



A Change in Behavior

3. If a woman notices that the atmosphere in her workplace is causing her to dress less modestly, she should take this as a sign that this workplace is not the right place for her and she should seek employment elsewhere. (*Yisrael Kedoshim*, p.

256)

4. If a woman notices a change in the way her male coworkers address her, e.g., they used to address her as “Mrs. Feldman” but now call her by her first name, she should discuss with a *Rav* how to handle the situation (i.e., whether this is a reason that she should leave this job or if the issue is not a cause for concern). This also applies to a man who notices a change in how female coworkers address him. Any lowering of the professional boundaries between them is a reason to take note and possibly take
