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This Sunday night we will be celebrating Shavuos. It is a time to recall how Hashem chose us from among the nations and gave us the Torah – not just as a set of laws, but as a sign of His eternal love and promise to us. The giving of the Torah was Hashem's declaration, "You are Mine, and I am yours, forever."

No matter where we find ourselves spiritually, no matter how distant we may feel at times, Shavuos reminds us that this bond is eternal and can never be broken. Even when life gets overwhelming, even when we feel lost, this holiday is Hashem's way of telling us, "I never left your side – not for a moment."

While there is a custom to study Torah throughout the night of Shavuos, this holiday is not reserved for the inspired or the learned. It is for every soul at every level. We stood together at Har Sinai on that day, "like one man, with one heart." Even if you don't feel the excitement or enthusiasm right now, know that you were there at Sinai – your soul heard those words. That connection has never faded, and that connection will never fade.

Whether you're full of fiery passion or just barely holding on, this time holds a place for you. Your presence alone is not only precious, but essential. Simply showing up – even in silence – can be just as meaningful as the loudest celebration.

So this Shavuos, wherever you may find yourself – physically and spiritually – know that Hashem is already there, eagerly anticipating your arrival.
