From this week's Torah portion:

"Perhaps you will say to yourselves, 'These nations are more numerous than us; how will we be able to drive them out?' Do not fear them... Do not stand in dread of them, for Hashem, your G-d, is in your midst; a great and awesome G-d." (Devarim 7:17-21)

Rabbi Elimelech Biderman quotes the Shelah HaKadosh who understands these verses as a cause and effect. When our enemy nations are more numerous than us, when winning would defy all logical explanation, our only hope is to rely on Hashem entirely. It is precisely then that we are told, "Do not fear them." The faith and trust we place in Hashem during these uncertain times will ensure our success in battle.
