In the palace of the king there are many chambers, and each one needs a different key. There is one key, one instrument, however, which can open all the doors - the shofar.

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We are about to enter 72 hours of connection, commitment and renewal. It's a three-day yom tov for Jews around the world. There will be thousands of words read and said. Hundreds of pages turned. Shofar blast after shofar blast...

The litmus test of this Rosh Hashana is not in the amount of words that we say, but in the meaning behind them...

This year, in particular, there is a unique opportunity that we have this Rosh Hashana.

Perhaps for the first time in our lifetimes, the insanity and crookedness of the world around us is so blatantly obvious.

The bubbles have burst, the illusions have faded, and we have witnessed a world of hatred that vehemently denies

Hashem, His Torah and right for His People to live.

But that's only a piece of the story. Simultaneously, we have seen and participated in the greatest reawakening of Klal Yisrael in generations. Through the pain and brokenness, we have met and discovered heroes of our people.

We have shared their tears and have been inspired by these giants of spirit.

We are entering 5785 with a sense of clarity that we have never known before. The difference between good and evil has been highlighted with stunning precision.

As we stand in Hashem's court room, He is asking each of us and all of us: How should we proceed?

Are you willing to take a stand? Are you ready to make a change in your own life?

Hashem does not make this decision. It's up to us to choose how our world continues from this point onwards.

The decisions we make in our hearts and minds are invisible to everyone outside of us and Hashem;
