



### While One is Outdoors

**21.** When outdoors, one may say *devarim sheb'kedushah* without being concerned that an immodestly-dressed woman might appear before him. If, however, he notices an immodestly-dressed woman, he must stop and refrain from continuing to say *devarim sheb'kedushah* at that point. (*Halichos Shlomo – Tefillah* 20:8)

**22.** If one goes to a place where he will certainly come across immodestly-clad women, he may not say *devarim sheb'kedushah* (unless he turns his body away from the *ervah*, or — if need be — closes his eyes, as mentioned previously). (*ibid.*)

Furthermore, if someone is sitting in a car and an immodestly-dressed woman is visible outside the car, he may not say any *devarim sheb'kedushah*, even if she is in a different car. (*See Mishnah Berurah 75:26 and Halichos Shlomo – Tefillah ibid.*)
