Shlomis

bas

Divri

In *Parshas Emor* (*Vayikra* 24:10-23), the Torah relates the story of the *mekalel*. The *pasuk* states, “The son of a Jewish woman went out, and he was the son of a Mitzri... His mother’s name was Shlomis bas Divri.” Rashi explains that the reason the Torah relates the name of his mother is to teach us the beauty of Klal Yisrael. Although they were in Mitzrayim – home of the Egyptians, the most depraved nation at the time – for so many years, they remained holy. They remained particularly careful in the area of *arayos*.

Shlomis bas Divri was a lone exception. She would greet and speak to everyone. How did this seemingly innocent act spiral to the point where she ultimately was nichshal with a Mitzri?

Rashi explains that it was precisely because she'd greet and schmooze with all men that she fell to such depths. He points out that this character trait is reflected in her name: "Shlomis" corresponds to the "Shalom" greeting; "bas Divri" symbolizes *devarim*, speech.
