the next day you want to remind your child what a nice time you had with them. You may say "Dovid, that time we spent before was really fun. I had a nice time with you. I can't wait to do it again soon."

Hang-Up Versus Hold-On Relationships

The deeper the connection the more pumped a person feels! Let's talk about the difference between a hang-up relationship verses a hold-on relationship with people. If you're on the phone with someone and you have to go, you hang up the phone, and you are no longer on the phone with them. But what about if you're on the phone and you just want to do something in your house; you keep them on and say "hold on." The connection is still live. They can continue listening to you and they can continue hearing what you are doing. As soon as you finish your activity you talk to them.

As parents, many times we end up using what we call a hang-up relationship.

The child asks, "Can I tell you a story?" The mom responds, "Not now." Or "Can I show you this picture?" The parent responds, "Not now, go to bed..." How many times a day do we say to a child, "Not now" or "I'm busy?" Are we "hanging up on them" when they are about to tell us something...? What about if we keep our children in a hold-on relationship. We start to say yes. We may say hold on but we don't hang up. The child asks, "Can I play a game with you?" And you answer, "Sure, but first we will eat supper." Or the child asks, "Can I tell you the end of that story?" And you answer, "Of course, after I do this work meeting." Or the child asks, "Can I play on the dance machine again?" and you respond, "Certainly, but first we will go to sleep and in the morning you can play again." This maximizes your relationship with your child, because even when you are not talking to your child, you did not shut them out of the relationship. It is on hold and continuous. This can be done with all relationships and not just children!

Remember, when:

We want to constantly remind people of fun times we had with them; of little affection games we have played with them. For example, "Remember that time when it was late at night, we were out in the country, and we played that game? It was so much fun!" Reminding a person of fun times is always important, and is especially important during challenging times. It pumps people up knowing that you remember about the fun time you had with them.

Having fun by the Seder and over Yom Tov:

We spoke in a previous article about how an important way to increase connection and pump people up is to have fun with them. People of all ages need to have fun. Here are some fun ideas you can do over Pesach:

The wine bottle

Create a large wine bottle out of poster board. Draw lines across the wine bottle in an effort to make a visual of reaching the top. Each time a job is complete, color in one line of the bottle, starting from the bottom.

Room by room

Every child gets to choose a room in the house. Give them a job to start in that room. Every 15-30 minutes, you say "switch" and everyone switches rooms and continues the job that is in the new room they entered.

Music or cleaning

Turn up the music while cleaning. Set a timer for a random time, for example 17 minutes or 43 minutes. When the timer rings, everyone joins in a predetermined room to do a Pesach dance. Any moves constitute a Pesach dance.

Hide the Afikoman

Color or draw a Matza. Play hide and find with the Matza.

Alef Bais Pesach game

The first player says a word that starts with an Alef that has to do with Pesach. The next player says a word starting with a Bais that has to do with Pesach.

Pesach Number game

Think of a number between 1-1000, but do not tell anyone what it is. For younger kids, it can be played 1-10 or 1-100. For added challenge the number can be 1-1 million! Yes, that is fun! The second player has to try to guess the number. Here is the fun part. You have to tell the player if it's higher or lower without

using the words higher or lower, but using Pesach words such as Haggadah for higher and Leil Shimurim for lower. So, if the number you are thinking of is 888 and the player says 1000 you say Leil Shimurim (meaning the number is lower).

Haggadah Game

All players have a Haggadah in hand, and each person is opened to a different random page. Call out a letter of the Aleif Bais and everyone blurts out 5 words that start with that letter that they find on that page. For added difficulty, try playing that you find 5 words that END with the decided upon letter.

Act out a scene

One person acts out a scene to do with Pesach, and players have to guess what they are doing.

Some examples: Splitting of the sea, lice, cleaning for Pesach, leaning while eating Matza, looking for the Afikoman.

The table of household items

Think of a household item used on Pesach. Describe it in one word. Count to 5 backwards. On zero, everyone calls out their guess of the household item. Anyone who does not guess the correct household item has to go under the table and start doing a silly motion before returning to the game. Caution: this game causes lots of laughter.

We have a tremendous amount of love in our hearts that is readily available to share with others. Pumping up the people around us has so many benefits including: it makes us feel good, it generates a positive atmosphere, it makes the other people feel great and worthwhile, and it can actually change a person's whole life!

I just love to try to give people support and chizuk. As an aside: Doing for others makes us feel so good ourselves and fills our own emotional bank account!

As an adult, I try to sing this song all the time! I try to change up the motions or dance steps as I sing this song. This creates a function called expansion. When we add change to something while we are singing, it helps solidify the feelings associated with it. The more times we sing and add a small change, the more neural pathways we have connected to what we are doing. This helps it become more integrated into our beings.

Feeling Hashem's Love!

Taamu Ure'u Ki Tov Hashem — see and realize how wonderfully good Hashem is and then Ashrei Hagever Yecheseh Bo! Seeing the goodness of Hashem is what helps us to rely on Hashem. Saying 100 things you thank Hashem for shows that you know Hashem is the One giving you every single thing that you have! Rabbi Niehaus in issue #142 of The Spring Hill Times explained that saying Asher Yatzar is not just to help for Refuah it is to help for everything because it shows you know it is Hashem that does everything! Hashem has compassion, pity, and love for us. Thanking Hashem for the good allows us to be fully reliant on hashem!

In Yesod #1825 on A Life With Bitochon, Rabbi Golombeck explains how seeing and realizing the beauty in Hashem's world is what allows us to become very close to our loving, caring

Father and best Friend Hashem!

Rabbi Safdieh explains, "When a person is reliant and has no Safek at all, then the Bitochon is the Sibah for the Yeshuah! By Krias Yam Suf, Nachshon Ben Aminadav jumped into the water and then it split. The Yeshuah happens when you are 100 % completely sure of Hashem's Yeshuah and ability to do anything. And Rabbi Golombeck has taught us, "Hakol Yochul," everything is easy and possible for Hashem!

A person has to imagine they already got the Yeshuah, and relying on Hashem is an absolute!

Hashem is the only address to go to; there is no one else!

I was singing this song "Ki Tov Hashem L'olam Chasdo V'ad Dor Vador Emunaso." I thought that perhaps you see the Tov of Hashem and therefore it is much easier to have the Emunah, like Like it says in the song KI TOV Hashem and then V'ad Dor Vador Emunaso!

We have to be so sure, like Rabbi Safdieh explained the Posuk,

"The watchman waits for the sun." He knows his shift is over when the sun comes up and he knows for sure the sun will come up. That is how we have to rely on Hashem with certainly.

It says in Ahavah Rabbah, "Hashem loves us, Our Father, Our King. Unify our hearts to love and fear Your Name." Then it continues and says, "Ki B'Shem Kudshecha Hagodaol V'hanora Batachnu, because we have trusted and relied on Your great and awesome holy Name," THEN "Nagilah V'nismichah b'yeshuasecha, we will rejoice and exalt in your salvation." It says it is BECAUSE we trusted in you THEN we will rejoice in your salvation. We all need to be reminded: You did not get better because you went to the doctor, rather it was Hashem's salvation. The shadchan did not make your daughter's Shidduch — it was Hashem's salvation. The money did not come from the person who gave it to you. It was from Hashem's salvation.

It says LaHashem Hayeshua Al Amcha Birchasecha Sela. Hashem in His great mercy sends us the Yeshuah to us, His blessed nation. We are blessed. We are Hashem's child. We are Hashem's sheep. We are being taken care of lovingly by Hashem, our Father. Rabbi Sutton explains in the Bais Halevi on Bitachon that it is better to trust in Hashem than to trust man, as it says, "Tov Lachasos Bahashem Mivtoach Ba'adam" What does this mean? He explains it is better to trust Hashem even if he did not give a promise to you for that specific thing than to rely on a man who gave his word. Hashem is our Rock, as it says "Tzur Chasayu Bo." Just as a traveler will find shelter under a rock in a storm even though the rock did not say so, if we completely and totally rely on Hashem, then Hashem comes through 100 percent, as it says, "Tzuri v'lo avlasah bo." Rabbi Sutton writes that when one completely relies on Hashem, that is when Hashem 100% will come through for him. He gives the following explanation: If a person named Chaim lives in a town, and the one person in town who has a car is R' Dovid. Chaim needed to catch a flight, so he called the one person with the car, R' Dovid. Before R' Dovid had a chance to say that he can pick Chaim up, the phone dies. Chaim knows that R' Dovid is coming to get him because he is relying ONLY on R' Dovid. There is no one else who can help him. And R' Dovid comes through because he knows that Chaim is 100 % dependent on him! The same is true with Hashem. If we are relying 100 percent on Hashem and no one else, then Hashem comes through for us! Hashem loves us day in and day out. When we put on our "Hashem loves us glasses" we will see those occurrences by the dozens.

On Shabbos my friend shared a story about how the Ribnitzer Rebbe went to the water to use as a Mikva in Russia. He had to crack the ice to go inside, however when his Talmidim put their hands in, the water was warm! I shared with her that I was at a pool and the water was freezing. I could not swim and I wanted to swim right then. I said, "Hashem, You are in charge of the water temperature," and lo and behold, three seconds later I went back in the pool and the water was completely warm! This reminds me of the time I was in my hotel room on Shabbos on the eighth floor on late Friday night, with the air conditioner blowing. The room was really cold and uncomfortable. My sweatshirt had gotten ruined earlier that week, so I did not have it. I strengthened my Bitochon and said, "The air conditioner is not in charge of the air that comes out of it; Hashem is." A few moments later my room was warm enough to go to sleep!

Mayer'ke, an eight year old boy who lives in Monsey, said he saw how much Hashem is showering him with love! He shared that his toast fell and it spun in the air, and it landed with the chummus-side up. Also, it landed on the baby mat so he was able to eat it still because it was clean! Then he was on time to Cheder and wasn't late. What a present from Hashem!

Recently I was on a plane and the baby in the seat behind me was screaming. The mother and father were trying to soothe the baby to no avail. This was going on for about 30 minutes. It was really difficult to listen to the screaming. Then I said, "One second, Hashem is the ONLY ONE in charge of the baby's crying." I started to whisper Hakol Yochol and within minutes the crying stopped. In other news, I was at my friend's house and her baby kept crying and not going to sleep. I started to sing Hakol Yochol and within minutes the baby was sleeping peacefully.

A few months ago, a woman called me up in desperation and asked me for twelve thousand dollars. I told her that I would ask my bank to give her three times that amount by the end of the day. Then I added that my bank was Hashem and I'm going to talk to Hashem and rely on Hashem to send her the money (even though I was not giving her any money at that time). I then showered her with Brachos and words of encouragement. Later that night I got a call from her that, indeed, she had received money all day, way more than ever surpassed her dreams. I was so excited and reminded her that Hashem is our only Bank and we just need to ask Him to wire us the funds and wait peaceful with Menucha for it to come!

I wanted a certain rain jacket that I saw one time when I was in Florida and I wasn't in the mood to spend the \$72.00 on the rain jacket. The next time I was in that area, when I arrived at my hotel, they did not have the exact room I booked available, and they gave me a very similar room (that worked fine for me). However, they gave me a gift card for \$75.00 because they downgraded me. The gift card was only able to be used at their restaurants and bars that were not Kosher and ... at their market. The market was the very place they sold the jacket that I wanted. I felt Hashem just sent me the jacket!

All day long we can find stories to see Zeh Hashem Kivinu Lo. Zeh Hashem: this is Hashem that I see — Kivinu Lo when I hope to Him and only Him and rely on Him! On Pesach many things are different, and in our lives things can constantly change; however, one thing is always the same "Hashem is my best Friend!"

excitement! As much as he tried, he just couldn't control them! He tried for over one hour without success... I never saw him so excited in my entire life...

We tried calming him down but nothing worked...

Spring Hill Times: Wow, it must have been so amazing doing the very first korban Pesach!

R' Daniel: Boy it was! And so was every Korban Pesach I was zoche to bring. Unless you experienced it, it's impossible to describe... The closeness to Hashem... The kedusha... The joy of fulfilling His mitzvah... Giving Hashem pleasure... I would give away all my money just to experience it once more...

Spring Hill Times: If only we also would be able to bring the Korban Pesach...

R' Daniel: Don't worry, you will! Very soon!

R' Daniel: Don't ever give up for even for one second! I remember, how out the blue, a man showed up one day and told us," מקוד פקוד פקוד and we were in total shock! We couldn't believe it was really happening! It was exciting beyond description!

So, as hard as things seem, and as long as this galus has been, the yeshuah will come soon and it will be so sudden!

From one minute to the next, everything will change! Get yourself ready today! Pack your bags! Put aside a beautiful suit, tie, shirt to put on when you go greet Mashiach!

Too good to describe!!



Illuminating Words of Chazal

"Everything about Hashem, His Torah and His world is supposed to bring out positive emotions and help us have a healthy relationship with Hashem." Rav Yehuda Mandel

Hashem told the Yidden in Mitzrayim they should not leave their houses on leil Pesach. Chazal say that once the mashchis has permission to kill, he does not differentiate between a Tzaddik and Rasha. We hear on A Life With Bitachon that everything that happens in the universe, from beginning to end, is coming directly from Hashem, and that everything is perfect. If so, why are we afraid of a 'mashchis' if no mashchis exists? In addition, how could it be that Hashem would just kill tzaddikim for no good reason? This Chazal is also making me very scared that something bad could happen to me....

First of all, to think that there is an independent power to a "mashchis" is a lack of belief in the first of the yud-gimmel ikarim, "Hu borei u'manhig l'chol hab'ruim." It's k'neged the alef-beis of emunah. Chas v'shalom to be scared and think that the world is out of control, to think "leis din v'leis dayan." Before we explain what the p'shat is in this gemara, it's important to note what peshat isn't, what the gemara does NOT mean to say. After you know what it does not mean to say, then we can work on figuring out what it does mean to say. To learn the gemara k'peshuto would actually turn a person into a kofer and apikores. Because if you think that there's an independent koach called a satan, you think there's an independent koach called a malach hameves, that means you don't believe in one of the yud gimmel ikarim. And by not believing the yud-gimmel ikarim, a person loses his status of being a ma'amin in yiddishkeit.

So the first thing is to realize Hashem is Boreh u'Manhig. The Peleh Yoetz says that really you should make your whole life's career to chazer over the first of the yud-gimmel ikarim – Hu boreh umanhig. You have to spend your whole life working and growing and shteiging in Hashem Hu boreh umanhig, Hashem is the only One, there's no koach to the satan, there's no koach to the malach hamaves, there's no koach to baal bechira, there's no koach to teva, there's no koach to anything other than Hashem. Because if you don't chazer it over your whole entire life, your eyes can show you exactly the opposite. Our eyes show us what seems to be cause and effect, our eyes show us the illusion of teva – laws of nature. Our eyes show us that there seems to be a koach to baal bechira.

Similarly, there are chazals and mareh mekomos that make it seem like there's a koach to the satan, to the malach hamaves, to a baal bechira. R' Avigdor Miller says that this is why you need a live Rebbi. A yid whose emunah doesn't come from a live Rebbi and a mesorah can become a kofer and apikores. This is an example... if you learn the gemara according to what it seems to be saying k'pshuto, you have no understanding what chazal actually are saying and now you lost your emunah. R' Avigdor Miller brings from a gemara that when they asked a certain tanna or Amora how do you know this and he said from his rebbe. The gemara says how did his rebbe know? From his rebbe. And how did his rebbe know? From his rebbe! All the way up to Moshe Rabbeinu and all the way to a possuk in the Torah which came from Hashem. So many meforshim ask, R' Chaim Shmuelevitz, R' Avigdor Miller, why doesn't the gemara bring the possuk from chumash right away as the proof? The teretz is, says R' Avigdor Miller, because you can't even learn a possuk in chumash without having a rebbe. You can't learn a maamer chazal without having a rebbe.

R' Chaim Volozhin explains that when you believe 'ein od milvado,' actually what you are doing is taking away the ability of teva, a ba'al bechira, or the malach hamaves to have any effect on you. You say, "Hashem, I don't believe in it," and therefore the koach it seemed to have vanishes and disappears into thin air. That's how ein od milvado works.

You have to make it your life's career to really believe "ein od milvado." It's brought down in the biography of Rebbetzin Kanievsky that she lived in Eretz Yisrael right next to the border of Jordan where the Arabs were. The snipers were constantly shooting, and they hit one of her sisters. She asked her zeidy, R' Aryeh Levin, "How am I supposed to live like this? One of my siblings was already niftar. They're shooting constantly!" R' Aryeh Levin responded, "Just say ein od milvado." Don't believe in the power of teva, of the snipers, of the malach hamaves. In the biography it brings down three instanc-

es when snipers shot directly at her and Hashem altered the path of the bullet so it wouldn't hit her!
Three times!

You see there's no malach hamaves, there's no satan, there's no baal bechira – there's only ein od milvado. There's only Hashem! There's only Hashem!

R' Shimshon Pincus brings down from the Meiri, that ad kedei kach that that's why our emunah can't come from mareh mekomos, can't come from seforim, can't come from chazals. If your emunah comes from sources and mareh mekomos, today someone will show you this source, tomorrow someone will show you that source, and then your whole emunah will be wishy-washy. And emunah, says R' Avigdor Miller, means steadfast. It means I am strong, I am steel. So if your emunah comes from mareh mekomos, and sources and chazal, it's not going to be steadfast. Every day you'll see different mareh mekomos. So don't believe anything kpshuto if it sound kneged emunah! Says R' Shimshon Pincus from the Meiri, so where does our emunah come from? Emunah comes from our Bubbes! You know what our Bubbes said? Altz iz bashert!

So now that we know that altz is bashert and there's no baal bechira, I'm just going to say one more point and then we'll get to what the gemara does mean.

Says R' Chaim Kanievsky, if a person has no aveiros then the malach hamaves can't kill him. When it says eino mavchin m'tzaddik l'rasha – it's not talking about a tzaddik gamur, it's talking about a tzaddik relative to the rasha. But avada if a person has no aveiros then the malach hamaves can't kill him. Just to show you that the malach hamaves really has no koach.

That's just the introduction to get to what the gemara does mean to say. The gemara means to say that whenever there's a dever ba'ir, there's a kitrug, there's a shaas sakana, a makom sakana, so there's a klal that hasatan mekatreg bshaas hasakana. The satan goes to Hashem and he's mekatreg. Why should you save this person if he has this aveira?

Now, remember, as we are explaining what the satan is doing, don't forget that he has no koach and the only reason why he's doing it is because Hashem told him to do it. Hashem sent him; he's just a shaliach. It's all how Hashem runs this world. Hashem has shluchim, but when we see Hashem's shluchim, we know we have to remember and believe that they don't have any of their own power. They're all messengers. It's all just a puppet show. We live in a puppet show! That's why Spring Hill Times advertises every week "puppet shows." People have told me that they learn



the puppet show advertisement as mussar bihispailus. They open it up and they chazer it over and over and over. Because that's what infuses them with emunah, that's what makes it sink into their bones, by realizing that it's all a puppet show. It's very important to see that advertisement and learn it over and chazer it over. So whenever we speak about what the satan is doing, remember, go back to the advertisement and remember that it's nothing more than a puppet show.

So, the satan, the malach hamaves, is mekatreg. He says, "Why should You keep him alive? He did so many aveiros." So what does it mean that Hashem gives him permission to kill without differentiating between the tzaddik and the rasha? It means that there's a gezeira that right now there is a makom sakana, and the hishtadlus that's required in order to survive in a makom sakana, for most people without extraordinary zechusim, is to run away. That's what the gemara is saying. The gemara is saying to run inside your house, to do hishtadlus.

Now, "that sounds so scary." So first of all, it's not scary at all, because it's not the malach hameves doing it anyway, it's only Hashem, and whatever Hashem does is because it's soap and shampoo, a tikkun for your neshama. So, if something happens that means it was soap and shampoo and that's the best tikkun, and now the neshama is by the Kisei HaKavod and smiling after getting its final tikkun. But if you still want to live, have no worries, have no fears. R' Chaim Volozhin says, just say "Ein od milvado." Just like Rebbetzin Kanievsky did. So bottom line is, either there's nothing to be scared about because you realize that it's all Hashem's love and the neshama of a person who is niftar is by the Kisei HaKavod, or there's nothing to be scared about because you'll say 'ein od milvado' and nothing will happen!

Q. My family does not respect me at all. I feel like an outcast. How can I possibly thrive when I am not getting any support from my family?

A. There was another person in history who felt similarly: Dovid Hamelech.

When Dovid Hamelech was growing up, his family did not appreciate him at all. In fact, he was rejected. They considered him to be a mamzer. He was sent to tend the sheep in the wilderness amongst lions and bears.

Dovid Hamelech declared: בי אבי ואמי, my father and mother forsook me. הבט ימין- וראה ואין- לי מביר, look at my right and see; I have no friends.

Since Dovid Hamelech did not have family or friends, Dovid Hamelech took refuge in Hashem; וה' יאספני, Hashem will draw me in.

And by making Hashem his family, Dovid Hamelech became the happiest person in the world. He rose to the level of ne'vuah and sang songs to Hashem all his life. Until today we get chizuk from Dovid Hamelech's Tehilim. In all situations in life, we turn to the holy words of Dovid Hamelech.

How did Dovid Hamelech become who he became? It was not despite

A. Nervousness comes because people think that events are in their control. And they're scared that things might not turn out the right way.

In your situation as well, when you what's exp talk to your brother, you're nervous, will determ 'How will my brother react to what very best.

I say? Maybe I'll say something that he will decide to take offense from, and then he will be upset at me. Who knows?"

But you should realize. Hashem is the one in charge of emotions. He is the one who is going to determine whether or not he will take offense. And if he does get upset at you, it's still not his decision. It's Hashem who wanted it to happen.

Therefore, whenever you talk to your brother, certainly you should do your best to talk to him in a manner that won't hurt his feelings. At the same time, you have to realize that whatever ends up happening, has nothing to do with your sibling.

When you take your brother out of the picture and put Hakadosh Baruch Hu in his place, instead of feeling that you're walking on eggshells, you'll be confident that you're walking on safe ground. You know that you're doing what's expected of you, and Hashem will determine the outcome for your very best.

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I got home from school and no one was home. I called my mother, and she said she was in a store that is a

12-minute bike ride away from my house, and I could bike there and meet her.

While I was biking, I got hit by a car and I didn't get hurt and my bike didn't get damaged either!
