to remove the shackles of whatever imprisons us – the worries that sit heavy on our hearts,
the anxieties that loop through our minds, the fears and doubts that make us feel stuck or trapped.*

*The story of Pesach reminds us that we are never truly alone in our struggle. Hashem declared,
"I have surely seen the affliction of My people... I know their pains" – Hashem was never distant or indifferent;
He saw every tear, every burden, every silent cry. Even when we can't see it, Hashem is working behind the scenes,
preparing our personal redemption, guiding us toward a freedom we may not yet be able to imagine.*

*It's important to remember that Pesach is meant for everyone – not just for those who feel deeply connected,
but especially for those who feel distant or uncertain. It is a day where we are encouraged not only to ask questions,
but to seek answers – to find truth, clarity, and strength.*

*So come as you are. Bring the weight, the questions, the imperfections. Because Pesach isn't about perfection –
it's about willingness. Willing to hope again. Willing to believe again. And willing to trust, even just a little,
that no matter how confined things may feel, freedom is closer than you think.*
