## **BITACHON PAYBACK**



## Rabbi Moshe Radner related:

It was shortly before Yom Tov, and Mr. Goldstein,\* a lawyer, found himself in a difficult financial position. His business was not doing well, and he could barely hold out a few more months on his regular budget. He really could not afford Yom Tov expenses. On top of that, he was expecting a large family for company over Yom Tov. He couldn't bring himself to cancel his guests, and even his wife was not aware of his dire financial state.

He told his wife to spend whatever they normally would for Yom Tov, including food, clothing and accommodating the guests. He had no idea how he was going to pay for it without going into debt, but he had bitachon that for hotzo'os Yom Tov, Hashem would pay him back.


During this time, R' Goldstein was involved in litigation, on a case where his profits at best would be very minimal. The other side was aggressive and throughout the entire litigation only offered a nominal amount in settlement. They told him they were willing to go to trial rather than pay anything more than a nominal amount. Even if he would win a trial, his percentage of the proceeds would be minimal, and the defense could tie up

the verdict for years in appeals before he saw any money from it.

There was one last hearing before the case would go to trial. R' Goldstein arrived, and to his total shock, the defense did a complete "180" and wanted to settle the case at far above what the case was actually worth! His percentage was even more than his expenses for Yom Tov!

Mr. Goldstein was sure that the sudden offer of this settlement was only due to his bitachon that whatever he spent on Yom Tov was covered by Hashem. There was no other explanation! (Harav Eli Yelen)

I was learning with my chavrusa, Yechiel, in night kollel. I don't remember why, but I told him about a dream I had. He said, somewhat emotionally, "I never have real dreams. I only dream nonsense."

I could barely have imagined the answer to this question.

This happened time after time, until I stopped trying. The principal had borrowed the money, and I knew he would return the loan. It was a waste of time and energy to keep calling him.

The next day came, and the lawyer's secretary called. Along with reminding me of the meeting that was to be held the next day, she informed me that I was to bring along enough money to cover the sum of 7 percent of the deal.

That was a huge amount of money. How had I not anticipated that I would need it? My head started spinning with possibilities, names of friends and acquaintances past and present. Then I quickly recalled the principal who just transferred money to my account. I called the bank, but there was no dramatic announcement; the money was not in the account.







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ot only does our nose serve as an important centerpiece in the nice look that a human face has - our nose also gives us our unique individual look. Even though there are billions of people in the world and the basic build and shape of their bodies and faces are the same -Hashem created subtle differences in people's faces that give them their unique, personalized identity. The primary place that a person is distinctly recognized from is his nose. There is something very distinct about the nose in particular more than his other organs that can help you clearly and absolutely identify someone that you are familiar with. Now, there are definitely many other factors that also contribute to identification – for example – the height, the weight, the smile, the hair and eye color and the way they walk and present themselves. But the single organ that gives the clearest identification is the nose. It's for this reason that robbers and other criminals cover their noses - they don't want to be identified. You probably bumped into this phenomenon during the thick of Covid - when everyone was wearing masks that covered their noses. You couldn't recognize your neighbors and even you close friends. Likewise - electronic devices that work through facial recognition - do a very poor job when the nose is covered. Our nose gives us our distinct, unique look.

From this we can understand an additional reason as to why Hashem situated our nose in the center of our face. We discussed in the past how it's important for the nose and its ability to smell to be in the center of the face – opening directly on top of the mouth. This increases the pleasure that we receive from our food - before it goes inside our mouth we already begin to enjoy it. It also picks up the unpleasant odors of foods which are rotten and should not be eaten.

We can now add an additional reason: the place which is the most convenient and helpful in facial recognition is in the center of the face. It's the persons face that you see when the person faces you to talk to you, to listen to you or to see you. And it's the center which naturally grabs your attention – more than the sides. Let me give you an example to bring out this point.

Imagine what it would be like if Hashem would have created our noses on top of our heads - how would a short person see the nose of a tall person in order to recognize him? Or how would a tall person, who is seated, recognize someone who is standing his nose would not be visible.

Hashem, with His unlimited wisdom, created the nose in the most useful place for us.

Of course, not every person merits everything listed in the coming chapters. It goes without saying that one should try to pay more attention to the things he has and less attention to what he lacks.

# Chapter 7: The Good Beginning

In this chapter we will see that Hashem initiated world history by introducing Adam Harishon and Chava to a life full of enjoyments. We will also discuss many of the pleasures in our lives that are often overlooked.

# The First Lessons in Happiness

When Hashem first created Adam and Chava, He gave them a life that was truly amazing. But as good as it was, Hashem was not content. He wanted to make sure that they enjoyed their lives to the max!

Rav Miller explains that

Hashem didn't give Adam his wife right away. First, Hashem showed him all the animals. Adam saw that the animals all had mates and he understood that he needed a mate as well. Only then did Hashem give Chava to Adam to be his wife. Hashem had delayed giving Adam a wife so that Adam would truly

appreciate and enjoy the benefit that he was receiving.

(Perhaps for this very reason, we too must wait to get married. In this way, every person experiences life without a wife or husband, which makes us appreciate our spouse much more. How sad it is when we forget the experience of those early days of happiness, when we had found and married our spouse after all those years of waiting).

The Chizkuni (2:8) points out that Hashem created Adam and Chava outside Gan Eden. Only later did He bring them into the garden, so they would compare Gan Eden to the world outside and recognize what a wonderful gift they were being given.


We see from here that Hashem taught man right from the beginning these two principles:

- 1. It is Hashem's desire that people should intensely enjoy life, and this is a foundation of existence (since this wonderful life was Adam and Chava's introduction to the world).
- 2. To maximize enjoyment, a person must use his mind to think, observe, and contrast his situation with other situations that are not as good.

# A Commandment to Enjoy Life

Even though Hashem did everything possible to help Adam and Chava enjoy their lives, it wasn't enough. He didn't just allow them to enjoy life, He com-

manded them to do so, with a mitzvas asei!
On the pasuk that says, "יוצו הי הַאָּדָם וַיְצוּ הֹי, אַלְקִים עַל הָאָדָם לֵאמר מִכֹל עֵץ לֵאמר מִכֹל עֵץ —
And Hashem G-d command-



ed Adam saying, 'From every tree of the garden you shall surely eat...,' Rabbeinu Bechaye writes:

... Adam was commanded two mitzvos, one mitzvas asei and one mitzvas lo sa'asei. The mitzvas asei was "and you shall surely eat from every tree of the garden" and the mitzvas lo sa'asei was "but from the tree of knowledge of good and bad, you shall not eat from it."

(It is possible that this is the basis for the Gemara (Yerushalmi, Kiddushin, Perek 4, Halacha 12) which teaches that every person must eventually give an accounting for any food he saw but did not eat! The Gemara relates that Rabi Elazar was concerned for this halachah, so he would save up his small coins to buy new types of food at least once a year. - See Otzar Pela'os HaTorah, p. 87)

In any event, we see that Hashem did not just allow Adam and Chava to enjoy all the fruit trees of Gan Eden, He commanded them to do so! This teaches us that Hashem desired that Adam and Chava enjoy the world He made for them.

# Living With Appreciation R' Daniel Shasha

ust the thought of the evil Eisav marching with 400 soldiers, to confront Yaakov and his family, is extremely unsettling. We can't imagine how Yaakov must have felt. His brother explicitly expressed his desire to kill him and was menacingly advancing towards him with a powerful army. Yet due to Hashem's great kindness, Yaakov and his family were saved from this terrifying encounter, and no one was harmed.

After this miraculous salvation, Yaakov had so much gratitude to Hashem, and really wanted to express his appreciation in the optimum way. Chazal (Shabbos 33b) teach that he decided to something to benefit the public, as a way of expressing his heartfelt gratitude for this incredible miracle. Some say, he built market places, some say a bathhouse and some say he minted a coin. We see that he had such an outpouring of gratitude that it wasn't sufficient for him to thank Hashem verbally. Instead, he wanted to do a permanent action in which people would benefit from. We can learn from him, that a powerful way of expressing our gratitude to Hashem, is by doing something that many will benefit from. After all, everyone is Hashem's beloved children, what would give a father more pleasure than his children being benefited.

This practice is actually codified by the Mishnah Berurah (218:32). He writes that after we experience a miracle, we should give tzedakah to support Torah scholars and should daven that this will be in place of the korban todah. He writes further, that it is appropriate that one does something to benefit the public and each year, on the anniversary of the miracle, one should thank Hashem, recounting His kindnesses.

Another allusion to the importance of gratitude in our Parashah is from the verse, 'And You have said I would surely do good with you....' (32:13). Al derech remez, the Sefer Divrei Yisrael explains that we can read this verse 'when you will say things are good, then 'I will do good with you', then Hashem will reciprocate and you will be dealt with more kindness. Focusing on the good in each situation and stating how everything is for our best can really perform wonders for our situation. No matter how challeng-

ing things could be, our loving caring Father is always looking out for us and only wants what's best. When we thank Him and focus on the good, it could perform wonders for our situation. The following story is but one example of this.

After a long tiring day of work, Yaakov pushed himself to attend the Torah shiur he normally hears in the evening. He struggled to stay awake after such a busy day yet he tried his best to take in at least something of what the Rabbi was teaching. The Rabbi began to explain that when things are challenging yet we see the good, things will turn around. He explained that this is alluded to in the verse, 'and You have said I would surely do good with you...' We can read the verse 'when you will say things are good, then 'I will do good with you', then Hashem will reciprocate and you will be dealt with more kindness.

Yaakov really perked up when he heard these words. After all, he had three sons who were still bachelors and his family was finding it very challenging. They were not receiving suitable suggestions and this hard situation just seemed to be dragging on and on. After the shiur, he excitedly told his wife this teaching and they resolved that instead of focusing on this challenge, they would thank Hashem for all the blessings that they have received. They completely changed their perspective, and their life was that of gratitude. They focused on all the blessings they have received and were much happier people. Just a few months after they had adopted this attitude both of their sons were engaged! Yaakov went to approach the Rabbi telling him about their yeshuah and expressing their gratitude for revealing this teaching.

The Rabbi mentioned he forgot about this teaching and Yaakov's story helped him think how he could apply this to his own life. He was recently diagnosed with a hearing condition and his hearing was severely deteriorated. He decided to focus on all the blessings in his life, despite this difficult predicament. He spent the next week devoting countless hours expressing his tremendous gratitude to Hashem. At the end of the week he received a call from the hospital that one of the doctors thought that maybe there was one more thing they could try to help improve his hearing. The procedure was performed and sure enough his hearing greatly improved! Chai BeTodah p.34

The following is a message from R' Yossi Hecht, founder of Asher to the Yatzar:

Yet again, in Parshas Toldos we find Rivka, another one of the *Imahos* struggling with infertility.

The Gemara in Yevamos (64a) says it is because "Hashem desires the *tefillos* of tzaddikim." Moreover, it applies to all of us as well. When we find ourselves in a dire situation it is an opportunity to daven out our hearts to Hashem. A little over four years ago, I was sitting shiva for my beloved mother a"h. During that time, I felt perplexed. I asked her father, my esteemed grandfather, Rabbi Yeshaya Siff *shlita* what happened to all the tefillos for his precious daughter? Did we not daven enough? Scores of people had been praying that she should get better from her severe illness.

Without batting an eyelash, my grandfather with his iron-clad *Emunah* gave me the following answer, that blew me away. "If we take a look at Shemoneh Esreh it does not say that Hashem is 'mekabel tefilla,' that He accepts tefilla, rather it says shomeiya tefillah – **Hashem hears our** tefillos!"

Chazal in their infinite wisdom chose each word extremely carefully. Thus, it is true that Hashem listens to every single tefilla and no tefilla goes unheard. However, "for whatever reason, my daughter had to pass on, but that does not mean for a second Hashem did not listen. He did listen, but the answer was no." Hashem knows exactly what He is doing and we must accept that He is the *Manhig Ha'olam*.

This answer struck me like lightning and is a quote that I share and hold on to perpetually. May we have the wherewithal to learn from my Zaidy's rock-solid Emunah, that whatever happens is for the best. In that *zechus*, may Hashem not only hear our tefillos, but also accept them.

I would like to add to the above. Tefillah is not just about being answered - it is about our connection to Hashem, and realizing that without Him, we could not exist or manage. Each time we daven we gain tremendous awareness of Hashem, and that is priceless.

But it is also important to know that every tefillah does something, whether or not we see the results. Here is one example I saw in a dvar torah, quoting a nurse in an Intensive Care Unit. She writes that when people daven for a sick person, they want a total cure, and if the person is *niftar* they are disappointed, and feel that their *tefillos* were not answered. But they need to realize there is so much more to daven for with regard to a seriously ill individual than his or her complete recovery. Here are some of the things she suggested people daven for: that the sick person not suffer pain, anxiety, depression, or loneliness; that the sick person be treated gently and with dignity by the medical staff; that the veins of the sick person be easy to find for intravenous injections; that the family have the strength to hold up under



the strain; that the correct decisions, medical and ethical, be taken by the family, patient, doctor, and Rav. She concludes: "If you daven for all the above for a sick person, you will find that many of your tefillos will be answered."

Of course, Hashem is *Kol Yachol* and can completely cure any person in any situation, and that is the main thing we should daven for. But there is a very big benefit if we also daven for all these details. First, it will help us realize how much the sick person needs and feel their pain. Second, our *tefillos* will take on a new light, as we realize how much power they have, and how precious they are to Hashem.

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# **Chizuk Corner**

We have discussed in the past few weeks the era of Moshiach. We spoke about how when Moshiach comes there will be much love in the world for everyone and especially for our Father, our King.

So while we are grabbing the diamonds that galus has to offer, I would like to give more insight into the days of Moshiach to give us greater excitement and anticipation for that special time.

Before we begin, we will give a disclaimer. We don't know exactly what Moshiach is going to be like and we don't need to know everything, but one thing is for certain. As Reb Yitzchok Sorotzkin once elaborated in a speech, that the chessed and rachamim that's going to spill out from Hashem is beyond our wildest imagination. It's going to be so amazing and gevaldig.

When one looks around the world and especially at their own personal life one can get a glimpse of the chessed Hashem as we say three times a day, "hatov ki lo chili rachamecha v'Hamiracheim ki lo samu chasadecha".

However, as much as we see now, it pales in comparison to what Hashem will do for Klal Yisrael when Moshiach comes.

I saw a nice Pshat in a kuntres by R' Pinchas Doppelt a novel explanation on the famous words of Hallel.

We say in the Hallel "הללו את ה' כל גוים- שבחוהו." The gentiles will praise Hashem for all the chessed that he is doing for us when Moshiach comes.

The Meforshim ask: why will the nations of the world praise Hashem because of all the chessed that Hashem is doing for us?

So there are different approaches to answer this question, but he explains as follows.

Someone once exclaimed, "If non-Jews would know about all the organizations, gemachs, hotlines, the Spring Hill Times and all the other wonderful chessed that goes on in the Jewish nation they would immediately convert.

I actually heard of a story where a non-religious doctor who came to Eretz Yisroel on a tour. Somehow during the tour the doctor was enlightened to all the different gemachim and organizations that were available.

The doctor was so impressed and inspired from this that he decided to do something huge. He decided to give an extremely expensive surgery for a Jewish child that he was supposed to operate on the following month, who lived in Eretz Yisroel, and he would do it free of charge.

Furthermore, although it was an exclusive type of surgery that the surgeons in Israel did not

know, he graciously offered his services that the Israeli doctors could come and learn how to do this special unique surgery.

Getting back to the question says Reb Pinchas that when Moshiach comes, the world is going to demand to know what is so special about the Jews that

they get special treatment. Why do they deserve so much Chessed?

Perhaps we can say that at that time Hashem will give the rest of the world a glimpse into the greatness of Klal Yisroel.

- 1. He will show them Hatzalah, Chaveirim, Rccs, Chai lifeline, Echo, Bonei Olam, Bikkur cholim and all the other wonderful amazing organizations (that we cannot enumerate obviously as there is no room in this magazine).
- 2. Then Hashem will show them the wine gemach, the Schnapps gemach, the chair gemach, the table gemach, the A/C gemach, the crib Gemach, the baby accessory gemach and the hat brush gemach and the thousands of other gemachim.

## **HAPPILY OUTBID**



It was Shemini Atzeres, 5518, and the beis midrash in Michelshtat was filled to capacity. After Minchah, they would sell the kibbudim of the coming day, and no one wanted to miss it. As Minchah concluded, Chaim Speisner, Michelshtat's philanthropist, stepped up to the bimah and began the auctions.

Chaim opened the bids at a low price but in no time the prices were high. Matisyahu, an impoverished fellow, was determined to buy something, but as the auction went on, he was finding this rather challenging. Every bid he posed was outbid very quickly.

They were now bidding the final auction when Matisyahu turned to his neighbor, Baruch, and asked if he'd want to buy the kibbud together — the zechus of rolling the Sefer Torah. This zechus wasn't limited to Simchas Torah, rather anytime throughout the year that the Sefer Torah had to be rolled the winner would have that honor. Baruch agreed to put in five zehuvim, and if Matisyahu added five, they'd have a bid of ten — a sizeable bid, and they would share the honor.

When Matisyahu put in the bid for five, Chaim was sure that Matisyahu couldn't afford it, so he put in a bid to outbid him. Matisyahu, though, kept going, and Chaim kept outbidding. This went on for a while, and Chaim started to suspect that Matisyahu was increasing just to get him to increase - with no intention of buying it. Chaim's anger started to see the until, out of frustration, Chaim announced his bid as "one zehuv more than Matisvahu's possessions!" Hearing this everyone's jaw dropped. That ended the bidding, but it got the town talking.

#### RIGHTFULLY OUTDONE

People were enraged at Chaim's brazenness and the humiliation caused to Matisyahu. Everybody besides Matisyahu was bothered. He went on with his simchas Yom Tov as though nothing happened.

He thought he'd escape the murmurs at his seudah, but nobody was able to talk about anything else! His wife and his guest were distraught, Matisyahu, though, assured them that he bears no grudge. "Every person is entitled to buy a kibbud," he announced. "It wasn't reserved only for me. And beside for that, I wasn't intending for my own glory; I was intending for Hashem's. By Chaim buying it, it'll bring in more money for the shul and thus allow it to grow and expand; that interests me, and nothing else." He then turned to his prestigious guest and asked, "Am I correct?"

"I believe that you're coming out winning," the guest ensured Matisyahu. "On the one hand, you're getting s'char as if you'd bought it; and, you're also giving in, which itself is rewarding. Chazal teach us: 'Chishev laasos mitzvah' — someone who sought to do a mitzvah, 'v'neenas' — and was unsuccessful despite his efforts – 'maaleh ha'Kasuv ke'ilu asou' — the Torah considers it as though he performed it. So, in Shamayim, it's as if you'd bought the kibbud and fulfilled the mitzva. And on top of that, you gave in, which in and of itself is enormous."

After Yom Tov, when it was time for the guest to leave, he thanked Matisyahu and asking him what he can offer in return. Matisyahu requested a bracha for children (over the years Matisyahu's wife had six miscarriages). The guest ensured him a child which would leave him lasting generations.

"And what's your name?" asked Matisyahu. "When the yeshua comes, I'd like to express my hakaros hatov to you."

"My name is Eliyahu."

"Please hold a moment as I get something for your trip," Matisyahu requested. But by the time Matisyahu returned, the guest disappeared. There was no point in looking.

And as the tzaddik decreed, within the year, Matisyahu and his wife were holding their first newborn. They named their dear child Yitzchok Dov, and nicknamed him: Zeckel Leib. At a young age, he was known as a genius, using all his kochos for Continued on next page

id you know, zugt Reb Yehuda Mandel,"Whenever someone compliments me, I say "shechinah medaberes mitoich groinoi," the shechinah is talking. When someone gives me criticism, I say that's just a nisayon from Hashem to see if I'm going to believe it or

not."

When someone gives you a compliment you should believe it, because it motivates a person, and it helps a person grow and shteig. Reb Avigdor Miller said you should even thank Hashem that someone gave you kavod. Hashem sends it to give you kavod and be mechazek you to grow. You should appreciate it! When someone gives you criticism, don't take it to heart because it's just a nisayon from Hashem. If you take it to heart it will crush a person and make them have low self-esteem. It will bring out the worst in them and they will walk around feeling like two cents.



When you walk around feeling like two cents then you become like two cents. Rather say it's a nisayon, and don't take it personally, and don't get insulted from that person. Just view it that it's the animal part of the person that's talking and when you realize it's the animal part and not the Neshama and that of course Hashem doesn't want you to feel like two cents, then you won't get insulted.



The following pesukim from Dovid Hamelech are super powerful in helping you grow in Emunah and bitachon.

In Tehillim, Dovid Hamelech says "- שויתי ד' – לנגדי – תמיד", I set Hashem before me always, כי – מימיני – בל – אמוט, he is by my right

hand, I will not fall. Dovid Hamelech continues and says that therefore he has the following feelings, לכן – שמח – לבי – ויגל - כבודי – אף – בשרי – ישכון – לבטח, my heart is happy and my spirit is elated etc.


These pesukim are an amazing exercise to feel more connected to Hashem and this exercise is always available whenever you need it. Whatever situation you are in, place Hashem right in front of you and tell yourself, "Hashem loves me. He is holding my hand and He is going to take care of me."

Whenever you want to feel more settled and connected to Hashem, tell yourself – 'ב שויתי – ד' . When you do this, you will have the end of the passuk, you'll feel so happy and joyful and you'll feel secure and confident.

Part V

They so desperately want to be considered nice and accepted, and they are constantly seeking approval from "nobodies" (every human is a nobody compared to הקב"ה). They confuse basic respect with unwarranted fear and even awe since the world is loaded with praises about humans which can sometimes be more a חסרון.

Part VI

Beware of שפלות which causes all kinds of צרות like self-hating Jews and ענוה פסולה and depression and anxieties. Relax! And appreciate your own greatness - especially where are you superior to others! There are people who every time they meet others they exercise feelings of inferiority.

Part VII

Those who work on their מדות make it their business to shteig with every encounter with those who scare them and they play down the unhealthy משיבות and build themselves up. With time and regular practice they become new people בס"ד.

- The following are some of the Baal Shem Tov's main teachings:

1. He was opposed to fasting and self-affliction. Rather, you should serve Hashem in joy. When you're sad, then it's as if Hashem is sad too. Even if you did an aveirah, you shouldn't be too unhappy. Just do proper teshuvah, and then be happy again.

2. Everything has good in it. Even evil has good in it. A tzaddik can recognize the good inside evil and draw it out. The Baal Shem Tov was understanding of backsliding Jews. He tried to find the good in them.

3. He put a strong emphasis on tefillah. This is something even an am haaretz can do. The Baal Shem Tov said: "All that I have accomplished, I have accomplished through prayer, not study." Chasidim would prepare a lot before tefillah. This became more important than the zmanei hatefillah. Also, it became important to daven with a tzaddik, who could help elevate your prayer.

4. The Baal Shem Tov emphasized the importance of spiritually purifying oneself by going to the mikvah every day.

5. A Jew should attempt to feel dveikus in Hashem in every little action that he does. Even the simplest deeds, if done with sincerity, can have tremendous significance.

6. You should daven and do mitzvos with joy. It should be a fiery ecstasy (hislahavus).

7. A tzaddik serves as a conduit to bring Hashem's closeness to those who could not otherwise achieve it.

8. He emphasized love: love of Hashem, love of all Jews, and love of Eretz Yisroel.

9. Chasidus reawakened Jewish longing for moshiach. Before then, it wasn't spoken about so much because of what happened with Shabsai Tzvi (who was a false messiah, who disappointed many people).

Din and Rachamin is all out of love, out of one place, out of complete love for us. Whatever happens is love. I learned from Rabbi Golumbeck when something happens that we don't see the good, it is great for our Neshoma and if it didn't happen exactly how it already happened, it would be poison.

# Ahava Rabba! Pumping people up

Share how lucky we are that we have the Mitzvos. Show with tremendous love and excitement to the young ones, starting at age zero, how Hashem is so full of love and Chessed and we all are so lucky to do Hashem's Mitzvos. We literally get more than millions of dollars to do easy Mitzvos.

I was shaking Lulav and Esrog on the first days of Sukkos and I turned to my five and three-year-old nieces and I said to them: Look how much Hashem loves us. We do a little shake and Hashem rewards us with more than a million dollars. Look how easy it is to get rewarded because Hashem wants to give and give and give. I told them look: I shake the Lulav and boom I get a million dollars; I shake it again and boom I get a million dollars. Hashem makes things easy for us. My nieces were pumped.

Just imagine that someone would come over to you and say, "Shake this plant for a quick second and then I will wire a million dollars to your account." You would be smiling from ear to ear. That is how I feel with Hashem's love to us. Just say this Brocha and you get more than a million dollars. Say this Benching and you get more than a million dollars. Remember the six mitzvas Temidios and you get more than a million dollars.

Here is a song that helps me remember the 6 Mitzvos Temidios: Feel free to put in a place you will always see like the refrigerator:

Hashem exists - Hashem is here (1)
I do not believe in other G-ds (2)
Hashem is one and only one (3)
And I love you Hashem (4)
I am in fear (Awe) of you, Hashem (5)
Every single day,

I will not follow my eyes and heart (6) And I'll follow the Torah way.

Hashem loves us and wants us to get reward!

We also talk about how we want to connect things that are going on to how Hashem loves us and watches us. A mother called me up and said that her child couldn't fall asleep at night and was scared to go to sleep. I shared with her a few grounding ideas to do before bedtime and shared with her how to discuss his fears. Then I shared, when she puts her child to sleep, she should stay in the room with him and sing to him about how much Hashem loves him, watches him, and protects him. She should sing a song that outlines what Heiny Lo Yanum means in English: Heinay Heinay Lo Yunum Vlo Yishun Shomer Yisroel. Henay Lo yoanum Vlo Yishun Shomer Yisroel- Hashem is watching over you– He is protecting you, and loving you, Hashem is always at your side by night and day... Then go through family member's names (This is expansionthinking about who else is Hashem watching). Hashem is watching over Moishy by night and day... Hashem is watching over Gitty by night and day... The child started to have no problem with going to sleep thank you Hashem!

I just love to try to give people support and chizuk. As an aside: Doing for others makes us feel so good ourselves and fills our own emotional bank account!

Idea: It's so easy to share love with other people.

- Sending your friend 60 seconds of inspiration in the morning can change her whole day. Some mornings I will record a 60 second clip with a quick story of how I saw Hashem's loving kindness and I'll send it to a few friends!
- Share with joy how excited you are to do Mitzvos.

- Share with joy how much Hashem loves us and is protecting us.
- Tell people how you enjoy spending time with them for example "when I Schmooze with you, I feel so amazing inside". Or "playing with you is the best part of my day!"

Ahava Rabba – there is a great love that Hashem shows us every day! I talk about it all the time to help myself remember it and the more I talk about it the more I feel it!

Hashem is Mitzadei Gaver. Hashem plans the steps of man. I had an amazing story happen today.



# **PARSHA SPARKS**

In Parshas Vayishlach, the angel turns to Yaakov Avinu and tells him, "'Ki sarisa vatuchal,' (because you fought and prevailed), your name shall also be Yisroel, which comes from 'sarisa,' – you struggled."

Harav HaGaon R' Shlomo Kluger, zt"l, asks a question. Why is Yaakov's new name Yisroel, reflecting his struggle with the angel? Wouldn't it be more appropriate to name Yaakov 'vatuchal' which means that he actually won the battle? Shouldn't we be focusing on the end result?

He answers that the Possuk is coming to teach us two important lessons in Bitachon.

- 1. Hashem put us into this world for the purpose of trying, for putting in our efforts. Yaakov's greatness was in the battle, not the victory. Our success, as well, lies in the struggle and not in our results, outcomes and accomplishments which are HaKadosh Baruch Hu's department.
- 2. The Torah is coming to teach us that the reason Yaakov was able to prevail, Vatuchal, is because he knew his mission was only to try. The actual result of his effort was almost irrelevant because results and outcomes are up to Hashem. It was because of this mindset that he was successful.

The Mesilas Yesharim says that the Yetzer Harah is always making us busy so we do not have any time to think about Hashem. Baruch Hashem, I am the mother of a large family. I am busy round the clock taking care of each of my children's needs, and I do not have a second to think. What can I do?



Ayou do not have to stand still in order to think. You can be hustling and bustling while still including HaKadosh Baruch Hu in your thoughts and actions. Remember, you need Hashem for everything you're trying to do. When you dress your children, say, "Please, HaKadosh Baruch Hu, I need Your help to dress them." When you send them off to school, say, "HaKadosh Baruch Hu, please help my children arrive safely and be successful in school." When you're preparing meals, say, "Hashem, please help my children enjoy breakfast, lunch and supper."

By doing this, you are bringing Hashem into your life, and living with Him in the most tangible way!

# Difficulty in Achieving Bitachon

I've always put a lot of effort into working on Emunah, Bitachon and Menuchas Hanefesh, but I know I'm very far from attaining my goal. I find myself getting very disheartened.





YUD IS FOR YESHURUN (Parshas Vayishlach)

Yaakov Avinu's name starts with the letter Yud, as in Yid and Yirah. Yud is like the spark of G-d in every Yiddishe Neshama.

The second letter in our third father's name is Ayin for sight.

Yaakov was an Emesdig Ish Tam who could clearly see wrong from right.

An os Ayin, his brother Aisav also claimed.

While Yaakov fixed his eyes on good; for all that was ra, Aisav was famed.

Yaakov's third letter, Kuf, must reach down where Erliche Yidden would rather not go,

but Yaakov Ávinu taught us to live in galus while focusing on Ayn Od Milvado.

Yaakov's last letter Bais is large enough to hold all that is Tov. There is a home for all Yidden in the House of Yaakov.

It was pitch black outside when Yaakov crossed the Yabbok stream. As he stood at this threshold, it must also have felt dark bifnim.

The River Yabbok shares the letters of Yaakov's name; missing the Ayin, the eves.

As the long, daunting night loomed before Yaakov, his doubts began to rise.

Even more than his fathers, Yaakov

## The Bitachon Perspective

Q & A with Rabbi Zevy Golombeck By R' Shalom Yedidya Klatzko

Q. I put in a lot of effort in working on my bitachon and menuchas hanefesh, but I feel that I'm still very far from living with true emunah and bitachon. This makes me feel very disheartened.

A. The reason you're tzubrochen is because you think that your job is to achieve results.

Understand; Hashem does not demand results. He just wants you to try. Every neshama has its unique mission in the world. There are some people who fulfill their tikkun haneshama by having to work hard without seeing the fruits of their labor. It gives Hakadosh Baruch Hu a tremendous nachas ruach when a yid still tries his best despite the fact that doesn't have the satisfaction of seeing results.

Certainly, you should believe that 'ישועת ה', and in a moment, Hashem could inject into your heart the feeling of kirvas Hashem. But in your current situation, your efforts are your accomplishments.

And your frustration of not being able to achieve, serves as a kappara for aveiros.

Q. I was recently diagnosed with yeneh machlah, lo aleichem. A friend of mine heard about it and tried giving me chizuk. He told me, 'If you have absolute bitachon, you will have a complete recovery'.

However, instead of becoming relaxed, his words caused me to become full of anxiety. Now, I feel that my fate is in my hands. If I don't recover, I am to blame, because that indicates that I did not have enough bitachon.

A. One of the concepts behind bitachon is that Hashem wants us to live with menuchas hanefesh.

If you find that the concept your friend told you is causing you stress, that is not the concept you should be living with.

Instead, you should tell yourself a chizuk that will give you more menuchas hanefesh.

You may choose to tell yourself the words of Dovid Hamelech: טוב ה' לכל, ורחמיו- על כל Hakadosh Baruch Hu is the epitome of goodness. He's running a perfect world, and everything that happens is coming from Hashem's love and rachmanus.

Whenever something happens to us, it's because Hakadosh Baruch Hu wanted it to happen, and it's exactly what we need for our tikkun haneshama.

Internalizing that everything that happens is orchestrated by our loving Father can enable you to achieve true menuchas hanefesh and help you build a healthy relationship with Hashem.

## Illuminating Words of Chazal

"Everything about Hashem, His Torah and His world is supposed to bring out positive emotions and help us have a healthy relationship with Hashem." Rav Yehuda Mandel

Chazal say that the biggest mitzvah is Talmid Torah (utalmid Torah kneged kulam). The seforim tell us that bittul Torah is also kneged kulam. How am I supposed to live bmenuchas nefesh knowing that if I shmuz for one extra second, space out a little or enjoy myself too much, I'll get a terrible aveira and gehenim?

The first point, as my Rebbi gave over to me as a mesorah from his Rebbeim, is the yesod that the point of every Chazal is only to motivate you to become a bigger, better, happier, healthier person. To bring you more menuchas hanefesh and simchas hachaim. to give you a healthier connection to Hashem. So if learning a chazal does that, then it's beautiful. But if you're learning a particular Chazal and it's doing the opposite, then obviously that Chazal (as you understand it) is not for you.

The point of this world is to have a healthier connection to Hashem and to view Hashem as a loving, caring Father. If you start misinterpreting Chazal and view Hashem as a policeman with a stick in His hand and if you do one thing wrong He's out to get you, if that's your picture of Hashem, then that Chazal is not for you, because that's the opposite of avodas Hashem. The opposite of having a relationship with Hashem is to be scared of Him and be frightened and be nervous and anxious. It's not going to want to make you get closer to Hashem, it's going to make you want to get further away from Hashem. Chazal only want you to become closer to Hashem, not further away from Hashem.

Bottom line is that **the point of every Chazal is only to motivate you** and only that you should walk away with positive feelings and positive emotions. If it's doing that and it's teaching you how exciting Torah is and how important it is, and you walk away with positive feelings, that's amazing. But if you're walking away anxious, a bundle of nerves, and scared and worried, then obviously that Chazal is not for you. The yesod and point of yiddishkeit is only to motivate you to have a healthier connection to Hashem and to view Him as your loving, caring Father, not someone who's scary and frightening and out to get you.

The second point is you have the right ratzon and the right lev. When you have the right ratzon and you have the right lev, that itself gives you the highest level of avodas Hashem. Because when you want to learn and you want to do the right thing, Hashem says: that's what I consider avodas Hashem and I'll give you machshava k'maisa. You want to learn? Boom, it's as if you did it. You don't want to waste your time? Boom, it's as if you didn't waste your time.

That's why R' Avigdor Miller says that the Chovos Halevavos name his sefer Chovos Halevavos, the chov of your lev, because the ikar of yiddishkeit is your lev. Hashem looks into your lev. And that's why the arba minim the esrog is k'neged the tzaddik. And it says the esrog is k'neged the lev. Why is the esrog k'neged the lev and the tzaddik? To teach you that Hashem looks and dans you where your lev is. It's where your ratzon, where you're caring, where you're trying. And an esrog, as my Rebbi points out in his kuntres Bitachon Weekly, has a lot of bumps. Even if your actions you fall, but you get back up, you fall you get back up, you fall you get back up, that's not an issue, that's not a problem. The ikar is your lev. That's why an esrog is bumpy and it also resembles the lev. Your actions can be up and down, but your ratzon, you have a good ratzon.

That's point number two, that you should pat yourself on the back and say: okay, after I saw this Chazal I have a good ratzon, I want to learn, and I see how important it is to learn and I don't want to waste time. Boom, now Hashem considers as if you were mekayem that Chazal.

Point number three is zagt HaRav HaGaon HaGadol R' Avigdor Miller zt"l, what's the whole yesod of Torah? Why did Hashem make the Torah? **The Gra in his pirush on Mishlei says that the point of Torah** 

is to be mechazek and bring you to more emunah and more bitachon. So if that's the point of Torah, so it comes out that the greatest form of Torah is the Torah of emunah and bitachon. Therefore, zagt R' Avigdor Miller, what are you worried about? You're going to enjoy life, you want to relax, you want to rest up, you want to enjoy this world. Well, if you enjoy the world in the right way of feeling loved by Hashem, feeling cared for, watched and protected, that's part of the Torah of emunah and bitachon.

R' Avigdor Miller was very into taking exercise, eating properly, keeping yourself and your body healthy. Zagt R' Avigdor Miller, if you take a walk and you walk around and look at the beautiful flowers, all different colors, and you say: wow, Hashem, all different colors it makes the world colorful so I should feel loved – that's called Torah and that's called Toras emunah and not only do you get talmud Torah k'neged kulam, but that's more chashuv than all the other learning. Do you know why? Because the whole point of Torah is to bring to emunah, the whole point of Torah is to bring to bitachon, the whole point of Torah is to make you feel loved, cared for, watched and protected. So if you enjoy this world in the right fashion, in the correct way, you can turn it into Torah and turn it into the best Torah because all Torah is to bring to emunah and bitachon, all Torah is to make you feel loved, cared for, watched and protected.

This is a very important point. Of course, enjoy this world and enjoying this world will gufah make it that it will be considered talmud Torah and you'll even get sechar more than talmud Torah, because that's the highest level of talmud Torah – Toras emunah and bitachon.

Another important point to note, that the Chofetz Chaim once wasn't able to learn a whole year because he overworked himself, he overworked his body and the doctor said that he can't learn for a whole year. And the Chofetz Chaim for a whole year couldn't learn. Couldn't learn iyun, couldn't learn gemara. The Chofetz Chaim listened to what the doctor said. And not only did he grow from this, because from then on he took care of his body – he ate properly, he slept properly – but in his yeshiva he made sure to turn off the light at night and tell the bochurim that they have to go to sleep. Because he said that relaxing your body, that's also what you need to learn. That's not called bitul Torah, that's called learning. It's called bitulah k'dei l'kiyuma. And look what the Chofetz Chaim produced! He produced the Mishna Berura, nowadays everyone's repeating over the Chofetz Chaim's Torah. Why? Because he knew the healthy balance. He knew that you have to learn, but you also have to take care of your body. You have to rest properly, eat properly.

So you see that everything can be done in a healthy balance. You can enjoy this world, feel loved, and realize that you're enjoying this world gufah to relax and to help you learn. Not to overwork your body, not to learn every second, to have a burden.

They asked R' Chaim Kanievsky, how come you don't snap from learning too much? You learn every second. R' Chaim Kanievsky said, I can't snap from learning because Torah is delicious! If a person is learning every second it's an ol, it's a burden, it's a pressure, it's a lachatz, he's doing it in an unhealthy way. That's not avodas Hashem, that's called avodas yetzer hara. That can cause burnout, that can cause him to lose his cheshek in Torah. And therefore, don't get fooled by the yetzer hara that he could make you think that you're someone who you're not. You can learn about all these gedolim in books, you can learn how all these gedolim learned every second, you have to know the truth, you have to know reality, you're not R' Chaim Kanievsky, you're not R' Elyashiv. Your body can **only handle who** *you* **are.** Therefore, a person has to realize that learning has to be geshmak, learning has to be fun, be freilich, it has to be b'simcha, it has to be that it's not taking an emotional toll on your health - emotionally, mentally, physically. That's also another very important point to note.

And then, one more point to note that the Rosh Yeshiva of Yeshiva HaKedosha Beis Medrash Govoha Rav Malkiel Kotler shlita told me that he met a yid who went to a shmuz from R' Chatzkel, the mashgiach of Ponevezh. And R' Chatzkel was very into saying over all these Chazalin that sound so scary and frightening. He was very into yirah and din, onesh and gehenim. And for R' Chatzkel he loved yirah, din, onesh and gehenim, because for him it motivated him and it made him feel that Hashem's his loving, caring Father Who wants his neshama to be clean. He viewed din, yirah, onesh and gehenim as love, a kiss and a hug, because he viewed it as soap and shampoo. He viewed it as a cleaning process. It's like taking a shower. R' Chatzel got motivated by these things. But this yid who went to the shmuz got very pale and he became anxious. It turned him off. Continued on page 58

And then, Rav Yoel's Rebbetzin screamed, "LOOK! LOOK!" Rav Yoel turned around, and saw all of his children hugging each other! Rav Yoel grabbed his phone, and took a picture. After the trip, he printed this picture as a large poster and hung it in the playroom to show his family that true Shalom and real harmony is not just a dream, but a true reality!

As we say in our Sefer Hashem Loves You (available by pressing 9 on the Hashem Loves You Hotline), 'If you believe in Machlokes, then believe

### HASHEM WATCHES OVER EVERY YID

Rabbi Lieberman's\* mother a"h was nifteres when he was a child, and his father's second wife raised him devotedly from the time he was twelve years old.

He was chozer b'teshuva and he kept up the connection with his father and his father's wife. From time to time he would come to visit them in the kibbutz. He would tell them words of chizuk and speak words of emunah. He especially emphasized how Hakadosh Baruch Hu sees everyone and is mashgiach over each and every person. He told stories of hashgachah pratis and said, "If we only delve into things, each person would see the hashgachah pratis."

His words had an influence, and from then on, every time he came, his father's wife had a few things that she had collected to tell him, stories of hashgachah pratis that had happened to her.

Rabbi Lieberman's father passed away a few years ago, and since then his father's wife ("Ima") lived alone.

His sister also lived on the kibbutz, and on Motzaei Shabbos she told him that the kibbutz was attacked. "Come," she told him, "come and give us chizuk."

Rabbi Lieberman was not able to speak to "Ima" on Sunday. She was not up to talking about anything. The next day, Monday, they met, and then she told him what had happened to her:

"I heard the sirens, and a moment later the booms. A sense of fear grabbed hold of me and my entire body grew hard as a rock. I couldn't move! I tried moving lips, and saw that I was able to do that, so what did I say? I said vidui, and I asked Hashem to forgive me and to watch over me.

I remembered all your good words, and I said, 'Ribbono shel Olam, You love me. You are with me. You're watching over me. I have nothing to fear.' I said this again and again, until I felt that my body softening and I was able to move.

I got up and took something to eat, and the whole time I was hearing the sounds of war. I strengthened myself that Hashem is with me, Hashem is watching over me. He is mashgiach on me. I am not alone.

No human being was with me, but I was not alone. It was clear to me that the Creator of the world was not leaving me and that nothing would happen to me. This calmed me down.

In the end, the terrorists did not reach my home. They didn't even enter our row of houses. Tell me, is this not the Borei Olam, who watched over me within the inferno?" [Kav Hashgacha Pratis]

#### A YID RETURNS TO HASHEM

Rabbi Weingarten\* was walking near Tel Hashomer hospital. A Yid came out and saw him with his beard and peyos. He seemed to be looking for someone religious.

"My son is injured," he said. "He is hospitalized here, and he has something to say that will be of interest to you."

Rabbi Weingarten went in to the injured man. He was in pain and he was emotional. It was obvious that he had endured a far-from-simple experience.

"I was called to a specific place in the South," he said. "A difficult battle was raging there, and they called me to come in and help. I came to the place, close to one of the settlements. There is a memorial monument there on which is written, "It's not the tanks that will win, but only Hashem." There were four of us up against 12 terrorists. I fought under fire from close range.

Suddenly, there was a bullet in my back. It had hit a main artery, and I lost tons of blood. I recalled that in my left pocket I had a tourniquet, but because the injury was on the left side, I couldn't reach that pocket. I lay on the ground and quietly rolled in the direction of the monument, so that no terrorist would notice me. Let them think they had finished me off...

"The monument was round, and I was able to find shelter underneath it. When I got there, I lost consciousness.

During those moments I was not in this world at all. Blue, pure skies spread over me.

I felt enveloped in a profound love, the likes of which I had never felt in all my life.

'I am not so perfect!' I thought. 'Why am I so beloved? What have I done, that this is how I am being embraced?'"

As he related this, tears flowed from his eyes, and he continued:

"I felt myself disconnecting from this world, and I understood that I was dying.

'I have a family,' I said, 'I need to go back.'

I sensed that someone was listening to me.

"You can go back,' they told me, and I then regained consciousness on the hard concrete under the round monument.

New strength and vitality rushed through me, and I managed to pull out the tourniquet and stop the bleeding. I felt very thirsty, and in order to survive, I needed to imagine myself taking a canteen and drinking lots of water. It was clear to me that I would be saved, since I had received permission to come back.

"I lay in total silence along with some friends who were also hurt, so that the terrorists would not notice us, and we anticipated yeshuas Hashem.

"After eight hours of lying there with the tourniquet, a helicopter landed 300 meters away from us. How could an injured person like me traverse this distance? I have no idea, but it's a fact. I got up and ran toward the helicopter, and there was...water!!

"My life was saved. Everyone who was in that structure with me survived.

"I am pained at how I led my life until now. I did not believe in Hashem enough, but today, I believe in Him completely. There is a Hashem! Yesh Elokim! He causes people to die and revives them, He watches over me in the most personal and exacting way.

Do you see me now? Today, I am a believing Jew." [Kav Hashgacha Pratis]

R' Simon's\* son Yair was thrown out of Yeshiva and spent his days at home. R' Simon thought that was the worst that could happen, but it soon became clear that the friends Yair had found dragged him down even further.

#### LAKEWOOD BOY MISSES HIS BUS







#### **Patient**

There are people that I know who are machmirim in many mitzvos. I don't like being machmir, it makes a pressure in my life and I feel like something is wrong with me.

`1. In truth you are being machmir to enjoy serving Hashem and not to make it into a pressure which comes from the Yetzer Hara. That's wonderful.

In addition, when you look into your actions you will see that in plenty of areas you **are** being machmir. For example: not to hurt other people's feelings, not to talk in middle of davening or to think positive about other people.

2. The best place to put your chumras is in feeling Hashem's love, recognizing all the good He does and staying away from any negativity. This will completely transform your entire Avodas Hashem!





### DET US IMAGINE

Let us imagine for a moment that the world as we know it was suddenly changed, and the ability to sing and make music became a forgotten entity...

Thousands of people would suddenly find themselves without a job as singers, musicians, choirs, music therapists, talented chazzanim, musical instruments manufacturers, and voice trainers...

Musically gifted individuals would constantly feel the need to express their creativity through music, but they would be unable to do so, resulting in discomfort and even depression c"v...

Shabbos and Yom Tov seudos would be dry and lacking as the family and guests would tunelessly recite the previously joyous-sounding zemiros...

Children would find learning tefillah difficult and boring since they would have to memorize the words without the benefit of a tune...

In shul, adults would think longingly of the good old times, when they could still sing Kabbalas Shabbos...

Hallel would lose much of its spirit when uttered without its

traditional, joyous tunes...

Imagine Yom Kippur without the tunes of "V'chol Ma'aminim", "Mareh Cohen" and the joyous Kaddish before the tekiah gedolah...

Simchas Torah would be reduced to a shadow of its former existence. The men would try to dance while reciting the pesukim and piyutim, wish-

On Tisha B'Av, the mournful tune of Eicha arouse people to mourn and yearn for the Beis HaMikdash. Without this tune, it would be so much harder to truly feel the tragedy...

Learning would c"v lose some of its geshmak without the ability to read the Gemara in tune.

Kumzitzes in camps, schools, and simchos would no longer occur, depriving people of much-needed spiritual inspiration...

Weddings would sound like noisy lunchrooms, with plenty of chatter but zero music to liven the atmosphere. The dancing would be half-hearted at

best. People would forget why there ever used to be enthusiastic dancing by simchos. As time would pass, the younger generation would laugh at the silly people silently shuffling around the Chassan and Kallah...

exercise improver, pain reducer, and memory aid, amongst a host of other benefits. If music would cease to exist, we would lose all these advantages...

Who used immense wisdom to create the concept of music and vested it with incredible power to uplift and inspire? Who ensured that every person automatically knows how to use their vocal chords in the pre-

cise manner required to produce the kind of sound we call "song"? Who ensured that the unbelievable gift of music was never forgotten from the world so that we can continue to enjoy it day in and day out? It is You, Hakadosh Baruch Hu, our loving, caring Father, Who anticipates our every need and takes care of us 24/6, 365 days a year! We love You, Hashem!!!

outside all pale and R' Isser Zalman Meltzer met this yid

and he asked, "Why do you look so pale?"

He answered, "Because I just heard all about yirah, onesh, din, gehenim, all these scary Chazals that R' Chatzkel said over."

R' Isser Zalman responded: that's without emunah and bitachon. But if you live with emunah and bitachon, it's unconditional love, and these so-called scary Chazals are not nogea to you because Hashem will give you front seats in Gan Eden and you won't have any gehenim. Aperson has to realize that with emunah and bitachon it's a different set of laws, a different Shulchan Aruch. We're zooming into Hashem's unconditional love and we'll get front seats in Gan Eden and no gehenim.

R' Chaim Kanievsky explained that that's the peshat at the end of U'va L'Tzion. It says in order to be zoche to Olam Haba you need ahava v'yirah b'lev shalem. You have to be complete. Otherwise, nigah l'rik v'neled labehala, you were created for nothing. So zagt R' Chaim Kanievsky, a person can just say okay, I'm signing myself out, it's not nogea. I'm not ahava, I'm not yirah, I'm not lev shalem. I'm worthless. Who am I? What am I worth? But zagt R' Chaim Kanievsky, continue on in u'va l'Tzion and you'll see three pesukim of bitachon. What are these three pesukim doing here? To teach you that that's without emunah and bitachon. With emunah and bitachon it's a different set of laws, a different Shulchan Aruch. Bitchu bHashem adei ad - have bitachon, and that is zooming into Hashem's unconditional love and you'll get front seats in Gan Eden and at the same time there's no gehenim. Like the Gemara in Shabbos pei tes amud beis says, that with emunah and bitachon you're snow white clean. All your aveiros change from scarlet red to snow white. And therefore, a person has to realize that whenever you learn anything that sounds like yirah, din, onesh and gehenim, and you see it's making you a bundle of nerves, it's making you scared, worried and nervous, tell yourself: I'm going to zoom into Hashem's unconditional love. That itself earns you front seats in Gan Eden and that itself is mechaper for all your aveiros, no gehenim.

So bottom line is that every Chazal is there to motivate you to become a bigger, better, happier healthier person. Every Chazal is to motivate you to give you more menuchas hanefesh and simchas hachaim. Every Chazal is there to motivate you to have a healthier connection to Hashem. If that's what Chazal is doing for you, then beautiful, hold onto it and don't let go. But if you see Chazal is making you anxious, worried, nervous or frightened or making you view Hashem as a scary dictator, like a policeman with a stick in His hands ready to beat you up, then obviously you're understanding Chazal the wrong way and the Chazal is not meant for you. Chazer over these points that we mentioned that if you view everything with the right light, you'll always walk away with positive feeling and positive emotions from every single Chazal.




Suggestions for Last Week's Case: Meir's cell phone went off in the middle of a shiur and it very embarrassing for him.

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
