id you know that when it comes to Mussar or when saying a Mussar concept, it's only for what talks to you and what motivates you. What motivated people in the olden days is different than what motivates people nowadays.

For example, the Kotzker would say to people, "Are you eating I'kavod Shabbos, or are you eating I'kavod your stomach? You're not really I'shem Shamayim, you're I'shem stomach!"

R' Yehuda Mandel said, "You know what I say nowadays? It's I'shem mitzvas Shabbos! Nowadays, if you say it's not really I'shem mitzva, it will crush you. Don't criticize yourself and don't criticize

others. Even more, the way you value your mitzva, that's the way Hashem values it. Even if it's only 1% l'shem Shaymayim, if you value your mitzva, if you consider it more valuable than the mitzvos of Rishonim and Acharonim, since it's so much harder for us to do mitzvos, that's the way Hashem values it."

I called R' Falk to ask where the m'kor is for such a concept, and he said he heard a shmuz from R' Yaakov Galinsky that there's a pasuk in Tehillim, "U'lecha Hashem chessed, ki ata seshalem



l'ish k'maasehu." R' Yaakov Galinsky said the pshat is, Hashem is chessed because He gives schar according to how you value the worth of your actions, not according to their actual worth. Nowadays, you should never criticize your mitzvos, you should consider them valuable and chashuv, and you'll get schar accordingly!

chances of no one getting hurt makes no sense al pi tevah. Then we saw the Iranian president who was behind this attack, how he suddenly died in a helicopter crash and vanished in thin air. He is the one who has been saying: I'm going to wipe out Israel, and now look at what happened to him!

We have to speak about these nissim and realize how much Hashem is doing for us and protecting us. We should remember this neis again and again, R' Mandel said over that after the 6 day war R' Chaim Shmulevitz was talking about the great nissim that happened, for a year after. This story has so much potential to build our Emunah and bitachon when we internalize Hashem's power and how much chessed he is doing for us.

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The Bitachon Perspective

Q & A with Rabbi Zevy Golombeck Typed by R' Shalom Yedidya Klatzko

Q. I am presently redoing my house and am immersed in all the details. It came to a point that the renovations are on my mind every second of the day, robbing me of my menuchas hanefesh. What's the emunah and bitachon perspective about this?

A. The reason a person can become overwhelmed when redecorating his house is because he feels that his decisions are what determine the outcome. Therefore, his mind is constantly racing, "If I decide on such-and-such, I will be happy. One the other hand if I do things differently, I might be happier. Perhaps, I should do things in a third way altogether..." This never-ending deliberation can rob a person of his menuchas hanefesh.

You need to realize that your decisions have nothing to do with how your house will turn out! Hakadosh Baruch Hu is the one who will determine how your house is going to look. Your job is merely to do hishtadlus; do your best to design your house according to your taste. However, the way your house will turn out and how much you will enjoy it is completely up to Hakadosh Baruch Hu.

When you reprogram yourself with this mindset, you will find that you will be able to go through renovations relaxed and at ease.

Additionally, consider the following: Why are you so pressured that your house should come out perfect? Because you feel that if your house comes out beautiful, you will be happy. Therefore, you want to make sure that everything comes out right.

Comes the Mesilas Yesharim and teaches us: Happiness does not come from material pleasures. A beautiful house cannot supply a person with true sipuk.

We are all programmed with the awareness that we were sent to this world for a purpose: To gain closeness with Hashem and become eligible to enjoy Olam Habah. Only when we are involved in fulfilling our mission in this world do we feel true, intrinsic happiness.

Once you realize that it's not your house that will make you happy, rather it's fulfilling the mitzvos and working on your relationship with Hashem, the renovations won't be so pressuring. After all, having a nice house is just the backdrop. However, the chief component of happiness — serving Hashem — will always be available to you, no matter how the house turns out.







Many years ago, I was a camper in Camp Ohr Shraga and there was a major blackout in camp as well as in the entire mountains. There was absolutely no electricity, lights, air conditioning, or running water, since the reservoir ran on an electric pump. The entire camp utilized these moments of heavy darkness as an opportunity for growth and elevation, and everyone gathered for a major shmuz given by the Camp's Mashgiach. The atmosphere was quiet and tranquil, and everyone's eyes were completely focused on the shiur. The Mashgiach spoke about the amazing endless love that Hashem has for every single yid no matter what. Hashem gave us so many Mitzvos both Bein Adam LaMakom and Bein Adam LaChavairo, so that we can have countless ways to

connect with Him and tangibly experience His great love. Every time we show our friend extra concern and sensitivity, every time we daven to Hashem from our hearts, and every time we connect to Hashem by learning His Torah, we are connecting to the flow of endless love, infinite joy, and nonstop Simcha which Hashem is sending our direction at every moment. Everyone walked away uplifted and energized.

I will never forget how one of the greatest senior Talmidei Chochomim in camp, HaRav

HaGaon Rav Karp ZT"L, who knew all of Shas by heart and was a walking Sefer Torah, instructed everyone to wash their hands only until their knuckles so as to ensure that everyone will have water, and he encouraged everyone to use these challenging moments as an opportunity to strengthen בין אדם

That Shabbos, by Shalosh Seudos, a senior elderly Rav in camp spoke about how the electric company, located many hundreds of miles away, produces a tremendous supply of

electricity and a small "technical glitch" in the system greatly affects the power supply for thousands of people and families who live many hundreds of miles away, as we all experienced during this major blackout. Similarly, the Rav explained, our Torah, Tefila, Chesed and Bitachon powers the entire world with energy! Our Torah and Mitzvos sends millions of 'kilowatts' of life, Bracha, Gezunt, Parnasa, and major Yeshuos to the entire world!

Later, when Hashem restored everyone's electricity, everyone was so Be'Simcha! Spontaneous dancing erupted! Everyone understood how electricity, light, power, running water and air conditioning is Hashem making us feel so loved, cared for, watched and protected!

To this day, when I turn on the faucet and water comes out in abundance, I focus on how much love and caring from Hashem is flowing freely.

Everyone understood that the entire blackout experi-

ence, with all of its challenges, was Hashem showing us how much we can enjoy and appreciate His gifts of light, energy, running water and air conditioning and how much we should feel so loved and cared for with these precious gifts.

I was once eating by a Gadol's house on Shabbos, and as he ate the Seuda, he kept on saying again and again how much the food is making him feel loved, cared for, watched and

protected by Hashem!

When we enjoy the hundreds of gifts that Hashem is sending our direction every moment, let's feel loved, cared for, watched and protected by Hashem, because Hashem is sending us these gifts out of the greatest Ahava, a love so great that we cannot even comprehend how infinite and endless it is!

Hashem loves us!
