The van was completely packed with our things for our yearly 500-mile summer trip to Bubbie and Zeide and we were almost going to tell everybody to get in when 14-year-old "Yitzy" started yelling that he had glass in his leg. He had been taking out a bag of garbage that had in it broken glass from a picture frame and somehow that glass had gone into his leg as the bag rubbed against him.

We took him to the local urgent care to be evaluated. They cleaned out his wound and, seeing no glass, prepared to stitch him up. Baruch Hashem b'hashgacha pratis, Yitzy spoke up and asked for an x-ray. He thought that there was glass in his leg that they couldn't see because he had heard a slight crunching noise as the bag rubbed against his leg and had felt it break inside him.

Begrudgingly, they agreed to do an x-ray all the while saying, "But it's not going to show anything because glass doesn't show up on x-ray."

Two x-rays later we had a very clear picture of multiple pieces

of glass embedded in the part of his leg further up away from the place where they had been looking. They tried a bit longer to get those pieces out but when they realized that they couldn't, they sent us to the emergency room. We stayed overnight in the emergency room and were sent the next day to the pediatric ward to await what was supposed to be a 15-minute surgery that ended up taking THREE hours.

Bechasdei Hashem, Yitzy realized something was off in the urgent care and asked for an x-ray, bechasdei Hashem they listened to him even though they didn't think it would help. B'chasdei Hashem they didn't just sew up his leg with the pieces of glass from the garbage embedded in his leg (chas veshalom we would've been 500 miles away on our trip and he could have had a huge infection percolating inside his stitchedup leg!). Thank You, Hashem, for taking care of us every moment of every day whether we are able to see it immediately or not!


beginning of seder. The caller told him, "Listen, I need a baby carriage. If you sell it to me now, I'll pay in cash immediately."

I'm looking back and thinking, "What happened this past year? I see it was a year full of tzaros, a year full of tragedies and a year full of wars. I'm thinking to myself, what should make me feel confident that next year should be any different? How do I know that next year will be better?"

A: The first point is, if you are looking back at this past year and trying to figure out how you should label this past year, you should realize that this year was a year where we experienced open nissim gluyim and yeshuos l'maalah miderech hatevah that we haven't seen in decades, in centuries! 



Hashem's Simple, Cheap Food Dye Makes Skin Transparent to Give Doctors a 'Window' into the Body

A revolutionary new technique, created by Hashem, uses food dye to provide a "window" into the body by making skin transparent.

By applying a mixture of water and a common yellow food coloring called tartrazine, researchers, B'syata D'shmaya made the skin on the skulls and abdomens of live mice see-through.

The ground-breaking technique, described in the journal Science, gives medics a new way to see organs within a body by rendering overlying tissues transparent to visible light.

Also known as Yellow Dye #5, the technique needs to be tested on humans, as certain food dyes have negative side effects.

But the process was reversible in tests with animals, and scientists say it may ultimately apply to several medical uses—from locating injuries to monitoring digestive disorders and identifying cancers.

"Looking forward, this technology could, Be'ezras Hashem, make veins more visible for the drawing of blood, make laser-based tattoo removal more straightforward, or assist in the early detection and treatment of cancers," said Dr. Guosong Hong, of Stanford University who helped lead the work.

"For example, certain therapies use lasers to eliminate cancerous and precancerous cells, but are limited to areas near the skin's surface. This technique may be able to improve that light penetration." Baruch Hashem!

The researchers developed, with the wisdom of Hashem, a way to predict how light interacts with dyed biological tissues. The predictions required a deep understanding of light scattering, as well as the process of refraction, when light changes speed and bends as it travels from one material into another.

The team explained that scattering is the reason we cannot see through our body. Fats, fluids within cells, proteins, and other materials each have a different refractive index, a property that dictates how significantly an incoming light wave will bend.

In most tissues, those materials are closely compacted together, so the varied refractive indices cause light to scatter as it passes through. It is the scattering effect that our eyes interpret as opaque and colored.

The researchers realized if they wanted to make biological material transparent, they had to find a way to match the different refractive indices so light could travel through unimpeded.

Building on fundamental insights from the field of optics, the researchers realized dyes which are the most effective at absorbing light can also be "highly effective" at directing light uniformly, through a wide range of refractive indices.

One dye the researchers predicted would be particularly effective was tartrazine. When dissolved into water and absorbed into tissues, tartrazine molecules turned out to be perfectly structured to match refractive indices and prevent light from scattering—resulting in transparency.

The research team first tested the technique on thin slices of chicken breast. As tartrazine concentrations increased, the refractive index of the fluid within the muscle cells rose until it matched the refractive index of the muscle proteins—and the slice became transparent.

The researchers then gently rubbed a temporary tartrazine solution on mice.

First, they applied the solution to the scalp, rendering the skin transparent to reveal blood vessels criss-crossing the brain.

Then they applied the solution to the abdomen, which faded within minutes to show contractions of the intestine and movements caused by heartbeats and breathing.

When the dye was rinsed off, the tissues quickly returned to normal. The tartrazine did not appear to have long-term effects, and any excess was excreted in waste within 48 hours.

The researchers suspect that injecting the dye should lead to even deeper views within organisms, with implications for both biology and medicine.

"We combined the yellow dye, which is a molecule that absorbs most light, especially blue and ultraviolet light, with skin, which is a scattering medium," said study lead author Dr. Zihao Ou, Assistant Professor of physics at The University of Texas, Dallas.

"Individually, these two things block most light from getting through them. But when we put them together, we were able to achieve transparency of the mouse skin."

"For those who understand the fundamental physics behind this, it makes sense; but if you aren't familiar with it, it looks like a magic trick.



"In addition, it's very inexpensive and efficient; we don't need very much of it to work."

The researchers have not yet tested the process on humans, whose skin is about 10 times thicker than a mouse's. They don't know how much would be necessary to penetrate the entire thickness.


Human medicine today includes ultrasound technology to look deeper inside the living body—but the expense makes it inaccessible to a broad audience, while a method based on food dye would not be.

"Our research group is mostly academics, so one of the first things we thought of when we saw the results of our experiments was how this might improve biomedical research.

"Optical equipment, like the microscope, is not directly used to study live humans or animals because light can't go through living tissue.

"But now that we can make tissue transparent, it will allow us to look at more detailed dynamics. It will completely revolutionize existing optical research in biology."






Rav Shlomo Lorintz related that bochurim once came to complain that their roommate was not putting on tefillin. They were certain he would immediately be expelled from yeshiva. To their surprise, Rav Yerucham asked them, "Does this bochur change out of his clothes when he goes to sleep, or is he the type to sleep in his clothes and shoes?" The talmidim checked, and sure enough, when this bochur came back late at night after learning to his room, he fell asleep in his clothes and shoes. They returned with this information to Reb Yerucham, who listened and then said, "If so, the fact that he does not put on tefillin is not because of lack of yiras shamayim or irresponsibility. Apparently, he has the personality of an absentminded illui (genius), and is unorganized in all his affairs, physical and spiritual. I will teach him, and you will see he will soon put on tefillin and daven properly".

Indeed, Rav Yerucham began working with that bochur, and transformed him into a regular person, weaning off all his eccentric genius habits! One of the first places change was noticeable was in his scrupulousness in davening and laying tefillin.

Rav Lorintz added, "Had Rav Yerucham acted like other Mashgichim, and expelled this boy, he would have been lost to Klal Yisroel. Thanks to his wisdom and tolerance, this bochur eventually became someone who disseminated Torah to the public."

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We mentioned that one of the important functions of our nasal passage is to warm the incoming air in order to adjust its temperature to be compatible with the lungs. Let's elaborate a little bit more on this point. We usually perceive our nasal passage as a simple straight, open tube that takes in air from the outside world and transfers it to our windpipe. Yet actually the passageway that Hashem created is quite complex. High up in our nasal passage are bony structures that are folded and rolled over like a scroll. Their shape is similar to seashells which are hard, hollow and twisted. The air that we inhale enters this area and gets swirled and turned around these structures. This internal movement warms the air and adapts it to our body temperature. Obviously, air that gets inhaled through our mouth does not have this special advantage. Perhaps we can point out the importance of having warm air in our lungs as opposed to cold air from the rates of mortality. The numbers of people that die naturally in the cold months of the year are significantly higher than the amount of people that die naturally during the warm months of the year. Our bodies function better with warm air rather than cold air.

We have another function that the nasal passage does to prepare the oxygen. It might sound similar to the warming of the air, but it is really a different point. Our nasal passage humidifies the air that we inhale. To humidify the air means to add moisture to the air. Our lungs can get dried out from regular air. When the air enters the nasal passage, it gets swirled around the twisted, bony structures that are deep inside, not only does it warm the air but it also humidifies the air. This makes the air moist and ready for our lungs. There is so much chessed Hashem that is going on - with every single breath that we take - and we are not even aware of it! The amount of humidity that the air receives when we breathe through our nose is double the amount of humidity that is contained in the air that we breathe through our mouth. This is another important advantage that we have in breathing through our nose instead of breathing through our mouth.



The "BUSY BEE" – all the jobs the worker bee does in its short lifetime. Part 3 of 4

This article will focus on the numerous different jobs that all worker bees are actively involved in. Almost all of them take place within the hive, so you don't get to see them doing them.

On the chart you will see that there are many overlapping jobs that take place during the same age group. There's plenty of worker bees to share doing the jobs. However, who decides who should do which jobs is currently still unknown. Why some bees of the same age group do one of the jobs for that age, and others do other jobs available at that specific age is not known. What IS known is that the hive as a whole, acts in unity as an amazing socially, functioning unit, even though there's no manager giving out any specific jobs to any of the workers. It's another amazing feat of Hashem's Wisdom!

As we go through this list, one by one, we will see how Hashem

has instilled amazing instincts for the PURPOSE of keeping this great machine of honeybees all working together in great unity, keeping the hive going throughout the year. THERE'S NOTHING HERE THAT CAN BE AN ACCIDENT - IT'S ALL YAD HASHEM AND CHOCHMAS HASHEM as we shall see.

1. Housekeeper (days 1-3 after it emerges from its cell)

Worker bees leave their capped cells by gnawing through the wax capping. They immediately start working, by cleaning their cells in preparation for a new egg to be laid there by the queen. SOMEHOW, they "KNOW" that the Queen bees will inspect every cell to see that it's completely clean before laying their eggs in it, so Hashem made it that they should "CARE" that the queen should be able to lay their eggs in these cells. They immediately clean their own cell to make it available again for another egg to be laid there by the queen (she won't clean it, but she will skip it if it's not 100% clean). Now, why should the bee "care" about anything that has to do with the welfare of the hive? Are these bees balei chesed, kind hearted bees, that they should care about the welfare of the hive? Obviously, it's all instincts that Hashem put into them!

Once their cell is completely cleaned, they spend the first few days as a general-housekeeping bee. This involves finding other empty cells that may have had honey in them, or pollen, that now needs to be cleaned thoroughly, otherwise, the queen will skip the cell and move to another one which is a waste of space, something that we will see that bees never allow to happen. Bees are extremely fastidious (very careful and concerned about accuracy, detail, and cleanliness) in how they take care of their hive.

2. Undertaker (days 3-16)


Undertaker bees (mortuary bees) remove dead bees from the hive, and other debris that they may find. This behavior maintains colony



hygiene and cleanliness, helping prevent the spread of diseases and keeping the hive clean. Again, Hashem put into their instincts to be sure to keep the hive in good shape. Do you think that bees "KNOW" anything about the importance of cleanliness? Of course not!

3. Nurse (days 4-12)

The primary role of a nurse bee is to check on each larva about 1,300 times daily, and to feed them as needed. This works out to about 10,000 individual checks throughout the development of ONE larva. The worker bees can be observed fulfilling tasks such as feeding larva up to 100 times a day as necessary. In the last article we spoke about the amazing special glands that Hashem put into the worker bee from which they feed the "bees milk" to developing larvae. These glands are OBVIOUSLY NOT ACCIDENTS.


tortions. there is a way to become cheerful and positive: Learn about and pay tention (i.e., think about) to the good. A person is

Living With Appreciation R. Daniel Shashal

"For this commandment that I command you today, is not hidden from you and is not far...it is very near to you..." (30:11,14) The Ramban teaches that "this commandment" refers to teshuvah. Surely this is very puzzling. We associate teshuvah as being something daunting and difficult, how can it be described as something close to us? However, the Torah is telling us that it is less daunting and more attainable than we think.

We tend to understand that teshuvah means making a complete turnabout and never returning to our sins again and if we did sin again, our teshuvah wasn't successful. However, this isn't so and thoughts of repentance alone can accomplish a lot, even if we don't change our ways. For exam-

When we think about it, teshuvah doesn't really make sense. If someone was speeding down the highway and upon getting pulled over, says, "Officer I am sorry, I didn't mean to speed and I won't do it again," he will still receive a ticket, no matter how sorry he is. Yet, lehavdil, when we tell Hashem, the King of all Kings, that we are sorry for our aveiros, He is willing to completely forgive us and wipe the slate clean! Teshuvah defies reasoning and logic. The Rabbeinu Yonah begins his monumental work, Shaarei Teshuvah (3:2) by writing that teshuvah is a gift. He brings elsewhere that when we repent, we need to contemplate the great kindness of Hashem Who gave us this priceless opportunity.

Another area of teshuvah which is a precious gift is the special Siyata Dishmaya that we receive. Our Rabbis teach that "one who wishes to be purified will receive Divine help" (Shabbos 104a). Elaborating on this, Rabbeinu Yonah teaches that the assistance we receive is beyond natural: Hashem gives us a very powerful Siyata Dishmaya to help us overcome our yetzer hara (Shaarei Teshuvah 1:1). We just have to make the first step. Our yetzer hara can be very cunning and quite difficult to overcome. However, when we make the initiative to do teshuvah, we have a guarantee that Hashem will be with us all the way, holding our hand no matter what. There is no limit to Hashem's willingness to accept teshuvah.

The biggest reshaim who ever lived were given the opportunity to do teshuvah. Let's take the example of king Menasheh. He was one of the most wicked kings in Jewish history, who worshipped multiple types of avodah zarah,

placed an idol in the Bais Hamikdash, and led the Jews astray. He was captured by an enemy army and in his great distress he cried out to Hashem in repentance and was forgiven! Another example is Elazar Ben Dudaya, he was one of the most immoral people, who visited every single zonah in the world. One time he traveled a very large distance to visit a certain zonah, who told him that there was no hope for him. He cried copious tears of repentance until his soul departed from

him, and a voice from Heaven proclaimed, 'Rav Elazar Ben Dudaya has a place in Gan Eden.' He went from being one of the most immoral people to receiving semichah from Shamayim.



ple, the Gemara (Kidushin 49b) teaches that the betrothal of

an evildoer to a woman on condition that he is completely righteous might be valid, since maybe he had thoughts of repentance. This is even without him changing anything yet!

Although there are four stages of teshuvah which are required (regret, leaving the sin, confession, and resolving not to repeat the action), it is not all or nothing and just the will to change can accomplish so much. Furthermore, one might think "how can my teshuvah be accepted if I am

bound to stumble again? Maybe that canceled out my teshuvah?" However, this is not so: teshuvah wipes the slate clean and whether one stumbles again or not is irrelevant.



Hashem is our loving caring Father and just like a father really desires his son to behave correctly and be close to him, so too when we return to Hashem it brings Him so much pleasure. He is also waiting for us to come close to Him, and do teshuvah. Three times a day we express our appreciation for this. In the berachah of selach lanu, we finish Baruch atah Hashem harotzeh bitshuvah. We are expressing our gratitude to Hashem Who not only He gives us this opportunity; He actually wants us to do teshuvah, and is eagerly waiting. The following story provides us a glimpse of the power that the precious gift of teshuvah really has.

One time Rav Laib Sarach, a talmid of the Ba'al Shem Tov, was in a certain village in Poland for Yom Kippur where they only had nine people who could make a minyan. "Are you

sure there are no other Jews here?" he asked. "We are the only Jews here who identify with our faith" they replied. 'What about someone who left the fold? The gates of teshuvah are open to everyone," he responded. "There is the squire of the village but he has left all ties of Judaism behind and has been engrossed in grave sins for over 40 years", they told him. "Let me go speak to him" the Rav said determinedly. He explained their predicament to the squire, and surprisingly he showed newfound interest in connecting to his Jewish roots and completed the minyan. At the climax of neilah when everyone screamed out "Hashem Hu HaElokim" for the seventh time, the squire suddenly passed away. The Tzadik proclaimed that he now had a place in Olam Haba! (A Treasury of Chassidic tales, Rabbi Zevin p. 127)

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Let Us Thank Hashem for...

What a treat it is that we can step into a nice cool shower in the summer and a hot shower in the winter, adjusting the temperature to our liking. The Tannah, Hillel, taught that washing ourselves is a mitzvah since we are created in Hashem's image; our bodies are due to be looked after properly, since it houses our neshamah.

Do Yourself a Favor!

This coming week is Rosh Hashana and we are definitely looking for more zechusim in order to merit a good judgment. One of the best ways to be zoche to chesed from Hashem in our court case is to follow in His ways and try to do chesed with other people, and to do so with simcha! Of course, chesed starts at home, especially with your spouse and family members. You are taking care of them anyways, so why not have in mind that you are doing the mitzvah of chesed! But did you know that when you take care of your health you are also doing chesed? The Midrash (Vayikra Rabba 34:4) cites the pasuk in Mishlei (11:17) "חסד" – "A man of kindness brings good upon himself," and says it is referring to the following story. One day, after Hillel Hazakein finished saying shiur, his talmidim saw that he was in a big rush. When they asked him where he was running to, he answered, "I am going to do chesed with the guest staying in my home." The next day this happened again, and he gave the same answer. After this happened for a few days they asked, "Do you have a guest every day?!" He answered, "My soul is not a guest in my body? Today it is here, tomorrow it is gone!" The meforshim explain that Hillel was going to eat, and viewed that as an act of chesed to his soul.

Rav Avigdor Miller zt"l says that Hillel viewed his body as the inn for the *neshama* and by treating it properly, he was doing an act of chesed. We learn from here that whatever you do to take care of your body is called גמילת. This includes taking care of your physical aspects, such as eating breakfast, eating at the right time, and

staying away from foods that can damage your health. But most of all, davening for good health is the greatest chesed we can do for our bodies. The gemara says in Sanhedrin (44b) that a person should always daven that bad things should not happen to him. Because once a person is already in a *tzara*, *chas v'sholom*, such as if he got sick, he will need many *zechusim* to get out of it. It is much easier to daven to stay healthy. Davening is a great way to prevent sickness. If a person davens very fast and doesn't try to work on having *kavana*, or if he doesn't add personal requests for



health, he is actually being cruel to himself! When a person says in *tachanun* "ה' אל באפך תוכיחני, ואל בחמתך תייסרני"

- "Hashem, do not rebuke me in Your anger, nor chastise me in Your wrath," he should beg and cry to Hashem for good health. Every person, at every age, must do so.

Rav Miller concludes, and of course you should not do things that destroy your health. Such a person is similar to one who is building a wall with one hand, and smashing it down with the other!

We have mentioned in the past that saying Asher Yatzar with *kavana* is the best preventative against sickness. Now we have discovered that doing so is also a great act of chesed to yourself. Through that, may we be *zoche* to a *kesiva v'chasima tova* and a year of good health!

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Chizuk Corner

We are standing now before Rosh Hashana and we are getting closer and closer.

Rosh Hashanah is a Yom Hadin and at the same time, we know that it is a joyous day like every Yom Tov. In fact, according to many poskim there is actually a Mitzvah of visamachta bichagecha.

The obvious question is how do we understand this? How can we have fear and joy at the same time?



The truth is that this concept of fear and joy is not something new. Dovid

Hamelech tells us in Tehillim "v'gilu b'raada." How do we blend these two seemingly contradicto-

ry things together?

Let me give you a Mashal that will help us understand this, and perhaps it will give us a refreshing outlook at Rosh Hashanah as well.

There was once a king who had a rebellious son who did some-

thing that defied His authority. The king loved the prince and realized that he needed to teach

him his long-awaited lesson and he banished him from the kingdom.

The prince wandered around and he settled in a little hut somewhere. He didn't hear from his father the King for over a year and he was yearning to return to his father.

One day, a messenger came to the prince with a message that his father is calling him to his court to judge him for his misdeed.

Now the prince understood that there was a chance that he might get punished, but at the same time he saw that the king didn't forget him and perhaps he would even take him back.

When the prince arrived at the court, he looked fearful but at the same time he was smiling. The king surrounded by all his ministers saw the mixed expressions and he asked the prince for an explanation?

The prince explained that on the one hand he was full of fear for who knows what would happen to him, but at the same time he felt joy with the fact that the king hadn't forgotten him. Furthermore, now that he

> had arrived at the castle, he was close to his father and perhaps he would take him back once again and those thoughts brought him joy.

> When the king heard that, he got off his throne and engulfed his son in a tight bear hug as he whispered to his son through tears of joy, "Welcome home welcome home."

> The Nimshal is clear. We know that we are heading into the

However, at the same time the fact that

Hashem is going to judge us shows that He is thinking about each and every one of us and this itself should pump us up.

Moreover, the Chinuch says that if we wouldn't be judged each year then our aveiros would start piling higher and higher and it would be almost impossible to return to Hashem r"l.

We know that on Rosh Hashanah we get an extreme closeness to Hashem. Like the prince in the mashal we have extreme hope that Hashem will take us back to Yerushalayim once again.

Let us discuss this unique and special day so that we will go into Rosh Hashana with hearts full of yearning and joy for this special day.

- 1. Rosh Hashanah is the day that the world was finished and man was created. Yes, the amazing human being was created on this day. That makes this day the anniversary of mankind. And the reason why Hashem created us is because He loves us so much and wants to give us infinite pleasure in Olam Haba.
- 2. On Rosh Hashanah Sara and Chana were nifkad which means they were remembered [so to speak]. On this day it was decided that they were to have children. So, Rosh Hashanah represents the birth of Yitzchok and all of Klal Yisroel.
- 3. On Rosh Hashanah, Yosef came out of jail. Yosef is the one who saved his whole family from starvation. Additionally, Yosef's nisayon in Mitzrayim helped pave the way for Klal Yisroel's spiritual survival as well.
- 4. On Rosh Hashanah, the hard labor in Mitzrayim came to an end.
 - 5. Rosh Hashanah is the first day of the

Aseres Yemai Teshuva, which is a time that Hashem is very close to us.

- 6. Rosh Hashanah is the day that we are coronating and proclaiming Hashem as our king and the King of the whole world.
- 7. Rosh Hashanah is the first day of the year. And everything we do makes a tremendous impact on the coming year. This is why we eat sweet things to help sweeten up our year.



Imagine if we give chizzuk and we are sweet to our family and friends how much it can affect our coming year.

Imagine how much goodness we can acquire for the whole year when we are mechazek ourselves with Emuna and Bitachon on Rosh Hashanah.

I saw a beautiful explanation why it's called Rosh <u>Ha</u>shanah and not Rosh Shanah. It's because we are hoping that this will be "Hashana" - the special year. A year full of Bracha and rachamim, and most important a year of revealing the glory of Hashem with the Geula Shelaima.

Wishing all my readers, "A Wonderful Sweet Year."

id you know that the Mashgiach, Rav Nosson Wachfogel, told my Rebbi that teshuva has to be looked at as fun, geshmack, and exciting... "ki karov eleicha hadavar meod," that it has to be very close to us. Hashem specifically wants teshuva to be close to us because when a person feels like he's clean, that motivates him to want to stay clean. If someone is dirty he's just going to get more dirty.

This that we find in Rabbeinu Yonah in Shaarei Teshuva and many seforim that say teshuva is a mountain and overwhelming, that's because it was easy according to their generation. But nowadays that we're not on



that level and have no shaychus to that level, it's not the mitzvah of teshuva bizmanenu. The mitzvah of teshuvah transfers and switches according to the generation, according to every person. Bottom line is that teshuva has to be fun and exciting. Look at it as "Boom. I am snow white clean. Everything is perfect gevaldik and amazing."

Now practically speaking, how many steps are there to teshuva and all the different levels in seforim, and who does it apply to? Everyone has to know themselves. What's considered easy? What's considered fun? What's considered geshmak? As my Rebbi said "deracheha darchei Noam," yiddishkeit has to be pleasant. If a person

starts doing teshuvah on everything and starts working on everything, that is too overwhelming. It's not deracheha darchei Noam. Teshuvah has to be pleasant, and working on your middos has to be pleasant, and everything about yiddishkeit has to be pleasant.



y Rebbi, R' Golombek, said on the bitachon hotline that Emunah and bitachon has many perspectives that you can use for every situation in order to enhance your life. One of them is realizing that when you have anxiety or emotional pain it is the biggest gift in your

life. That is

because your anxiety came from none other than Hashem, your loving caring Father. Anxiety is a tap on the shoulder from Hashem telling you, "I love so much, so I want you to come close to me." Hashem gives you anxiety and emotional pain because this will push you into working on bitachon because bitachon combats anxiety; bitachon is a modality to bring your menuchas hanefesh.



The deeper your pain is, the stronger you can grow in bitachon. People without anxiety don't have this push to grow in bitachon, but with anxiety you have a push to develop a relationship with Hashem. Anxiety is also yissurim; it's a sponge to scrub your neshoma snow white clean and saves you from gehenom. With this attitude, anxiety becomes a passing stage but while it's there realize its purpose and worth and instead of dreading these feelings, embrace them with a dance.

A LIFE WITH BITACHON ON THE PARSHA

Nitzavim (section #4 #223)

The Torah starts off this week's parsha, אתם נצבים היום,"," talking directly to Klal Yisroel and telling them, "You are all standing here alive and well!" Rashi explains that the Yidden have just listened to the tochacha, where they heard all the bad and scary things that can happen ch"v, to a person who doesn't serve Hashem properly. With this they thought, "We're in deep trouble. We don't stand a chance to survive. What's going to be?" Their faces became pale and their moods turned gloomy.

Moshe Rabbeinu responded to this by telling them: "Klal Yisroel! Look! Don't you remember? You have done so many big aveiros in the midbar, but you are still here!" This calmed Klal Yisroel down. They realized that even though they sinned many times in the past, they were still fine. This made them feel much more comfortable with the whole tochacha.



The Mefarshim ask, what is going on here? Moshe just gave them tochacha to scare them off, so they should not do avei-ros, because all these terrible punishments can happen to them. Then Moshe tells them not to worry, because they can see firsthand that even if they do aveiros, the tochacha won't come about. If so, why did Moshe tell them the tochacha to begin with, if anyway Moshe will reassure them that there is nothing to fear? How do we understand all this?

Perhaps, we can answer based on the Rabbeinu Yonah in Sha'arei Teshuva (shaar 4). He writes there that because of Ha-shem's

tremendous Rachmanos, even when a person is deserving of a big punishment due to his many sins ch"v, Hakadoish Baruch Hu starts off with giving him a small inconvenience or a very minimal challenge. When this happens, a person has the opportunity to say, "This is coming from my loving, caring Father, Hakadoish Boruch Hu, out of His love, and דעביד רחמנא לטב עביד care tis my soap and shampoo. I accept it be'ahava and I will try to improve my relationship with Him." When a person does this, then Hashem says, "You realized it is coming from My love, and you took the message? That Zechus is so great that you won't have to go through any more suffering or Yesurin r"!!"

From Rabbeinu Yona we see that if a person says gam zu letova for small challenges, using them to bolster his relationship with his loving, caring Father, he won't need the big tochacha to come on him ch"v, even if he struggles to serve Hashem properly.

We can say that this is the back and forth going on between Klal Yisroel and Moshe Rabbeinu. Klal Yisroel has just gone through the midbar for 40 years, and there were many times that they had a shortcoming in their avodas Hashem. Howev-er, at the same time they were living with Hashem, and they brought him into the picture even when times were difficult.

This is what Moshe Rabbeinu was telling Klal Yisroel. "Because you have been connecting to The Source all along, through thick and thin you were still mechazeik yourselves in Emuna and Bitachon. You don't have to worry about the tochacha.

So, whenever a small challenge or nisayon comes our way, let us look at it as a once in a life-time golden opportunity! If we accept it in the right way and say, "This is out of Hashem's love. It is soap and shampoo for my neshama," we will be Bez"H spared from anything worse, ch"v, happening to us. The more a person accepts his challenges with simcha, the more Ha-shem will say, "Now I will save you from things you wouldn't want, and you'll have a life of open chessed and rachamim!

Someone shared the following: I am currently not making ends meet and can't afford chicken and meat. Instead, I need to serve the children macaroni and eggs. That is basically what we have for breakfast, lunch and supper. My kids ask me, "Why can't we be like everyone else and have better food?" I was wondering what the right response would be to that question?



Later that day Hashem sent me a very clear answer. I was at a meeting with a few people. During the meeting, different people happened to mention different challenges they were going through. This one's husband was really not well. That one's child had a serious medical condition, and the other one had this problem, and that one had that issue.

Afterwards, I thought, "I have no medical conditions, nor any other big issues in my whole family. I think it is because I am mekabel my financial situation with simcha. Be-



cause of this, I am spared from any other big challenges. No hospitals, car accidents or other sort of tragedy c"v."

"Yes, we might not have chicken and meat like everyone else, but because of that we are able to be home sweet home as a wholesome, happy mishpacha! Wow! Chasdei Hashem! What can be better?!"

A Yiddishe Mamme shared: I went to a family simcha, and no one was looking at me. I was totally ignored. I felt very rejected.

Then I thought that Hashem is doing this so I can get my tikun nishama in this easy way, instead of with hospital stays! I became so full of simcha and gratitude, that I got onto such a high! Naturally, I went over to say hello to everyone, even though they didn't do that to me.



These people realized the amazing gift Hashem sent their way by giving them a challenge, and they utilized it. Let's use these golden opportunities as well! With this perspective, we will always have such simcha and a heart full of gratitude! We will only see bracha and rachamim in our lives, and be zoche to a kesiva v'chasima tova-AMEIN!

he Sound of the Shofar is in the air. Here we are again, Boruch HASHEM and the question persists in asking? What is the Shofar trying to say, with-

The Torah has plenty of words and HASHEM has words too. With words HASHEM created the universe. So why now are suddenly, not quite stricken silent, but speechless?!

I heard from one of my Rebbeim many years ago that there are two types of silence. One is a silence that is below words. There is another silence that is beyond words.



This world is so busy with words and it is crowded with conversation. It's often hard to know how to respond. We find ourselves stricken silent, a silence below words. When Shabbos arrives with the help of a Niggun, a song from the heart we are suddenly vaulted to a silence above words. We know what that feels like.


Somebody turned my world inside out many years ago, on my first Shabbos encounter, by simply stating, "You, western intellects, you thinkers, you think G-d is in your little world?! You are in G-d's world!" Suddenly, I realized that I better prove to G-d that I exist, and that my life has significance.

One of the names that we have for HASHEM is MAKOM - literally PLACE, because HASHEM is the place of the world. HASHEM may be in

our minds but we are really in HASHEM's mind. We are a thought of HASHEM and that's a good place to be because HASHEM's thoughts are real.

When we find ourselves thinking about HASHEM then our thoughts are real. As Shlomo HaMelech wrote in Shir HaShirim, "Ani L'Dodi v'Dodi Li" – "I am to my beloved and my beloved is to me".

Now what is it that the Shofar is trying to say, without words. The Shofar itself comes from a ram's horn that sits on top of its head like a crown. Now even though everything that comes into this world flows through the process of MACHSHAVA – DIBUR – MAASEH – THOUGHT and SPEECH and ACTION, prior to the first thought is an overwhelming desire to create, and to bring into being. The Shofar is emanating from and expressing that higher desire.



That may help understand and breathe some meaning into the sound of the Shofar that comes from HASHEM, but the Shofar is like a choral reading. It's not delineated who is communicating with whom. Like the Kol Chosson and Kol Kallah there is a back and forth as they each search for the other.

Although it's often covered and even smothered, to the point where it's barely audible, that "Kol Demama Daka", the small thin voice, still, the greatest desire within a human being is to come close to HASHEM, as Dovid HaMelech said, "Kirvas Elochim Li Tov" – "For me, good is being close to HASHEM!" The greatest pleasure a person can have in this universe is to be connected, to be attached to HASHEM. Therefore, the greatest pain that's possible is to be separate from HASHEM, and the Shofar is an amplification of that voice and it expresses a desire to break through all the barriers and make it all the way back.

So, the Shofar is an expression of ultimate desire, HASHEM's desire for a world and a people and our desire to be that people and complete His world. The Shofar is a Holy signal that we are thinking of HASHEM and HASHEM is thinking of each and every one of us at the very same time. That makes HASHEM real to us and us real to HASHEM. The Shofar may not employ

any words but it sure is saying a lot.



Q & A with Rabbi Zevy Golombeck Typed by R' Shalom Yedidya Klatzko

Q. Can I act on a higher level of bitachon than I am actually holding at, such as how much time to invest in learning, how much tzedaka to give, or must I first make sure that I am actually holding at that level?



A. Obviously, you shouldn't jump too high. However, Rav Don Segal Shlit"a said: When it comes to bitachon, a person may leap 'a little bit higher' than the level he is actually holding by. The mere fact that you are able to muster the courage to do the actions of a ba'al bitachon already indicates that you have reached a certain elevated level of bitachon.

Additionally, when a person acts with bitachon, this itself is a way one's bitachon is strengthened.

The truth of the matter is, without looking for extra-curriculum activities, throughout one's day, opportunities arise for one to work on bitachon.

Often, a person can be tempted to round corners in his mitzva performance for the sake of material gain. Being meticulous to do mitzvos b'shleimus, is a great way to exercise your bitachon muscles. For example:

- Not leaving shul before the end, even for 'important' reasons.
- Spending money for the honor of Shabbos, and trusting that Shabbos will pay you back.
- Shutting one's phone when sitting down to learn, trusting in Hashem that you are not going to lose out.
- Distancing one's self from forms of technology which the gedolim warned against, trusting a person can never lose out by doing the right thing.

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
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Hashem's Amazing World

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Illuminating Words of Chazal

"Everything about Hashem, His Torah and His world is supposed to bring out positive emotions and help us have a healthy relationship with Hashem." Ray Yehuda Mandel

Q: There are many pesukim and chazal describing the sweetness of torah. I'm already a middle aged person and I never felt that sweetness (Other than sometimes the intellectual enjoyment which I would have from other chachmas too, or the enjoyment of kavod of asking a good kasha). On the contrary, many times when I open a sefer I feel anxiety. Maybe I'm learning the wrong pshat... maybe I'll look foolish and stupid...

How can this be if Torah is supposed to be sweet?

A: There are a few points to understand to answer this question.

The first point is that the less Torah is sweet to you,



and the more it tastes like thorns, but you continue to learn anyway, Hashem considers it to be more chashuv than someone who has a geshmak in learning! If you're learning Torah and it's not sweet, and you're still learning, that shows your devotion, your dedication and your love. If you learn Torah without enjoying it, you'll get a thousand times more schar! Of course, if you do enjoy it, say Baruch Hashem learning Torah is so enjoyable! As R' Yehuda Mandel always says, everything is l'chatchila. Everything can be looked at in a positive way. Not only can everything be looked at in a positive way, but you always have to look for reasons why your situation is better than everybody else's. So Ben hei hei omer, lefum

tzara agra. In a certain aspect, one word of your learning Torah is worth the whole year of a Gadol's Torah! That's how chashuv one word of your learning is! Because how

much the Gadol enjoys Torah, and how much we enjoy it, has no shaychus – and still you're learning! Can you imagine? If you look around, you go to batei midrashim in every part of the world there are kollelim, there are yeshivos, there are batei midrashim, there are shuls, everyone, every type of person, every single person is learning! Do they all enjoy it? No. Guess what? The ones who don't enjoy it as much they get more sechar. That's the first point.

Now comes the second point. It's very important to note that many times the reason why people don't enjoy Torah is because they don't follow Chazal's teachings of how to enjoy Torah.

You know how to enjoy Torah? Chazal say, Mah shelibo chafetz. Makom shechafetz. Rabo shechafetz. You should learn what gives you geshmak, where you get geshmak, and with a Rebbe that brings you geshmak. You know, I saw myself personally that you know what gave me geshmak in Torah? I learned Chumash b'iyun. I learned Rashi, Kli Yakar, Chizkuni. And I made a siyum on sefer Bereishis with kaddish and the next year I made a siyum on sefer Shemos with kaddish and the next year I made on sefer Vayikra with kaddish and the next year I made on sefer Bamidbar with kaddish... That's what made me enjoy Torah. That was my libo chafetz.

A yungerman told me that he didn't enjoy learning, he didn't have a sipuk, so he went to his Rebbi and his Rebbi said, "Pick one sefer that you would enjoy and write a pirush on it." Like it says, kinei lecha chaver – ki-

nei is lashon kana, a pen. Take your pen as your chavrusa. And now this yungerman took different sefarim and he wrote on many, many volumes of sefarim and he's a big talmid chacham and now he's a big marbitz Torah! This all started off from no cheshek haTorah but with the right direction. Many people told me that the shiur they went to was too hard and they didn't enjoy it and now they got into an easier shiur, now they have a Rebbi that turned them on, and that's the Rabo chafetz.

It's very important to know, that we have to do our hishtadlus to enjoy learning. Do you know nowadays there are so many seforim out there, and different types of seforim, and some people like to learn Nach, some people like to learn Chumash, some people like to learn bekius. My nature is to learn bekius. When I met my Rebbi, R' Yehuda Mandel, he said yiddishkeit is about enjoying yourself. So I said, okay I enjoy Daf Yomi so I started Daf Yomi.

The Chofetz Chaim brings there are different derachim how to learn, there are different mehalchim, some people learn b'iyun, some people learn bikiyus, kol ha-Torah kulah, a little bit a day. So if you're looking over your shoulder and you have to be like everybody else, that could be the reason why Torah is not sweet, because you're not figuring out the Torah that you enjoy. There's so much Torah! Go to a seforim store, there's every type of miktzoa, every type of limud, and every type of mehalach. It's very important to find the right Rebbi.

Here comes point number three. Many people are embarrassed - they might say the wrong peshat. That's the whole yesod of Torah, that Torah is not about results. Anu ameilim v'hem ameilim, anu ameilim u'mekablim sechar v'hem ameilim v'ein mekablim sechar. Torah is about ameilus, not about the results. And that's why the sugyos in Shas, most of the gemara is all about hava minas. The Rambam just wrote the maskanos but the gemara it's all hava minas. To teach you that Torah is not about results.

Hashem doesn't care if it's wrong or right because that's not what we're here for. We're not here for results. If you're busy with wrong or right that means that you're busy with results. The whole yesod of yiddishkeit is that we're busy with wanting, trying, caring. And you can say a thousand bad sevoros and do you know in Shamayim you're more chashuv than the person that learns and right away comes up with the right sevara? Because you're toiling more. It's not about who has the right peshat, that's not what Hashem gives you sechar for. Anu ameilim u'mekablim sechar - we get sechar just for trying, just for wanting, just for caring. And therefore if you say a silly peshat, a foolish peshat, you gave a peshat that's wrong - who cares? That's not a problem, that's l'chatchila! That's how Torah is learned! Go through Shas, why is the gemara busy with this hava minei and that hava minei and this hava minei and that hava minei? Why are we busy and sitting on working on

hava minas all day all night long? To teach you that's how Torah is learned. What's important is that we're working to try to get peshat. We're not here for results. There's a teshuva from Reb Moshe Feinstein, and later on in another volume he came out a different way. That's not a problem. If you feel it's a problem, that's your problem.

Ameilus b'Torah is how you connect to Hashem. The Gaon says that the whole tachlis of Torah is to connect to Hashem. Torah is a heicha timtza to connect to Hashem. The Gaon says that the tachlis of Torah is just to bring you to emunah and bitachon. That's the tachlis of learning. So because it's just a heicha timtza to bring you to emunah and bitachon, that Torah connects you to Hashem, the way Torah connects you to Hashem is by working on the Torah, trying, that's what connects you to Hashem. Trying connects you to Hashem. It's not the end result, it's not the peshat that connects you to Hashem. It's the trying that connects you to Hashem.

So if you chazer over all these three points: That first of all, if you don't feel sweet that's gevaldik. I'm better off than anybody that does feel sweet! Second of all, we have to try to figure out if we're able to come to the



right mehalach of how to make it sweet. That's beautiful if you're able to do it. And the third point, everything is sweet! Even your wrong peshatim are sweet and even your bad sevaros are sweet, because sweetness is the ameilus, the working on it, which will connect you to Hashem.

So everything in yiddishkeit is I'chatchila, everything has to be geshmak. If you do understand the learning that's geshmak, if you don't understand that's geshmak. And if Torah is sweet that's geshmak, and if it's bitter that's geshmak. Everything has to be geshmak! Do everything happily, because everything is I'chatchila.




